The Rembrandts have painted a masterpiece with their selftitled debut and the hit single, "Just The Way It Is, Baby," but after this HITS cover appearance, you might just call them "the boys in blue."



Nothing the industry likes better than to see new projects score at the cash register — even if they hate to see it in this rag.

This week's HITS Top 50 Albums chart shows exploding sales for two projects, one that debuted last week, Rod Stewart (WB), and one that jumps into the Top Ten for the first time, "New Jack City" (Giant), plus a host of newcomers doing big numbers. The New Jack project explodes 13-5 with MON-STER sales nationwide. Meanwhile, Rod's latest for the Bunny takes a massive 41-17 jump in only its second week, prompting Manager Arnold Stiefel to query: "How'd it do in Billboard?"

EMI's **Roxette** scores their first smash album, debuting at #20 behind massive breakout reports. The live **Rolling Stones** Columbia project hits at #22 to go along with labelmate **Bob Dylan**'s debut at #40.

Oozing in just behind Dylan is SBK's **Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles**, which debuts at #41 and is expected to climb sky-high, while the final debut at #50 belongs to Virgin's **Lenny Kravitz**, whose carryover base from his last project has combined with a strong Post Modern story to propel him onto the chart.

Virgin Records executives aren't mincing words as they react to a "false and deceptive packaging" suit filed by singer **Yvette Marine**, who is seeking credit and compensation for what she claims are her actual contributions to the **Paula Abdul** tracks "Opposites Attract" and "I Need You."

"It's sad that the quest for fame can lead people to be manipulated by lawyers and boyfriend/managers into furthering their careers by falsehoods," said label Co-Managing Director Jeff Ayeroff.

Marine's suit charges that she shares lead vocals with Abdul on "Opposites Attract" and "I Need You." According to Marine's interview with the Los Angeles Times, "I'm not saying Paula didn't sing. I just want credit where credit's due. We both sang lead and I feel Virgin ought to give me proper billing and pay me appropriately for my supporting vocals."

Marine claims that Virgin combined her lead "guide" vocal with Abdul's vocal track for the song's final mix. A fact, she claimed, was mis-

Virgin Records executives represented to the public as en't mincing words as they one voice.

> According to "Opposites Attract" composer and Producer **Oliver Leiber**: "I can personally state that the only lead voice appearing on that recording is that of Paula Abdul."

Producer **Glen Ballard** noted: "Paula sang every word, every line on the record I produced."

Marine explained to the Times why she waited this long to file a suit over a 1988 recording. "Initially, I got all caught up in the excitement of being associated with such a successful project. But when the thrill wore off, I thought, well, what can I do? How can a little singer in my position go up against such a big company?"

According to Virgin attorney Joseph Yanny: "This lawsuit is nothing more than an opportunistic attempt to extract money and/or a recording contract while holding Virgin Records' reputation and Paula Abdul's career hostage to bad faith litigation. It will not be tolerated."


Kids' Merch Is Alright

Warner Bros. Sr. VP Of Sales Lou Dennis is one of the most articulate and respected music men in the business. He's the kind of guy you'd like to hang out with at bars and around a cup of coffee just for the stories — and more than a little wisdom. Having started in the business in 1953 as a d.j. in Lewiston, Maine, Lou was hired by Charlie Goldberg at Jubilee/Cosnet Records in 1962; later that year, Dennis was tapped by Mark Ginsberg at Seaport Distributing to be his promotion man. In October of 1963, Lou moved to California to become regional coordinator for Chicago-based Smash Records. The following June, he found himself in Chicago as National Product Manager for Fontana Records, during which time they hit with "The Game Of Love," "A Groovy Kind Of Love" and that timeless anthem, "Winchester Cathedral." Dennis' mentor, Charlie



Fach, was promoted to New York and Lou took over as Product Manager at Fontana/Smash, which at that time was more like a GM gig. In September of '67, Lou came to Warner Bros. in N.Y. as East Coast Regional Sales Manager. "We had a small office on W. 44th St. near 8th Avenue — a real pleasant neighborhood!," he laughs. Dennis then headed to Burbank in '72, one year after the start of WEA, as Director Of Tape Operations, then National Singles Manager, then VP Of Sales in '76 and Sr. VP a few years ago. This quintessential music man, who does a daily radio-like broadcast to his sales troops, has impeccable taste in books and culture, which is a lot more than we can say for HITS' ULO (Unidentified Lumpy Object) Joe Medwick, whose idea of intellectual stimulation is doing the TV Guide crossword puzzle.

