
# **AC/DC Suit**

The father of one of the three teens crushed to death at the January 18 AC/DC concert in Salt Lake City has filed an \$8 million lawsuit against the band, their managers and agents, as well as promoters and managers of the Salt Palace. Meanwhile, local police investigators announced they have found no criminal negligence in the incident.

Bruce Child, father of 14year-old Curtis Child, filed the suit February 4 in Third District Court in Utah, claiming his son died because of "willful malicious conduct on the part of the defendants." Named in the suit are AC/DC, the band's management Hart to Handle Ltd., booking agents CAA, Salt Palace management Spectacor, concert promoters J.C. McNeil, United Concerts Inc. and KBER-FM, along with station owner Devine Media Corp.

The concert used festival seating, which was outlawed in Cincinnati following the deaths of 11 fans in a similar incident at a **Who** concert in 1979.





For you veterans, this list may help jog the memory of conventions past (you were probably too out of it to remember doing most of this stuff) — or it may inspire you on your quest for total Gavin Nirvana.

- \*19) Ask every person you see, "Whenja get in?"
- \*18) Ask every person you see, "Whenya goin' back?"
- \*17) Ask every person you see, "So, whaddya think's going on at Pirate Radio?"
- \*16) Try to get into all the parties, dinners and suites without tickets or your badge (novices find this hard to believe, but you don't need to register or pay at all!).
- \*15) Radio guys: Scam free drinks off of every record guy you see in the lobby, especially the ones you don't like.
- \*14) Record people: Give radio geeks the wrong room number for that "private" cocktail party with your superstar artist you have conned into this mess.
- \*13) Scam free drinks and meals from anyone who works at one of the 743 new labels. Most of these people may not be around next year, so score now.
- \*12) Get drunk and shamelessly beg for a job.

# DAYS OF WHINE & LOSSES

Is Top 40 on the verge of collapse or is news of the venerable format's demise greatly exaggerated? Darned if we know, but there's no disputing the fact that Top 40 has experienced a noticeable down trend in the last two books, and while opinions vary on how significant the dropoff is, it's at least significant enough for us to waste a coupla pages and some long-distance phone calls to let you know what a few so-called experts think. Are we faced with a mass exodus in search of a new slant that'll suck in the 25+ demos that everyone seems to covet

these days? Or should the affected stations just sit it out, adjust their strategy a little, and have faith that the trend will reverse itself? HITS' own ratings disaster Mike Murphy managed to get through to KIIS-FM PD Bill Richards, KMEL PD Keith Naftaly, KDWB PD Brian Philips and Z100 PD Steve Kingston in search of answers, only to be put on hold while we made up the following reponses.

Does the ratings drop of the last few books mean that Top 40 is on its way out as a dominant radio format?

Can this trend be reversed, and if so, how?

# Keith Naftaly, PD, KMEL, San Francisco:

Top 40 is still, by all means, a viable format. We're just experiencing some temporary confusion. Once programmers stop worrying about whether they're "niche" or "mainstream" or "mix," maybe

they'll find time to zero in on the lifestyles and music trends of the 18-34s living in their own individual markets. Add some reality, show-biz and soul, and your sales department will have a nice marketable package to hustle. A 28-year-old woman in San Francisco wants to hear Father MC. In Columbus, she wants to hear Elton John. Let's all panic. I think a well-programmed, streetwise Top 40 station can thrive and rule in any market in the United States with a pulse.




# Brian Philips, PD, KDWB, Minneapolis:

My immediate recommendation to anyone having problems is to help your direct format competitor go out of business. This has worked well for us, and I would recommend it for anybody. That's my recipe for Top 40 success; it's a great short-term solution. I also think it's more than just radio being open to records of different textures - which we really always have been, because in Minnesota you don't have these ethnic concerns pulling the station too far in one direction or another. Last year in the middle of summer, I was saying, "Top 40 is devouring itself." Even before the summer and fall books began coming back, I was getting a sense that we weren't in good shape. We'd just come off of New Kids and then we went into the all-rap thing. I'm just now realizing that there's not only a better variety, but all of a sudden the floodgates seem to have opened up and we really have some good records to play again. It's probably time to stop bashing the industry and asking where all the good records are. All of a sudden I'm hearing a few of 'em on my station again. My only indication that things are better is how easy it is to fill those slots. It has gotten much easier to do music since about the second week of January. There's a nice variety -- you have everything from an explosive Timmy T. record, to a good uptempo Mariah Carey record and a Sting record that sounds real good on the radio. All of a sudden, it just got easier to do music again. It's as simple as that. But it was a nightmare for the last six months.

It's not only the music that's out at any given time, but how we rotate that music. In analyzing that period, we certainly can make an argument for doing anything other than what we did. One of the things we are seeing with Top 40 is that a lot of 25+ formats are getting really adept at exploiting Top 40's weaknesses in their advertising. All the Album Rock stations here are advertising variations on the "no repeat" theme. The Adult outlets are sort of taking the "station you can listen to all day at work because it's not too hard, not too soft" approach. These people are smart enough to key in on our weaknesses, so you have to fight twice as hard to overcome that. Maybe the other formats have gotten good at neutralizing Top 40, and we have to fight back by being awaresounding and having a leading-edge attitude with new

music trends that those other formats simply can't deliver. Our real claim to fame is a freshness that sets the format apart from everything else on the dial.

