Officer of Mercury Records in New York by Poly-Gram President and Chief Executive Officer Alain "Goodbye, I'm" Levy.

Goldberg, who was previously Chairman/CEO of Warner Bros. Records from January to August '95 and President of Atlantic Records from January '94 to December '94, replaces Ed Eckstine, who leaves to start his own PolyGramfunded and distributed label. Goldberg joins a PolyGram management team that includes A&M's Al Cafaro, Island's John Barbis and Chris Blackwell, Def Jam's Russell Simmons and Lyor Cohen and recently named Motown President Andre Harrell.

Said Levy: "Danny Gold-

berg has a great track record as an artist-friendly music executive and a keen feel for trends in the marketplace. I'm sure he will fit in well with the other PolyGram label presidents... as soon as we get him into some de-

signer European suits and out of those lame cardigans and kha-

kis. I also look forward to having him rebuild the existing artist roster and order the entire staff free subscriptions to the Village Voice.

"I'd also like to thank Ed for his contribution to Mercury. I'm thrilled he will continue working with us. How else would I get to sit in his Knicks courtsides?"

Commented Eckstine: "I've loved working at Mercury and I'll miss the people there. However, I look forward to getting back to what I love best — working in a hands-on creative manner, directing a small number of artists and playing point guard for the Knicks. Now if only Ewing would pass me the ball."

Of God And Goo

Not to get too "Timbo-esque" on you or anything, but Warner Bros.' Goo Goo Dolls and Mercury's Joan Osborne, two of the most remarkable multi-format success stories of 1995, stand poised for huge breakthrough success because of songs that examine lofty concepts by way of directly accessible and beautifully simple pop. And with the help of their labels' unswerving commitment and some radio folks who knew the genuine article when they heard it, the Goo Goo Dolls' "Name" and Joan Osborne's

"One Of Us" look to be mass appeal radio staples.

"It's really a combination of a lot of hard work, some luck and Kevin Weatherly's ability to pick a hit," said Warner Bros. Sr. VP/GM Jeff Gold. The only apparent downside was that KROQ's Weatherly had chosen to add "Name," a track he had fallen in love with over the preceding weekend, over the label's track of choice, "Flat Top." Suddenly, the album started selling in reaction to the L.A. airplay at a pace the label hadn't seen with other singles and Gold and crew elected to

make the switch to "Name."


"We probably would have gone for 'Name' after 'Flat Top,' but this was a happy accident. Our skill was taking advantage of that," added Jeff.

Similarly, Joan Osborne's rapid ascent began when a PoMo radio visionary elected to spin the heaven-brought-down-to-earth "One Of Us."

"We knew that 'One Of Us' was a breakthrough song and APM laid a solid foundation for its success. Brian Phillips and his

crew at 99X were the first to step out on the track at Post Modern in April, and when they really

stepped on it, the sales, requests and research were undeniable," said Mercury Exec. VP David Leach. "KROQ was among the PoMo stations that came in early, and with their excitement and passion for Joan, they were the catalyst take it to the next level. We knew we had an incredible piece of music and an exciting artist — the music spoke for itself."

Records Vice Chairman and "Spirit Of Liberty" award recipient David Altschul, who was honored for being such an ardent supporter of liberal causes that his left knee jerks involuntarily even while fast asleep. Moments later, the two executives nearly suffocated under the massive weight of resumes thrown at Mr. Ostin.

Virgin Looks To Smash Pumpkins

Virgin artist Smashing Pumpkins' sprawling new double-CD, "Mellon Collie and the Infinite Sadness," is off to a flying start with last Monday's (10/23) midnight release and the accompanying national satellite broadcast of the band's concert at the 1.000seat Riviera in their hometown of Chicago. The first single, "Bullet and Butterfly Wings," is already huge at Post Modern and MTV and quickly breaking at Top 40 with instant phone reaction. All signs point to a smashing debut on next week's HITS' Top 50 Albums chart, perfectly timed for Halloween.

"I believe we can grow the fan base of this band without blowing off their core audience," said label President/CEO Phil Quartararo, who adds the launch is part of "an 18-24 month campaign" for the album, the group's first all-new studio recording since '93's "Siamese Dream," which has sold more than 3.5 million. They also have new management, recently inking with Q-Prime's Cliff Burnstein and Peter Mensch, joining fellow alternarock heavies Hole and Veruca Salt.

Quartararo is confident the

double-CD's 28 tracks and more than two hours of music will offer fans value for money, with a suggested retail price of \$24.98, far lower than similar packages "and only \$5.\$6 more than a single CD," according to the Virgin exec.

