Forever Her Vocals

In a hastily called press conference, Paula Abdul and Virgin Co-Managing Director Jeff Ayeroff angrily refuted back-up singer **Yvette** Marine's claims her vocals were used as leads on three songs from the smash "Forever Your Girl" album.

"I want my fans to know what they heard on my album is what they paid for," said a visibly riled Paula. "And I will not let this annoying incident get in the way of all the big wonderful things which are about to happen."

Ayeroff insisted, "Virgin Records has not deceived anyone. We could no longer stand by and watch Paula Abdul's career held hostage by a media circus. It's like Mel Gibson's stunt double asking for half his fee on 'Lethal Weapon'."

The label produced documents from University of California musicologist Dr. Frederic Lieberman, whose analysis confirmed Paula was "responsible for the predominant sound of the lead vocals on the CD as released."

According to Epic's **Polly Anthony**, who is also winning with Gloria and Firehouse: "Does Joel Denver like the record?" We hope so.

Record producer Beau "Knows Music" Hill, who has ordered pizza into the studio for the likes of Warrant, Ratt and Winger, has joined Interscope Records as a partner to discover and develop talent as well as call out for a pie in the by-and-by. The announcement was made by the label's Ted Field and Jimmy lovine and accompanied by a screaming ten-minute guitar solo.

The Dallas, Texas-born Hill started out as a performer in bands like Airborne and Shanghai, then was a solo artist before realizing the error of his ways and becoming a producer. In 1983, he produced Ratt's debut album, which sold more than 3 million copies, despite the fact the band is made up of complete geeks. He just finished working on **Europe**'s forthcoming record.

Commented Hill: "I see Interscope as music-driven — a place where people who are record-makers, who understand music and have a very

comprehensive overview of all aspects that go into an artistic, creative and marketable commodity, are running the company." (Translation: "Top 40 programmers are only playing dance tunes; I better cop a label gig fast.")

Around The Horn

While many bemoan a lack of MTV power, the strength of two current MTV-led projects quickly disproves the theory. It was MTV and MTV alone propelled Queensryche's "Silent Lucidity" (EMI) into the spotlight. They single-handedly took this cut and made it so big that Top 40 radio received massive crossover calls, forcing them to deal with a sixminute cut by a band they never before even considered playing. A similar story has occurred with Def. American/Reprise's Black Crowes, a band the video channel has supported for the past year (and broke wide-open during their earlier Geffen distribution deal). MTV has ignited this album into the national Top Ten, where it has resided for all of 1991, by playing three videos in heavy rotation. Now, with the ballad "She Talks To Angels," they have forced Top 40's hand again as it heads for the higher reaches of the singles chart..... Indie labels are having a great year, with Quality's Timmy T, Next Plateau's Salt-N-Pepa, Profile's DJ Quik Select's Chubb Rock leading the way. The market for street records has always existed, and radio is finding a massappeal audience exists on some of this product..... The latest from the Kentucky Headhunters (PolyGram) is

doing massive business and heading for the national pop Top 20..... Hats off to both floors at Sony for sensational promotion efforts on Michael Bolton (Columbia) Luther Vandross (Epic). Killer records combined with great set-ups did the trick..... New labels are getting on the map, as both Charisma with Enigma and Giant with New Jack City have Top Ten albums.... Motown's Another **Bad Creation** is bigger than you think..... Sales on the With **Wolves Dances** soundtrack (Epic) keep going up. This could be Chariots Of Fire all over again if the single pops..... Interesting that Roxette (EMI) now has album sales to match its singles success..... Wonder if the Extreme single (A&M) marks the dawning of a new world at Top 40. Many are comparing it to Lennon/Mc-Cartney, others to the Everly Brothers. In any case, it's a non-dance, non-rap active smash. Yes, there is such a thing..... R.E.M (WB), Divinyls (Virgin) and Jesus Jones (SBK) prove conclusively that there is life in Post Modern.... And, speaking of Top 40, is anyone in the universe getting more spins than C&C Music Factory? The biggest problem we hear is, "When can we take 'Sweat' out of A rotation so we can move 'Here We Go' in?"

AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH

PAULA ABDUL


Paula Abdul lets out a sigh of relief. The ordeal of having to defend herself in front of the ravenous media hordes against a former back-up singer's charges the two shared vocals on three tracks on Abdul's 7.5-million-selling "Forever Your Girl" is over. We leave the paparazzi and the TV cameras in the dust to go to the new Hollywood Canteen restaurant for an exclusive tête-a-tête with the former Lakers cheerleader and choreographer turned recording superstar.

The 28-year-old San Fernando Valley-raised daughter of a Brazilian-Syrian father and a French-Canadian mom was visibly upset and angered by the accusations, though she is not specifically charged in the law suit, which is leveled at Virgin Records. She won't allow the whole brouhaha to overshadow what she calls "the big, wonderful things that are about to happen," meaning the release of her long-awaited second album, "Spellbound." The record is slated to come out in May, preceded by the first single, "Rush Rush," a

ballad penned by Peter Lord who, along with V. Jeffrey Smith and Sandra St. Victor of the band Family Stand, coproduced and co-wrote eight of the tracks on the LP.

The album offers proof that Paula is not just another dance artist. There are two other mid-tempo numbers on the record in the charming "Will You Marry Me?" and the orchestral "Blowing Kisses In The Wind," as well as a Don Wasproduced cover of a song written especially for her by John Hiatt, "Alright Tonight." Of course, there are the expected dance-floor smashes, including the Prince-penned "U" and the sassy "Rock House," in which she raps, "For the critics on my jock — Shut up and dance!" If the nay-sayers needed any convincing that Paula Abdul can sing, they need look no further than "Rush Rush," which demonstrates her vocals have greatly matured and begun to take on a character all their own. In addition, she's planning her very first headlining tour, a practically year-long global jaunt which will culminate with a possible stint on Broadway.

So it was a very forthcoming, very sincere and very vulnerable Paula Abdul who agreed to break bread with HITS' own resident background Senior Editor Roy Trakin, who stopped chewing long enough to nod in agreement.



Absolutely. Why the heck should I have to deal with this? But I just couldn't sit back and take it because my silence was hurting the situation. I owed it to my fans and to myself to speak out the second I heard about it. But my management and record company convinced me not to. It was only when they went to the press with their case that I had to get involved.

It does seem like a naked ploy to wait three years and then drop this bombshell three weeks before your new album is to be released.

I just think it's important for the people who voted me the "People's Choice" award to know there's no way, in any shape or form, that I would allow myself to be discredited or let them down. It's important to me. I'm a hard worker to a fault. And this is a slap in the face. At first I laughed about it because it was so ludicrous, but when I saw what was happening, it's no laughing matter.

Still, you don't have any compunctions about using "augmented" vocals in a live situation.

I'm a visual artist. I've worked with my musical director to change keys on certain songs, dropping them down so that when I'm out of breath dancing, I don't have to go for that high note. When this controversy first hit other artists, I never disputed the fact that I had some background vocals programmed into a machine. You can't sit there and expect the same vocals you hear on the album when you're singing and dancing on-stage. Every other performer in the genre does the same thing.

Does this controversy threaten to overshadow the release of the new album?

I honestly believe, in my heart, that when my single comes out, it's going to blow over this entire situation. I'm coming out on this album stronger than ever before. I've worked my butt off on this. And I'm so proud and excited about it. My fans will understand.

So it doesn't really matter what the media thinks, then.

There are things I can't control, such as what the media or the critics will say, but it's my responsibility to be honest and truthful and to stand up for what I believe

is true. And to let my fans know I'm not going to let them down.

