Two L.A. attorneys filed federal racketeering lawsuits last week against BMG, RCA and Arista, claiming there was a conspiracy to defraud the public in the marketing of label acts Milli Vanilli and Black Box, respectively.

The suits, filed in U.S. District Court in California on behalf of a consumer who bought the two albums, call

for unspecified damages under the RICO act. The Black Box action from accusations that front-person Katrin Quintrol is not actually the singer on "Dreamland" and dance smash "Everybody Everybody."

Next up: cases against Mr. Ed, Howdy Doody and Steve Reeves from the old "Hercules" movies.

Not Rob's Week

Los Angeles police arrested Milli Vanilli's Rob Pilatus last Tuesday and charged him with sexual battery. Pilatus was arrested at his Beverly Hills home at 5:30am and later released on \$10,485

bail. Police said his alleged victim was a 25-year-old woman. Unconfirmed reports say Pilatus denied any wrong doing and insisted the crime was committed by a 60-minute Memorex tape.

If you watch CNN, CBS, NBC, ABC or Geraldo, then you know the economy is stranded in the Bush League. We're talking recession, folks. So it only follows that the music retailers of America would also be feeling the pinch, right? Not so far.

"Overall sales are up in all stores," said National Record Mart's Doug Smith, who reported 20% and 19% increases over last year's sales for the Friday and Saturday after Thanksgiving, respectively.

"We are expecting a record-breaking Christmas," stated Harmony House's Sandy Bean. "We were extremely concerned because of this pessimistic media blitz, but sales are definitely up."

"The media has been doing a great job of convincing people that the recession is worse than it really is," said Gerald Bain of Q Records, citing more than a 5% increase in day-after-Thanksgiving sales over last year.

Not everyone is jumping for joy. The '90s also mean that hundreds of thousands of troops are in the Persian Gulf. That's a lot of people not listening to tunes back at the barracks. According to **Record Bar's Steve Bennett**, "The military markets are soft as you might expect."

Happy Holidays!

the Wednesday before Thanksgiving through the first week in January, the world as we know it generally ceases to exist. You'll notice just about everything is different traffic patterns, people's attitudes, productivity. Most normal activity gets suspended as we get swept up in and covered by this blanket we call "The Holidays." How many times have we heard, "I'll get back to you after the holidays," or "Once the holidays are over, we'll take a look at this," etc., etc?..

As programmers, it behooves us to understand this phenomenon, and to serve the needs of the listeners during this bizarre time — clearly different needs from the other ten-and-a-half months of the year. Good programmers have learned to read the periodic shifts in life patterns within their markets and finetune their stations accordingly. Aside from "the holidays," there are other distinct cycles that should change the way we think and program. Traditionally, the September back-to-school/ new TV season transition. "spring fever" and "summertime" all produce subtle changes in the way people live their lives, and these changes need to show up in our programming.

But back to the holidays. What can we do to steer our stations through a period one leading P.D. calls, "Six weeks when everybody has their head up their ass?" For one, this is not a good time to introduce anything new, make sweeping changes, or do anything on a grand scale. People are too distracted, and the impact will be lost, if not totally non-existent. Keep things small, lighten up a little, don't try to hit people over the head with anything right now. Go for a little warmth and compassion. We don't need to add to the jangled nerves that cause people to shoot each other over a parking spot at the mall in this season of supposed joy and peace.

This is also a time for greater than normal familiarity in your music. The new stuff simply won't get the attention it needs to maintain a foothold. Don't be afraid of being a little "burned out." People are looking for comfort, not a challenge, at this time. And one of the old adages rings true - on Xmas day, there are millions of people checking out their new CD players and radio/Walkmans. I don't think you'd test out a new system at home with something you've never heard before, and neither would they.

As I've said before, the best programmers are the best observers. Learn to read the life pattern changes in your market. And I'll get back to you after the holidays.