"They have left nothing to chance with this project," says Quartararo. "This is something [band leader] Billy [Corgan] has been working on for a long time."

Last Monday's live broadcast was heard on over 70 stations, including WNEW and WAXQ in N.Y., KROQ in L.A. and WXRT, WKQX and WRCX in Chicago. And, despite Corgan's professed reluctance to tour, Quartararo is confident once "he has a chance to re-group and get off the treadmill of writing and recording the album, he'll come up for air" and reconsider.

"Billy's anxious, prepared and ready to go," he adds. "And he's provided us with enough images, marketing and promotional tools to work with, so he can just go out there, play and focus on that. Now what section of Billboard did you say this would be in?"

IT'S A DUTCH TREAT AGAIN...

FAILING THE

n my last column, I touched on a subject that demands serious further exploration namely the validity, value and use/misuse of call-out research in today's Top 40 environment. I contend that what is indeed a valuable tool is being applied incorrectly in many cases, much to the detriment of the stations.

There seems to be this arbitrary 6-8 week window that programmers are giving new music to "test" — and tunes are getting yanked off the air every week that don't show strongly enough quickly enough. The problem here is that virtually nothing really "tests well" in this short a period of time. PDs pride themselves on saying, "I don't test anything until we've played it 100/125/150/ whatever times" - well, how lovely, but even that is grossly premature in most cases. Yes, you can see titles that show strong potential in call-out early on (by isolating the scores given only by respondents familiar with the song) - but very often the biggest hits of all simply do not test well in call-out early in the game. They simply don't look good under this system until you, several other stations in your market, MTV and everybody else have played the track in question consistently in a significant rotation for three months or more. Most of the truly "big hits" in the last 18-24 months have not "tested well" until they were practically ready for recurrent status.

Here are some recent examples: Melissa Etheridge "Come To My Window," Seal "Kiss From A Rose," Dave Matthews Band "What Would You Say" and "Ants Marching," Pearl Jam "Daughter," Cranberries "Dreams" and "Linger," Sophie B. Hawkins

"As I Lay Me Down," Des'ree "You Gotta Be," Counting Crows "Mr. Jones," Gin Blossoms, "Hey Jealousy." The list goes on and on practically ad infinitum. These tunes and tons more like them generally tested mediocre to poor in the first 6-8 weeks, and only 12-16 weeks down the line did they really "kick in."

So what does this mean? These were all gigantic hit records that sold millions of albums, generated massive requests in many cases, and ended up testing at the top of the call-out list. During the time that they "didn't test" many programmers avoided these tunes like the plague. Top 40 radio hit these tracks big-time way after their impact was really happening in the marketplace. Surely there were signs that these records were hits before they started showing up in call-out. Y'know, little things like huge sales, massive requests from your own listeners, huge reaction and success at other formats...

The bottom line is this — if you're using call-out research to determine the fate of developing current music, you're missing the boat. All this does is make Top 40 an after-market for the biggest hit records. Alternative, Active Rock, Country and Urban/Churban are taking advantage by playing the active music when it's active. 

The group's current tour has been canceled and all future plans are on hold.

YA (which means "Now" in Spanish) will be based in Caracas, Venezuela, with additional operations in Mexico City and Buenos Aires and will license videos from all available sources. The channel will reach subscribers from Mexico to Argentina and Chile, as well as the Caribbean. A second satellite signal, which will create distinct northern and southern footprints in Central and South America, is planned for shortly after the initial launch.


Pot Shots







An exclusive HITS' retail dialogue with Valley's Barney Cohen, Rounder's Ken Irwin and DNA's Duncan Browne by Joe Medwick

F

or those of us in the music business who love authentic American roots music, no one has carried the torch like Rounder Records. Through disco, new wave and unspeakable trends like the Lambada, Rounder has been an oasis of genuine prove-it-every-night live music that is respected worldwide by musicians and fans alike. With its eclectic roster of bluegrass, blues, folk, Cajun/zydeco, reggae and world music stars, to name just a few genres, Rounder has stood for quality and authenticity while others have floundered. So it is a thrill to see the Cambridge, MA-based label celebrate their 25th anniversary with one of the surprise hit records of the year in bluegrass diva Alison Krauss to launch their brand-new distribution deal

with fellow Cambridge cronies Distribution North America (DNA) and Northern California-based partners Valley Records. HITS went to great pains to round up the principals of this rootsy royal group — Rounder co-founder Ken Irwin, Valley founder Barney Cohen and DNA head honcho Duncan Browne — but the biggest pain of all was having to put up with our own weary blues traveler, Joe "Blind Watermelon" Medwick.