How did you first become attracted to the music business?

I wanted to be a disc jockey because I loved music. I went to broadcasting school for a few weeks and got a job in Lewiston. Maine just when radio was dying because television was coming! And because radio was dying at the network level, I kept getting more and more time to play music. It started with a half-hour show and pretty soon I was doing a two-to-five. I went to Waterbury, Connecticut in '55, where I did afternoons for the CBS affiliate. I worked at only three radio stations in my life: WCOU in Lewiston, and WVRY and WATR in Waterbury. I spent almost ten years doing that. Did you get much accomplished at NARM this year? Absolutely. It's a place to present some of your upcoming releases, and certainly a place to meet old friends and chat about what's happening. We don't really sell at NARM because obviously we put out records year-round. Some companies that sell accessories and surplus items probably do business there, but we really don't take orders. We're there to talk about what's coming and also to talk about what's happening in the business -- what accounts are feeling and so forth.

What was the key issue at NARM this year?

CD packaging, obviously. The industry has certainly been under pressure from many environmental groups and some of the acts about the 6x12 box. It's a big problem for both the record companies and the retailers. The retailers have a fixturing concern and we are faced with environmental pressure. More and more of us are going to have acts who come to us and say, you can't put my CD in the

6x12 box. It certainly would be much easier if we just said, to heck with the whole packaging thing and sell the CD like it's sold in the rest of the world. But that's not going to be easy to accomplish at this point, because of fixturing and so forth. We understand that you just can't wave a wand and expect things to change. There's a lot of money at stake and we're sensitive to that. That's why Henry [Droz] announced our support for the Eco-Pak at this year's convention. Obviously, we endorse the package 100%, which should be ready to roll out by April 1, 1992. What are the accounts

telling you about how business is coming out of NARM?

It's really too soon to tell what effect the war and the economy will have on their business. Frankly, I mostly talk to our people, and I don't see any real red flags up. Of course, the retail business in general is down. I think the recession in general, however, is a media event. But retail had a good holiday season.

Retail had a heck of a Christmas. There is no question about that. We had our best year in history. I think it was a little slow in coming. There were a great many people that were a bit nervous because it came later, but I think there is an explanation for that. I don't think people necessarily go out and buy albums when the Christmas selling season starts because they know that music is always going to be available. Whereas if you're buying sweaters or specialty items, the supplies don't last as long, so you have to shop earlier. Sometimes we make a mistake in saying, well if it didn't start the day after Thanksgiving, then it's going to be a terrible season. This has happened for the

last few years and it's always turned out to be a great season. What's surprising is that some of the places the media said were pretty hard hit — the northeast and New England and so forth — did absolutely sensational. How do you maintain your market share in competitive times? Music. It always comes

down to the music. I'm blessed because, when I came here in the '60s, Jimi Hendrix's "Are You Experienced?" and Arlo Guthrie's "Alice's Restaurant" were huge, and it seems like it's been the same from that time on! We have a special record company and we maximize what we do. I believe that most of the performers that are with us agree.

Can Album Radio still break new acts?

We have a classic example here in L.A, where an Album Radio station, KLOS, has broken Toy Matinee wide-open. Now if we could get everyone else in the country to do what they've done, we'd have a major record. So wouldn't discount Album Radio. They may not hav jumped on board early, but I think they've helpec groups like Faith No Mor-Jane's Addiction and certainly Guns N' Roses. It's kind of a strange time for radio right now because the population is getting

"m older and you have to hen I deal with that. Even bs, Jimi though I haven't been in Experituthsome time in that busines so I understand their

priorities. They have to have an audience to sell the time. Of course, we'd like to think our music wi help them get that audience. Depeche Mode is a classic example of an act which we've stayed with for a long time that now has platinum albums. How about MTV and VH MTV and VH-1 and the various video shows are also key. Today, you have so many more formats are outlets that help you bree

artists. There are a great many more radio stations and the competition is unbelievable. As it is for the record industry. The bulk of our businesses have grown and I like to think that we've helped each other.