You're a throwback to the allaround entertainers who sing, dance and put on a show. You came out of being a choreographer and dancer. Do you consider yourself a strong vocalist? I agree it's more the whole package with me. But I'm very proud of my vocals now. I've worked so hard on them. Coming into this business, people mostly knew about me as a successful choreographer/dancer. Moving to the front as a singer, I've been adamant about continuing to improve and grow. And that goes for choreography and dancing, too. It doesn't just stop because I've gotten all these awards. The singing has been the most rewarding area for me. I have really built the muscle and strength in my vocals. I'm more and more confident. I

take singing lessons every day.

How different an experience
was it making this new record?
On "Forever Your Girl," there
weren't really the expectations
to deal with you have now.

There were no expectations, but I did have to put up with the stigma of being "some choreographer trying to make it as a pop singer." And guess what? I did. But that's the way this society is. You have to prove yourself and God forbid you're a well-rounded entertainer. Growing up, the people I idolized were the Shirley MacLaines, the Judy Garlands, the Fred Astaires, the Gene Kellys. In order to be a star back in those MGM days, you had to be an all-around entertainer. You had to excel in every area to be a star. That's why sometimes I feel as if I was born in the wrong era. But I'm glad I'm able to bring back that

tradition in a pop sense. It's a struggle, but it's becoming more accepted that you don't just act or sing or dance, but do all of them.

What kind of image will you have on the new album?

The first single is a ballad, "Rush Rush," which is not the norm for Paula Abdul. People are expecting some slammin' dance tunes. Which I have, too, but I was so excited when I received this song, which was written for me over a year and a half ago by the Family Stand, who ended up doing eight tracks on the album. I co-wrote four songs with them and they co-produced a song that Prince wrote for me, "U." Coming out with a ballad is the total antithesis of what people are expecting. I think the song shows so much integrity, depth, strength and vulnerability, too. There was something magic that happened with it. I laid down a scratch vocal for it not intending it to be the final version, but when I sat down with it for a few days with them, we decided not to touch it, because there's a raw quality to it we didn't want to ruin.

It's the perfect response to what's going on now with this law suit, that's for sure.

And it wasn't even planned that way.

How did you come to meet the

How did you come to meet the guys in Family Stand, Peter Lord and V. Jeffrey Smith?

They're from Brooklyn. They had done a couple of tracks for a new group on Virgin called Aftershock. I heard these tracks and some cuts from their own album, which was coming out on East West, and fell in love with them. I was blown away. I am so happy for them because they will now get their just due. They'll get credibility as both artists and producers from this.

Did you take more control of things this time around in the studio?

I went into this album with the luxury of not having the pressure of a deadline. I had time to get a strong rapport going with these people. And that's the basis of a successful collaboration. I really got to bring out the elements I wanted, the songs I wanted to sing, the lyrics I wanted to contribute, the song titles I wanted. I wanted to be more involved with this record from a creative standpoint. I wanted to grow as an artist. I wanted to have input and I wanted to write as

well. And the guys in Family Stand were very willing to work with me like that. It started with "Rush Rush" and continued on another song, "My Foolish Heart." I never planned on having them on practically the whole album. But I kept loving what they came up with. And the ballads. I'd been wanting to sing ballads all along.

How did the Prince track, "U," come about?

Prince had contacted me and said he wanted to write some material for me. The very first song he contributed we used. The song he delivered was just cool, and we all really loved it. He had no qualms about having the Family Stand produce it, either. He came into the studio and overdubbed some guitar on it. He's really a nice guy. He was fun to be with. He wanted to hear some of the other tracks and was so impressed, he kinda punched me in the arm and went, "Sister, you singin' yer butt off on this album!" I must say, I had so much fun making this album I was in tears when it was over. It was a wonderful experience. Of course, it's over and it's just begun. Now comes the hard part.

Don Was also produced some tracks?

Don produced a couple of tracks. One of them is a song John Hiatt wrote for me called, "Alright Tonight." There's also a song I did with Don that will only be on albums outside the States, as well as on the "Pediatric Aid" album. It's a lullabye written by Jesse Belvin called "Goodnight My Love."

When you're beginning to work on individual songs in the studio, do you think about what the accompanying choreography might be?