Valley Co-Founder Barney Cohen:

When did the Valley/DNA deal actually happen and how is it going so far?

We actually started shipping product as an entity and joint venture the middle of September of last year. We agreed to do it in the spring of last year. Around May, we spent the summer putting our two systems together so that we could work together in the same language, so to speak.

We did it because we both had something the other one wanted. Valley was interested in getting into independent distribution... we felt we could help raise the bar a little bit. We felt the job being done by some independent distributors wasn't good enough. We thought we could do better with better new release and fill information, more timely shipments... things like that.

One of our primary goals was to influence the way independent distribution worked. Rounder wanted an effective distribution partner. I

think the label suffered for many years from not having an effective representative on the street. We both saw in each other the chance to have someone do the things we've wanted to do for a long time.

And how has it been going?

Great would be an understatement. Our sales have been phenomenal. Last DNA calendar year — including the three months we worked together — did about \$10 million in business. And this year we'll do about \$60 million. That's a significant number.

Any surprises?

The first big surprise was when we signed our deal with DNA, we didn't think it included Rounder. Between the time we signed our deal and the time we started, REP and Rounder decided not to work together anymore. The other big surprise was how well the Alison Krauss did and continues to do. They were thinking, if they did 100,000 copies, that'd be great. And now we're well over a million and a half shipped and it's still rolling along. I'm sure it'll be double-platinum this year and I don't see

any clear indication that it's going to slow down. It's a great record.

You have the best of both worlds -- not only do you have a hit record, but Rounder's vast and legendary catalog.

They've always put out quality music and had name recognition in that area. And now they have effective distribution.

Now that you're among those independent distribution ranks, have your views changed regarding the job that they do?

Yeah, it's worse than I thought. We have a great deal of work to do to give ourselves the kind of grade I would like to give ourselves. I want to be known as somebody that does an "A" job in everything I do. We're not at that level yet. We have to be as effective as the majors

at putting new releases on the street. That's our next big job and I think that it's going to take awhile because indie labels aren't used to doing what the majors do in terms of getting the product out there. And the sheer numbers work against them. A major can drop 500,000 records on the street. Indies don't have the resources the majors automatically bring to the table. But we can still do a real good job in regard to timing a release and setting records up, even the smaller ones. But it requires great discipline, which the labels, the salesmen and the distribution companies aren't used to. Even the customers aren't used to getting that kind of program from an indie distributor. So we're still working on it. It's an uphill battle, but the payoff is huge. If we can be effective putting

out new releases and creating the kind of sales these records deserve, the labels will make a lot of money. And somethi doing it. BARNEY COHEN.

this segment of the business will get that much more healthy. It's a challenge worth taking on and we're happy Where do you see indie distribution heading? Certainly it's going to get consolidated. The thing that's driving it is that the number of retail players who buy

large quantities of music is shrinking. Right now there are maybe ten big customers, including the racks that represent well over 50% of the business. If that number gets smaller, you're going to hear a lot of them saying we just want to buy from one, two or three indie suppliers; VALLEY RECORDS we don't want a hundred. That's going to force a tremendous consolidation, especially on the distribution level. There aren't going to be too many people with the

desire to become national distributors or have the resources to do it for that matter.

I see us as being very fortunate we've got a hit record at the same time we are trying to build a company. Because the volume lets us go ahead and make some expenditures now that we might not have been able to afford otherwise.

Plus it's always nice to have that calling card.

It helps to get your foot in the door. We've got a quality relationship with every major retailer and wholesaler and the reason we were able to do that was because of this hit record. We're looking pretty good right now.

Rounder's Ken Irw

Talk about timing. You celebrate a 25th anniversary, a new distribution deal and a huge success with Alison Krauss.

We feel pretty good about ourselves right now. We feel like we're basically continuing to do the things that we've done for the past 25 years. Which is putting out the best roots music along with their contemporary offshoots. Over the last five or six years, we have improved a lot of the things we do. Particularly in the marketing and the promotion departments. We've enlarged those areas and brought in some extremely talented people to work in them. And as we continue to sign new groups to the label, we really count on many of the relationships that we have built up over ten years to really help us continue our steady growth.

Allson's record must have changed a few things.

Before we even got into the record business, we looked at a lot of labels, like Folkways, County and Arhoolie, that were doing music that we liked. We also took a look at some of the more commercial labels that were doing folk music, like Elektra. We saw what happened to them about the time they had the Doors and other rock groups when they moved their operations to the West Coast. That probably had as great an influence on us as what was happening to the traditional labels, in the respect that we saw a company that was putting out wonderful folk music, one day had success in another area and then just dropped their folk leanings.

