



Ozzy Osbourne has won his lawsuit against *Music Confidential* magazine for their story stating he had suffered a disabling medical problem which he was concealing from his fans.

Osbourne was awarded an undisclosed financial settlement, which he will donate to a pair of charity organizations the Bridge School and the International Rett Syndrome Association — and a lifetime subscription to Music Confidential. Have rumors of the New Music Seminar's demise after 15 years been exaggerated? A Seminar representative insists that organizer Mark Josephson will make good on the convention's debts, including the final two weeks of pay for NMS employees.

Seminar publicist Jody Miller says Josephson is still awaiting money to come through from several sponsorships. She claims that NMS walk-up business wasn't as big as expected and that previous year's debts were paid off with revenue, leaving the seminar "undercapitalized." Miller insists the NMS will return next year, but in a "scaleddown" version at the Motel 6 in Napiersville, Illinois. he Bunny is hopping.

One week after news of earthshaking executive changes at Warner Bros. overshadowed all other industry events, the label's artists are again grabbing the spotlight and grabbing four of the Top Ten spots on the HITS Top 50 Albums chart.

Well, at least VH-1's ratings will be up in South Dakota, as favorite son "He's So" Wayne Isaak has been named Sr. Vice President, Music & Talent Relations for the channel by VH-1 President John Sykes, with long-time exec "Ab" Norm "L." Schoenfeld promoted to Vice President, Original Music Programs by VP Production and Original Programming "Hit The Road" Jack Sussman.

Isaak will be responsible for all talent/artist and label relations activities, serving as the chief liaison between VH-1, the artists and the recording industry, and as Sykes' body double for promotional events. Schoenfeld will be involved in exploring development projects as they relate to music-based programming and the music community in the role of executive producer and fetching coffee for **Francis Ford Coppola**.

Commenting on Isaak's appointment, Sykes said: "Wayne is a uniquely talented music executive in that he not only has a solid grasp of the needs of a record label but has also built exceptionally strong relationships. And he wears the same suit size as me, so I can cut my monthly Barney's bill in half."

Said Susman about Schoenfeld's promotion: "Norm has established himself as both a creative executive and someone who understands the relationship between talent and

the creative programming process... and he perks a mean cup of java."

Isaak comes to VH-1 from A&M, where he was Executive Vice President, Publicity, East Coast Operations and preening in front of a mirror. Schoenfeld was most recently Vice President, Program & Artist Development for VH-1, which he joined in 1988 after his band the Sic F**ks broke up.

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American vs. Phonogram

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The lawyers are racking up on this one. In a court case taking place on two continents, Rick Rubin's American Recordings has filed a \$14 million lawsuit to get out of its international distribution deal with PolyGram's Phonogram U.K. The bizarre action includes the attempt by Phonogram to introduce as evidence a tape of a tapped phone call between Rubin, lawyer John Branca and American executive Mike Bone a former Phonogram employee, who most recently served as co-President of Mercury Records.

American originally filed the fraud suit last April in L.A. Superior Court, alleging their overseas distributor failed to fulfill a number of contractual obligations, including an improper withdrawal of \$4.5 million from the joint venture account. Phonogram responded by filing an injunction, since dropped, against the label in a British High Court countersuit to stop American from seeking another distributor, preventing the overseas release of Johnny Cash's recent "American Recordings." The company insists they were left with no option but to seek recourse for American failing to deliver master recordings by the Black Crowes, Danzig and Slayer as well as Cash, for international release.


During the course of the British High Court proceedings, Phonogram's in-house counsel tried to introduce a tape of a phone conversation between Rubin, Bone and attorney Branca which he bought from a "radio hacker" for \$1500 to show "how the label conducted its business." Such recordings are legal in Britain, but the judge quashed it as evidence, citing the "sanctity of attorney-client privilege." Bone, in London for the trial, insisted he had "never experienced skullduggery like that" in his years in the record business.

The case will now be tried in California, where Phonogram has filed a "multimillion dollar" damages counterclaim.








Making Movie Music

"WHAT I WANT TO ACCOMPLISH WITH THIS ALBUM... IS TO IN-SPIRE PEOPLE MY AGE TO LIVE OUT THEIR OWN FANTASIES."

An exclusive HITS dialogue with **Gary LeMel**, President of Music for Warner Bros. Films BY ROY TRAKIN

orn in London from Russian-Jewish ancestry, Gary LeMel has become one of the leading executives in the art of putting together successful movie soundtracks in his role as President of Music for Warner Bros. Films and before that, Columbia Pictures. Among the hit albums he's been associated with are "The Bodyguard," "Maverick," "Batman," "Ghostbusters," "St. Elmo's Fire," "The Big Chill" and "A Star Is Born." Before he became a force in the burgeoning soundtrack field, though,

LeMel was a musician himself. When his family moved to Tucson, LeMel picked up the bass at 11 and formed a band before he was in his teens which earned money playing for weddings and even at some local venues. Influenced by the big bands, jazz stylists and pop crooners, LeMel eventually took a gig as the house bassist at a jazz club in the area, where he was discovered by jazz great Anita O'Baker, who took the then-17-year-old on the road with her after he backed her up one evening. Switching over to singing himself, LeMel was inked to Vee Jay Records, where he released "The Gary LeMel Album," whose liner notes described him as having "the heart of a Tony Bennett, the rhythm of a Bobby Darin, the phrasing of a Frank Sinatra and the youthful appeal of a Jack Jones."

Unfortunately, the record came

out just a scant month before the Beatles' album was released on the very same label, basically wiping out everything in its path and turning the pop music world of the time on its head. Finding himself reduced to playing increasingly second-rate dives, LeMel turned to the business side of the music industry, landing in music publishing, then A&R jobs at London, Casablanca and Boardwalk Records before seguing into the film industry at Columbia and Warner Bros. Ironically, he was sought out by movie moguls as an expert on the very rock & roll which put a halt to his own career as a pop stylist, a 30-year hiatus which didn't end until LeMel recorded "Romancing the Screen" for the Blue Note Contemporary label. The project was a labor of love as well as a dream come true for LeMel, who recorded a collection of movie



music, ranging from "The Way You Look Tonight," first heard in the 1936 movie "Swingtime," to the Burt Bacharach/Hal David standard "Alfie" and "How Do You Keep The Music Playing," featured in the 1982 Burt Reynolds/Goldie Hawn vehicle "Best Friends."

At a special Hollywood Cinegrill appearance to promote the record, Gary was introduced by his pal Warren Beatty and performed before a star-studded audience which included none other than Sinatra himself.

"This is music for people of all ages who want to return to more





romantic times." said LeMel. "When the right song matches up with the right scene in a movie, it lives on as a memory of both the movie and the song... It is truly magical." Of course, it would have been really magical if he was able to make HITS' gadfly and lunch schnorrer Roy "Do You Really Know War-ren Beatty?" Trakin disappear.