If you're an Adult station somewhere and you're watching two Top 40s beating each other up over the head with positioning and negative advertising, and one guy is calling the other guy a wimp and a dweeb, believe me the people in the other formats are laughing all the way to the bank at that kind of stuff. It's completely unproductive. Listeners are only listening for things they can use like concert and artist info or entertainment, but they're quick to realize that negative comments about a competing radio station serve no purpose at all. There is no consumer benefit, and they tune it out the way they tune out everything else that has no bearing on them. Maybe there was a point where you could develop some kind of loyalty that would make people cheer for your station vs. a competitor the way they cheer for a favorite team. But with fragmentation and so many signals on the dial, they're looking out for their immediate concerns - which is to find a good song and a good station to listen to. You can't ask them to get caught up in your battle with a competitor. It's unproductive and always has been. I think the fact that trend has been bad for the format has been verified by diary comments people are making.

# Steve Kingston, PD, Z100, New York:

The only way to answer this question is to rephrase it. There's no Top 40 deficiency. There are more stations, consultants and researchers now, so there are more formats. We're in an age of fragmentation, but this won't go on forever. There is a period of reconsolidation ahead, and that's good for Top 40 radio.

The strong will survive and the weak will perish. It's that simple. Guess what? If you're the number two Top 40 in your market today, you're dead. The shakeout is just getting started and the "mother of all battles" is about to begin. Z100 is a year ahead of the industry in addressing Top 40's challenges. This whole thing started in New York and will end here, because this market is so competitive.


If you want to be a leader you've got to act like one. We have to stop thinking that market segmentation is the answer. It isn't. The only way we can make Top 40 work is by building audience coalitions between different market segments. Stations that obsessed themselves with a niche approach will be the first to fall. Top 40 has never been a niche format. This isn't easy to do, but nobody ever said it would be easy.



# Bill Richards, PD, KIIS-FM, Los Angeles:

The loss of shares nationwide (no pun intended) would indicate that this is true, but I think the problem with Top 40 is that we've gotten off the track by trying to be so ultra-hip that we've forgotten what true Top 40 is all about — being mass appeal. I think we've kind of screwed ourselves by niching our own format. People keep forgetting that you can play Genesis' "That's All" or something similar that tests well but doesn't necessarily fit the "sound current" of the station. But we forget that the sound current of Top 40 has always been variety. Too many programmers have gotten caught up in just trying to be hip - trying to find the newest, freshest song to out-hip the other guy. That's good for the format to a certain extent, but it can be overdone.

There is plenty of good music available for Top 40s right now. One of my biggest pet peeves, though, is the mentality that, for example, "I shouldn't add Damn Yankees now because it's fallen off the charts." Bullshit. You know Power106 never played it. KOST never played it. KBIG never played it. PIRATE and KLOS played it, but only a portion of our listeners are familiar with it. If we add it now, people will say we're adding a recurrent. Once again, bullshit. If it's valuable to your station, it's never too late. We added Alias way late, and now it's in a power rotation.




Another example is UB40's "The Way You Do the Things You Do." It was dead on the national charts when we added it at KKBO, but that didn't mean it wasn't a viable record for us. You can't let the national charts dictate what is good for your station and what isn't. There is plenty of good music around - you just have to quit looking at the Back Page. The format is certainly polarizing like I've never seen it as a PD. It's getting harder and harder to be all things to all people - to be that mass appeal station during the day and at night play what's hot, because what's hot is rap and that sort of stuff.

> One of the things you see with successes like Mix in Houston is people thinking that there must have been a big hole in the market for the music they play. And a lot of that may be true, but they don't realize that it's marketing that gets the job done. It has little to do with the music. The Mix stations find key buzz words and things to attack a Top 40 on, which may or may not be vulnerable. Marketing is important like never before. A good example is what's going on with B96 and Z95 in Chicago. That's going to be nothing but an imaging and marketing war. It's going to have very little to do with music.

So there you have it. Maybe Top 40 is going to survive after all. Maybe the inyour-face, blast-the-competition approach is not the answer. Perhaps some of the time and effort spent belittling the Top 40 across the street could be tempered with a marketing approach that would attack and reposition other formats as well. As for the music, we keep coming back to one point: Play the hits that work for you, regardless of the national picture.

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AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH MARK SHANDS BY DANNY OSTROW

Mark Shands was born in Elvis Presley's birthplace of Tupelo, Mississippi and went on to attend Mississippi State University. His first radio gig was back in 1968 working part-time at WKOR in Starkville in his home state, where his boss was Bill Tanner, himself a first-time PD. After stints in Jackson and Naches, Mississippi, Shands hooked up with the Lee Abrams-formatted WRNO in New Orleans as an on-air personality and researcher. He then segued to Y100 in Miami, rising to MD in 1974. The following year, he went to Pittsburgh's 13Q as MD and morning man. His first PD gig was at I100 in Daytona, Florida, then he went back to Miami at I95/WINZ as Ass't. PD. In 1985, he moved over to Ass't. PD at PWR96 in the same town before returning to the PD ranks at WHKW in Tuscaloosa, Alabama the following year. He joined KISS102 in Charlotte as PD, where nothing could be finah than to be in Carolina.... until HITS' radio germ Danny "Slapper" Ostrow called, that is.