æach other. How do you go about breaking critically-acclaimed, but difficult-tocategorize bands like Los Lobos, the Replacements, Texas Tornados, etc.? In the markets where they are touring, you make sure their music is avail-able in the stores and you make sure that you adver-tise them properly. You go for in-store play and get that point-of-purchase material up — the stuff Jim Wagner's people do such a good job at. This is not a business that revolves around one person. We have a huge organization here in Burbank, New York and Nashville - as well as all the wonderful people at WEA. They all make sure the job gets done. The secret of this

business is very simple take advantage of the opportunities. It's rapidly becoming a

It's rapidly becoming a HITS cliche, but every time we speak to somerone in the WEA organizartion, the word "family" comes up.

When Warner Bros. was rsmaller, it was easier, but

we still try to operate as a Family. Most of us have been together for a long time. That's a real factor. Someone who has only been around here for ten years is a newcomer! We've all worked together for a long time. WEA's George Rossi was the first person I met as a Warner employee. He was working at our indie distributor in Philly. I had to go to NARM in Lancaster, so I took a cab up to Broad Street and went in with my bags in my hands. I've known George Rossi since September of 1967! Henry Droz was our distributor, Fran Aliberte worked in our branch starting in the warehouse. As it turns out, Fran and I are from the same hometown near Boston. In fact, his dad used to be our insurance man! He's from Everett, Massachusetts, but I think his parents made it, so they moved to Malden! I didn't really know Fran then because, you know, he's a few years younger than me! So we've all been together a very long time. We all know what to do and we get it done. How are the various types of music worked at War-

ner Bros.? Everyone has their own areas, but the regional sales people talk about all of the music. Country has Vic Faraci and Neal Speilberg. Black has Earl Jordon and Jazz has Chris Jonz and so forth. But when we do a conference

call with the regional guys, we talk about all the music. To us, it's all equally important. As a matter of fact, I would love to see just one chart. I would love to see record stores be alphabetical. I think A to Z would be real easy. Hey man, it's all music! There are no rules, there's no checklist. This is far from being a science — you just do it!

What do you see as future growth areas?

We're aware of DCC [Digital Compact Cassette], which will be coming along at some point. What's interesting about that is, if you buy that new machine, you can also play your old tapes on it. Which should be kind of interesting. I'm not sure about DAT, but there are plenty of opportunities out there for growth and development. Who knows? They may put music on a matchbook. If they do, we'll put it out. I was at a meeting recently at Sound Warehouse and someone got up, held up a credit card and said they were going to put music on this. I'm sure they will. We're in the music business, so we'll release what people want to buy.

It's amazing what's happening right now with the growth of CD5. Also, CD sales have literally exploded. It happens every year in the first quarter. All those new CD machines kick in and, as you know, of them, it's obviously their first player. So you have a whole new group of software buyers. Our first three weeks of January were really unbelievable — catalog sales literally went through the roof. And we feel our catalog is second to none.

Is this stickering issue finally behind us?

I keep reading that some of these state legislators, who a year ago wanted to sticker things with that ridiculously large label, are not going away. There will always be a small group of people that make a great deal of noise. Unfortunately, it has created problems for us and our accounts. We've been labeling our records long before this, by the way -. T can remember Richard Pryor and Frank Zappa albums years ago that had stickers. This is nothing new to us. I do believe some of us are labeling things that we wouldn't have in the past, but I think the industry as a whole has more than done its job in these areas.

What keeps you enthusiastic about your job after 20 years?



AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH RALPH TRESVANT BY PASCALE LANFRANCHI

"I want to show people a guy who came from a rough part of town but, through family upbringing and music, made a good life for himself." So says Ralph Tresvant, the latest member of New Edition to take the solo trail. From a Boston project to the slick stylized settings of his latest video, "Stone Cold Gentleman," Ralph Tresvant certainly has managed to show people that not having a great head start in life doesn't mean you can't change the course of the future, which he carefully explained through a French interpreter to HITS' resident Can-Can girl, Mademoiselle Pascale Lanfranchi.