What was it like touring with Anita O'Day when you were all of 17?

I thought it was the greatest opportunity of all-time. Anita was always late to the gigs, so we ended up having to go on and play without her. I had never sung before onstage, but one night the crowd was getting really restless, so I thought, maybe I'll sing something. I ju t happened to start singing when Anita walked in and heard me. At the end of the show, she pulled me aside and said, "You know, you could really be a good singer." So she started working with me on my singing, primarily my vibrato. She taught me a way to control it through a thought process which was later included in many singing teachers' repertoires. Because at the time, it wasn't the style to have a vibrato.

How did you get an album deal with Vee Jay?

I was working in a club called the Holiday House in Malibu, which, as I found out later, was a popular rendezvous spot for those in the film business to take people other than their wives. The guy who ran the place was even accused of bugging the tables to give scoops to Louella Parsons about who was taking out whom. After I started playing there, I built up a following. Eventually, Jay Lasker and

Randy Wood from Vee Jay came out, saw me and offered me a contract. I was going to be the next lack lones. They signed me to a \$25,000 advance, which, in those days, was an enormous deal. There were pictures of Jay, Randy and I signing the contract in Cashbox. Somehow, I hooked up with Tommy Oliver, who was kind of the David Foster of his day, as my producer/arranger. We recorded an incredible album, it came out, things were happening and then the Beatles released their record on the same label.

Like all other jazz musicians, I thought rock & roll was a fad which would go away quickly. It took me four more years to begin to realize that maybe my singing career wasn't going to happen. It was very painful, but I was smarter than most. My agent then was Ashley Famous, one of the big agencies of the time, and the crowning blow came when I was booked at the Playboy Club in Detroit with this thenunknown young comic, who absolutely destroyed the place. I told my agent he had to check this guy out, so he came by and ended up signing him on the spot. It was Flip Wilson. And that was sorta the last straw. I realized maybe I should get involved in another side of the bu iness. So you went into music publishing? I was about to get married, I had adopted my wife-to-be's two children and it was time to get serious. I was lucky enough to get a job with a music publisher which had a good Broadway catalog. I was a song plugger, signing writers. The irony was, these guys were as blown away by rock & roll as I was. They wanted a "younger guy" who could help them make the transition. And even though I didn't know any more about rock & roll than they knew, I looked the part. I was a quick study, learning as I went along.

Sergeant Pepper" was a big turnaround for me. I finally realized this was great music, but I was smart enough to know not to sing it myself. I eventually learned enough to know what was good and what was bad. And, strangely enough, dealing in rock really made my career.

You began working on movie soundtracks when you were at First Artists. That was the company put together by Barbra Streisand, Paul Newman, Dustin Hoffman, Steve McQueen and Sidney Poiter, where I assembled the soundtrack for "A Star Is Born," which was very successful. My job was to get the music together before Warner Bros. would **"ALL MY** greenlight the film. Back then, there was no job called

PREDECESSORS Music Supervisor, but that's what I did. [The movie's producer] Ion Peters and Barbra gave me a wonder-CONDUCTORS

ful opportunity to do far more than just the music. I became part of the team, and it was almost like us **MUSICIANS LIKE** against the world because nobody

thought we'd pull it off. The seeds of my involvement in mu-NEWMAN, WHO sic and film took place during "A Star Is Born" because I realized I had a talent for it and no-**CREDIBLE, BUT** body from the record business had become involved on the film side. All my predecessors were conductors and classical musicians like Lionel Newman, who were incredible, but they had no understanding of the record business nor of

the pop artist. And they BUSINESS NOR didn't want to know. Then you went to

work for Neil Bogart at Casablanca and Boardwalk. **POP ARTIST.**"

I worked on the disco movie, "Thank God It's Friday," before Neil, Jon Peters

and Peter Guber formed Boardwalk. The younger producers and directors had begun going to the studio heads and complaining that they couldn't work with their music departments because they didn't under-stand what was needed. When Columbia Pictures hired me as head of their film music department in 1982, I started running the film music area more like a record label A&R department.

Soundtrack albums were afterthoughts until "Saturday Night Fever" proved they could be big sellers. "Saturday Night Fever" was successful be-

cause Robert Stigwood was a record guy. In the early '80s, record companies even began releasing singles from the soundtrack before the movies themselves came out. For "St. Elmo's Fire," we released a single upfront because we knew it was a movie targeted at a young audience. Now it's done as a matter of course. MTV has become a major piece

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of marketing for films. You were also involved with "The Big Chill," which was one of the first examples of a soundtrack album that repackaged oldies in a way that showed you could get new life out of back catalog.

Ironically, the head of Motown Records at the time was Jay Lasker, who originally signed me to Vee Jay. Being a record guy, Jay didn't quite get it. He told me he had these songs repackaged al-

ready in 80 different

configurations. So we actually gave Motown \$25,000 to put out the album. Usually, it's the other way around... the record company gives us the money. But he didn't believe that anyone would buy a compilation album of stuff that's been on the market 80 million times. So we gave him the money to press up a minimal amount of records. The day the movie opened, we got reports people were running to mall record stores for the album, which wasn't there. Of course, being the record man he was, Jay made sure that album was there pretty quickly and we ended up selling two million units. And then we did "The Big Chill 2," with songs not included on the first one. The film studios realized something was happening and started to get on the bandwagon by hiring people from the record business to help package those albums. The modern soundtrack reached its commercial apogee with "The Bodyguard," half of which featured all-new Whitney Houston material. Kevin Costner would not make the movie without

Whitney Houston. He waited a year until 🔹 she was available. Originally, only a course of her songs were supposed to be on the record. Even the finished product is only half Whitney Houston material, but those tracks are so dynamic, they've sort of overshadowed the rest of the album. The more she got comfortable in the movie, the more she wanted to contribute musically. When "I Will Always Love You" came out and blew everything else away, it was just a phenomenon. We're now over 30 million albums on this record. The ultimate is to have a major pop star in a movie actually singing. That's the dream thing ... other than a musical, which hasn't worked except for Disney's animated features. These days, it's not unusual for the soundtrack album to outperform the movies from which they came.

The days of one single, with the rest score and filler are gone. A good soundtrack album has to be able to stand alone. The planning for a soundtrack takes just as long as for the film itself.

We get involved the minute a film is green-lighted. I read a script and make my own notes. I know who the director is and, if I've worked with him before, I have an idea whether he's into music or not. Many of them don't want songs in the movie; they'd rather have a more traditional score. The truth is, I don't just want to jam songs in there for the sake of having an album. I want the songs to really work in the film. I'd like to know that the director feels the same as I do about the music.

How come all Warner Bros. films don't have corresponding Warner Bros. soundtracks?