#### Do you deal directly with the talent on WCKZ?

Yes, and I really enjoy it. When you're dealing with talent and egos, you should always try to remember how it was when you were a jock. I'm lucky to have real strong talent because Charlotte is such a happening market. A great many people want to come here. I work with them the way I like to be worked with. I try to let the talent be their own PD. I just try to convey the philosophy and the reasons we do things, then I hand it over to the talent and let them go at it in their own way. In most cases, it works really well.

#### What is your philosophy regarding on-air talent?

That they shouldn't be an announcer, but a person. We really don't want d.j.s or celebrities on the air; we want someone who's like a friend. We want to avoid all those radio cliches —we don't want those big egos up front. We want our people to relate to the listener one-

on-one — as though he or she is our personal friend.

### Has WCKZ been responsible for breaking any records nationally in the last year or so?

The Boys' "Crazy" started out here as well as Another Bad Creation's "lesha." Actually there have been way too many, and it would take much too long to tell you all of them. Just kidding.

### Why has such a premium been put on WCKZ to get a record started within the Clifton chain?

We have a real good situation in our market. It translates well to other cities because we have a big city style makeup. The market is about 50/50 as far as northerners and southerners or blacks and whites go. We're able to try just about any kind of music. If it's a hit, it'll work here. If it works here, we spread that information to the other 20 or so Clifton stations, most of which are in major markets. Because of that, we can make a hit happen in about four

### days. [Laughs.] How much input does Clifton have as to what records you play?

He doesn't generally give us a perrecord approval or disapproval. He does help us decide how to attack the market. Which changes all the time. Just recently, we lost our direct competition in WZZG, which became an automated oldies station. We've been talking to Jerry about how to react to the situation of not having a direct Top 40 competitor. But the situation's always changing. When we first started this station about three years ago, we came on as an urban station, filling a hole in the market. But since then, WPEG has really gone back to serving its listeners much better, so we evolved into more of a Top 40. When I first got here 18 months ago, our audience was 77% black and now it's 28% black. So we've gone from being an urban station to a crossover Top 40 and where we go now is the next phase.

single-handedly, y'know. Just kidding. It happened the way you always want it to happen. The club scene is so strong there and we really aligned ourselves with the clubs and the stores. It was one of those times the clubs, the stores and radio all worked together. We really teamed up and found out where that market was. And to prove it, I've got her panties right here.

Do you foresee a rap backlash after all the down books nationally?

I think there already has been. We see a very distinct line between what people under and over 25 think of as good music. I think it's very similar to what happened when Elvis or the Beatles came on the scene. Rap is controversial to folks that are not part of the youth culture. When it comes to the street and rap, people over 25 just don't get it. It will spread out a little bit, but whether or not the baby boomers will make it an upperdemo phenomenon remains to be seen.

#### Does the Clifton philosophy differ market to market?

Definitely. Each market is looked at as a separate entity. He doesn't put the same format in each market. If you take a look at the markets, the stations are custom-made to fit every one and he's constantly fine-tuning them.

#### Do you have any good Miami stories?

The first thing that always comes to mind is breaking Madonna. I did it

The main thing going on with the stations is survival in the recession. It's tough selling enough advertising. So stations are going to drop back and play it safe — deciding they are adult outlets in order to grab those dollars.

#### What do you think of the Gavin Convention?

If it wasn't for the overwhelming humor of Ron Fell & Dave Sholin, it would be just another convention.



At 22 years old, Scooter B. is one of the youngest PDs and GMs in the country, and y'know he'd have to be with a name like that. The Scoot-guy got his start while still in high school at a small station in Walsonburg, Colorado, which was country in the morning, adult in the afternoon and rock at night. He attended college for a semester at the University of Southern Colorado in Pueblo, where he worked at the campus radio station. The Scootmeister went on to do overnights at country station KCCY, before Max Miller offered him a gig at KKMG in Colorado Springs in April '87. From there, the Scoot-a-doodle-doo's rise was meteoric — from overnights to nights to afternoons to afternoon/MD to PD to GM/PD/middays, an upward trajectory which only began plummeting that fateful day the phone rang and HITS' radio rube Todd "Packin' A Rod" Hensley got on the line.



Do you face any prejudice on account of your age?

I feel like a baby dealing with all these 40and 50-year-old people, but I try not to let it show. Besides, a great many people think I'm older than I am. I never bring it up because I wouldn't want to get labeled as a stupid kid. But I've never had a major problem with it. The staff here is also very young, so that helps. Anyway, people deal with prejudice all the time — sometimes because you're 40 and short.

#### Where did the name Scooter B. come from?

The "B" stands for Bret. Which is my first name, but Scooter is a lot easier to remember. Scooter is the Muppet with the goofy hair. I've been told the "B" stands for the "Bambino" of radio.

people from Citadel and they've been great to work with. They're also doing this somewhere in Montana with a country station and a Top 40 and they're seeing fantastic results. However, the economy is much better there than here. It's pretty crummy right now. But we're making history.

#### Are you setting an FCC precedent with this arrangement?

There have been some similar instances, but for this exact situation, we are the first, yes.

A fee is paid to us from them and they are allowed to sell the time as they want. I meet with them and let them know what will and won't fly. A classic rock audience is much different than ours. It's not a great idea to advertise a rock & roll bar on our station. But

It's sort of a brokerage. KKFM, the classic rock station, sells our advertising for us. We just make sure the product numbers stay great. That's the agreement. We are two separate entities that happen to sell our advertising together, sort of like an AM/FM combo. They can sell one or the other or both. It's just starting to kick in. I knew it wouldn't happen overnight. These are the

### You're obviously being affected, like everyone else, by the recession.

It has affected every station here. There are over 20 signals in this area, and this is a big military town. We have Peterson Air Force base, Fort Carson and the Air Force down books, but just wait until summer and it'll be as hot as ever.