A lot of the stuff you'll see on my tour was envisioned while I was behind the microphone singing the songs. Different colorations.

You talk about being a "dance" artist. This is a record that proves you're more than that.

That's what I'm all about. As soon as everyone expects me to turn right, I turn left. It's important you don't stagnate creatively.

Do you feel dance artists are somehow not given respect by the industry and the media?

They're not the critics' choice. But fortunately, they end up being the people's choice.



Tell me about the track, "Will You Marry Me?"

I presented the idea to the Family Stand and at first they thought it was kinda corny, but when we began talking about it, we realized there really hasn't been a song like this. It's about the girl having enough courage to ask the guy to marry her. Stevie Wonder does an incredible harmonica solo on it. I just think this will be one of those classic songs that girls are gonna request on the radio and that'll get played at people's weddings.

The Diet Coke commercials have also made you very visible and helped turn you into a pop icon. Do you feel compromised by endorsing a product?

I don't see anything wrong with it. I mean, I drink Diet Coke. I don't find it in any way, shape or form offensive. But I respect the opinions of people like Tracy Chapman and Neil Young who speak out against doing them. For certain artists and their style of music, it makes sense. For example, I would never sell one of my songs for a commercial. I've been asked to, but I don't believe in it. I don't feel that's right. What's the tour going to be like? It's all my dreams and efforts coming to fruition in one big event. It's gonna be a visual feast, an extravaganza. I'm going to take it even further visually than people like Madonna and Janet Jackson. After I tour the States and the rest of the world, I'm going to take it to a theater on Broadway. I start touring at the end of August for four months, take some time off for the holidays, then to Japan, Canada, Australia, Europe and back to the

States for a short time before the Broadway run.

What's happening on the motion picture front?

I've got development projects with both Universal and Disney for my film debut.

What kind of film would you like to do?

I don't want to play myself. For my first project, I want to co-star. I want a good support system. I want to be surrounded by a great cast and a great director. I want to work in an ensemble. I don't want all the weight to be on my shoulders.

Fame seems to be a mixed blessing, but it's still better to be famous than not, isn't it?

I love what I do. I love every aspect of it. I don't like this part. But the most gratifying thing is to do what you want to do and get back that fan appreciation. Knowing that you're giving the people and receiving in return. With any success, you have to weather the storm and take the hard knocks, too. That's the high price of fame and success — dealing with that. But that's such a small part in comparison to the big picture. What about the loss of privacy? That stinks. I kinda wish it weren't that way, but it is.

On another subject entirely, are the Lakers going all the way this year?

I sure hope so. I've hardly been able to go to any games, but they're really good to me at the Forum. When this new album comes out, they want to retire my Laker Girl uniform and hang it from the rafters next to Wilt Chamberlain's and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar's.

Do you have any time at all for a social life? You've been linked to a lot of famous people, like Dolph Lundgren, Eddie Murphy, John Stamos and Arsenio Hall. Who are you seeing now?

I'm trying, but it's hard. It's really hard. I feel like I'm a very accessible kind of girl. The hardest thing for any guy who tries to get involved with me is to understand the passion I have for my career. And to understand the importance of it. My work comes first, but I'm very good at working in other elements in my life and making them equally as important. So, there's hope. I want a relationship. I eventually want to settle down and have two or three kids.

Adam Kaplan, Director of Marketing & Sales, Mute Records:

I lived directly upstairs from Ivana years ago, long before she could even spell L.A., in Hoboken. Though I think back on these days as her "humble beginnings," she has more than once referred to them as "days spent slumming it with second-rate babes in a third-rate horse town." When she moved, she assured me that it was not a matter of moving on, but selling out and growing up, but I digress.

Ivana was responsible for my entry into the music biz, and setting up my first job interview, coaching me how to impress the BIG BOYS at Celluloid, and gently assuring me that my interest in leaving my job teaching retarded

remember which way it worked) as the base upon which my career has been built.

