





The suit claims Mc-Pherson's allegations damaged the group's "good name and business reputation" and that the Kids "have suffered humiliation and been subject to contempt, disgrace and ridicule before the public and within the music industry." McPherson, a college music teacher, was employed as a director and producer for the group before suing New Kids producer Maurice Starr for creative infringement and breach of contract. Prior to his current appointment, Carroll was **Promotion** VP/Pop Chrysalis Records, where he sang on all the Billy Idol records. Previously he was National Promotion Manager Chicago. He began his in-1979, he became local Promotion Manager for Warner Bros. Records in Cincinnati, where he made a name for himself by talking like Donald Duck.

PoMoOnThe Go Go

An exclusive NITS Radio Roundtable by Todd Hensley, Connie Breeze & Mick Bull

The Post Modern format is starting to break a great many records at Top 40, from R.E.M. to Nirvana, from Enya to Pearl Jam. There are a great many stations across the country which feature their own PoMo/alternative shows, among them XL106 Orlando, KJ103 Oklahoma City, WPST Trenton and KKXX Bakersfield. PDs Adam Cook (XL106), Mike McCoy (KJ103), Dave Hoeffel (WPST) and Steve Wall (KKXX) stay on the phone long enough with the HITS' losers to explain the motivation behind their individual shows, what kind of music they're programming, the impact on their stations and the results, as our resident gang of broadcast bozos gets it all down...

Why did you decide to program a Post Modern show at your station and what time does it air?

Adam Cook, PD XL106 Orlando: When I came in, I thought the station needed a hip edge to it, so we put a show on Sunday night called "Alternative Static," which runs from 10 p.m. to midnight. We put on a d.j., Surfer Dave, who had been working in the promotions department and promoted the hell out of it. We have an English girl doing all our sweepers. We did it in freeform... We never talk over the music, and we play about half current and half gold.

Mike McCoy, PD KJ103 Oklahoma City: For years, we have been running our Post Modern show on Sunday nights, but

we recently moved it to Friday nights, mainly because the audience was calling, writing and asking for it earlier in the week and earlier at night. It runs from 10 p.m. to 2 a.m. The show has been here for a number of years before I actually arrived. Joel Folger instituted it, but we've made it a little more mainstream and a little more crossover.

Dave Hoeffel, PD WPST Trenton: Alternative music proved to be immensely popular in this area. The reason we started the show was, there's no modern rock station in the Philadelphia market. We're kind of the de facto modern rock station for this area simply because we have had so much success with the music out here in the suburbs. We decided to superserve that audience on Friday nights, 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. We've been doing the show for a little over two years now. Mel "Toxic" Taylor, our regular 6-10 d. j., hosts the show and he's off to a club in the area to host a Post Modern PST promotion practically every night of the week.

Steve Wall, PD KKXX Bakersfield: We started "Music From The Edge" about five or six weeks ago, Sunday nights from 9 p.m. to midnight. We started out 7 p.m. to midnight, but we moved it up to 9 p.m. because of the fact we just don't have enough current product right now. It's straight-ahead Post Modern. We try to get out on the streets and find out what the buzz is in town, and discovered there's not one danceoriented dance club left here. Our clubs have skewed a totally different direction than just rap and dance. Any club you go to in town, you'll hear country. I mean, you'll get Garth Brooks next to Hammer. The underground clubs are playing a great deal of alternative music and that's really where we're finding our crowd.

What kind of music are you zeroing in on?

Cook: A great deal of the music busts out of the show and ends up in our regular rotation, including, for example, The Shamen, EMF, Blur, School of Fish, Nine Inch Nails and many more. We listen to anything that comes in. A huge record for us right now is the Quadrophonia. It's a huge night buzz record right now and a big club hit. We're not playing the hair bands... we're playing the alternative groups.

McCoy: About every other song we play is totally familiar. We've been digging back and finding some real good Post Modern stuff from the early '80s. Of the new music, St. Etienne, The Shamen, B.A.D. II and many more have great potential to be crossover smashes. My MD, Billy the Kidd, networks with quite a few other stations, but mainly we hit the streets to find out what they're doing in the clubs. There are more clubs here playing Post Modern than your traditional dance type of music, so you know there's a huge market out there waiting for these types of shows.