Call Chris Isaak a critical darling and he won't disagree. But he still thinks his label should give free records to regular folk instead of rock writers to broaden his listenership. Actually, it

might not be necessary anymore because "Wicked Game," the single from his third album, "Heart Shaped World," has suddenly taken off. Which is all the more ironic because the record was originally released last fall to little response, but its inclusion in director David Lynch's controversial "Wild At Heart" and a TV movie about the N.Y.C.



preppy murder case has given it a second life. The Stockton, California native, who now makes his home in San Francisco, seems to be taking it all in stride. Heck, he still lets his mom pick out his stage duds. His influences are wide — from Vaughan Monroe and Marty Robbins to Roy Orbison and Pat Boone. With a glorious pompadour and a rockabilly attitude, Isaak seems custom-made for his pal Lynch's skewed vision, as is HITS' own Ben Horne wannabe Brian "Don't Call Me Andy" Griffith.

#### You must be gratified by the resurgence of "Wicked Game."

It happened in a real nice way. It kinda came out of Atlanta. A guy down there by the name of Lee Chestnut [Power 99 M.D.] just said, "Damn the job, let's play the song." And I was glad he did. I was just sitting on my couch watching "Hawaii Five-O" and [Warners' Atlanta promo rep] Warren Hudson called and said they're playing the record. I was so happy, I called my mom. After awhile, I got calls from Canada, then England. I had already gone out on tour and done all the work and was home working on the next record, when all of a sudden, they're playing the last one.

### The instrumental version of "Wicked Game" was used in "Wild At Heart," but the vocal was included on the soundtrack.

I can see why David [Lynch] used the tracks without the vocals in the film. I usually don't like pop songs in films, either. There are only a few people whose vocals I would like to hear under a film — Connie Francis being one. The problem with having any kind of vocal is the words comment on what's going on, so it's very hard to just take a song and use it in a scene. These days, producers are more interested in using artists who may have nothing to do with the film, but who are selling records, so they can have a Top Ten soundtrack. It's a marketing thing. I understand they're trying to make money, but

don't expect me to buy a ticket.

#### How did you meet David Lynch?

We worked together on "Blue Velvet." We get along pretty well. He's a real straight guy, not weird at all. Everybody seems to think he eats live mice, but he's really easy-going and soft-spoken. He doesn't have a big ego. His success didn't come that quick, so he doesn't buy into that "boy genius" stuff. He was broke long enough to understand what it is to work and to deal with people on a realistic level.

#### You've studied filmmaking. Do you come into video shoots with your own ideas?

I'd like to make films someday. I work with directors on my videos, but I drive them

crazy. I not only bring storyboards, but I bring videotape. I'll take bits and pieces of various films, and tell them stuff like, I want the light to look like this, I want this scene to look like that. See how the camera moves here? If you get with a good director, they make it all happen and more. I've been lucky

working with people like Mary Lambert. She looks great bending over a camera.

#### You've done some film soundtrack work, haven't you?

Well, I've written some background music for TV shows. The door opens and you see the body, that kinda stuff.

### You've also appeared as an actor, most notably in Jonathan Demme's "Married To The Mob." Any desire to do more of that?

I'm in there for all of 12 seconds or something. I play an assassin in a clown suit who works at a Burger King. It's based on a true story. Just kidding. I just did another one with Jonathan called "The Silence Of The Lambs." I haven't seen it yet. I play a cop who finds a body with its face all chewed off, covered with blood. I get to be revolted. I have great lines like, "He's down here!" and "Let the girl go!" I think it'll be a good film. It really looks spooky. It's about a cannibal and a murderer, so it's gotta be good.

#### And now you've finally got a hit record.

It's great and I'm really happy, but in a way, I'm so into making the next record and working with the band, things haven't changed that much. It's not like I was waiting for this to happen and didn't know what I was gonna be doing. I've worked with the same people for years and years. I live in the same place and drive the same car. My life hasn't been turned upside-down; the only thing it does is make me real happy. \*

Most of rock's control freaks like to pretend their veneer of democracy/social skills are something other than the emperor's new skivvies. Jesus Jones' Mike Edwards, however, rides proud on the computerized steed he (and he alone) guides through the cobblestone PoMo streets. As a follow-up to their virulently sterile debut LP "Liquidizer," Mike has decided to spread his gospel in a decidedly more user-friendly manner. "Doubt," the second Jesus Jones sermon on the mount, is more pacific than the pounding strains of "Info Freak," displaying an almost vulnerable side, especially on the alternative hit and crossover hopeful, the haunting "Right Here, Right Now." Still, if you believe Jesus Jones leader Mike Edwards' spiel about self-doubt, you'd probably also be interested in some waterfront property on the Persian Gulf from HITS' own used camel salesman, David "Spritz" Sprague.

In the U.K., people tend to call you a metal band using technology. Here in the U.S., you've been cast as a technoband with wattage. Who's right? Because we use so much, we are all things to all people. Certainly, we have some very confused people reviewing us. The word that seems to crop up the most is "expect." People seem to expect all sorts of things from us, none of which I think we've given them.