Now Alison Krauss isn't the Doors, but

her success tempts you to change in ways you might not want to. We don't want to do that. When we had success with George Thorogood

in the late '70s, we were aware

were not going to change what we were doing. At least not as far as our commitment to roots music

our success with Thorogood helped financially, and got our name out a little bit more in the business and in some ways the same thing has occurred with Alison. But we didn't sign her with the thought that she would be a huge success. We just liked her music, and things just grew into

what they are today. It's been a fairly gradual growth, although it's been a pretty substantial jump this time. We're always trying to do things better, but it certainly doesn't give us a great desire to become the 24th label in Nashville. We like it here, and we like it when a record we put out and believe in does well. But we are not going to stray from our roots.

Having this hit record does get all your other wonderful releases and catalog in a lot more hands than before.

The other thing that is so exciting is that this

is all happening with a brand-new distribution company. The DNA/Valley deal was great in its timing in that we went with

DNA January 1, and Alison shipped February 1son7. This was one of the first "AUSS" records of ours that they UCCESS a tremendous thing in mpts terms of developing that company. It was great for the sales people to have a ecord that was this good S and this well-promoted and marketed. Everyone $\square \mathcal{U}$ worked really hard to tmake this happen, from the band to Alison to her KEN IRWIN, publicist, right down the line. It was a true team ROUNDER RECORDS effort. Our CD and

> practically became partners, making product for us before it was even needed so we could ship orders out really fast. In that way, we didn't run into one of the problems that indies have run into in the past, and that is not being able to keep the pipeline filled with product at critical times.

Is there the risk of getting tunnel-vision when you get a record like this right, and start to ignore your other artists?

I think there is some feeling that Alison gets more attention in some ways. But the vast majority of the people that I have spoken to

feel really good and feel that the increased visibility of Rounder is helping all the acts. The people who are more savvy and aware of how the business works feel good about this. They realize that it's just as easy for a store to order 100 copies of a record as it is five or ten. We are hoping that this success will

open the doors for everyone. It really has helped in building new relationships, whether it's been at radio, press or retail. Having a successful record obviously is something people want to talk about. It's fun to be a part of that. People have been very helpful and we are all constantly trying to work with

our artists as a team. Most of them understand and feel very good about this success, and of course, many of them hope to have this kind of success as well.

We work with a lot of talented artists and we try to do our best for each one.◆

DNA's Duncan Browne

This DNA/Valley deal took awhile to complete. Where are you at right now?

You're right. These endeavors are not without their difficulties, but considering that we are just about a year old, I think that we are all quite happy with our performance to date. We have exceeded our expectations and projections due in no small part to a young lady named Alison

Krauss. We need to give credit where credit is due. We feel really good about where we are considering how young we are. As far as DNA goes, we have a lot of work to do to become the kind of distribution company that we'd like to become.

You know Rounder better than most people. You must take great pride in its latest wave of success.

When we started DNA, we had no expectation that we were going to distribute Rounder. Our plans were for a distribution company that did not include Rounder Records as part of its offering, and so the addition of Rounder in January of 1995 was wonderfully unexpected. What Rounder

offers as a label is, to some degree, a mirror of what Distribution North America wants to offer as a distributor. Which is a diverse and eclectic roster of quality music from many different genres. Rounder gave DNA more credibility than we already had in the marketplace. The label and Alison opened retail doors for us that would have probably been a little more difficult to open without them.

Radio has jumped on Alison as well.

Radio, video and especially press have all greatly aided our successful growth. They've reacted to Alison, of course, but they've also reacted to other artists as well. Many of us here at DNA have been very familiar with Rounder over the years. Our VP of Sales Pip Smith used to be VP Of Sales at REP and as such was the sales manager for Rounder. Our Director of Vendor Relations John Ruch was a sales person at Rounder Distribution and a lot of our sales people have sold Rounder before. So we did have a great advantage in that many of the people at DNA had a prior relationship with Rounder.

And the Valley part seems to have worked well.

The Valley partnership was a key element in the development of DNA for a couple of reasons. First, it gave DNA instant credibility on the West Coast, where before we had largely been an unknown or extremely minor player. By partnering with Valley, we immediately added to our impact not only on the West Coast, but really throughout the industry because of the stature and status that Valley holds.

Valley brought to DNA expertise and discipline in some important areas of the distribution business, namely operations and shipping. Getting boxes in, getting boxes out. Historically, Rounder Distribution

had been fairly weak in those areas. Valley also brought to DNA a new way of looking at and analyzing our business, which I think has made DNA a very healthy company.