NEAR TRUTHS







AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH AC/DC BY DAINA DARZIN

angus away

The first thing you think of when you meet AC/DC is — jeez, they're so short! About the size of the little Stonehenge in "Spinal Tap." Swear to God. Which is particularly ironic when you think of AC/DC's music — loud and fierce, like cannon blasts or a dinosaur stampede. They're obstingte in their commitment to that bombastic, bluesy sound. Over their decade-and-a-half career, sometimes it has sold like crazy (the multi-platinum "Back in Black" or current hit album, "The Razor's Edge"); sometimes it hasn't (1983's "Flick of the Switch." for example). If that bothers AC/DC, they hide it well. Despite the obligatory paraphernalia that graces the London offices of their management company Part Rock (gold records, leather couch, lifesize point-of-purchase stand-up of guitarist Angus Young), the members of AC/DC hold their veteran rock star status in amused contempt. The fans and the tunes are the fun part. Everything else — the image, the pretense and the schmooze — is suspect or downright evil. You can't dress them up and wherever you take them, you get the feeling they'd be happier in a workingman's pub with a pint and a cue stick. That goes for interviews, too. But AC/DC are good sports, so here they are, sitting on that couch and fielding questions, knowing full well HITS' Daina "Won't You Blow" Darzin will pawn the whole sordid story off on us to try to make some kind of sense out of it.

Why did you choose [producer] Bruce Fairbairn for "The Razor's Edge"? The original team of Harry Vanda and Angus' brother George Young had been with you since the beginning. Angus Young: Vanda is a great rock & roll producer, but he himself told us, "You guys need to work with other people. I've done as much at this point in your career as I can." We didn't want to produce ourselves because it's always good to work with someone who is not too close to you but can tell when you're doing bullshit or something good, instead of someone who tells you what you want to hear without any input. That way, you don't disappear up your own asshole.

Angus, as a big Chuck Berry and blues guitar fan, you've said you don't care much for today's fast, technical players.

Angus: It's not rock & roll to me. It doesn't have that rhythm. It's very clever, but not my idea of a good time. If you look at the Top 20 for the last ten years, you'll find very few real rock & roll songs. As soon as I hear a ballad, I have to switch off. It always sounds like the guy's been shot in the side or something.

Your career has had its share of ups and downs saleswise. How important is commercial success to you?

Angus: We've never been number counters. We're happy playing in front

of 50 or 50,000.

Brian Johnson: Nobody goes in to make a bad album. You always go in with the same gusto and zeal. On your '88 tour, you were up against the Monsters of Rock and all these

other arena shows, but yours was the

Angus: Another time, in Frankfurt, a mortar shell landed on stage and everyone wondered whether to duck. It didn't explode — it was just a dummy — but it was frightening. At

Brian: We sent threatening letters to all the kids.

Angus: We like to give the audience an honest show. We try not to come across as if we're better than they are. You've had your share of fan rowdiness and vandalism at your shows. Does the audience ever scare you? Angus: We love them all. I wouldn't dare go up to an audience and tell them to behave. That would be like being back in high school and having the schoolmaster say that to me. We keep people entertained, so they don't have time to be destructive. They come to the show to release a lot of steam—

What's the worst thing that's every been thrown at you?

hopefully not on us.

Angus: The last time I was in Seattle, I could have opened a shoe store. You always see girls at the end of the show trying to collect their high-heels. Once, some guy launched a rocket that got stuck in the roof of the theater.

the time, there was a lot of terrorism going on in Europe.

What was your most memorable gig? Brian: When we did Rio de Janeiro, there were people as far as the eye could see. I remember walking down the stairs and just before we went on, a guy comes up and says, "And you know, ees 25 meellion people watching on television." And I'm thinking, "Aw, fucking thanks, that's just what I needed to hear." But it's one of those things you never forget. And the smell of shit — I mean real shit. They had only 500 Port-A-Loos, so people were just dropping it where they stood.

Brian, would you want your daughter

to go into the music business?

Brian: I think she's going into pub management. A wise choice. Actually, she's been in a few films — just bit parts so far, but she loves the excitement.

What advice did you give her?

Brian: Keep your legs crossed. And don't sign anything until you send me the contract.





Alaska's Anti-Grass

Steve Knoll's radio career started at WROK-AM in Rockford, Illinois, running countdowns and religious programs while operating the boards. After a year, he got his first full-time airshift, but soon afterward jumped to the station's FM counterpart, WZOK, where he did nights. He then moved to Aberdeen, South Dakota for his initial programming gig at KQAA. He was there for a year, then segued to WSPT in Stevens Pt., Wisconsin, before returning to Rockford, where he did mornings and was Promotions Director at WYFE. His next stop was in Kansas City at Album Rocker KKCI (now KXXR), where he stayed for three years before heading north - way north - to KPXR in Anchorage as P.D. It was there that Steve made the fatal blunder of answering what he thought was "a call from an old pai in Sherman Oaks" one recent blustery afternoon, and — as if it weren't cold enough already - he now had to face the chilling reality of spending a few minutes talking to HITS' own version of an Alaskan oil spill, Matt "Valdez" Zacky.