Does that excite you?

Very much so. It's important to be unpredictable. That's why we got together - because there was a gap. I don't mean that in a marketing sense, either, I continue to see gaps everywhere and we'll fill them when we feel like it.

There's much more range and a lot more texture on this album.

I'd agree with that. We had one central idea with "Liquidizer," which we wanted

tend to be a complete control maniac. You'll notice I've written all the songs again, but this time I've produced most of them as well. I have total control of our video scripts and of who supports us on tour. I have to have that total control. Not that I can be trusted.

The samples you use aren't readily recognizable.

I deliberately seek to pervert the samples because I'm more interested in the sounds than the sources. I see it as being an artistic crime to take an old hit, chop out a bit and go. The examples are too obvious to mention.

How about an instance of doing it your way?

It's inherently thrilling to be able to loop a sample round and round, backwards, then three octaves below its original pitch so that it becomes unrecognizable. An actual example of that method is our

to hammer home — that we could mix dance and rock music in a way that had never been done before. Remember, this was 1988, long before the infamous Manchester scene. With "Doubt," we wanted to make an album of extremes - a very eclectic record - and I think we have.

Why have you tempered the aggression so much?

We're just showing different facets. I don't want to consider myself a onedimensional character and the same goes for the band. It's a very personal record; it deals with a lot of uncertainty I have about my own abilities and indeed. the very concept of doubt.

The first song on the album is "Trust Me." Who do you trust? Me. That's pretty much it. That's why I

ambient house track, "Blissed." It's very slow, sedate and pacific -- and we used a sample of the Sex Pistols' "Pretty Vacant" on it, which is a bit of an ironic juxtaposition.

is there a downside to using all that technology?

To an extent. The typical idea is that the machines can take over, which can only happen if you have a limited imagination. You can either get a machine and see what it does or come up with an idea and figure out how to implement it. Have you kept abreast of your fellow Jesus bands, like MC 900-Foot Jesus, the Jesus Lizard or Creaming Jesus? None that I'd go to see based on name alone. I've heard the Jesus Lizard and they're quite good. It worries me, though. If something becomes common,

I tend to shy away from doing it. Have you received flak about the name from religious groups?

Not yet, but we'll see what happens as we get bigger. It does worry me, especially since we're not called Jesus Jones for religious reasons; technically, we're called (with hispanic accent) Chay-Zoos Jones. People who've got a problem with it better address thousands of Latin Americans who had the name first,

Your hit from last year bore the line. "Happy is never enough." Is that how you feel?


Absolutely. I'm never satisfied, and I think that's good. We've just had a Top Ten single, and I said, "Great, #7 — six to go." I'm sure if we reach #1, we'll start counting how many weeks we stay there. A lack of satisfaction is essential to improvement.

How much of the band's image is real and how much is builshit?

Well, there are times when bullshit is useful, but honesty seems to startle people even more. There's a lot of encouragement in this country to live a ludicrous, excessive, cliched lifestyle a la Guns 'N' Roses. We don't do that, but we're not shy to make fun of ourselves and others.

What forms of excess do you approve of?

Control. I'm quite dictatorial. Even the bio refers to me as megalomaniacal, but then again, I had final approval on that, too, didn't !?



"8-Way Santa" (Sub Pop): Anyway you look at it, this album is truly massive. The single "Jinx" only hinted at the impact that "8-Way" is going to have on the PoMo/Metal audience. Most of the songs cover the usual redneck territory of drinking, driving and drinking while driving. But

there's a difference. The Tad Band are gifted musicians and songs such as "Delinquent," "Trash Truck" and "3-D Witch Hunt" have all the power and cultural iconography of "Institutionalized" or "Epic," but with irony. Turn up the fat!

Todd Rundgren, "2nd Wind" (WB): For at least the last 15 years, few artists have wielded the influence that Todd has had over musicians and fans alike. Recorded live, enlisting many of the musicians he's used in his touring band (with the return of Roger Powell), "2nd Wind" opens with "Change Myself," a



pop song that showcases Todd at his finest. Unfortunately, the uneven nature of this album is felt with the inclusion of 3 "show tunes;" songs written for the failed Broadway play "Up Against It." Still, well worth a place in your collection.



Godflesh, "Streetcleaner" (Earache/Combat): Huge and relentless is the best way to describe this Birmingham group, formed from two seminal UK industrial combos. Now available through new deal between Earache/Relativity, "Streetcleaner" is STREETCLEANER death metal at its finest: unrelenting

percussion, slashing guitars and some of the most gutteral, angst-ridden vocals this side of Live Skull. This "sense-surround" of despair and paranoia is best found in "Pulp," "Like Rats," and "Wound," one of the 4 extra tracks on the CD.

Robert Forster, "Danger In The Past" (BB/RCA): After 12 years in the Go-Betweens, co-founder Robert Forster has "part company," with a solo debut that could be described as the indie/import version of John Hiatt's "Bring the Family." Yes, Robert has married and relocated to Germany, where fellow



Aussie expatriot and Bad Seed, Mick Harvey, gathered past and present members of Nick Cave's group for this LP. "Danger" reflects Robert's expansive, celebratory outlook braced by Mick's melancholy piano and Robert's precise lyrics, reminding us that there is always a price to pay for happiness.