What other releases are upcoming?

I know you know the Burns Sisters in Ithaca. I just got to meet them a couple of weeks ago. They came up and played at our sales convention.

We had a lot of fun with them and then the label and the Delivantes and the Blazers followed them. So by the end of a very hot and sweaty night, I looked around on the dance floor and there were all three of the Burns Sisters rocking. It was very cool. And they are such a typical Rounder act. They have a huge regional following and are not afraid to support other artists like themselves.

I know the Blazers are getting a big push in L.A., their hometown. What kind of plan do you have for the Delivantes?

DUNCAN BROWNE, **DNA** The Delivantes are getting a real nice buzz in that Steve Earle, Kevin Welch

country-rock scene. It's really one of the areas of music right now that seems to be taking hold all at once at radio, retail and in the press. So we think they've got a nice future ahead of them.

How do you feel you're going to compete with all of the majors and

the other indies in this fourth quarter run for the money?

Pretty good, because we're going to be working solid records by solid artists. We've got new records by Burning Spear, Ronnie Laws, Bobby Watson, Taj Mahal, a great new band called Grover in the alternative area that we're excited about. David Grisman, Kevin Welch... I could go on and on. We're looking forward to a lot of good times.

Time for some pearls of wisdom from 7 Mary 3's Jason Ross by Marc Weingarten

When a band's breakout single churns along on a muscular yet fashionably sluggish guitar riff and contains lyrics like "I have become cumbersome to this world/I have become cumbersome to my girl" warbled in a gruff baritone, it only follows that they would get lumped in with the nihilism-for-bucks Pearl Jam/Stone Temple Pilots grunge axis. And 7 Mary 3 certainly don't shy away from the inevitable comparisons.



"I bought Pearl Jam's '10' when I was 18 and I thought it was the greatest thing since sliced bread," says the band's vocalist Jason Ross, who admits he'd like to think of his band as having a slightly less fatalistic world view. After all, why shouldn't they? Six months ago, 7 Mary 3 - guitarist/vocalist Jason Ross, lead quitarist Jason Pollock, bassist Casey Daniel and drummer Giti Khalsa — were plugging away on Orlando's club circuit shilling for their self-produced debut album "Churn." Now they find themselves teetering on the brink of mainstream success. "Cumbersome," the first single from the band's second album (and first for Mammoth Records), "American Standard," is an anthemic slice of selfhatred that has captured the attention of PDs and alienated teens everywhere. HITS' sent their own expert on selfloathing, Marc "How Does Your" Weingarten "Grow" to trade neuroses with 7 Mary 3's Jason Ross.

Were you in a lot of bands before Seven Mary Three?

I had never been in a band prior to this. I used to play acoustic guitar with a friend in coffee houses, but neither of us had ever played for a large number of people.

Orlando has never really been known for its music scene.

I think Orlando has an exceptional music scene. It's eclectic and widespread over many different genres. There are guys who have been making music for 20 years and there are kids right out of high school. There's a very big local club circuit; all the bands are really supportive of each other. We suffered a backlash initially because no band from Orlando had ever broken big like we did. Hopefully, people will turn heads that way, ignore Michael Eisner and Disney for a minute and sign some of those bands.

"American Standard" has a lot of self-deprecating lyrics, particularly "Cumbersome."

The self-loathing is a direct result of my Catholic school upbringing. I'm only 22 and most of the songs on the record were written when I was 18, a time when I was feeling very alienated from everything. When I went off to college, I realized that no one's gonna do anything for me, except myself. A lot of stuff was going wrong and I wasn't in a great state of mind. I don't want people to hear this record and feel sorry for me, though. I'm not nihilistic, either. It's just pretty cut and dry. It's just kinda like, "Hey, I fucked up."

But there are songs on the album, like "Roderigo," that are about survival and resilience as well.

I think all of us in the band felt the same way when we were younger... that everyone's against you. So when we all got together, it just did wonders for our confidence. After I joined the band, it gave me a sense of purpose. It just felt good waking up each morning and thinking, "What can I do for the band today?"

Whose career would you like to emulate?


Well, the bands we listen to the most on the bus are Neil Young, Creedence Clearwater Revival and Fleetwood Mac. I want to get to a place where Neil is right now. He can just write and record whatever he wants. There's no, "Well, I have to make a rock album this time because my fan base is here and my market is such-and-such." His attitude is, basically, I don't care whether you buy the album or not. Unfortunately, we're not quite at that point yet. I read an article with Slash recently where he said the fans will just have to wait for his next album, and how he could care less. That's certainly not how we think about our fans. If it wasn't for them, I'd be flipping burgers.