We like to keep it in the family as much as we can, but sometimes the labels don't have the right artist roster for the movie, so we have to go outside. Picking a label for a soundtrack is very important. In the past, it wasn't uncommon to have artists from all different labels on one soundtrack, but as these albums have become increasingly popular, the individual labels want more and more control. You have to give a great deal of consideration to the label you've chosen because you're going to have to use their roster, but it works both ways: we break a new artist for them and they give us one of their bigger stars to lead off with.

What kind of things are you doing to make your soundtracks stand out?

You're only as strong as your script. The important thing is to remain current. You have to know what music is going to be popular a year or 18 months from now, when the movie will be coming out. It's important to be tied into who the record labels are signing. Even in the mid-'80s, there was still a lot of animosity between the film and music people. What I was able to do — since I at least had experience in both businesses — was bring the two together. Now, I feel there's a lot of mutual respect. When an Epic Records makes a major commitment to an Epic Soundtrax, you know they're taking it very scriously. It's not like you're taking a big financial isk with a multi-album commitment to a single artist. And you get millions of dollars of free publicity by latching on to the film's marketing and advertising campaigns.

We just got Émilio Estefan to do the soundtrack for a movie we're making down in Miami with Sylvester Stallone, "The Specialist." Emilio did an amazing job of integrating the Miami sound into the film, but the great part for him is being able to showcase his new Epic label and some of his new artists by launching the company with this soundtrack album. You have said making "Romancing The Screen" was a dream come true for you, being able to get back to your own first love.

There's a dual purpose to this album. First, I get to live out my dream. When [Blue Note President] Bruce Lundvall said he wanted the album, that was it for me. Because Blue Note was a label I've loved my whole life. Everything else was just gravy. The other part was I had the revelation that something very important was missing in my life. It looked on the surface that I had it made, but I knew there was a hole in my soul. When I stopped singing, I stopped completely. The memories were just so bad. That's why I think people are responding to this album. It comes from the heart. It gets them on that level because that's how it's affecting me.

The concept of doing music from the movies was a natural for you.

It's what I do for a living. What I want to accomplish with this album — aside from it doing well — is to inspire people my age to live out their own fantasies. Whatever it was they gave up, do it. Don't hesitate. It'll make you feel whole.

How did you make the song choices? I had a list made of every song from the movies starting in the early '40s and then I whittled that down to about a hundred. Most of these songs have transcended the movies from which they came. Being younger, Roger Voudouris, the vocal producer, wasn't real familiar with the material, so I gave him 30 of my favorites and had him pick the final ten. And that made up the bulk of the choices, except for the ones I knew I was going to do. He introduced me to [album producer] Randy Waldman, who is probably the greatest musician I've ever been associated with. He was the musical genius behind this project. He just finished touring with Barbra Streisand as her keyboard player.

What if this project does take off? Will you leave your day job?

I really believe I could have a wonderful career doing both. Actually, the funny thing is, the Beatles are gone and I'm still standing. I was just waiting for my time. If you live long enough and keep your health, there's no limit to what you can do. And I think the time couldn't be better for this album, with people like Natalie Cole, Tony Bennett, Harry Connick Jr. and Frank Sinatra doing so well singing these kinds of standards.





SWAY: They're lost man. The people that are marketing and selling the music don't listen to it. They don't take it home with 'em. They've lost touch with the people buying their stuff. The A&R people still go by old-school tactics that don't apply to new school music. Guys like Russell Simmons and Keith Naftaly surround themselves with people who know. That's the key to their success. If you give more creative freedom to the artist, it'll work better in the long run. And listen to the d.j.s who play the music because no one knows better than they do. With us, if the music is good, it gets played. How will you do things differently with your label?

SWAY: The difference is, we have matured in this business. We have values, morals and ethics. We're true to this shit to the day we die. But we're businessmen, too. When we don't know shit, we plan to apply people who do know shit! We're gonna take it step by step and try to come up with innovative ways to market our artists. Back in the day, that was the model. You gotta do your own shit.

You'e trying to break down the old rules.

SWAY: There shouldn't be any with hip-hop, man. The problem is too much call-out, too much research, too much generalizing and not enough gut instinct. Radio has the power to influence generations just by the music they're playing.

"We called it 'The Wake Up Show' not because it was in the morning, but because we thought people were sleepin' on good rap music."

When you stifle the musical growth of a station, you stagnate the growth of the listener. It's not necessary for certain records to be played 100 times a week when there is new music that could be introduced as

well. That's why we have so much success in radio - because we don't give a fuck! We're gonna introduce that new shit to you so you can decide whether you like it or not. How much influence does video play have on

your programming?

TECH: We don't really let videos guide us to whether we're gonna play a song or not. "The Wake-Up Show" is 90% gut instinct. That's the way we've worked from the beginning. We hear something; we go, this is dope. Whether people tell us it's dope or wack or not doesn't really influence us. We've had so much success doing it our way that we're not going to change. If I hear something wack, I'm not gonna play it no matter how many units it's selling. Just because everybody's buying something that don't make it good. Look at crack. It's like, we're selling vitamins and wakin' you up and sayin', "Look, man, you've been doin' fuckin crack. You don't need this in your system... why don't you get a little taste of this?" Our audience goes from 13 to 40.

SWAY: It's time we took matters into our own hands. Control your assets, like me and Tech are doing. PDs have to step aside and listen to the people livin' the shit. Like Ricky Leigh, man. Ricky Leigh is one of the greatest muthafucks who ever stepped on the planet earth! You gotta listen to him! TECH: I just wanna give a shout-out to all the muthafuckas that are real, that have the balls to play what they wanna play and come out and say, 'Fuck, this is the way it should be run." Like Funkmaster Flex, Tha Baka Boyz, Tha Joint, Red Alert, Premiere... all those d.j.s out there that worked hard enough to get their own time slot and do what they wanna do. It's up to the d.j.s like us to keep the shit alive and I guarantee you, in ten years, about 75% of these muthafuckas are gonna be running the industry. So wake up!

😽 ay Area hip-hop d.j. King Tech and rapper Sway, along with East Coast master of the tables Joe Quixx, have been hosting the San Francisco-area KMEL's award-winning Fridaynight "The Wake Up Show" for the past four years, and recently expanded to KKBT in Los Angeles. Quixx was a master mixer and King Tech a "break dancer" when they first met in the early '80s d.j.'ing local high school parties. In '86, Tech met up with an Oaktown MC named Sway, and the two formed All-City Records, a partnership that blew up the hip-hop scene in the Bay Area. When Tech won a battle of the d.j.s sponsored by KMEL in 1989, he was hired by the station to do a Tuesday night mix show, which eventually grew into Friday night's "The Wake Up Show," with the addition of Joe Quixx and Sway, thanks to the foresight of station PD Keith Naftaly. On the strength of the program, KMEL earned Rap Station of the Year Award from some other trade magazine three years in a row. When Naftaly moved down to L.A.'s KKBT earlier this year, he took "The Wake Up Show" with him, as Sway, Tech and Joe Quixx fly back and forth between NoCal and SoCal doing several shows including "The 7 O'Clock Bomb" (on KKBT Thursdays and Fridays), "The Ten O'Clock Bomb" (on KMEL Tuesdays through Thursdays), "Diggin' In The Crates" (KKBT, Sundays from 6-9 pm) as well as "The Wake Up Show" (Fridays on KMEL 10 pm -1 am, Saturdays on KKBT from 9 to Midnight). With all that activity, it was a wonder the guys had any time at all to waste with HITS' master of the mix malaprop, Ricky Leigh "Do

You Know What He's Talking About?" Mensh.