Hoeffel: Basically, Mel and his co-host call the shots, and I give a little insight to where things should be placed, and how things should flow. They mix it up. They'll go out on the deep end for a cut, but bring it right back with something familiar. We have the benefit of being a station that has played a great deal of that type of music for a very long time, so we can get away with playing great music to a great audience.

Wall: We play stuff like Nine Inch Nails, Soho, The Cure and now, Nuclear Valdez and the Smithereens. Depeche Mode's "Personal Jesus" is a full-time recurrent. Cause N' Effect will be a Top Ten record for us. Orchestra J.B. is catching on and the new This Picture is kicking in. It's really high energy and the hook is great.

How have the results been in terms of listener demos, response and local retail sales?

Cook: We just got our numbers back from the Fall and not only did the whole station go up, but "Alternative Static" went number one in the market 12+ and 18-34 at night. We also have a sponsorship from an alternative club in town, which is spending \$50-60,000 a year just to be associated with the show. McCoy: Response on the street has been very positive. People are going nuts. They want to hear more and they're running home to record it. The numbers were great when the

show was on Sunday night. We haven't had a book since we moved the show to Friday night, but the response has been terrific. This show is not intended to be a ratings-getter. We're not chasing cume and quarter hours with it. The primary objective is to enhance the image of the station as a whole, but in the long run, that imaging will help the numbers. Hoeffel: This show has been immensely successful for us from a sales point as well as a programming standpoint. We're halfway between New York and Philadelphia. WDRE in New York is a 3,000-watt station, so they don't really make it this far, while there is no commercial station in Philly doing any Post Modern show. That's a tremendous hole for us to fill. It's all a matter of analyzing where the hole is, determining what tracks are going to work best, and going for it.

Wall: Our listener response has been great! It's mostly adults now. During the week, we're fighting just to get adults on the phone, but Sunday nights, it's 20+ and a lot of them are women. This past weekend, I went into a bar where they had a live band and during the break, someone recognized me, so they put the radio on KKXX and cranked it up! The band ended up not going back on and we just danced to the alternative show all night. We won't get ratings results until February 25, but our initial feeling from the buzz is that it's very positive. Some of the kids at the local college are pissed off. They feel like some of their favorite groups, like Blur, aren't cool anymore because they're getting played on commercial radio!

How has the Post Modern show impacted the rest of your station's playlist?

Cook: The best thing to do is have an alternative show on the weekend, promote the hell out of it and from that, spring a few songs that are very popular into other dayparts, as opposed to trying to play a lot of Post Modern music around the clock. There's just not enough of an audience to warrant it. Instead of following a night record with a hard rock record, we're playing School of Fish and things like that.

McCoy: We have been able to start a great many records there that Billy and I liked and wanted to get on the air, but didn't feel were ready for a full-time rotation. Records that started on "Planet Underground" and have broken into rotation include The Shamen and B.A.D. II, among others. It's just another avenue for breaking records on to the radio.

Hoeffel: The show overall gives us an edge amongst our audience. Generally, a song that does well will generate phones and sales and encourage us to add it early.

Wall: Cause N' Effect's "You Think You Know Her" is something I popped on the radio one afternoon, and we got 600-700 calls on it. When I was in Richmond, we took seven points away from Edens by playing Edie Brickell and the New Bohemians out of the box — and everybody said I was crazy! So many good records like that get lost because of label priorities. The neat thing about having a Post Modern show is we get to expose all types of records — especially our favorite alternative records. There are one or two records we're playing that no one likes but me — but that's happened before. Then, a week or two will pass and everyone will love it! There's so much great stuff out now that's Post Modern. alternative or progressive. +

The title of This Picture's debut Dedicated/RCA release is somewhat of a misnomer. The music that weaves throughout "A Violent Impression" is at times both driving and wistful. And although it is impressionistic, there is little violence. With live cello and violins, much of the album is reminiscent of great British bands of yore like Traffic or early Van Morrison. There are also traces of the sounds that have made such contemporary artists as U2 and Sinead O'Connor chart-toppers. Coming from the rural highlands outside of London, This Picture singer Symon Bye and drummer **Duncan Forrester were both** enthralled and repulsed by the

excesses of Hollywood, where

with the pair recently.