I think the biggest misconception is about what Anchorage really looks like. People expect to see log cabins and igloos, but it's actually a very cosmopolitan city. We've got skyscrapers, streets and stop lights — the things you'd find in any other American city. It's actually a busy little city. The population bounces around a lot. The last time I checked, it was about 250,000.


What's the ethnic breakdown? It's kind of hard to pinpoint, because we've got a real strange mixture of people up here. There are a lot of native Eskimos, and a lot of Asians, such as Koreans and Japanese. It's a very good mixture, although there isn't a large black or hispanic population.

Who is your average listener?

Our average listener is female, 27 to 30 years old, a professional, and makes a good salary. She's very hip and likes to go out and have fun.

How do you think Top 40s can capture adult demos?

We've been doing pretty well at it with what we do. We're real mainstream, and we daypart

heavily. We don't play rap, for example, until after 3 p.m. We try to relate to the adults, and this fall we've been pushing really hard on the office listeners, giving them a bigger incentive to tune in. For instance, we are giving away paid weeks off from work, and during November and December, we are giving away three Christmas parties for up to 100 people. That's the kind of stuff you've got to do. If you give them good incentives, you can get away with almost any kind of music. If there is a good enough prize, they'll stick through it.

What kind of music works best for you?


Stuff like Breathe's "Say A Prayer," the pop and mainstream records that are right down the middle. Damn Yankees is working real well for us, as are David Cassidy and Donny Osmond, which are both going through the roof. Those are the types of records I look for first.

How tough is the competition in Anchorage?

The competition is pretty good. When KPXR first signed on fourand-a-half years ago, KGOT was a very bad Top 40 station. I've heard tapes from before I got here, and since then they've improved 150%. Today they are actually a pretty good radio station, but it's not too often that you'll hear me give them a compliment. They definitely keep us on our toes - if they weren't around, we might get a little lazy. KGOT and we are constantly trying to outdo each other, but we usually get the upper hand. We've got a crew here that is pretty sharp as far as promotions go — and that keeps us a step ahead of

them. When we do a promotion, they will do the same thing to try to confuse the listener, but we have beaten them in the last three books. Our formula is working. We're #1 in the market.

What do you think of the recriminalization of pot - gania. buds, weed, hooch, reefer, cannabis, skudge, mary jane, the hein, louisville, madison, cheeba-cheeba — in Alaska? I voted to outlaw it. Alaska was the only state in the nation where a certain amount of pot was still legal. Being a new father, I think it was sending a negative message to the younger generation, plus it sends a message to the rest of the country — "Come on up here and smoke some dope." It's gone now, and I'm glad to see that. (Ed. Note: Awwnnuw). •

THE OLDIES BUT GOODIES REMIND ME OF YOU: The practice of sampling R&B classics has been selling LOTS of records, both old and new. As the law has caught up with sampling, R&B ar-

As the law has caught up with sampling, R&B artists have been GETTING PAID! TWICE! They are getting BIG dollars for their publishing rights (that is, if they own them), and they are raking in the green AGAIN as buyers search the racks for old records used on new hits. I talked with key retailers on the extent of this impact, and most agree with the Wherehouse's Violet Brown, who notes that "because of sampling the number of requests for older records has increased TREMENDOUSLY. Too Short's 'The Ghetto' has people running in for Donny Hathaway product." In addition, Candyman's "Knockin Boots" has shop-



pers in search of Betty Wright's classic "Tonight's The Night" and Rose Royce's "Ooh Boy," and Hammer has brought about a resurgence of interest in Rick James. Many of these JAMS are unfamiliar to today's teens, and Delicious Records' Tommy Hudson even recalls that "younger customers come in with tape recorders to playback the section of the song, and then buy the original." Is there a message for radio? DEFINITELY! Many programmers shy away from anything more than ten years old, and that's a mistake! Today's young samplers remind us of that with each new hit. Lets end the misconception that the young listener will not respond to the massive amount of music that at one time, grabbed its share of the active audience. Try it. Later.