Tell us about "The Wake-Up Show." KING TECH: Me, Sway and Joe Quixx founded the show because we felt there was a lot of good rap that people slept on because the record labels did not know how to push their product in our market. Keith Naftaly gave us the opportunity to come on the air and represent hip-hop for two hours. We called it "The Wake Up Show" not because it was in the morning, but because we thought people were sleepin' on good rap music. We felt like it was time to say, "Just because it's on rotation doesn't mean it's the only rap record out! Go check in your store, listen to our show and we'll give you clues as to where these records are." It was time to say wake up. Flip off some of the groups that you were instrumental in airing for the first time. SWAY: Me and Tech started All-City Records, where we worked with MC's from the Bay Area as well as New York. We worked with Mysterme, which later got signed to Gee St./Island. We also worked with Motion Man, who we later signed to Tommy Boy. We just did a distribution deal with Priority and Bryan Turner is going to release some of our groups, including Endangered Species, a hip-hop duo from Harlem, which consists of O Smack and C-Deaf. TECH: We feel we've got to the point where we can alter people's careers, man. If we feel like the record's gonna happen, we have the power to go to the table and say, "Look, man, this is it." A lot of records we brought to the table have gone on to become hits, whether the label's behind it or not. I wonna put things on the air that will take music to another level. Not the same shit that's already out. Any advice you can give to record companies in marketing their hip-hop and dance product?





Time for some psyche-

delic fur-trapping with Love Spit Love's **Richard Butler**

iguring if he never Γ heard "Love My Way" again it would be too soon, Richard Butler disbanded the Psychedelic Furs back in 1991 after over ten years of seemingly endless playing and touring. Butler has a new band (Love Spit Love), a new label (Imago) and a new record ("Love Spit Love"), so why is it all anyone wants to talk about are the Furs? Butler is used to this by now and will answer any question gamely. Does he ever listen to old Furs records? (No. and why should he? He knows what they sound like.) Does he think there will ever be a reunion? (God, he hopes not.) Is he sick of questions like these? "Oh no," he says politely. "Please, ask me some more." Love Spit Love ---which included Butler's brother Tim. a Furs holdover, on bass, for the album, but not for the touring band --sounds, in its more drastic moments, like a Nine Inch Nails record. The Furs never did anything like it. "I know," says Butler. "Isn't that great?" What wasn't so great was having to explain it all to HITS' spokesperson for her generation Allison "Thinks Beck's A Dork" Stewart.

So what happened to the Furs? Did vou all just get sick of each other?

Well, it wasn't only that we'd been working together for over ten years, it was just that it had become predictable. If I had an idea for a song, I knew exactly what it would sound like with that particular group of musicians. I'm not saying they were bad musicians... they were the fucking Furs, you know? It all ended amicably. No one was really shocked. They were great, but I wanted something that was just as excittold that it's very unsingle-like. It would apparently be commercial suicide. I don't think the record sounds like the Furs so much, but it's difficult to get away from it entirely, because I've got the same voice, and the same sense of melody that I've always had. If I tried to totally divorce myself from it, it would sound artificial. It's hard enough to write songs without having to go, "Wait a minute, that sounds too much like the Furs. Well, throw it away then."

You're not playing any old




ing as the Furs were at the beginning, something that was interesting and unusual for me. I'd worn a path, so I just wanted to get out there, meet some new people and do something that didn't sound like what I'd been doing. It's funny that you would say that, since the first single, "Am I Wrong?," is the one song on the record

that sounds like an old Furs song. 1 know, 1 know. I would have

chosen "Jigsaw," but I've been

Furs songs during your shows. Have people been giving you a hard time about that?

I was expecting people to be shouting out old song titles and things like that, but they haven't so far. I'm sure it's gonna happen, but I don't want to do them and I won't. It would seem like a bit of a cop-out to do them; like a cheap way to get applause by playing something that's familiar. Besides, I'm sick of those songs. The longer you're with a hand,



the heavier the baggage you have. When you're writing out a set list, you always have people going, "Oh, you've gotta play 'Pretty In Pink' or 'Love My Way'," or whatever and soon your entire set is hits

Having too many hits isn't exactly most people's idea of traumatic.

Yeah, but just because they're hits doesn't mean you wanna go out and play them every night! It's still baggage. For example, we've played "Love My Way" on every tour since we wrote it... same with "Pretty In Pink." It's a hit of pressure, you know, and not one I enjoy.

Is it scary to be out on your own, virtually having to start all over again in the clubs?

I think it's exciting. I love it. But even when we were in the Furs, we'd play clubs. We did a sort of a press tour last time around where we just played clubs. I hate them. Don't be silly... everybody likes clubs. They're our roots.

Yeah, well, to hell with that. I don't like my roots. All these big acts who do club tours and say, "Oh, we wanted to be more intimate and see people's faces," it's rubbish, don't believe them. They just weren't selling tickets. I don't want to go back to my club days. I don't want to look back. Although, having said that, the other day some guy asked me, "This record is sort of alternativsounding. Do you think you're jumping on the alternative bandwagon?" And I was like, "Uh, I thought I was one of the people who invented alternative!" When we first started playing America, there was no label like "alternative music." Back then, it was the Clash, U2 and us. R.E.M. and the B-52's were just getting started. We were it; we were alternative music, whatever that means. Do you get a lot of other artists coming up to you and telling you what an

influence you've been? Yeah, but half the time I don't hear it. I heard where Kurt

Cobain was doing an interview and he said he hoped we didn't sue him, because he'd been doing a bit of "Sister Europe" on one of the songs on "Incesticide," but I listened to it and I couldn't hear it. What's worse is, if it's a hand I don't like, and they tell me what a huge influence I've been, l just kind of go, "Oh, uhmm.... really?"

HOUS SMORGASBORD AND A BACK RUB WITH ACE OF BASE BY DOMINIC GRIFFIN

ess than a year ago, Swedish pop band Ace Of Base signed on with Arista Records and released their American debut, "The Sign." The first single, "All That She Wants," exploded right up the charts, garnering airplay everywhere, including alternative leader KROQ in Los Angeles. While not considered a "grunge" band anymore, the band has sold a staggering eight million copies-plus worldwide. Two more singles — including the title track and "Don't Turn Around" — have also gone Top 10 and even if you wanted to, nothing seems capable of stopping those sweet pop melodies tinged with reggae beats from complete and utter world domination.