I read where This Picture has been together five years.

Symon Bye: It's been a relatively slow process, but one in which we've learned a hell of a lot more about ourselves. It's such a big business, but we are very fortunate because we do things step by step. People do respect what we try to adhere to, so we don't want things hyped out of proportion, just presented to people as they are, and as we are.

Where exactly do you come from?

Duncan Forrester: We live in the county of Wiltshire, about an hour and a half west of London, near Bristol and Bath.



Was it advantageous to develop outside the media circus of a big city like London?

Symon: Absolutely. We are not an urban band. We are a rural band. There are so many elements of the countryside in our music — atmosphere, at some points etheral, even references in the lyrics. We are not a media band.

On the record, you used real strings as opposed to synthesizers, and a real Hammond organ instead of an electronic keyboard.

Duncan: At the end of the day, you can't replace natural sounds.

Symon: The Hammond and piano was done by Simon Clark, who's easily among the best in the world. He's played with Peter Gabriel and Tears for Fears. He contributed certain colors and different textures, things you couldn't do with a synthesizer.

The fiddle on "Naked Rain" also stands out.

Symon: It's not contrived, it just goes on feel. It's dangerous because sometimes it works, and sometimes it doesn't. Simon [Clark] said he hadn't heard real music in such a long time, because there aren't many bands in the world. Everyone seems content to just travel this linear path and not challenge anybody.

You recorded this at Real World, Peter Gabriel's studio in Bath. He's an exception to the rule, don't you think, in the way he uses technology to push the boundaries?

Symon: His studio is an extension of what he believes. For example, all the timbre fiber used in the construction is organic. **Duncan:** It may sound a little bit hippie, but it all has to do with positive and negative ions.

Symon: There's a river running underneath the studio. The setting is incredible.

Duncan: The room we used has a big glass floor, and the river actually runs underneath the room. You can light it up and see all the fish. We did feed off the environment quite a bit.

Symon: The big room, as it's called, is huge. We set up and recorded live there. The room was designed to be acoustically perfect for that purpose. Peter was really happy we did it that way. We were the first band to do it. He spent millions of pounds building this room and no one had used it the way it was supposed to. When we finished, he moved his band in to work on his new album.

The majority of the album was produced by Kevin Maloney, best known for his work with Sinead O'Connor.

Duncan: Kevin is very good with sounds, and he's very tolerant. We got along very well. Things can sometimes be a disaster if you get a clash of egos. Not that we're egotistical, but we are stubborn.

Symon: We've been together quite a long time. We know what we want. It is our music — it is us. I get pissed off because these aren't just lyrics, this is what I feel. There were arguements, but they were resolved. We are proud of the album. Especially because it's our first.

The writing credits on the album are shared by the whole band.

Symon: We share everything. We're living together right now, writing the next album. I can't imagine anything worse than being in a band where one guy gets all the money. Greed is such an awful thing. The most important thing is the music itself. If we stay honest with ourselves, we won't go wrong. That's why so many of the '60s and '70s records are still good... they were just guys playing off each other.

Are you planning to tour the U.S.?

Symon: Hopefully after the New Year. It depends on how the record does. We've heard that there is a worry that people won't understand it.

Duncan: Because it's such a different view of life than most folks around here can relate to, it might be refreshing. With a title like "A Violent Impression?"

Symon: It's a strange juxtaposition. The song itself is almost sedate, but the lyrics are very harsh and critical, almost obscene. The record is a whole, and we hope after hearing it, people are left with an impression, not necessarily a violent one, but that things can haunt you. People say it's a very pretty album, but you have to hear the words.

caught up with the band and coaxed 'em to sign on the dotted line, releasing both of the group's "do-it-yourself" efforts in the process. So it makes perfect sense that the group's third album (their first to

feature an outside producer, Gavin MacKillop, and first to be recorded with a budget that didn't rely on parental loans) is titled "Fear." After all, going from cozy gigs in

whatever club would have them to joining a team that includes such commercial heavyweights as George Michael and Bruce Springsteen can be pretty heady stuff. But the guys in Toad are quick to point out that it's a good fear, as compared to the horrific fear of confronting HITS' resident wart removal expert, Steve "What This Man Needs Is A Healthy Dose of Salt" Peters.