What's the biggest difference between being on a major and recording your own record?

From a production standpoint, it was similar, because we produced both records ourselves. On the publicity side, we're on a label now that's just hooked into the whole Atlantic and WEA empire. That kind of leaves you awe-struck. Before you ever sign a contract, you think everyone in the business is gonna be [affect sleazy accent], "This is Frankie Sharp from Sharp Records. You kids are great. We wanna sign you to a ten-record contract. You're gonna be big, big stars." It's really not that way at all. Besides, we have Mammoth to filter out all of that! They're very down-to-earth people and they really take care of us. All of the bands on their roster are in some stage of development. There are no Monsters Of Rock on Mammoth. At this stage in our careers, we want to be on a label that nurtures developing bands.

You've got to feel good about the fact that WEA has broken new bands in a big way this year, like Hootie and the Blowfish.


They can break a band wide-open, but I want to maintain some degree of control. For example, we're about to go on a tour of small clubs for the rest of the year. We want to stay on the club scene for a while and take our music to the people on a very intimate level. We want people to recognize that we're young, we're developing and we'll evolve. ◆

TIME TO BLAST OFF WITH SPACEHOG BY LILY MOAYERI

Leeds is a Very cold Northern city in England which is best KNOWN for its pumping dance clubs and the breeding of whippetts, the dogs used in fox hunts. Occasionally it brings forth some rock bands, LIKE SPACEHOG, which come to us from that fair burg by way of New York City. The four members of the group are all originally from Leeds, but met and live in Manhattan. Drummer Jonny Cragg met rhythm gultar and occasional songwriter Untony Langdon at an espresso bar where Jonny was killing rats. Antony's brother, bassist and main tunesmith Royston Langdon. arrived soon after for a visit and never left. And finally lead guitarist Richard Steel was imported to complete the equation.

Their first Spacehog gig was in July '94. They got signed to Sire/EEG by Seymour Stein in March of this year and their debut album, "Resident Allen," just came out this Fall. Unlike the current flow of British bands that are doing so well in their homeland, Spacehog take a more rock-oriented approach to their music, with no sign of laddish-ness and one eye on playing arenas. Though their roots may be firmly entrenched in the N.Y.C. club scene, where they've developed a strong following, they belong on the big stage.

Before a showcase at NYU's Loeb Center, the members of the band put some time aside in between tightening snare drums and getting into

arguments with the slaphead promoter to hunker down with HITS' resident PoMo hunkette "Diamond" Lily Moayeri.



Why did you guys decide to establish yourselves in New York as opposed to England?

Antony Langdon: With the indie scene in England being what it is, most bands have to come through the NME/Melody Maker press route. Especially if you're a guitar-based band, it's very difficult unless you do it in a boyish/laddish Anglophile way to really get through.

I think we could have done what we've done here and gotten a deal there. But anything rock-based is not going to happen at the moment. We played with Supergrass the other night and in this country, it works. In England, people just wouldn't get it... they'd be too cynical about what we're doing.

How do you feel about the vocal comparisons to David Bowie?

Royston Langdon: I get that all the time. It's a bit boring for me, but there is definitely an influence. A lot of it's John Lennon, too. Early David Bowie is basically like John Lennon... a white blues thing.

Jonny Cragg: New York has allowed us to be ourselves a lot more than England, which I find very constraining. Every-

body's second-guessing everybody else and the scene's very enclosed. There is a very strict set of mores telling you how to act. I came from a climate in Leeds which was completely uninviting to rock bands who played music with live instruments. New York had to be better than anything England had to offer.

Royston: I just had to get out of there to get a better perspective on myself. None of us came here to do this band... it just happened.

Antony: I hope we can do well here and put ourselves in a position where we're somewhat established, where we can get to England and play slightly better shows without having to rely on the press. To me, the U.K. rock press is the downfall of the English music scene.

Both Royston and Jonny used to be in bands that were very different to Spacehog. What brought about the group's current sound?





like a lot of different things. My previous band, the Hollowmen, was a lot different and much more indieoriented. This is a lot less self-conscious; it's more, you do what you feel and you're not looking over your shoulder to see whether it's acceptable or not.

Royston: When I was living in Leeds, I was in a band called the Zeroes - who still exist --- but it basically wasn't going anywhere. I'm more analytical living in New York than I was before. Different vibes, different things to rub off. Meeting Jonny was an inspiration for his drum playing. In Leeds, musicianship standards weren't as high, so it was more inspiring here. There's a creative, immediate response to everything.

Are the songs all written by Royston?