"I like being a solo artist better because it's a lot more personal."

You were born and raised in the Orchard Park development of Roxbury in Boston. How did that background affect your rise to stardom? It's given me a strong sense of determination to do something with my life, to make things better. I think the closeness of my family and the discipline my parents gave me has helped me out a great deal throughout my career and my life in general.

What was the transition like going from lead singer in New Edition to doing your own thing?

It was easy. Being up front in the group, it's almost as though you're doing the lead role anyway. All I had to do was add to it.

Why did it take you so long to launch your own solo career?

I wanted to get it right. I wanted to wait for the right producers and the right songs. Once I felt I had everything together, that's when I put my album out.

Since all the members of New Editon went solo, each of you has created a different image. What do you think yours is?

I consider myself a combination of all of them because we've all learned from each other. I'm a little bit like Johnny [Gill] because I enjoy being romantic at times. I like to do rap and hip-hop, so that's Bell Biv Devoe. And I have a rebel attitude from the roots we all grew up with, which is something I share with Bobby [Brown]. Then I have that wholesome message New Edition stood for. Put all of them together and you come up with Ralph Tresvant, the solo artist. Has everyone's individual solo success made the group grow apart? No, not really, because we're still a part of one another's projects. We do little odds and ends for each other. We'll always stay tight and together. We appear together on BET or on the MTV Awards to show people that this is still a family. We want to stay together as long as we can. You've been in this business for almost a decade. How does it feel to be a veteran at 22?

I feel real happy at this point. It seems like a lot of the learning and the work has been done. We're much more confident as a group because we've experienced some success. I feel like we know what we're doing now. You've certainly outgrown the teen idol image the media gave you in New Edition.

That image held us back a bit. I feel like I'm over that now and I'm moving on. I'm trying to show people what I'm into now as opposed to what I was into back then.

You worked with such hitmakers as Jimmy Jam & Terry Lewis and LA Reid and Babyface. What was that like?

I wanted them not because they had a string of hits on the radio. They're great producers who know how to get exactly what it is the artist is trying to get across. They helped me express myself.

In both "Sensitivity" and "Stone Cold Gentleman," you describe yourself as the perfect catch. I asked my producers how they

thought others saw me and that's how those two songs came about. I always considered myself laid-back, shy and soft-spoken. I'm not real outgoing and loud. Right now, I'm into romance, togethemess and a caring type of vibe. What's the main difference between being a solo artist and part of a group? As a solo artist, I get to say what's on my mind. I don't have to screen anything through four or five other people. It's also harder because as a group you can split up chores, but as a solo artist you have to handle everything by yourself. I like being a solo artist better because it's a lot more personal. What can we expect next from New Edition?

Anybody that has followed New Edition knows that we are not the type to slap something together. We'll get with professionals that know how to match everyone's talent. New Edition will probably be a combination of BBD, Johnny Gill, Ralph Tresvant and Bobby Brown.





Temple Of The Dog, "Temple Of The Dog" (A&M): Brought together by the untimely and tragic death of the singer of one of Seattle's most promising bands, these five musicians formed a band to exorcise their grief. The identity of these participants is irrelevant (gee, what Seattle band is on A&M?); what

transcends is an emphatic and gutwrenching album that captures the darkness of the tragedy through the catharsis of creativity."Say Hello To Heaven," "Pushin Forward Back" and "Wooden Jesus" will blow you away.

Rocky and Bullwinkle, "Blue Moose: Volume IV" (Buena Vista) : "Hey Rocky, watch me pull a rabbit out of my hat!" "Not again!" "Nothing up my sleeve...Presto!...Guess I gotta get me another hat!" In Volume IV, Bullwinkle learns he's heir to an enormous fortune due to a "Rue Brittania" birthmark, only



to be thwarted by Boris and Natasha. "Cleopatra" is paid a visit through Peabody's "Way-Back Machine," while the "Fractured Fairy Tale" reinvents the story of the Ugly Duckling. TIME FOR A CUP OF JOE AND A DOUGHNUT