Since this is the first LP that you've actually made for Columbia, I imagine you had more time to record it.

Dean Dinning: Yeah. The first album was made in about six days and the second one was made in two weeks. This one took about two-and-a-half months.

Randy Guss: We spanned the length of the Persian Gulf war!

Dean: We started recording up in Reno the day the war started and the day we got home, the cease-fire was declared. It was pretty weird.

Randy: It was the right thing to do for now.

The band's name, which originally comes from a Monty Python skit, has always been an attention-getter, to say the least. Was there ever any thought about changing it?

Dean: We always kind of called ourselves that. We'd sit around in high school making up little band logos — y'know, little frogs jumping over gears. Randy's still got them on his wall.

Randy: Of course, as many times as people have asked us where we got the name, we've heard other people say, "Why don't you change the name?" We thought about other things, but we said, "Let's just do it for the first couple of weeks, so we can see it in print in the local listings." Then people knew us by name.

Dean: By then, it was too late.

Why did you decide to call the album, "Fear?"

Randy: [Laughs.] It's a Monty Python skit! No, no. Only kidding.

It's funny, though, because you've got the humorous nature of the band's name and then here's this real serious title.

Randy: Well, that's always been juxtapased against the music. In the very beginning, we got into this band because we wanted to have a different, more exciting life than

Why Reno?

Dean: We got a really good rate.

I would think you'd want to take advantage of the big bucks and go somewhere exotic.

Randy: We thought about that, but it wasn't quite realistic.

So you didn't get as much as Michael Jackson.

Randy: I guess not.

Dean: [Laughs.] Well, we don't really see the figures.

How did having more money and time change things in the studio?


Dean: It worked out really well. Dealing with so little money on the first two records, we just kind of went in and played like it was a club. All the microphones were on. All the tracks were live takes on both of the first two albums. But what this time kind of proved was that we could go into the studio and do overdubbing, or different tracking on some things. We still did some live stuff, but for the most part, all of it sounds palished. We proved we could make records both ways. I was kind of scared about how this would work, but it was really creative.

we thought, "This is a great way for us to experience more." And what we found was the only thing that was going to prevent us from making that growth was our own fear of being knocked down, or maybe not achieving what we wanted to achieve. In our first interview, Glen said that we weren't angry, we were scared. It's still there, but instead of avoiding fear, now we realize we have to confront it to get to the next level. In the past, being afraid has had an influence on what we've done musically, because we were afraid of people thinking we were A or B.

Or X.

Dean: Or Y...

Randy: We were afraid of every letter in the alphabet. But with this album, we had to overcome that. We have different arguments within the band about this, but I kind of think that fear can be a motivator. It can push you in directions that you should go. We formed this band because we were afraid of what would happen if we didn't. I think the record represents not completely overcoming that fear, but at least addressing it. **



TIME FOR A CUP OF JOE AND A DOUGHNUT WITH AMERICAN MUSIC CLUB BY JON FINE

San Francisco's American Music Club deserve a better fate. Since the mid'80s, the haunting, textured arrangements they've wed to Mark Eitzel's incomparable songwriting has won them a sizable and fanatically devoted European following and near-complete disinterest at home, beyond a small, fanatically devoted — oh, well you get the idea.

With the release of their latest album, "Everclear" (Alias), and MTV play of their debut video, "Rise," they're finally being exposed to a decent-sized stateside audience a mere five albums down the line. If a younger, more emotive Leonard Cohen who could really sing fronted a boundlessly inventive and versatile band, it still wouldn't sound anything like A.M.C., but perhaps such descriptions will convince some wellheeled reader to send some large dollars their way so they can quit their day jobs. Even if that doesn't (and won't) happen, they'll keep at it anyway, which is part of the reason why they're so great.

Vocalist/guitarist Eitzel, bassist Danny Pearson and guitarist Vudi sat down with HITS' Ivana B.Adored groupie Jon "Not So" Fine after everyone had way too much to eat, while pedal steel guitarist Bruce Kaphan and drummer Tim Mooney wisely abstained — not from chowing down, but from paying any attention at all to our intrepid reporter.

How did this get started?