Which I guess brings me to my point. Ivana has been a model of consistency throughout her career at HITS, one that I can constantly look to for auidance from afar (sometimes very afar, I guess she didn't get the message I called) to keep my path straight and true. It's the way she grows up in print, sells out in public. moves on at shows, grows up all over again at a trade convention, only to bowl you over and knock you down by selling-out in a one-on-one meeting. The mind reels at how she does it, and so well. without ever getting bogged down by issues as mundane and unimportant as morality. I guess her secret is that I never really have understood what she is talking about. But it doesn't bother me. because the way I look at it, if she doesn't, why should I?

Todd Bisson, National **Promotion Manager** Alternative Music. Columbia:

My first impression of her was "complete bitch." She was supposed to get me tickets to see UB40 and she was strung out on caffeine and some drug which at this point I can't remember and was standing off in a corner acting paranoid when all she was supposed to say was, "OK, your name will be on the quest list." Ivana was equally responsible for me getting my job in a pool of about four people, but certainly not exclusively. To know Ivana is to know that she sees herself as the center of the universe and one of the

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

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DOUGHNUT JOE AND ITH TAD BY DARIO SCARDAPANE

Tad is not Jim Morrison. Morrison was heavy, Tad's fat. Morrison crooned, Tad belches. He's a big boy with a real big sound — kind of like a Mack truck with a speed-freak hick at the wheel screaming down some interstate in Middle America. In fact, one of the songs on Tad's most recent album, "8-Way Santa," is about a wired truck driver. Anyway, Tad the band came about when Tad Doyle — a 300-pound ex-butcher from Boise, Idaho who grew up on equal parts Sonny & Cher, Black Sabbath and Herb Alpert — fled to Seattle and hooked up with bassist Kurt Danielson and quitarist Gary Thorstensen. After finding the perfect sonic meltdown of grunge, punk and metal, they stormed the offices of Seattle's indie label, Sub Pop Records. From there, they've put out a few EPs, done some tours and drank an incredible amount of beer. "8-Way Santa" marks a high point in the band's history, being one of Sub Pop's biggest sellers and an underground critical success. It's a hell of an album, full of trailer park sensibilities and noisy chords. Sitting down with the band for numerous pitchers one cloudy day, HITS' fellow Seattle native Dario Scardapane "In The Butt" found out he shared a lot in common with Tad — including a love of whisky, pornography, a sense of humor and a buttload of volume.



How would you describe your music?

Kurt Danielson: That's a weird question. We tend to deny that we're heavy metal just because it's so easy to get thrown into that heap. Not that we have anything against heavy metal. There's good and bad heavy metal. I think we have more of a punk rock attitude. And our songs tend to be a lot simpler than a lot of heavy metal.

Kurt, I hear you and Tad have your own porn show on cable access, sort of the "Siskel & Ebert" of dirty movies.

Kurt: It's been a life-long dream of ours. Tad Doyle: Well, we were bored and a friend of ours works at the local cable company. So we threw together a couple hundred bucks and we've shot about six episodes, of which three have been shown so far. We review porno movies. And then there's the occasional "guest" people like Amber Lynn, because she lives up in Vancouver. We're trying to go after the older

porn stars, the ones that don't take off their clothes anymore but are trying to get on with their lives.

What's the worst place Tad's ever played?

Kurt: Definitely Paris.

Tad: I mean, you travel half way around the f***in' globe to go to the cuisine capital of the world and they give you rice and beans for dinner. Shitty frog food. The promoter caught on that we were upset about it and said he'd order out for pizza. We figured, "Oh cool. We're gonna get something good to eat." So, it comes back and what did it have on it?

Kurt: F***in' tunafish.

Tad: Tuna and anchovies. We ended up throwing it c., me walls.

There's a song on the new album, "Jack Pepsi," which recounts the time you and a buddy sank his dad's truck into a lake.