EMF may sound like a hot new designer drug, but it's really the trendy alias of five young music-makers from England's remote Forest of Dean. In existence for less than a year, EMF delivered a cheerful blow to the moody Manchester wave with "Unbelievable," a hiphop rock single that has captured the charts and hearts of happy groovesters on both sides of the Atlantic. With a second single, "I Believe," already released in the UK and a debut album, "Shubert Dip," imminently due, EMF will have a chance to throw off the shackles of one-hit wonderdom and live up to the critical praise that has followed them from the old country. EMF's guitarist and main songwriter Ian Dench and drummer Mark Decloedt sat down and discussed their dizzying ride out of the woods to the top of the pops, with HITS' own dizzy dame, "Maraschino" Shari Roman.

What does EMF really stand for? Mark Decloedt: It used to stand for Epsom Mad Funkers, which was just a mad drinking crew. We'd have these wild parties and the next day, all these mad funkers would be drinking epsom salts to calm their stomachs. Ian Dench: We do sing "Ecstasy to my mind to my feet from us to you." It had a really good vibe about it. And we chanted."motherf***er, motherf***er," because it makes you feel real good. Some people think it stands for "Ecstasy Mother F***er," but it doesn't. Now it just stands for EME

You hail from such a remote locale. Is there such a thing as a music scene in the Forest of Dean? Mark: It is very different there,

very "Twin Peaks." At eleven o'clock at night, everything closes, so you have to go into the woods to get a fire going, dance and play music.

Iam: Music catches everybody's imagination. Ever since the Beatles, it seems everyone in England — every sort of working class person — has a guitar and plays in a band because it's the easiest career opportunity. For "Unbelievable," you

sampled Andrew Dice Clay? Mark: We wrote the song and sampled him saying, "It's unbelievable." We tried to phone him up to ask if we could clear it with him, but his secretary was messing about and couldn't get through to him.

Ian: I believe his dad manages him. All we could hear was, "Hey Dice, you there?" and he says, "Yeah, I'm in the bathtub." Mark: We heard he was performing next door to the hotel where we were staying, so our manager and manageress ran around to catch him while he's just driving out of the parking lot and they're banging on his window frantically like two mad Andrew Dice Clay fans. They're holding their EMF laminates and going, "Open up your window, we just want to clear a sample!" And he sticks his head out and says, "Sorry, I'm f**kin' outta here," and drives off the road a hundred miles an hour. I guess he just didn't want to know about it.

You've achieved an extraordinary amount of success in an extremely short time. What do you feel about people saying you're riding the coattails of the Manchester wave?

Mark: Our music is hard and energetic. It's not all laid-back and druggy like the Stone Roses or Happy Mondays. The Manchester scene is sort of about looking so miserable on stage, you look cool. Morrissey's droning says a great deal about Manchester. Ian: So many bands are doing this kind of genre — mixing rock and dance music — that I don't know how any group can claim they're the first. People passing opinions on us bothers us a bit. lesus lones likes to claim that EMF is the first clone band, but that's totally untrue. We wrote "Unbelievable" way before we even heard Jesus Jones. Actually, the band that's influenced us the most is Killing Joke.

Mark: We look half-decent and people think just because we go straight to the Top Ten that some record company co-wrote the songs, dressed you up and stuck you there. They don't realize we've played in bands from the age of ten and how much we've slogged it out over the years. Ian: We enjoy ourselves and people respond to that. I think that's the big difference.

AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH PAT BENATAR BY ROY TRAKIN

"True Love" represents a brand-new career direction for Pat Benatar. "I'm constantly looking for new things to do with my voice," she explains of the new album, which features her working out on classic blues and R&B songs, as well as several originals in the tradition co-written with husband Neil Giraldo. One listen to the LP should answer any questions about Benatar's ability to belt out bluesbusters like Wyonie Harris' "Bloodshot Eyes," B. B. King's "Payin' The Cost To Be The Boss" and "I've Got Papers On You," Albert King's "I Get Evil," Big Maybelle's "So Long" and the three new cuts composed by her, Giraldo and bandmate Myron Grombacher. Toss in the accompaniment of Roomful of Blues and you've got yourself a delightful surprise package. It's quite a jump for the former multi-Grammy award winning rock singer, but not nearly the risk she took in talking with HITS' own Bilnd Lemon Jefferson fan, Roy Trakin.