# We Do Like Mondays

Remember popping the top on your first can of Silly String? Pressin' that ol' aerosol button and unleashing a veritable fireworks of multi-colored fun? That's sort of the same feeling you get listening to Mancunian psychedelophiles Happy Mondays' new release, "Pills 'n' Thrills and Bellyaches." From its bongofury rhythm section on up through its goose-stepping funk guitarwork, the record sounds like one non-stop dance party. The PoMo smash "Kinky Afro" is a kaleidoscope of the sextet's more prominent influences (the "Yippy yippy ya ya yay yay" chorus was lifted from LaBelle's "Lady Marmalade" while the lyrical theme was borrowed directly from Hot Chocolate's take on Stories' "Brother Louie"), bumping and grinding like a seamless house hit. How'd you publicize the events?


How did you make a living?

We sold Ecstasy. That's how we used to get our money because we didn't have jobs. We used to sell [Ecstasy] to the journalists and the ones who'd never had it before would start writing good reviews of us and our parties. Some of the gigs we did were pure shit, but because the atmosphere was pretty wild from us selling everybody Ecstasy, we got good write-ups. How much did drugs figure into the

songwriting and the concerts?


We've all gone onstage playing on E.; it's really good fun. But only if everybody else is on it in the audience so no one can tell how bad you are. But now we have loads more equipment, like sequencers and things. Once I get used to this expensive equipment, I'll probably start doing it again. That'll put some fun back into things!

Amid all the soul and house sounds on the album, there's actually a Donovan tribute! We got asked last year what tape we listened to most on tour. So we told 'em, about 8 o'clock in the morning, after we had been listening to that electronic stuff all night, we used to put on Donovan's greatest hits because it was dead mellow and everyone really got into it. We had him support us over here on tour. As far as we were concerned, he wasn't there for the audience — we wanted to see Donovan ourselves, so we got him to open for us.



Did you always want to be in a rock group?

We only started the band because we liked getting stoned. When I was 20, we were sitting in a room banging bongo drums and totally off our




Your band has become closely associated with the Manchester scene. Has that been a help or a hindrance in trying to break the States?

When [the Manchester scene] started off, it had nothing to do with bands like Inspiral Carpets, the Stone Roses or us. In 1987, a load of Ecstasy came into Manchester, and it became the big capital for the drug in England. We put on loads of illegal parties by breaking into old, abandoned warehouses. In London, police busted those parties, but in Manchester they just left everyone alone.

We used to sell pot to him and he'd sell us jeans cheap, but he knew a guy at Factory, so he just told him, "I want you to do these lads a favor. They want to make a record."


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

#### TIME FOR A CUP OF JOE AND A DOUGHNUT WITH SISTERS OF MERCY BY SHARI ROMAN

With the gloriously gloomy Andrew Eldritch helming its dark sonic ride, post-punk pop stars Sisters of Mercy first started blazing the doom-rock trail in England in the early '80s. Guitarist Wayne Hussey and bassist Craig Adams defected in '86 to form Mission UK, leaving leadman Eldritch and the drummer — a rhythm machine dubbed "Doktor Avalanche" — to "their" own happy devices. Residing in and out of Germany, Eldritch calls the band's previous album, "Floodland," "lyrically a very wet record... Hamburg is a very wet place, it's got a lot of canals." Theatrical, ironic and uncontainable, his newest, "Vision Thing," juxtaposes tactile prose with roaring rock, and is to Eldritch, "a very bright record in a very dark world." Permitting the light to fall across his razor-sharp cheek bones, the Brit-bom Eldritch smokes cigarettes, quaffs a beer and lets loose his tongue on the state of Sisters, as HITS' own Goth-gal Sharl "Arrivederci" Roman laps it up.



Sisters of Mercy has carried some pretty weighty labels — among them Goth Rock, Danceable Doom Rock and Dance Floor Apocalypse. How do you feel about it?

[Groaning.] Ugh. Goth rock. The G-word. It feels like a milestone, a dead albatross. I don't know how much it's helped. I do know how much it's hurt. They don't play our records on the radio because they think no matter how good the records are, we just don't fit into "their format." I see no reason why the kind of people that buy a Heart record shouldn't like our records. If people don't wish to be bothered with all the subtext, ignore that and it's still a good record — just straight-ahead rock music. I'd like to have people think of Sisters as REM, only a little louder.

You're planning to tour in the spring. Didn't you once say that you would never tour the United States because it was unworthy of Sisters?

What I said was, I'd never tour again period. I never said the U.S. was unworthy, but it's true. Why? I don't know. You tell me why in such a huge country no one buys our records. People have also said, "How can you tour when you don't have a drummer? How can you be a serious band?" Well, I say, "What about Depeche Mode?" — who I think are a great rock band, by the way. They're so wonderfully, wonderfully pervy. If I sang half that shit, I'd be banned everywhere.

#### You sound pissed off.

I won't pretend that I'm happy to be considered alternative or the G-word.

It's been two years between "Floodland" and "Vision Thing."

#### Why so long?

Basically, I didn't feel like making a record. There are a lot of people who make records every year just because their accountants tell them to. I think that if you've got nothing to say for a while, you should shut the fuck up. Or if you've got something to say and you can't work out a way to say it — you should shut the fuck up. Records have got to be about life, and if you just keep making records and never take time off to live a little, what the fuck are you going to write about?

#### What did you want to say with "Vision Thing"?

I don't see why I should have to explain the subtext — but there are quite a few references to my favorite leisure pursuit.