Vudl: Mark's old band Naked Skinnies moved to San Francisco, and I saw them play at the Mabuhay Gardens. It was a show that got them kicked out of the Mubuhay Gardens forever, and Mark insulted me when I called him a nice boy. Then they all quit.

Mark Eltzel: The drummer from the Naked Skinnies said to me, "There's this guy I know who says he's destined to work with you," which is the kind of pretentious thing Vudi is fond of giving utterance to.

Were you at all put off by such an utterance?

Mark: No, I loved it. I'm such a very pretentious...

Vudl: ...Mr. Destiny!

The two of you have been in A.M.C. since the beginning. By Mark's own admission, he can be difficult to get along with let alone work with, and for a long time there was very little interest in what you were doing. Why did you stick with It?

Mark: DON'T ANSWER!! DON'T FUCKING ANSWER!! You answer and you're FIRED!

Vudi: That's the answer!

Danny Pearson: You stick through the difficulties, because you're not going to play any other music that has so many emotional possibilities. It's like you're drawn to it, because life is so boring — you get on-stage with A.M.C. and suddenly it's not.

Things are going better now, but in the past you'd tour and five people would show up. That has to affect your performance.

Mark: It does change things when there's a buzz. But I keep thinking, "I've been singing these songs for five years. Now people like them. Why?" We're completely broke, we still owe everybody money... and we'll still do it, anyway. It's taken us an awful long time to get anywhere, but the people who are our fans now are really cool people. We can't pull any shit with them. We can't be phony, because they'd know. And they seem to stick with us, which is nice.

Do you ever get to a point where some of the songs lose the emotional validity they had when you first wrote them?

Mark: It might, if we were really successful and the only songs people wanted to hear were the hits. But now we play for people who come up to us and say, "I've been waiting two years to see you guys, and I really want to hear 'Outside This Bar,'" and we say, "Sure, we'll do it." I don't mind singing these songs over and over again. I'm an entertainer... for me, the kick is playing in front of people.

Mark, you've said there are certain songs you never want to touch again.

Mark: It's because they talk about old stuff that I get too emotionally involved in when I perform them. Some of the songs are so dramatic, I can't really pull them off and be honest about it anymore. Like "Laughing Stock." I'm nobody's laughing stock anymore. I may be, but I'm not going to stand up there and act it.

Which are your favorite A.M.C. albums?

Danny: I still like to listen to "United Kingdom."

Vudi: Demon Records in the U.K. has reissued "California" and "United Kingdom" on one CD — that's it. **Mark:** My favorite album has to be "Everclear," I guess, although I haven't listened to it.

You've been a band for quite some time in a nation that hasn't paid much attention, even though it bears your name.

Vudi: It doesn't seem that long.

Danny: It also doesn't seem that different now. We're still driving the same van we were driving six years ago. **Mark:** Last night, someone busted out the window of the van, so Vudi had to go to a junkyard to get a new one. Every day's like that — a new challenge. **

/ITH HENRY ROLLINS BY ERIN CULLEY

Singer, author, editor, lyricist, publisher, poet... Henry Rollins is truly a grass roots renaissance man with his fingers in many pots. Though he's achieved underground cult hero status for his efforts, the one-time vocalist for seminal L.A. punk band Black Flag is starting to break through to the mainstream, with a starring spot on last summer's smash "Lollapalooza" tour, a recent appearance on "The Dennis Miller Show" and a fulllength major label bow, "The End of Silence," on Imago Records. Although Chrysalis put out an EP of his Wartime project (a collaboration with bandmate Andrew Weiss) last year, this new album is set to make him a household name, at least in those neighborhoods where hard-core legends like Minor Threat and Fugazi are considered Gods. Rollins' publishing company, 2-13-61 (after his birth date), is taking shape, too, and his own future looks pretty rosey, but it's not enough to make him any less angry, especially having to deal with HITS' PoMo poobette, Erin "Do The Hully" Culley.



How did the "Lollapalooza" tour turn out?

I enjoy any opportunity to play, and that was a great opportunity to play. Being the opening band, I must admit was a little frustrating in that I reckon we played as good as anybody on the bill, but to very few people. There was a great irony in all of this, I think, 'cause I'd been doing records longer and touring longer than anybody on the whole tour, except for Siouxsie and the Banshees, and it was

just kind of perfect. All those performers were listening to my records. It's funny, but it didn't bum me out at all. To me, it was hilarious!