While on a recent press stop in the City Of Angels, HITS' own Swedish Meatball, Dominic "Is A Huge Anita Ekberg Fan" Griffin, was invited to meet the femme part of the Ace of Base equation — 23-yearold Jenny Berggren and younger sister Linn, a mere baby at 22. Thankfully, big brother Jonas and blonde bombshell Ulf Ekberg were nowhere in sight when the trio were sequestered in a private room so the girls could munch on their lunches of chicken and steak, and Griffin could watch them masticate while posing the following inane queries.

"The Sign" is actually a compilation album, isn't it?

Jenny: No, this is the album that we wanted to do from the beginning, but things happened so fast, we didn't have time. We only had one-and-a-half months to record a new album and you don't do that. We made one EP that we released in Europe, but Arista wanted more tracks and we didn't deny them because we wanted this record to come out and we had no time to record more tracks, vou see.

Are you happy with how everything's going?

Linn: The only thing we're not happy with is the time difference. It is tiring and we have a tight schedule, but that's the way we want it. We want to work.

I meant the way the record company was handling things.

Linn: The only thing we're not happy about is the talk about "the new ABBA." Yes, we are from Sweden, and there are four of us, but the thing about ABBA is, we're not styled and they were super-styled in those days. The press just find it good to ride on the ABBA wave.

In your documentary, you said, as young kids, you would sing ABBA songs. I happen to think they're still a great band. Why do you resist the comparisons?

Jenny: The thing is, when we actually got our record deal, we didn't succeed in Sweden at first, but in Denmark, we released "All That She Wants" last August ('93) and it went to the top of the charts there. But we hadn't really shown our faces, so everyone thought we were a black group from London. When we finally showed up, it took a very long time before anyone said anything about ABBA until we started to travel outside of Scandinavia. As soon as we

went to Israel, people started bringing up ABBA. The thing is, thing and we build our music around melodies. Other

if there were

five of

us, people wouldn't mention ABBA because they don't sound like us at all.

Linn, do you do most of the singing?

Linn: Not really. I do most of the slow songs because I'm very much into black soul music and Jenny does the faster songs. Because the slower songs were the ones released first, people think I do all the singing.

There's got to be a certain amount of sibling rivalry between both of you. Linn: Rivalry?

I mean, like competition.

Jenny: There was when we started out, but I've realized I have to take a step back because Linn is doing the songs which were chosen as singles. I was angry a little, but now I realize it doesn't have to always be that way. I am more content and secure now. "The Sign" is more interesting because we both sing and that's how the guys want to work with us in the future. We have different voices and I guess they go quite good together.

Why do you think Ace Of Base blew up like it did?

Linn: Because of the melodies. Also, you can sell our style to people... we don't say controversial things to newspapers. I wish you would.

Linn: With us, the music is the

European dance artists get a good bass line and a drum beat and they just sample some girls to sing, "Ba ba ba, ba ba ba," and they use it over and over in every song. We have lyrics and good melodies.

What's happening with the next album?

Jenny: Well, we finish this press tour and then we go home to Sweden to go back in the studio. Linn and I will be writing songs this time. I have already made one song for the next album.

What is it called?

Jenny: I'm not allowed to say that, yet.

Linn: We have been writing songs as long as our brother, it's just that he is older. He knows what he's doing and he's better at the technical side, so he's been developing more, but now, we are at that age where we are mature enough to do our own thing. Your bandmates use the

nicknames "Joker" and "Budda." Why?

<u>Linn</u>: 'Cause they want to have their lives here and have their lives there.

Was there a particular moment when you realized this record was going to be huge?

Jenny: The first sign I got was when I stopped caring about position on the charts; it was when we became #30 in Germany. That's the third biggest music market in the world and I felt like, "OK, this is going somewhere where I don't want to be," so I decided to stop caring.

What have been the benefits of your success so far?

Jenny: We get to see a lot of places. I had always wanted to go to the

States and maybe spend a month traveling around, but

I knew that would cost a lot of money and we would never get that much money. Now we get to go to Japan and everywhere.

Have you seen any of the financial rewards yet?

Jenny: At Easter, I brought some student friends of mine up to a cottage in the mountains of Sweden to go skiing. I've been a student and I know they can't afford it. We were able to pay for the trip because now we get a salary from Arista. Before, I couldn't afford it.

Are you going on a U.S. tour with this record?

Jenny: No, but we have toured in Europe.

Linn: We are going to wait to do another album first, which will come out at the start of '95, and then we'll have enough material for a tour. Right now, we only have one record out, so what could we do? "All That She Wants" five times?

How about some ABBA covers?

Jenny: [Laughs] Maybe. We're still going to wait until one more record.

Will you go back to the same studio next to the car repair shop for your next record?

Jenny: [Laughs] No, I think we have grown too big for that. The studio was part of a government-subsidized scheme. In Sweden, no matter if they're from the left or right, the government will give you a grant to create music.

Let Freedy Ring

TIME FOR SOME PLEASURE AND PAIN WITH FREEDY JOHNSTON BY MICHELLE MARIETTA

reedy Johnston is one of the nicest, most intelligent people around, despite his response of "You made that up" when confronted with a rumor regarding what he requires on his rider at live shows. His new album, "This Perfect World" (Elektra), is a wonderful continuation of lovely, familiar melodies and perfectly believeable lyrics. While Freedy admits that many of his songs exploit pop music clichés, each is geared towards making you smile in spite of the pain, and maybe even enjoy it. The lyrics are a salve in his attempts to resolve his past, twangy country-pop guitar included. Produced by Butch Vig, "This Perfect World" is a foil to its creator. While Freedy can be the nice, honest, approachable guy next door, his newest collection of songs shows what we can all be on the inside - damaged, torn, and deceptive. HITS' own damaged, torn and deceptive Michelle Marietta "Georgia" peels off the layers of skin to get at the blood and guts below. Yeccchhh!!!

How does it feel to be making your major label debut after several releases on Bar/None?

The guys at Bar/None are my friends, worked hard for me and were on my side ... they still are. They were really happy to see me go to Elektra. I've got a little more freedom here. Bar/None sort of walked me through "Can You Fly" and at Elektra, it was more like, "Go away and make a good record - we know you did it last time... now go away and do it again." They didn't want to make me into something I wasn't. Elektra is great - it's where I wanted to be. My mother always told me, if you can't say anything nice to not say anything. When an artist chooses a label, you choose it because you think it's the best place for you. Don't complain afterwards, because

you made that decision, not someone else. What made you decide to work with Butch Vig?