Tad: I was 22, old enough to know better and

drunk enough not to care. After we sank the car, there were serious problems. I never went back to my friend Jack's house after that happened. It was soft ground because it was an irrigation lake and they couldn't get a crane out there. They had to hire divers to find it. Once they found it, his old man had to hire National Guard helicopters to f***in' hook it up, pull it out and dump it on the road. It was very, very costly. The county made him do it. They wouldn't let him leave it there.

How did you go from living in Boise to playing the kind of music you're doing now?

Tad: Because I was out in the middle of nowhere, I would hear strange noises and music in my head that led me around like a carrot in front of me. The same way vagina juices make glam guys poof their hair, carrots make me want to play nasty music. That's just the way it is.

Tell us why MTV rejected your video for "Wood Goblins."

Tad: One of the things they said was the singer was "unpleasant looking." We had knives, chain saws, alcohol abuse, explosions, gasoline and paint sniffing in it.

Kurt: Man, there's nothing quite like sniffing paint, you know. I guess it just wasn't up to MTV standards.

Gary Thorstensen: It's not like we're just out to shock because one man's shock is another man's lip balm.

The band seems pretty heavy into the white trash aesthetic.

Tad: Yeah, but we're not some farm boys from Bumf**k, Ohio who decide they're going to move to L.A., become a glam band, buy a Marshall and a Kramer, get their hair stacked up and wear leather pants. Most of those jackasses are from that type of background but they deny it totally.

Tad, is it true you were a butcher?

Tad: I was a butcher for five years. I did some slaughterhouse work for a couple of weeks and that was pretty gross. I worked on the offal table. That's where you pull out the guts. Big ol' f***in' ten-inch steak knives right up the gut. The guvs who've been there like ten years are twisted. They'd wrap towels around band saws, put their hands on it and say, "Alright, turn it on." Shit like that. There were guys who'd drink liver tubs full of blood just to freak people out. We used to have liver fights. Which is great because they come in long sheets and they fly and stick all over your face. Meat frisbee.

Is there anything earth-shaking you want the world to know?

Kurt: If you ever come to see us, smoke us out after the show.

Tad: I got a part in Cameron Crowe's new movie. I'm a wrong number.

Is it true that you have to be totally wasted to appreciate a TAD show?

Kurt: It helps take away the pain. Hey, that guy at the next table is about to puke.

Tad: (Yells at waiter.) Let him puke man! Hey, I hear vomit stains are really hard to get out of a velvet jacket!

Kurt: L.A. is totally surreal.

TIME FOR A CUP OF JOE AND A DOUGHNUT WITH STAMEY & HOLSAPPLE BY LANCE LOUD

TO BORTO B

In the early '80s, Chris Stamey and Peter Holsapple were Lower Manhattan's Post-Mod answer to Lennon & McCartney. The gloriously catchy pop which these two lifelong friends from Winston-Salem, North Carolina created with their band the dBs featured strong melodies, sharp lyrics and adenoidal vocal harmonies set into a wide variety of ear-catching musical styles. On the strength of the group's first two highly acclaimed, import-only LPs, the dBs became known among pop afficionados as one of the premier groups of the underground scene at the time. But like many musical contingents collared as "critics' darlings," this reputation did not automatically translate into commercial success and eventually Stamey left in pursuit of a solo career. Several years later, Holsapple dissolved the band to do the same.

Now the two are reunited — and it feels so good. IRS recently reissued the first two dBs albums, "Stands for Decibels" and "Repercussion," making them available for the first time in this country with extra tracks and sparkling new mixes. More importantly, this month, Rhino Records' label RNA is putting out "Mavericks," a collection of brand-new songs by Holsapple and Stamey. By telephone hook-up between L.A. (where Peter lives) and New Jersey (where Chris lives), they spoke about their musical past, present and future, with the black sheep of PBS' "An American Family" (which means he fits in perfectly here), HITS' Lance Loud.

What made you decide to work together again? Peter Holsapple: After the dBs broke up, Chris and I did some shows together and we decided it sounded really good.

Chris Stamey: I've always enjoyed working with Peter. One of the things that I really found frustrating about being in the dBs was that there was too much going on. Now, since both Peter and I have gotten out of two fairly oppressive record deals, we were free to do this.