How would you say the Rollins Band has evolved since its inception?

Hopefully, I have more impact and my lyrics are better, more to the point. Musically, we're more adventurous, more challenging. Just moving forward, whatever the hell that means. Now we're doing all this stuff that's really hard to play. And I'm like trying to keep up with it. The guys in the band can play anything — any style — and the only slow thing in the band is me. I'm not musical. I can't play any instruments. I have to ask them, "Hey, where do I come in on this?," but I'm getting better, I'm learning. I'm using more of a polyrhythmic vocal approach and trying to hold some notes to have more impact, trying to hit harder. Physically, I'm in better shape now than I was when I was 25.

I work out six days a week and sweat blood, so I know I look like a great piece of work. You see, I have a real bad problem with depression; for years, I was on all kinds of medication. The way I get over that is with a lot of physical workout. This really intense Vietnam vet taught me how to lift weights and over the last three years, I've really found that's the way I keep myself in check. I teach myself things through pain. There are lessons you can learn about yourself and about life through pain that can't be found in any book. And the only place I've ever been able to find a similar thought is the Samurais, so now I'm studying the Samurai and their bellefs. I've always aligned myself with death and that's what makes me go. I walk with death... it's my reference point, my true north and that's why a lot of shit doesn't faze me.

Tell us a little about the new album.

I think it's the coolest thing we've done. I wrote lyrics that really challenged me. I finally had the courage to write about my father on the song "Just Like You." I really had problems dealing with it in the past. One of the reasons I do all this is because of him. You should have seen me years ago. I was skinny and on Ritalin for hyperactivity. I never said no to my father. He'd say, stand up, and I'd stand up. I'd go to his house on the

weekends and he'd make me set an entire table perfectly. Then I would have to sit down and eat an air meal, with nothing on the plate. He'd go, "OK, meat at 12 o'clock, vegetables at 3 o'clock," and I had to put the knife down and if I didn't do it right, I'd get clapped on the side of my head. I had to drill this over and over so that when my stepmother would sit down to

eat, my table manners would be immaculate. To this day, I have perfect table manners. When I turned 18, I said, "I'm never gonna see this guy again, fuck it!" He came to one of my shows nine years later — I hadn't seen him in all that time — and I talked to him for like a minute and a half. In those 90 seconds, I realized, I'm just like him. Maybe not mentally, but the way he moves, the way he speaks, the way he looks, and I'm like, "Fuck! I'm just like this guy!" And he's like, "Kid! You're a good man and people in my office want your autograph. Good going!" He was a real drill sergeant. And that's where "Just Like You" comes from.

How does it feel to be on an aboveground record company like Imago after all those years scraping by on indies?

three times in my life. I'm 30 and I've only had a phone a few years. That's just how it goes. It's weird, though, to get a royatty check in the mail. You're like, "What's this for?" And they say, "You make records, that's what you get paid for." Wow! I can pay my fucking rent! I could get used to this!

It's weird doing the Imago thing. You walk in there and it's this major label. I've made I don't know how many records and I've been paid maybe

Ain't That A Shamen?

TIME FOR A CUP OF JOE AND A DOUGHNUT WITH THE SHAMEN BY BRIAN GRIFFITH

Lolin Angus keeps his eyes closed during interviews. It's not that he's trying to avoid eye contact — he just concentrates better that way. Colin is the founding member of The Shamen, a London-based band that Jesus Jones' Mike Edwards calls "the most indicative of what new British music is all about." After five years, just as the band was attracting the eyes and ears of Great Britain with their pulsating club mixes, the group's other founder, Will Shinnott, mysteriously drowned off the coast of Tenerife, where the band had gone to shoot a video. Some say it was suicide. Nevertheless, newest member Mr. C took over much of the creative chores and The Shamen moved on.

The band formed in '86 in Aberdeen as a psychedelic guitar band with an eye toward technology. ■ Their first U.S. major label release is "En-Tact," an updated remix of the version which came out in the U.K. last year. ■ The first single, "Move Any Mountain," has the distinction of being in the Guinness Book of World Records as the most remixed song in history. ■

Colin and Mr. C were in L.A. for a few days of promotion, where they were hoodwinked into spending 45 excruciating minutes with HITS' own remixed-up reporter, Brian "I Take The" Griffith.