Thee Headcoats, "Heaven's To Murgatroyd, Even..." (Sub Pop): Billy Childish, an ever prolific Brit (Pop Rivets, Thee Milkshakes, Mighty Caesars, Delmonas, etc.), reveals himself as an artist involved in a series of "deconstructions." If the Kingsmen blamed their muddled vocals and

recording on the singer's braces, then Billy must have his jaw wired shut! Through this, Thee Headcoats have recorded yet another elpee's worth of '50's/'60's frolic and mayhem. Note to Hasil Adkins: you've got some catching up to do.

Bounty Hunters, "Threads: A Tear Stained Scar" (Rockville): The Bounty Hunters songwriter and lead muse, Dave Kusworth, played long-time foil to ex-Swell Maps' Nikki Sudden and Epic Soundtracks in the Jacobites, who released some of the finest LPs to never reach these shores (especially



"Robespierre's Velvet Basement"). Kusworth and his fellow Hunters have reinvented the romantic Johnny Thunders-Keith-Dylan-esque narrative of their earlier work into the full-fledged signature songwriting of a man who's found his niche.



Various Artists, "Acoustic Music Project: A Benefit For Project Open Hand" (Alias): This compilation serves as a brilliant musical documentary of the San Francisco music scene, all recorded acoustically; the most stripped and vulnerable presentation, all the while generating funds for Project Open

Hand, the Bay Area's AIDS "meals on wheels" organization. It's unlikely that you'll hear a more passionate, better annotated album this year. From Penelope Houston to American Music Club, there's a wealth of music to be absorbed. (continued)

Acoustic Music Project continued: This is far more than an opportunity to grandstand "marquee value" talent; AMP offers the listener the chance to discover new Bay Area artists. In fact, the entire San Francisco music community came forward to offer their time and talent to battle the realities of the



most pressing crisis of the '90's, and the Sneetches' take on "Everybody's Talkin'" and the unlisted Alex Chilton version of "No Sex" restates the purpose of this project. For aesthetic and conscientious reasons, you owe it to yourself to buy this heart-stopping compilation.

TIME FOR A CUP OF JOE AND A DOUGHNUT

It's a fact of life that all interviews are not created equal. On one end of the spectrum, you find yourself faced with musicians who truly let their music do the talking, and who answer even the most intriquing questions with a succinct grunt. On the other end, happily, lie bands like Mary's Danish. Founded by singers Julie Ritter and Gretchen Seager along with guitarist David King, the Danish has one full-length LP under their belts in '89's "there goes the wondertruck." Heavy touring followed by the recent release of the live "Experience" EP has bound these three even tighter with fellow members, bassist Chris "Wag" Wagner, drummer James Bradley, Jr. and quitarist Louis Gutierrez. Although each member has different musical tastes, they all agree that Hendrix was God — hence their new single, a cover of "Foxy Lady" done Danish-style. Previous to a seriously powerful performance at the CMJ's, the band agreed to be interviewed by HITS' Heather "Don't Call Me Leather Hose" Lose, who wondered, if they needed an extra lead singer or quitarist or soundperson or roadie or even someone to hold the gaffer tape, she was more than ready to give up her drab, uneventful, meaningless existence as HITS' editorial design director and hit the road with the group.



What made you decide to cover "Foxy Lady"?

Julie Ritter: Dave, take it away!
David King: We decided to do it because we'd just worked it up and started
playing it in the studio. We had been in
rehearsal and started jamming, and it
just came together really quickly, so we
incorporated it into our live set.

Julie: We'd been playing it for about a year, and we were going to record it for the new album that's coming out at the beginning of '91. But we were putting this EP out, and thought it'd be a good idea to make "Foxey Lady" the single, because it's really in the vibe of what we're doing right now.

David: There are not a lot of common denominators within the band. We all have totally different record collections. But you would find Hendrix in all of them — he's the one thing we do agree on.

The video is pretty sexy.

Gretchen Seager: My mom saw the video, and when I asked her what she thought of it, she goes, "Well, there's some lesbian overtones, but it works!"

David: Me and Wag went to watch the dailies every day, and Julie and Gretchen would ask us what we thought, and we'd be like, "Fuckin' A! Gretchen, you are s-o-o-o fine!"

Julie: We wanted to do something different. All our other videos have been us performing live in a warehouse or something. So we were thinking of concepts, and the guys were saying, "Well, why don't we get some rad, '70s foxy lady, like totally happening," and Gretchen and I are going, "Hey! You've got two girls here! What are we, chopped liver?"