How long did "Mavericks" take to record?

Chris: It wasn't a real labored record. We didn't have a lot of rehearsal time — about a day actually — and then we had a couple of days in June at a studio in Hoboken to sort of try it out. Then we came back for about two weeks in November last year. After that, we went up and did about a week of mixing in Bearsville.

Is either one of you more prevalent on the record?

Peter: We're both pretty much in evidence on it.

Chris did a lot on the technical aspects and I tried to cover the "weird instruments" end. Most importantly, we served as editors for one another.

"Mavericks" seems a bit more sweet-natured than the dBs' records.

Peter: It is. Back then, I was basically writing about all the terrible relationships I was having. Our snide quota has gone down substantially in the interim. This record represents Chris and I somehow moving gracefully into being adults. **The harmonies on the record are real strong. Peter:** Well, neither one of us are what you might

call "Star Search" quality vocalists, but it works really good together for some reason. After practicing in front of the world for 11 years, we finally learned to sing.

Is "Angels" about a guy who's in love with the girl that lives in the apartment over him?

Chris: No. Everybody thinks it's about something different. Victoria Williams thinks it's about a cat. Peter: Up until now, we've usually written songs separately, but we'd talked about trying to write some stuff together for this record. Of course, that didn't happen except on "Angels." I gave Chris a tape of the verse and the bridge and then he wrote the chorus.

Chris, would it be fair to call "I Want To Break Your Heart" the '90s version of "I Want To Hold Your Hand"?

Chris: There are two schools of thought on that one. Breaking a heart is like breaking a code to find out what's really inside somebody. Then there's the other interpretation, which is you see all those heavy metal love songs on MTV and it's hard to believe that a guy with that much big hair and all that spandex is being truly honest when he's singing how he really loves you, baby, baby. I think what he really means is closer to "I want to break your heart."

Is this record just another project for you two or does it represent something more permanent? Peter: We're really excited about this coming out. It's been a while since either one of us has had a record out. But the main reason for having done it in the first place is that we really, really enjoy playing together. We both have these alleged "solo careers," so we'll probably do some albums on our own before we do another one together, but now that we've broken the ice and we like working with each other again, we'll see.

Chris, tell us a bit about remastering the IRS re-issues of those first two dBs albums.

Chris: The English label they originally came out on lost the master tapes, but luckily, I had some safety masters. The biggest differences are on the first record, "Stands For Decibels." We made that record like we made this new one — in a couple of weeks — so there were a few problems with the Dolby sound and too much compression. It just didn't come out right. I went back and redid a lot of it. Now, when you listen to it, you can hear all these details you couldn't hear before. Have either of you ever suffered from the Sinead O'Connor Syndrome — complete disgust with the music industry?

Peter: I figure you can feel that way about it or you can just sort of muddle on and continue writing the songs you feel like you're supposed to be writing. I try not to let that negative stuff get me too much. It's just as easy to watch PBS as it is MTV. I suppose to some people it's a disadvantage not to be "in tune with the teens," but I don't need to do that anymore. I have other priorities. ●

Meet Him In St. Louis

Relatively new to the radio scene, KMJM St. Louis PD Chuck Atkins began his career three-and-a-half years ago at WDJY in Washington, D.C. The Buffalo native got his big break when MCA Records exec Brute Bailey, then at WDJY, hired him as a part-time announcer, a job he parlayed into Production Director. A year later, he moved to St. Louis to work in the same capacity under KMJM's Mike Stradford, who eventually left for KKBT in L.A., leaving Chuck with the PD gig. The proud father of twin baby girls is very serious about turning around the fortunes of KMJM — a task which took a turn for the worse the day HiTS' Joan "Hangin' On The" Rim decided to call.



Do you miss being on the air?

No, I really like leading. I enjoy being in control of what we're doing, and paying close attention to the sound and direction of the station. I'm pretty proud of what we've accomplished in the past two years.