#### And what would that be?

Sorry state troopers everywhere, I'm not putting that on tape. As far as subtext goes... there's a wonderful kind of arrogance to this record that I really like. Retribution, sex, violence, politics and religion are common themes. All of them fun things.

Are you arrogant, or is it that you're just perceived as such? I don't suffer fools gladly. People think just because you wear leather trousers you have to be dumb. If people treat me with respect, I treat them with respect. If they don't, yeah, I give them a hard time and I make no apologies for that.

You wear a wedding ring. Are you married? It's sort of difficult to envision you as a family man.

No, I'm not married. This ring on my finger is a lesson to me.

#### Something dark and unfathomable?

No. Something dark and about five foot nine. 4

Butthole Surfers, "Piouhgd" (Rough Trade): At last, the long awaited "sell out" record from one of the most consistently uncompromising bands in life. And guess what? "Piouhgd" (pronounced P.O.-ed) is completely brilliant. Radio has been quick (relatively) to jump on the "Hurdy Gurdy Man"

bandwagon, but it's the rest of the album that showcases Gibby and Co. at their finest. Hearing "Golden Showers" and "Lonesome Bulldog (parts I-IV)" is like grabbing for the brass ring on a carousal moving at warp speed. Awesome.

Kitchens Of Distinction, "Strange Free World" (A&M): The buzz on this band has far exceeded anything since the release of the first domestic Sugarcubes LP. "Drive That Fast," the first single, has utterly enraptured the PoMo world, and other tracks such as "Railwayed" and "Asprayed," with their chiming



guitar melodies countered against a storm of feedback, recall the finest of Echo and other UK faves. "Strange Free World" is a romantic and brilliant soundtrack to the state of suspended animation. This is a distinctive record from a splendid group.



Book Of Love, "Candy Carol" (Sire/WB): On their third LP, Book of Love still displays the breezy melodies and rhythm that endeared them to the PoMo and Dance world, but the music has evolved into a denser, layered miasma of keyboards and vocals. "Wall Song" is a perfect example of the band's

ever-expanding growth. Still, sunshine and love are the themes that persevere, setting up "Alice Everyday" to be the "feelgood" hit of the year and the LP, "Candy Carol," to fill the bright void left by those other New Yorkers, the B-52's.

Gerardo, "Mo' Ritmo" (Interscope): You may think I'm kidding when I assert that Gerardo is preternaturally Post Modern. Produced by that "maniac" Michael Sembello, "Mo' Ritmo" is kitsch, it's cool, and it has some of the most inventive lyrics since Robyn Hitchcock saw his first crustacean. To



wit, "My addiction has to do with the female species/I eat 'em raw like sushi." More macho than Big Dipper, more explicit than G.G. Allin, and sexier than Sting, Gerardo is a multilingual PoMo hero for the Nineties. Suave.







# LUSH

Miki Berenyi, the waifish 23-year-old frontwoman of U.K. sensation Lush, is onstage at a San Francisco soundcheck, staring blankly at her out-of-tune guitar. "I don't know what the fuck I'm doing," she bleats like a lost lamb, and a helpful soundman quickly gets the instrument ready. Minutes later, the four-piece group breaks into a rhapsodic, ringing readout of one of its more upbeat numbers, and Berenyi - eyes closed, her short red hair bobbing to and fro over her parka hood — is suddenly singing and strumming like an arena pro. This night-and-day switch neatly sums up Lush's short Cinderella career. Three years ago, Berenyi and her pal Emma Anderson were just a couple of English Lit majors dreading their eventual emergence into the London rat race. Their solution? To form a band. Now, after two EPs for the British 4AD label, Lush's music has finally been released stateside in a Reprise collection called "Gala." With much of the material buffeted by the Cocteau Twins' Robin Guthrie, it's easy to hear why Berenvi wound up an overnight celebrity in the British pop press. Sloppy though Lush may claim to be, there's some twisted primeval spark at work in their music. Anderson and the rhythm section of drummer Chris Acland and bassist Steve Rippon worked out on another tune while Berenyi, as animated as a snack-hungry chipmunk and puffing nervously on a cigarette, explained her wacky history in boldface terms to HITS' own NoCal SloMo PoMo Tom "One If By" Lanham "Two If By Sea."

Okay, an obvious one — why form a band at all if you didn't know how to play?

Nearly everyone I knew in London was in a band, and ever since I was 13, I was going out to see bands all the time. Plus there was this phase in British music where they touted the so-called "Shambling Bands," like us and the Shop Assistants. It was groups who weren't very good musicians — playing three chords not very properly — but we still went up and did it.

#### None of the original members were musicians?

Chris could actually play, but when we asked Steve to play bass, he'd never played the instrument in his life. He had six weeks before our first gig to learn to play all the songs. I didn't want to sing — I couldn't sing. We used to have this girl singing for us and she left, so we advertised for singers and they were all just complete lunatics. We figured one of us would have to sing, and Emma immediately said, "I'm not fuckin' singing!," so I had to.

#### Did you ever think you'd get this far?

We just wanted to be in a band. We saw as far as getting a record out on an independent label, but I never dreamed we'd be on 4AD.

What was the group's big break in the early going?

"I didn't know what the hell I was gonna do — I figured I'd have to get a really bad job as a waitress or something."