Why did you decide to do this kind of record at this point in time?

When I first sat down to do this next album, it was going to be a rock record. We had 35 songs written and we were just about to go in and cut it. But I just didn't feel like doing another rock record. Neil had been talking to me for years about doing another kind of thing, like a jumpblues album. He's always wanted to do a blues record; it's his whole life. I listen to those records, too, and love them, but loving it and doing it are two different things.

Of course, my roots are in classical music and musical theater, but that's the closest I've come to singing that kind of stuff. I used to sing in cabarets and clubs all those years, but that's whitebread compared to this. I have been listening to this kind of music for 12 years now, so I guess it subliminally sunk in. It wasn't like I sat there and listened to every single lick, though. This isn't supposed to be a contemporary blues album. I wouldn't be pretentious enough to think that. Just being a fan and loving the music all those years, something has stuck.

Were you fed up with rock?

I just really didn't think I could go out and cut another rock record. Most of it was wanting to do something else. It wasn't comfortable. But I'm never happy rehashing things anyway. I just didn't know where I was going with that genre of music. It would have been a mistake to record another rock album. I was interested in another challenge. My whole thing in life is singing. That's all I care about. And I'm not happy staying in one place. I don't look at this as a career move, though. It's just a left-hand turn. Don't think the next record will sound like this, either. Maybe it will, but maybe it won't. It's like Meryl Streep. Just get in there and learn a new accent.

You've also cleaned house in terms of your management. You're now being handled by Danny Goldberg.

The decision to do that came while we were on the last tour. Even when we made the last record, everyone knew it would be the last one like that. Artistically, I felt stagnant, but it didn't have as much to do with the music as with the routine. You really sound as If you're having fun on the record.

I'm having a great time. We've whittled away the excess, just like we have in our lives, which are very simple. It works for me.

You change the genre on songs like "Don't Happen No More," which gives them a tonguein-cheek edge.

That's the way those songs are. They're slice-oflife songs. No fooling around. Nothing cerebral. Just get down to the point. And that's what I'm interested in. I've got no time for this other shit. **How do you think your fans will react?** The die-hards might pause for a second, but you can't deny these songs.

You're certainly taking a risk.

You have to live your life. I come back when I can and hope for the best. I mean, what can you do? It's not my style to calculate. I genuinely don't care. I'm happy doing it the way I'm doing it and I hope you are, too.

The album doesn't seem to slavishly imitate those old records, but manages to update the idiom.

We didn't want to make a retro record. We wanted to make a modern blues record, like Jimmie and Stevie Ray Vaughan, consisting of

great old songs. If you're a rock & roll fan, and you don't know and love this music, you're not getting the whole picture. Because this is where it all comes from.

How different is the vocal style from the way you sing rock?

Like night and day. Phrasing is in another time signature. And that's the hardest thing. You're always bending the notes. I told Neil, if he picked any more B.B. King songs for me to do. I was going to divorce him. B. B. doesn't sing in regular time. He's from another planet. It was a real stretch for me, which is what was so great about it. But I'd hate to think I was an expert. There's not enough time in this life to learn the things I need to know. This was a real learning experience for me. It really pushed my voice and musicianship. It should embellish everything I do from now on and add depth to what we write. We're not just locked into what we know. And that's what interests me. It's not like sitting there and knowing what you're going to do next. Tell me about the first single and title track, "True Love."

I wanted a song that was real sultry, but modern, too. Bluesy, but with a female edge. The very first

line in the song is, "Never been no fragile flower." I can't let that feeling go. It's part of my being. That aggression is part of my life that won't go away. And I wanted a song to reflect that. Since we couldn't find one like it, I figured the next best thing to do was to write one ourselves. It's what I wanted to say. There's a line in there that goes, "I called the man at the video store and said, 'Cancel my membership!'" and I can just see women across America going, "Yes!!" And that's the point. You take your experience and interpretation and apply it.

This blues record is something Neil has wanted to do for a long time?