Antony: I've written three of the tracks on the album "Space Is The Place." "Spacehog" and "To Be A Millionaire." I'm relatively new to songwriting, but my brother's been doing it for

years. I've got so many songs that I want to develop and work on with the band. It's great and Roy's down with that. That's why we were able to move so quickly... most of the songs were already done by Roy, who's a prolific, talented musician.

is that why you were able to move forward in such a short time?

Jonny: Our timing was brilliant. We've surfed into this scene where the young and beautiful people are coming out to see bands again, people who don't normally go to gigs. It's a good sounding board for what we're doing. I'm not sure those people are going to be at our shows in five years time, but certainly in terms of starting off a new band, they're good for us. It was all very spontaneous and it felt really good. I was already playing in three or four bands around the Village, but it quickly evolved to a point where it felt very special and I just loved Roy's songs.

Jonny: What we're doing now is basically the music I grew up with, but I "TO ME, THE U.K. ROCK PRESS IS THE DOWNFALL OF THE ENGLISH MUSIC SCENE." (Interny Langdon

The Mind Boggles Time to make a friend for all with the Bogmen BY KRISTINA ESTLUND

Was it only two years and a coupla scores ago that Lonn Friend left the high-profile Larry Flint rag he built up, RIP, to be an A&R guy at Arista Records?!? Heads swung, tongues wagged and people bet he'd butt heads with Clive and wouldn't be there more than a year. Alas, he's surprised everyone and actually signed a good band. The East Coast, college-degreed Bogmen had an impressive following and label bidding-war churning, but when the smoke cleared. Lonn not only still had his job. Arista had a group of talented musicians with fun songwriting and a quirky sound, as well as a musically dynamic talented live show. With the knob-turning excellence of Jerry Harrison, a few swings of the golf club and the writing genius of the band's six members — vocalist Bill Campion, guitarist Bill Ryan, bassist Mark Wike, keyboardist Brendan Ryan, percussionist P.J. O'Connor and drummer Clive Tucker — the Bogmen serve up a delightfully original brand of music with their debut, "Life Begins At 40 Million" (Arista), that just may make them the next big thing if they don't trip over the feet of HITS' metal moll Kristina "Friend to None" Estland first.



What is the difference between the band a year ago — when you played a sold-out gig at Irving Plaza which got you signed — and now?

Mark Wike: Musically, a lot of the stuff that's on the album, for us, is old. All the stuff on the album was written way before we were signed. Bill Ryan: We did new tracks. Like "Yellar" is more recent.

Mark: The only thing that changed was we had a little more financial stability.

Billy Campion: That allowed us to take a lot of liberties. Like our rehearsal studio.

Bill: By the time we got signed, we had another album's worth of material. But we decided that these were the songs to be on the record.

Mark: Ever since we recorded, we've been writing a lot. We'll always keep new songs in the set — at least a couple — to keep that new energy going. Because if we kept playing the same old songs, we'd be, like, programmed.

How did you guys develop such a fervent college audience?

Billy: We were partiers at college, so we went to parties and made ourselves known. We took any gig to get our stuff out there.

Mark: We'd, like, play on campus and get our friends to organize something, lunchtime specials and stuff, and then we'd go to the club in town afterwards, and we'd have like 300

people who we knew from the school that'd come and see us.

Bill: When we first started playing New York, it was hard just getting people there, so we would have to be strategic about our gigs.

Who came up with the idea of Jerry Harrison as producer?

Mark: We knew, to get the record going, we had to go with someone who would satisfy the different camps. We were way down from, like, four guys to like, gee this is the only way we're going to get this record started before January.

So what did Jerry bring to the record?

Billy: [Laughs] Carol, his wife! He brought to the record a real, mature, adult kind of conservative get-things-done organization.

Mark: He tried to get us to listen more to each other and to, like, see our structure. He's one of those guys into the A-part, B-part, C-part of a song.... He helped us trim the fat off a song to give it a verse, a chorus and a bridge.

What are some of the band's collective influences?

Mark: Our individual influences are not that different, we just have a different approach and different energies that drive us. You could say the influences range from the Grateful Dead to Rush to Rolling Stones to the Replacements to Jane's Addiction.

But there's also calypso, horns and hip-hop.

Billy Campion

Mark: We listen to everything. We get in the van and throw on anything from Sonic Youth or Alan Parsons to all sorts of music. It's because of all our siblings. We're all the youngest in our families, so, like, we were exposed to a lot of music. Plus, we're really open.

Billy: This is just a result of us looking to do something original. We write, get stoned and fuck around, but there's definitely a style when we're all in the same room. And if it sounds like something else for a while, we're like, "This sucks!" We're always trying to get somewhere else.