# LIFE

By February of '89, we'd gotten a lead review in *Melody Maker*. Of course, all the major record companies started phoning and coming to see us, so we got a lot of coverage suddenly. But we were really bad live — absolutely abysmal. A couple of people who came to see us could see that we actually had songs — we just couldn't play them very well.

#### So when did [4AD head] Ivo finally see you?

We'd made a demo that 4AD was interested in. At the time, we played a London concert with the Pale Saints, who went on first and just completely blew us away. They were so perfect and there we were - out of tune, amps not turned on and vocals all over the place. Ivo came to see us about three or four more times before he was convinced to sign us - and even then he wasn't so sure. He only agreed to let us do a demo, so we did three songs and that was the first side of our debut EP, "Scar." Then we did three more and he put it out. So really, our first record was just demos. I still don't think Ivo's very sure about whether he likes us or not.

# Aside from the accent on heavy guitar, what exactly is a Lush song? You know, we find it quite difficult to write. I've heard Charles from the Pixies will tour, and then he'll write 30 songs really quickly. I could never do that, but I still don't think we've found the formula for what our songs are yet.

Other bands have played together for years and had a chance to develop, but we never had that. We had six songs and suddenly 4AD put them on a record. Maybe when we've done a proper album, we'll have more of a trademark sound.

#### It's very hard to pinpoint your influences. What are they?

All four of us are into completely different sorts of music. Emma was into airy music like the Cocteaus, Chris is totally into punk bands, Steve's into '60s types like Bob Dylan and the Byrds. I used to be into all that punky garage stuff.

It sounds like you're gradually developing your own voice as a singer. I don't like listening to it very much. It's just a necessity when I go onstage. But I don't think I'll ever think of myself as a singer.

What would you have done after graduation if Lush hadn't taken off? I've never had a job in my life. I refuse to work — and that's why I went to college. Then I thought, "Oh God... I can't make a living out of this band," because we weren't doing anything really, just playing little gigs. I didn't know what the hell I was gonna do — I figured I'd have to get a really bad job as a waitress or something. But I was really lucky, because as soon as I finished, that's when we did "Scar." Which was just totally brilliantly timed.





# NEOBILLY PICKS

Mike Reid, "Turning For Home" (Columbia): His voice is a soulful growl, reminiscent of James Taylor at his funkiest. He writes warm, comforting songs and he delivers them with an ease that wraps itself around the listener. With "Walk On Faith," his first single, Mike Reid establishes himself

as a progressive country force who takes those traditional values and casts them in a slightly R&B tone. The title track is timely, given world events, but look for the sensitively teary "Everything To Me But Mine" to be a major sleeper.

Marsha Thornton, "Maybe the Moon Will Shine" (MCA): Hard country thrush Marsha Thomton hones in on her old-time barroom roots as producer Steve Fishell places the emphasis on her bending and breaking twang. Drawing on material from Steve Earle ("A Far Cry From You")



to Buck Owens ("In The Palm Of Your Hand"), she's heartbreak personified — and those sentiments are buoyed by restrained playing from Albert Lee, Glen D. Hardin, Mark O'Connor, Carl Jackson, Willie Weeks and Jerry Douglas.



Martin Delray, "Get Rhythm" (Atlantic): With "Get Rhythm," Neobilly newcomer Martin Delray offers a musical combo plate that touches on several idioms within country's vast framework, be it a rousing rockabilly treatment of the Johnny Cash-penned title track or "The Very Thought of

You," which marries the heavy jazz influence of the late '60s to a solid vocal performance. Produced by Blake Melvis and Nelson Larkin, Delray also tosses off the pleasing "Who What Where When Why How" and "One In A Row."

Sawyer Brown, "Buick" (Curb/ Capitol Nashville): Sawyer Brown's been a high-energy act that entertained their fans. The formula: uptempo ditties balanced with big gut-busting ballads resulting in pure frenzy. "Buick" will accelerate the pandemonium generated by Mark Miller and Co. as they attack jumpers like "Supermar's



they attack jumpers like "Superman's Daughter," "Mama's Little Baby Loves Me," "When You Run From Love" and the title track. On the slower side, "The Walk" serves as a ponderous coming-of-age ballad.

Wilmi in New York was one of the few one-stops that mounted an aggressive pre-order campaign. Although there's no deal being offered on the song, Wilmi's Michael Smith says he is selling the cassette single at \$2.00 instead of his normal \$2.25 because "[I] don't need to make a lot of money on this title." Wilmi will ship all preorders before any new orders are fulfilled. Smith feels Whitney's version is "the new Kate Smith" and "could easily go to #1 even without heavy radio rotation." He thinks accounts downplaying the title will get caught short because "Whitney's people are going to see that she stays out in the forefront." Show Industries' Roger Dennis is concerned he is going to "blow out of [his] initial allocation well before the second shipment" and may never pick up the lost sales. Q

March 9. Choosing to describe herself with a Bob Dylan quote ("She never stumbles, she's got no place to fall"), Pat is one of the most respected and beloved individuals to receive this award.... All children's record companies should be aware of sales increases resulting from Radio AAHS, a 24-hour kids' station in Minneapolis. Down In The Valley has seen a rise of over 200% in children's music sales. Their new 4,000-square foot store has a large area devoted to children's product with an endcap featuring kiddle CDs. Even relatively unknown songs such as Joe Scruggs' "Bahamas Pajamas" and the Atomic Fireballs' "Kids Go Crazy" are getting requests. Just another example of why retailers should always listen and pay attention to their customers.... Ai!