Gretchen: So we had a little push-up bra action, a little make-up, and there you go.



How did the band come together? Julie: We met at Tower Records in Sherman Oaks and we decided to hang out together!

David: Julie and I started hanging — she and Gretchen were roommates at school. Julie and Gretchen had always written poetry, and even had a few published.

Gretchen: We were frustrated poets.

David: The origins of the band lie in a room just like this, with me playing this crappy acoustic guitar and wanting to put a band together. Julie and Gretchen wanted to get something together, too. They already had the name Mary's Danish.

Gretchen: We thought it was so funny. We called him up one day and said we'd found a name for our band that didn't even exist!

Julie: It was like, "It's Mary's Danish! Baaah!" And there was silence on the other end.

Gretchen: He thought we were babbling idiots.

David: What happened eventually was, I just put some music down on tape, and Julie took this one riff and looped it so that it was long enough to write a

song around.

Gretchen: We had no idea how to write songs.

David: But that's how they came together! And it worked. **Julie**: It's very spontaneous.

Were you looking to get signed to a label?

David: When the band started out, there was never a lot of importance placed on getting a record deal. I mean, we just wanted to get through a rehearsal.

Julie: We'd be so excited, but the music would sound awful!

David: But it really did fall together. We didn't start playing live until some guy came into our rehearsal studio and asked if we'd like to play a gig. So we showed up and played, and it kind of perpetuated itself. During the first year of the band, we played a ton of shows, like twice a week.

Julie: It was amazing — people just kept asking us to play. I'd call my mom and say, "We've got a show!" My parents thought we still only had three songs, and they'd ask, "Well, how are you going to do a set? You've only got three songs!" And I'd say no, we have

eight now!

Where would you like to go from here?

David: I'd love to continue to do what I'm doing.

Julie: I would like to be respected for what we do. I was talking to a friend the other day who said that they really respect R.E.M., because although they've changed a lot through the years, they never tailored their music to what they thought would be popular. You can see that kind of natural progression and development in a talented band.

Gretchen: I have a friend named John Wesley-Harding, and he gets asked by everybody to come and sing on their records and do collaborations, and I would love to be at that point where I would feel comfortable asking anyone I wanted to come in and help out, and then to be asked myself.

Julie: Yeah, acceptance by your peers.

David: I guess the overall goal at the end is to be with somebody, maybe have a couple of kids, and be financially secure. I'd love to have a lot of fun in the meantime, but I think everybody wants that in the end.

Julie: Oh yeah, totally. @


ALL THE NEOBILLY NAMES FIT TO DROP

NEOBILLY PICKS



Various, "Home For The Holidays" (RCA): Splitting the difference between contemporary and traditional songs of the season, RCA delivers a killer Christmas package. K.T. Oslin's sultry on "Blue Christmas," while Prairie Oyster yuks it up on the strolling "Christmas In Jail." Restless

Heart's quietly finger-picked, five-part-harmonied "Little Drummer Boy" is prayer-like, while Clint Black's harmonica-driven, swing-country "'Til Santa's Gone" is rife with anticipation.

Various, "Billboard Top Country Hits 1959-63" (Rhino): L.A.'s wackiest, yet most thorough, compilers have turned their attention to classic country and, with the help of Joel Whitburn, have compiled a 5-CD set that features the ten biggest hits of each year. We're talking a primo sur-



vey course of the artists and songs that shaped the future — as echoes of Ricky Van Shelton, Emmylou Harris and Dwight Yoakam can be heard in the hits of Buck Owens, Johnny Cash, Patsy Cline, et al.



Ray Kennedy, "What A Way To Go"-(Atlantic): Could Kennedy be Neobilly's answer to Todd Rundgren? Playing just about everything here, the guitar work he flexes shows why his reputation as a picker precedes him. As a vocalist, he's got a worn voice that's better suited to uptempo shuffles

than ballads — though there is something almost **Randy Owen**-esque about the slow ones. Plus, off-center songs using odd metaphors make for something of depth to hang all that playing on.