Which is?

We've grown into a station concentrating on a higher demo. We had the stigma of being a teen-oriented station, which really wasn't the case. We just had to emphasize that adults like us, too. We've increased our marketing to TV and billboards, and the music selection is basically adult, though not boring. Adults like some rap too, y'know. What is your mission in St. Louis? We've been faced with a great deal of skepticism. For some reason, this station's never been in double digits. That's something I'd really like to do one time because I truly believe we have the reach, the power and the following. We're just trying to constantly build on that.

So I take It you plan to stay at KMJM for awhile and see the job through.

Sometimes, even when you're content, an offer will come along that you just can't turn down. You would never think that Arsenio would go to ABC, but he'll

do it and I'm sure it'll be for money. We just lost Vince Coleman to our rivals the Mets — we offered him \$10 million and they offered him \$12 million. He said he really wanted to stay here, but for a couple million dollars, you gotta go. I have everything I need to play hardball right now. It's still really fun

What's the worst part of the job? Working on budgets. My ideas are usually bigger than the station's pocketbook, but then again, when they cut back on money, you have to be more creative with what you have.

Do you use the charts much in deciding what goes on the air?

and the people I work with are great. What do you like best about your job? My favorite part is when you have an idea and start off brainstorming whether it be in marketing, promotion or what-have-you - and then actually execute the project and see the response of the people. We try to make it fun for the listeners rather than just playing the songs and reading liners. Without being too talkative, we try to use the elements of production, our voiceovers and contests to make the station fun to listen to, even if you don't actually participate. It's like "Wheel of Fortune." There are people who go to L.A. to actually play the game, but most of us enjoy just watching it on TV.


I never use the charts, which is funny because a lot of people do. I just believe in listening to everything that comes across my desk and deciding whether or not it fits the station and our audience, regardless of who the label artist is. We're super-saving our core audience. They don't expect us to go left — and so far we haven't.

Who have you seen in concert lately that has really impressed you?

Definitely Kenny G. The atmosphere was right. I was with my wife, and it

was perfect.

What are your future goals?
Well, my brother Ron Atkins programs our sister station, Magic 102 in Houston, Texas. We were thinking about starting a family in radio. **



The Forester Sisters "Talkin' 'Bout Men" (Warner Bros.): With "Men," the Foresters tap a raw nerve in the battle of the sexes. "Too Much Fun" will be a summer smash for girls who wanna have fun. The reggae-tinged gospel of "Let Not Your Heart Be Troubled" is both uplifting and exuberant. But there's much more: swing



uberant. But there's much more: swing ("A Step In The Right Direction"), heart-aching balladry ("That Makes One Of Us") and fragile beauty ("Somebody Else's Moon") all caressed by those sweet blood harmonies.



Larry Boone, "One Way To Go" (Columbia): Hard country crooner Larry Boone checks in with a solid package on his label debut, downplaying wordplay to focus on his wonderfully resonant baritone. No fancy tricks, just straight-up honky-tonk laments — "Standing In The River,"

"It Wouldn't Kill Me" — and killer quick-steppers in "Rock On The Road" and "One Way To Go." Boone's a guy who stands by his heart and writes songs that say what every man wants to but can't — and that every woman wants to hear.

Lorrie Morgan, "Something In Red" (RCA): On her sophomore LP, Lorrie Morgan shows a great deal of growth, having come into her own as a performer and a vocalist over the last year. Whether it's the uptempo "We Both Walk" or the contemplative "Autumn's Not That Cold," Morgan displays a passion previously untarported.



displays a passion previously untapped. Producer Richard Landis has done a yeoman job capturing the essence of Morgan's vocal dynamics, making "Red" a work that should cement her position as a female vocalist to be reckoned with.

#34. It's Neobilly heaven as **George Strait** debuts at #31 and **Kentucky HeadHunters** at #32. **Lenny Kravitz** goes from #50 to #33 in his second week out. Other debuts are **Rick Astley** at #47 and **Pat Benatar** at #50.