Butch was a logical choice since he's from the Midwest... a hard worker and a nice guy. When [Elektra A&R executive] Nancy [Jeffries] asked me who I wanted to produce, I told her Butch, and right at that time he wanted to do something different. It was really flattering to me because he's produced all these multi-platinum acts like the Pumpkins and Nirvana as well as Sonic Youth.

Smart is a great studio in beautiful Madison, Wisconsin. It's small and nondescript, with boarded-up windows. Butch is really meticulous. I'd do something and he'd say, "That was great, Freedy. Now do it for me just like that four more times," and I'd say, "Oh shit," and then do it anyway. He's worth his weight in gold. He works 14 hours a day. I could never do that.

How did you enjoy touring with Cowboy Junkies?

It's nice because there were people that came to see the shows who were definitely my fans. I wasn't sure if the Junkies fans were going to get my music, but then I'd be out on-stage and the people would all be listening. I thought they'd all be talking through my sets. I didn't expect it to be successful, but it was and it was great. As for the new tour, I'm going out with just the band. I'll fly ahead of them to do some press, then they'll show up and we'll do the show.

What music do you listen to at home?

I'm not really a big collector of music nor am I really up on the new stuff. I wish I was on someone's mailing list so I'd get all the new cool stuff. I really like the Urge record and Liz Phair. I really like the old stuff - Sinatra, Steve Wonder, Hank Williams, George Jones, Merle Haggard. It was really cool a while back ... I was at some radio station and Emmylou Harris was there and I'm a huge fan of hers and she was out in the hallway, so I went up to her and said, "I love you!" and she said thanks, but had no idea who I was ... just some weirdo in the hall at the station, but it was so cool to just be able to say that to her.

What books have you read lately?

I'm not a real well-read guy. When I do read, it's mostly non-fiction. I like Martin Amis and Nabokov — both are masters of the language. Raymond Chandler. PG Wodehouse, the guy who invented Jeeves the Butler. I mostly draw from non-fiction... like biographies. That way I'm just getting the info, and I'm not criticizing the author or the style. It's the contents that interests me.

Do you ever think that you'll make the switch from Freedy to just a guy in a band?

It's always been a fantasy of mine to be just a hired gun — to be a member of a band, not a personality. My songwriting would have to change, but then again I'm so autocratic that I don't think it would really be that easy. I know myself, and I think that the rest of the band having equal say would last about two days. I'd definitely have to create a band; I couldn't join one.

What about hanging up your guitar and producing someone else?

I've never been presumptuous enough to think that I could produce someone, not even myself. Producers tell you how to go... they guide you. I don't know if I'd really be that good at it. I don't think I have the temperament, the focus or the skill. I'd rather just know what I want and tell someone else what that is and have them take it there. Maybe one day, down the line...



ith the release of "Life Model" (Beggars Banquet), their first record since 1991, the Blue Aeroplanes re-emerge boasting their most stable line-up since the band's ambitious electrified folk noise first leaked out of Bristol, UK ten years ago. Of course, this being the Blue Aeroplanes, all that means is that three of the band's seven faces are familiar, and two of them — singer/poet/ring leader Gerard Langley and dancer Wojtek Dmechowski - don't even play an instrument. Rodney Allen, barely a teenager when he first joined, is now the veteran member of the guitar-and-music writing troika. Along with the new members, there is also a new label, the band ending up on Beggars Banquet after Ensign dissolved following the SBK/EMI/Chrysalis merger. Other than that, the Aeroplanes are at their familiar best, with Langley's nuanced lyrical delivery set apace to scintillating pop, apocalyptic guitar balladry and even acoustic folk with a bit

even acoustic folk with a bit of pretentious French recitation. Speaking of pretentious French recitation, HITS' own bilingual Jason "And the Argonauts" Cohen tackled Langley in the tongue he knows best — utter nonsense. How come Angelo Bruschini left the band after co-writing and co-producing most of this album?

Angelo's given very different reasons to very different people. I personally think he got on a bit of a plateau. He decided, as he hit 30, he was going to concentrate more on the studio... to be a session guitarist and produce. The arrangements and vocals on two or three of the tracks on "Life Model" were finished after he decided to leave.

So who is in the band now? John, the lead guitar player, was recommended by Angelo and he plays very similarly to Angelo, but he's eight years younger. Everyone falls over and runs around more now. We used [ex-member] Alex Lee for a while, but he's now in a band called Strangelove with my brother [another forTime to fasten your seat belts and lower your tray tables with Blue Aeroplanes' Gerard Langley by Jason Cohen a little more melody in the guitar lines to work off. mer Aeroplane]. Alex recommended this kid called Max, who used to be in a band called Eat. He's a bit of a brat packer — Rodney calls him River.

Rodney is, in fact, the same age as the bass player and the other guitarist. He was 20 when he joined us, but we used to tell everybody in America he was 14. They'd all go, "Oh wow, don't you have problems with passports?" By way of explaining the songwriting process, how did four people come to be credited for the song "Mercury"? next record in the can?

We formed a set line-up for touring and they wanted to record some stuff for the album as well, so we wrote another six or seven tracks. We've got about 25 songs. There's no real pressure because "Life Model" is just coming out in the States, so I can really work on it and make it definitive. This album is deliberately meant to sound big. Everyone's commented on what they call the American nature of the sound. To me, all of our albums have sounded like that. A lot of people are against English bands — in England and in the States. We were always perceived as being part of the R.E.M. thing. R.E.M. are almost a perfect example of what an intelligent band should do in terms of achieving something with dignity. There are a whole set of bands which are transatlantic. I feel much more aligned to things like Cracker than I do any of the U.K. bands. I really like the Beck album. In my mind, he's the son of someone like Skip Spence, put in a room for two days with my mate Jazz Butcher to write lyrics, with unlimited drugs and drinks. Then they put him in a room with [Oyster band leader/part-time Aeroplane] Ian Keary for music, and give it all to Massive Attack to mix. Are you planning to do any spoken-word stuff?

In essence, most of what I do on record is spoken. I'm kind of amused by the fact that over the last half a dozen years, people said we were resolutely uncommercial because I spoke rather than sang. I tried to point out to those people that the biggest growth area in music was rap. We're just using guitars rather than beats. A lot of people ask why I don't rap, but to me, the last thing the world needs is another English intellectual pretending to be a rapper from Queens. I'm about as likely to do a rap album as Public Enemy are to do an album of English folk songs. Somebody once asked me to describe the band, and I said it was like a male Laurie Anderson fronting the Faces. What we do is not really like anything else. You may not like it, but if you want it, we're doing it. If not, buy a BTO album.

I read where you said you were the best-known living poet in England.

I talk to some of these literary guys and they're really happy if they sell a thousand books. By the end of this year, I'm going to have sold a quarter of a million records. It's not R.E.M., but it's not bad... especially for a poet. ■ five musicians, a road manager, a sound guy, a roadle with a bad haircut, 1000 pounds of gear, 5 or 5 magazines, a well-worn copy of Hammer of the Gods, over 400 comic books, a goldfish and a hell of a lot of t-shirts stuffed in a van traveling at dangerously high speeds down harrow roads in the dead of hight...