The direction of The Shamen has been evolving over the years, from a guitar-driven rock sound to what you're doing now.

Colin Angus: The techno-thing has always been there. We got bored with the sort of psychedelic-indie sound, and wanted to do something with a bit more substance to it, a bit more rhythm as well... more danceability. We began experimenting with hip-hop rhythms, fusing those with psychedelic and rock over a period of three singles. This was in '87, which is when Will joined. We began to hear about the Acid House scene in London, so Will and I left Aberdeen for London to get involved.

What attracted you to that scene?

Colin: Coming from the psychedelic angle, those parties were pretty heady affairs. That's where we met Mr. C. We also came into contact with others who influenced the direction of the band.

I've heard there are about 40 re-mixes available of the "Move Any Mountain" single.

Mr. C: It originally came out on a triple-album project called "Progeny." There are actually 19 mixes and 16 small bands of all the sounds, vocals and instruments

for would-be remixers. They've got the whole song in solo sections, so they can sample it and do their own versions. There are some other versions on 12" format, so it probably works out to about 40 or so.

Have you received many tapes from fans who have done their own mixes?


Colin: Yep. Some we like and some we don't. I would like it better actually if people would take our sounds and make new songs out of 'em. That's how we made the song in the first place, by using samples from other tracks. We've even received a rockabilly remix, which is quite astounding.

Mr. C: We were just contacted by the Guinness people who told us we're the only band to appear on both the singles and album chart with one song.

You were involved with the Syd Barrett tribute record awhile back.

Colin: Syd's been quite an influential figure in the British music scene. All these indie bands — like Blur and Inspiral Carpets — are pure Syd copies, really. Syd needs the money. He lives at home with his mom in Cambridge now. The psychedelic influence is still in our music, but in a more appropriate form for the '90s.

Where do you get some of the samples you use?

Mr. C: The new sounds that we're making, we generate ourselves. We just added a new analog synthesizer section to the band. We're trying not to use sampling quite so much.

Colin: As far as vocal samples, we can tell you about that because they've all been cleared. We used an anti-apartheid campaign for "Hear Me," so they get a royalty as well. For "Progen 91 (I.R.P. In The Land Of Oz)," it's the Iranian Revolutionary Parliament.

How did you go about getting clearance for that? Colin: [Laughs.] Needless to say, we didn't consult them on that one. Also, let me see, on "Evil Is Even," we used some South American shamens. We got that from a TV documentary that was shown in the U.K. a couple of years ago.

Tell us about the performance part of what you do, "Progeny."

Colin: The last show we did just before coming over here was for 4,500 people at the Brixton Academy. We had a full state-of-the-art light show, with scanners, atmospherics, projections and two enormous cubes suspended from the ceiling containing lights that pulsated differently to every

tune. Orbital and Funky Dread played, while Mr. C d.j.'ed and rapped all night. We had an ambient room, with ambient bands, brain machines, shiatsu massage... it was pretty comprehensive.

What's the next step, virtual reality?

Colin: We'd like to do a virtual club where you don't even have to leave your home, just put on the body suits and the glasses and plug into the network and, lo and behold, you'll be transported to Progeny 2000, or whatever it'll be. But the technology doesn't really exist in the real world yet. The only people that really have virtual reality are the military. With the fall of communism, our hope is VR can be put to more constructive, educational and fulfilling uses than combat training for tank crews and aircraft personnel.

Will you be bringing "Progeny" to the States?

Mr. C: We're hoping to in late January or early February, but it is a very large and lavish production, and getting it right is taking a bit of time. We don't want to come here with a half-hearted effort. We want to come with the full experience and hopefully affect the minds of quite a few people.





Though her folks may not quite understand her job description or what she's doing with Slayer, Clarissa has no problems working with any of Def Am's controversial artists: "I just like to find out where they're coming from." And as a woman in the male-dominated world of heavy metal, she's encountered few prejudices: "I've been really lucky. People always wonder what goes on backstage, but it's just business!" Or to paraphrase the Four Horsemen, "Rockin' is ma business, and business been good." Hell, yeah.