He always wanted to, just not necessarily with me. He never thought I'd go for it. He never even asked me. It just evolved. He told me to try it because I could do it. I thought he was out of his mind. These people have done it all their lives; it's in their blood. It wasn't scary, but it was hard.

The important things to me are being true to yourself and what you believe in and expressing that. I've been given a gift from God and you should do the best you can with it. Every little thing you do entails a choice. You can do it in a self-serving manner or you can do it for the good of everyone. That's kind of why I don't fit into the whole rock & roll thing. But I believe there are a lot of people who feel the same way I do.

The only thing I like about this business is singing. They can keep the rest. I'm not interested. I could be a lot more successful, but I don't want to be. The cost is too high. I'm very happy right now. I'm a lucky woman. I've got a husband I'm still in love with after all these years and a beautiful daughter. That's what I feel this record is about — being positive and happy for what you've got.

What was it like working with Roomful of Blues? That was it for me. Just to have that genuine swing feel happening. Because this is the kind of music they play and it's all they play. And you know, when that light goes on in the studio, you just go, "Alright! I've got this!" And they were all wondering if I could sing it. After we sang that first number, [Roomful of Blues tenor sax-player] Greg [Piccolo] came over to me and went, "I didn't know you could, like, do this!" And I said, "Me, either." This is like doing my first record. But the process of discovery is more important for me than actually getting to the final destination. I understand you're planning to tour with them. We really need to get that genuine thing. We've already played these songs in front of audiences a couple of times. If there are negative things around, it keeps the music earthbound, and that's what was happening. I'm not interested in being earthbound. I have enough earthbound in my life. I wanted to do something uplifting and positive.

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AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH CINDERELLA BY SHARON LIVETEN



Ince the release of their debut album, "Night Songs," power poppers Cinderella have had several hit singles and sold more than three million records. Who are these guys? The group's third and latest album, "Heartbreak Station," should finally make the band household names. The record has its share of bluesy rockers, but it also boasts some country-styled stuff, a coupla power ballads, and a smash hit single in the propulsive "Shelter Me." That's what matters most to singer/songwriter/guitarist Tom Kelfer. He may not be as wellknown as some of his peers, but the soft-spoken New Jersey native (the band got its deal with a lot of help from labelmate Jon Bon Jovi) is far more articulate and direct than most, a style that completely went over the head of HITS' own metal-addied leather queen Sharon "Wanted Dead Or A" Liveten.

"Heartbreak Station" Is

radically different for you. The situation we're in now is pretty similar to when the last album came out. Nobody knew what to do with that one, either. It was like everybody was asking, "Where are these guys going?" Well, we took it even further this time. The more I write, the more I try not to be inhibited by it. I really try to stay away from locking into one style or genre.

Does that allenate your hard-core fans or freak out the record company?

It shouldn't. I think this is a heavy blues rock & roll album. There is more acoustic music on this album --- which might take some people by surprise ---but it's all really earthy kinds of stuff. It's all from the roots of rock & roll, It's not like we're going off into some jazz thing that has nothing to do with rock & roll. It's all roots. There are a lot of things you can do, so that's what we're doing. We're trying to explore the boundaries of the music. Some of the people in the industry think that once you have something that's successful, you should literally stick with that sound, because they're afraid that fans are unable to accept any kind of change. I think

that's wrong. Music lovers are music lovers.

You're not as well-known as a lot of bands that sell a lot fewer records than you do. Does that plss you off? It used to bother me, but it bothers me less and less now. The longer I do this, the more I realize what's important. What's important is that we're happy with the music that we make, and that our fans are happy. Other than that, it doesn't matter. It really doesn't. I don't really care about the Grammys or the critics or anything else. That's all bullshit. What's real is the band and the fans. If the fans like your music, who cares what anybody else says?

You took a long time to record this album. Why? We like to take our time. We don't look at the clock or the budget. We probably spend a lot more time and a lot more money making records than most bands of our genre. I hear bands talking about making records in six weeks. We could never do that. We are in there to create, and you can't put time or financial constraints on creating. If we can make a record that we're satisfied with in six weeks, then we will make it in six weeks. If it takes six months, then it takes six months. That's really how we approach it. When it's done, it's done. It seems more and more that recording is not seen as an art form. It's sort of "get in, get it done and get it out." That's sad, and we won't work that way.