Time to go scuba-diving with Hootie & the Blowfish's Darius Rucker BY DOMINIC GRIFFIN

To many, the name may make it awfully difficult for 10,000 fans to scream in unison, but Hootie & the Blow Fish (singer/guitarist Darius Rucker, bassist/vocalist Dean Felber, guitarist/vocalist Mark Bryan and drummer/vocalist Soni) think otherwise. Formed nine

years ago in the unlikely suburbs of Columbia, South Carolina, the four-piece has been touring incessantly since and for the past three years, have been doing it full-time. In 1992, they released a five-song EP, recorded in five days, that went on to sell 50,000 copies. While some labels were none too impressed with their "unhip-where's-the-streetcred?-all-they-do-is-write-songs" sound, others couldn't ignore the sales figures. Eventually, A&R exec Tim Sommer and Atlantic won out and inked them. But more importantly, producer svengali Don Gehman was impressed enough with their EP that he offered to produce their major label debut. With their career soaring, vocal stylist Rucker pretty much parked it in the swimming pool by talking to HITS iap-puppy of the industry, **Dominic "The Singing None"** Griffin.

How do you feel about pigeonholing music in a specific genre?

Everybody has tried to label us, but most people are wrong.

We're not alternative. We're not trying to be Pearl Jam or Nirvana. That's not what we do. We write pop songs, not alternative songs. There are people who trash us 'cause of the alternative thing. I don't see it. Having said that, the first thing a record promotion department does is label you.

The latest trend is Adult Album Alternative, which you seem to fit into.

It seems now that we are the alternative to the alternative. Since Pearl Jam and Nirvana are selling all the records, we're on the outside, the guys who just play music. Everything goes in cycles in this country. The last time singer/songwriters were selling records was in the '70s with the likes of Jackson Browne and the Eagles.

Is the fact that you're black an issue?

I have to address it every single day. Every day I've got to deal with some ignorant asshole or somebody discriminating against me. I think it's helped the band, though, 'cause they also have to deal with it. It's helped them come to grips with things they haven't been accustomed to. They've never questioned anything I write. I'm a Southern black man with a great many feelings about what goes on in the U.S.A. and what I think is wrong.

What does it mean for you to be on a major label?

It's another step to where we wanna be. I didn't sign with Atlantic just because I just wanted to make a record or to sell records; I wanted to make a good record. We could've gone in and recorded an album in five days. But we wanted to make the best record we



could and Atlantic allowed us to do that. You write all the lyrics?

Everyone contributes songs; I just have a hard time singing someone else's lyrics. When I sing, it's an emotional thing and if I didn't write the words, then they don't mean to me what they should.

Have you ever thought about doing a solo record?

It'll never happen. But there is a lot of acoustic stuff I write that I

wouldn't take to the band. I wanna say some things a certain way and when I take stuff to the band, it turns into something different. For instance, I wrote "Drowning" as a country song, but when I gave it to Soni, he wrote the chorus and it became a rocker. Maybe someday someone will let me do a solo record, but I'm never going to leave H&TBF. We worked too hard to get this far. We've come a long way from Columbia, South Carolina.

What would constitute success for this band?

The day that you sit down and say, "Now I'm successful," is the day your creativity stops. I really feel we have already been successful with this record. All we wanted to do was make a disc that we were proud of and we've accomplished that. We've made the best record possible with the best producer we could find at the time. It's a great feeling

to know that if this record does sell two million copies, the only thing that'll change about me is my bank account. Although it sounds cliché, once you figure out who you are deep down, money won't change that. Just because our pictures are in magazines, we sell records and we're on MTV, does that make us better people? If you had your choice to open for anyone, who would it be?

This is just me, but I'd go out with Toad The Wet Sprocket, Bonnie Raitt and John Hiatt in a heartbeat. And, of course, R.E.M. Everyone has this thing about not citing R.E.M. as an influence and that's the biggest bunch of crap I've ever heard. If you were an American teenager in college in the '8os, R.E.M. influenced you. I'd love to go out on the road with them.

Any other influences?

I listened to Al Green every day of my life growing up... Barry White and Otis Redding, too. All these white college kids think "Take Me To The River" is a huge Talking Heads song.

That's gotta be in complete contrast to your band mates.

The rest of 'em grew up listening to classic rock, Lynyrd Skynyrd and Black Sabbath. They keep on listening to the new Pavement record. It's cool, though, I also grew up listening to the Beatles. My Momma had all their 455.



"Cold Comfort" is about a reflection on a particular moment. I am a very fortunate person. There are not many people on this planet who do what they love to do best. I had

uka Bloom arrived at his hotel promptly in style, exiting a black Lincoln Town Car, greeting me in the lobby with a smile and taking me with him to the counter to retrieve his messages. This 39-year-old Irish troubadour, with dark brown hair parted in the middle resting gently at his chin — like his childhood idol Neil Young - and wearing an oversized print shirt with khaki pants, is clearly comfortable and confident in New York City. But, like many poets, Luka - born Barry Moore, younger brother to the hugely popular Irish folk legend Christy Moore - had to fight many battles with himself in order to achieve his own recognition and voice. "Turf" represents his third effort for Reprise, beginning with his U.S. debut "Riverside" in 1990, followed by "Acoustic Motorbike" in 1992. It too, is a deeply personal, lyrical and heartfelt work which features him on his acoustic guitar.

Dropping out of college in the '70s to play folk clubs in Europe under the name of Barry Moore, he floundered. He changed his style in the '80s, influenced by Simple Minds and U2, briefly putting together a band called Red Square. Amid the confusion, Moore decided to give up drinking to see if it would change his fortune. Although his career still didn't pick up, his head did, and in 1987, he decided to try the shores of America with \$200 in his pocket, leaving his longtime girlfriend and family behind and changing his name on the trans-Atlantic flight to Luka (after the character in Suzanne Vega's song) Bloom (after the character in James Joyce's "Ulysses").

HITS' N.Y.C. correspondent and the daughter Florence and Walter wish they had two of, Janet "Never Heard of Roy" Trakin compares the neuroses quotient of Jewish vs. Irish childhoods with the pop bard. **Who helped you stop drinking?**

It was my own decision. I didn't need to look outside of myself. I was at a certain point of my life where I knew I was going absolutely nowhere very quickly. I don't mean just musically, but in every sense of the word. I needed to stop, and I had wanted to for some time, but I couldn't seem to get it together. I finally did. **Did you ever resent your brother for his success** while you struggled?