Michael Martin Murphey, "Cowboy Songs" (Warner Bros.): Murphey's always had a soft place in his heart for the Old West and real-life wranglers, so this 21-song package is a loving tribute to the soundtrack of these things. Drawn largely from songs we heard on Saturday afternoon westerns,

The Wolves Survive

Los Lobos' sixth Warner Bros./Slash release, "The Neighborhood," finds the acclaimed East L.A. band returning to the rockier side exhibited in their renowned live shows. From 1983's Grammy-winning debut EP, "...and A Time To Dance," to their 1984 breakthrough, "Will The Wolf Survive," and their subsequent megasuccess with the '86 soundtrack to "La Bamba," Los Lobos have become the darlings of critics and fans alike around the world. After "La Bamba," the band returned to their roots with a magnificent Mexican folk album, "La Pistola Y El Corazon," which gave them some much-needed time to figure out how to follow the unprecedented sales performance of "La Bamba" and to live up to the tag one writer saddled them with as the "best American band to emerge in the last 20 years." Drummer and co-songwriter of many Los Lobos' songs, Louis Perez, sat down with HITS' own very low-riding Joe "Jumping Bean" Medwick for this exclusive interview.

After the huge success of "La Bamba." was it a special challenge to come up with a new Los Lobos record?

We needed to get back to where the natural progression would have taken us after "By The Light Of The Moon." That's why we had to do a record like "La Pistola Y El Corazon." We needed to search for our identity again. We dug deep into our roots for that. The songs from this record were an outgrowth of all the experiences we had in making that Mexican folk record. We brought out all the old instruments and, along with every old song we played, there were ten old stories of what went on back then. It was a great cleansing sort of thing. Not that "La Bamba" is anything we regret — but even though it was immensely successful, we didn't have that much invested in it artistically. So, we sat there, talked about old times and just really got back in tune with who we were. After years of touring and doing so much, it was time to make a new evaluation. This record grew out of that. We got to do some real rock & roll and we also got back to where we left off on "Light Of The Moon" — with songs in that narrative style which talk about particular subjects that are important to us.

"Be Still" is kind of a first for you.

For the first time, we combined a traditional Mexican rhythm with a rock & roll band and an English

lyric. It's a real milestone for David [Hidalgo] and I. Did you find yourself consciously trying to rock out a little more on this record?

After the homogenizing effect a big success like "La Bamba" could have had on this band, we had to find our grittier side. We approached this record with our co-producer Larry Hirsch wanting to get closer to the way the group sounds live.

"Down On The Riverbed" has a real swamp-blues feel.

Yeah, that's an odd piece. It's like a standard 12-bar blues, then it's not. The only way I can define it is to say it's just a modern blues song. All these cool things happen sonically, like that funny little drum figure, which makes it kind of different.

You got some help on this album from people like John Hiatt, Levon Helm, Willie Dixon and a host of drummers. How do you explain your extreme popularity with other artists and industry people in general?

people in general?
I'd like to think it's because we translate a considerable amount of vulnerability somehow — whether it's in our music or our personalities or the honesty we have with journalists. We haven't masked the fact that we are Mexican-Americans from East L.A. The name of the band leaves no question that this is a Chicano group. We're just coming right out and saying upfront this is who we are, this is our music. Playing

traditional Mexican music in a rock & roll setting shows a real honest attitude. People respect being dealt with on an honest level — especially in this business, where rock & roll stars are put on pedestals apart from real life. But this is life, man, which is something I hope translates through our music. The guys can do a pretty good number with

a great deal of grass-roots support from retail.

I don't really know much about the mechanics of it, but I do know when we're out on the road, the local WEA and Warner reps bring people by from the local stores and hey, those are the soldiers. We spend a lot of time with them and if we can, we'll do in-stores or whatever it takes.

their instruments too, so I think other musicians respect that. When we played on "Saturday Night Live," the guys in their band came up to us and said it's great to have a real band on the show! I mean, you have solo artists or duos or synth bands but hey, we are guys that play with real drums and guitars plugged into amplifiers. It's a band in every sense of the word. We're buddies that grew up together. We're friends. Our moms knew each other before we ever had the idea that we'd play together, and this November will mark 17 vears we've been a band! Los Lobos have always received

How important is radio success to a band like Los Lobos?

What it boils down to is whether you're going to compromise yourself or try to preserve your integrity. I'm much happier doing what I really enjoy doing and what I really believe in. Sometimes you have to wait a little longer for that reward. We decided very early on to build a foundation rather than just toss out some jive thing that wasn't us. We're not just going to throw out "La Bamba 2." We'd rather try to satisfy the people that have been true fans all along and hopefully enlighten those who didn't know us aside from the big hit. A