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AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH JERRY DEAN BY DANNY OSTROW

Have you created a monster in **Jay Taylor?**

Well, I did teach him everything I know, which in the case of Jay, took all of three minutes. Actually, about eight years, which is how long we worked together. I'm really happy for him and I think he'll do a great job down there. Just remember one thing. Before he hooked up with me, he was nothing, and now he's got a PD job at a large radio station.

What direction is the Nationwide chain going in?

One of the nice things about Nationwide as opposed to some other chains is that they let the individual stations determine their own destiny. It's obvious our Mix stations are doing well, but at the same time, there has never been a commandment that all the stations in the chain have to sound like Houston or Orlando, KLUC is a pretty straight-ahead Top 40, while KRQ and KZZP are their own kind of Top 40s. As far as the chain goes, they've just purchased a new station in Dallas. They are looking to acquire stations in major markets, which I believe is the way to go. As far as the individual stations go, it's always been whatever wins in your market. And that's refreshing. It's a very healthy attitude. Las Vegas seems to be a unique market.

No doubt about it. People have stereotypes of Vegas and those are formed by coming in for a few days, gambling and partying on the Strip, then leaving. But those of us who are locals and have lived here a few years are sensitive to that image. It's a very nice town and a very exciting town to live and do radio in. By virtue of being next door to a lot of major entertainment venues, we've had people drop in on our morning show you'd never get in Omaha, Indianapolis or Des Moines. We've had everyone from Jay Leno and Jerry Lewis to Joe Namath, Cher and, of course, Moe Green. What's the wildest thing you've seen since you've been here? The first time my parents came to visit, we took them downtown, which is

north of the Strip. I'm showing off all

Jerry Dean was literally born on a naval base in Maryland, then was raised on the corn fields of Iowa. He attended the University of Iowa in Iowa City, then secured his first radio job at KCII in Washington, Iowa. His first on-air gig was at KMNS in Sioux City, Iowa, and his first PD job was at WAAY in Huntsville, Alabama. He segued as PD to KQKQ in Omaha, Nebraska, before landing at KLUC in the City That Never Sleeps, Las Vegas, as programming chief. these famous sites to my folks when we stop at an intersection. While we're waiting for the light to change, a derelict proceeded to walk up to our car and relieve himself on the door. My mother thought that was very in-

teresting. Needless to say, we drove directly to the car wash. Let's talk about your audience make-up.

Mostly Max Factor. No, seriously, it's very hard when you're in a resort area to take your attention away from the parts that aren't real. So we concentrate on the locals, the people that are here and listen to KLUC every day. The ideal KLUC listener would probably be a 25-year-old woman who's a secretary or maybe has a job in one of the casinos, likes to go out and party, dresses hip and feels music is an important part of her life. The point is, our target demo is no different than any other dance station in the country. Outside of the Strip, the city of Las Vegas is no different than any other growing city in America. It's the fastest growing city in the country, with over 4,000 people moving here every month. That's who we're trying to reach. What about the town's ethnic demographics?

We're getting more and more Hispanics all the time. The black percentage is just below 10% and that's lower than you think it would be. But it's still influential. The urban-leaning records work very well here and that's really the station's signature sound. So far it's been successful, so I see no reason to change.

What are the advantages to living in Las Vegas?

You can eat out here for practically nothing and the cost of living is very reasonable. You can get a fantastic house for \$100,000. I would also say the economy is probably in better shape than it is in other cities of comparable size.

Do you have anything else to say for yourself?

One of the things I'm concerned with, having been in the business 20 years, is where the new PDs are going to come from. We see a solid example in Jay Taylor, who worked very hard as a d.j., then MD, and now he's a PD. I'd like to see that happen more often. After he left, I got so many T & Rs from people that weren't qualified, it made me think. Are we training the MDs and PDs of tomorrow? I don't think we're doing a good enough job of it. As PDs, we have to direct people, find out what they want out of their radio careers and then help them attain those goals.