There were always those moments, because we're a close family. It was very painful for me to be in Ireland writing these songs and just being completely ignored. But most of my anger would have been directed either at myself or the people that weren't able to take me on board. It was as hard for my brother as it was for me. He knew that I had a gift and was talented, and it pissed him off that I wasn't getting anywhere. It was a nuisance to him, but obviously not as much as it was for me. I couldn't ever say that I was resentful of him. There were moments of frustration rather than resentment. Was your decision to come to America a spontaneous one?

It happened very quickly, but when I think about it, it's odd that it took me so long to get around it. I started listening to American songwriters when I was 16, and I was 31 when I came to America. I was a very fearful kind of person for a long time, hiding behind bottles for many years. By the time I was 31, I had no choice but to go somewhere. At that point, it was obvious that I'd have to come here.

Was changing your name to Luka Bloom an outgrowth of the move, a way of starting over?

Absolutely. It was spiritual and emotional and definitely had an enlightening effect. It was very liberating. It's the theatrical thing of the mask. You don't conceal yourself by donning a mask, you liberate yourself to reveal even more of yourself. It stripped away some of my self-consciousness.

When you finally started to achieve recognition in America, why didn't you stay? Is that what "Cold Comfort" on the new album is about?

a difficult life, yes, but the bottom line is, I can play and I can sing, I've got something to give, and that's a great gift to have. But there are moments when the loneliness is overwhelming. I was living in Washington, DC at the time and traveling to New York, and it was a freezing cold winter, which I remember well. I felt like a lucky man in that moment because there were times I just didn't feel that way when I was struggling. I moved back to Ireland because of my family, but I would be very happy to live here again.

When you returned to Ireland from America, did you ever get back with the woman you left behind?

Not really. We split up very soon after I came back. It died a natural death.

Is "Right Here, Right Now" about the tendency of human beings to deprive each other of happiness?

It's about human beings who deprive themselves of happiness by being too analytical of every situation and losing touch with the reality that anybody on this planet who has the ability to walk and talk and sleep and breathe has such a head start on so many others in the world.


"Sunny Sailor Boy" was given to you by your friend Mike Scott of the Waterboys.

It's one of the greatest gifts that has ever been given to me. He wrote it and sang it once, and I was there when he did. We were on the same bill doing a show together. I talked to him about it later, and he gave it to me.

As a vegetarian and reformed drinker, do you consider yourself a politically correct folksinger?

[Laughs] I ain't a folksinger and I ain't politically correct. If you want to label me a folksinger, then you have to label Henry Rollins a folksinger. It's a label I detest. A folksinger describes what I do as accurately as acid/jazz describes Us3. Politically correct is a meaningless term to me.

The Figgs, "Lo-Fi At Society High" (Imago): If you took four punk-rock kids from upsate New York and fed them a steady diet of classic English punk-rock and pop, i.e. the Undertones. the Attractions and the Buzzcocks, and filtered it through the craggy lens of Paul Westerberg, you'd have what could be the debut album of the year. You'd also have a heap-

ing helping of Figgs. The mission statement "Let's Go Pop" opens an album rich and fruity in pop gems like the perfectly unsteady "Wasted Pretty" and the lusty first single "Favorite Shirt." Producer Don Gehman provides his trademark crystalline magic to this PoMo sure-thing. Dig Figgs.

Luscious Jackson, "Natural Ingredients" (Grand Royal/Capitol): Four furiously imaginative white girls from the Lower East Side, Luscious Jackson are survivors of the same early '80s hip-hop scene that belched out the Beastie Boys (who used to have LJ's Kate Schellenbach as their drummer). Filtering jazz and funk grooves through a hip-hop prism and



running a seamless sample loop through the whole thing, Luscious Jackson sound loose and winning, like they're not afraid of anything, while songs like "CitySong" easily and thankfully resist the temptation to sound novelty-act cute. (Allison Stewart)



Katell Keineg, "O Seasons O Castles" (Elektra): The field of wispy European women with guitars grows increasingly more crowded, but Katell Keineg is far less airy, and far more able, than most of them. Keineg, who's from France but picked up a thick Celtic accent along the way, has a low, sweet voice that soars and

growls its way through her remarkable debut. Some numbers get dressed up with a full orchestra, but most songs (Like "Partisan," which comes off like catchy, pared-down Sara MacLachlan), sound steady and assured enough without it. (Allison Stewart)

Jules Shear, "Healing Bones" (Polydor): Master crafter Jules Shear pops up with Polydor disc 2 to continue his living legacy of disarmingly earnest songwriting. Though backed by the able guitar of Cars vet Elliot Easton and the 20-foot anchor of Tony Levin's deep, deep bass (not to mention Jerry Marotta's übergroove), the focus here is clearly on the songs and Shear's strong,



resonant voice. From freewheeling strum und twang ("Two Friends") to supple, eloquent string accompaniment ("Never Again Or Forever"), the production is refreshingly spare and up-front, allowing Shear's lyrical and melodic craft the subtle context it deserves. He's gonna heal your bones. (Jon C'Hara)







"First Class Only" (Scotti Bros.), is just that. On the Q-Tip: Aaron Hall's "When You Need Me" (Silas/MCA). Azz for Jazz: Kim Waters' "It's Time For Love" (Warlock).



RADIO: Simplicity II: On-air promotions. You may decide to go with teaser liners and/or promos. These must be short and simple in order to effectively pique curiosity. You'll need an explanatory promo. If you can hold it to :30 seconds (not likely), great. In any event, keep it as short and simple as possible. Would a listener grasp this on the first or second listen? Not certain? Then re-think it. Your supporting promos should certainly be :30 seconds or less. And supporting liners: A one-line liner is better than two-lines, and so on. The longer you talk, the more complicated it becomes and the less likely the listener will be to participate, directly or vicariously. Remember: As a listener, I deal with complexities by *not* dealing with them at all. Later.



To the surprise of many, the Blockbuster/Viacom merger that had seemed all but dead, as recently as last month, now seems to be alive and kicking. With the \$8.4 billion merger agreement due to expire at the end of September, most onlookers had totally written off the possibility of the mega-coalition being finalized. But now, with Viacom's Class B stocks rebounding, the biggest obstacle to the success of the venture may be hurdled in the nick of time. Earlier this year, when the merger was first announced, Blockbuster's stock stood at about \$29, but took an immediate beating (going as low as \$24 at one point) due to the immense debt load being carried by Viacom. It now stands at around \$28. Viacom's stock, which had plunged from \$41 to \$22, is now back up to \$35.75, tantalizingly close to the \$38 needed to consummate the deal. Stay tuned... Accompanying another less-than-sterling fiscal report by Transworld, a persistent rumor has been making the rounds. Although no one is commenting to the press, insiders are denying that Camelot is buying the 180-store Tape World chain (which is currently going through a name change to Music World) from the beleaguered giant. Transworld is currently

Richie Gallo and his wife Dawn on the birth of their son Carter James. The new Gallo was bom in Los Angeles, June 15... 