Mark: But we know when we touch on something that we all like.

Tell me about "Yellar."

Billy: It was just basically me getting a laugh, but at the same time being kind of for people who are so irresponsible that, after a while you just say, "Fuck it, I'm not going to ask this guy to do anything." They are so fucked. But they can survive on their personality alone, so you can kinda get away with just being a fucking cartoon character. But at the same time, it's called "Yellar" because it's kind of a cop-out. It says that you don't have to take any responsibility. I like the philosophy; I think it's great. I wish that I could live like that.

ic pop crunch with utter finesse, and Langdon's Bowiesque cabaret vocals are a glittering focal point. From the smash "In The Meantime" to "Candyman" and beyond, these celestial swine have landed in a big way. Take them to your leader. (Jon O'Hara)

Poe "Hello" (Modern/Atl./AG): Cosmopolitan vagabond Poe has lived a great deal in a short time, but where she could be cynical, she is wry 'n' dry in an endearing way. Her debut album sparkles with a wide variety of influences, but Poe's pure voice and assured delivery hold it all together. The massive funk/rock numbers "Trigger Happy



Jack" and "Choking The Cherry" (where Poe literally phones it in, but in a good way) contrast with the acid-jazz cool of "Another World." Poe's ability to make the most of each feel points to her eclectic nature. Struggling artist fighting to be heard? Nevermore. (J.O.)



Self "Subliminal Plastic Motives" (Spongebath/Zoo): There's something perversely addictive about this collection of mangled feedback. Like when you've had too much caffeine but don't know it until you have one more cuppa, and suddenly want to claw the skin off your face. Like when "Cannon" comes turbo-percolating through your

speakers, with discordant sampling and lyrics you know an introspective 15-year-old would dig. It's a nasty tongue burn. And "So Low," a thick pot of sludge. Make no mistake— Self is bad for you. But hey, so is life. Blow off the foam and suck it up, Starbuck. (Brian Alcom)

The Rentals "Return Of The Rentals" (Maverick/Reprise): Be careful. Weezer's bassist Matt Sharp has created The Rentals and he wants to take the world by storm with his brand of School House Rock. You know the nursery rhyme sound (the Sparks' "Cool Places" and Gary Numan's "Cars" in the '80's, right?)... sing-songy melodies and a



nonsense chorus repeated so often it sticks like a broken record. Armed with FOUR Moog synthesizers, girlie "ooh-ah-ooh" back-up vocals and the hit single "Friends Of P," The Rentals have arrived. Seat them at the back of the class and keep the spit wads away. (Julia Trainor)



Stewart has some shit to say: Anal Blast from Michigan is gonna have to find a new drummer as it seems their old one has left to join Kataklysm, one of Relapse's most promising young acts. Anal Blast: just say it out loud, it'll make you feel better... Due to legal problems, Spine (formerly Puke Weasel) is changing their name to Scully. The band has gotten rave reviews in most of the trades and fanzines and would like to hear from each and every one of you. Call Andrew @ 913-776-0415... The Trouble record, which some of you spent \$40 on for the import, is coming out stateside through Century Media in January... Due to a resurgence in metal groupies, the Stuck Mojo/Machine Head tour has been extended another ten weeks, with Wickerman joining in through November ... 10/30-31 adds: Wickerman full, Dismay, Guilt, Warzone, Cause for Alarm split and Therapy. Get some.

Time to play in the sand with Kyuss' John Garcia by Kristina Estlund

The desert is a vast oasis from which the four members of Kyuss vocalist John Garcia, bassist Scott Reeder, drummer Alfredo Hernandez and quitarist Josh Homme - have emerged. The brutal hot blast has brought us their last three albums "Wretch" in '91, "Blues For The Red Sun" in '92 and '94's "Sky Valley" — as well as their latest erupting scorcher, "...And The Circus Leaves Town" (EEG).

You may or may not have even heard of them or known that all four releases have been recorded under the watchful production eye of Masters Of Reality's Chris Goss, for Kyuss is one of those bands that everyone loves, though that passion hasn't quite resulted in mondo record sales... at least not yet. They've toured with everyone from Metallica to Faith No More to Danzig, yet radio is nearly nonexistent. So what is it with this band? What's their niche? Vocalist John Garcia called in HITS' RIP-roaring Kristina Estlund "Institute" for her own analysis.... at \$175 an hour no less.



Why was there such a short span between the release of "Sky Valley" and "...Circus"?

"Sky Valley" had been done for a while, but Elektra released it late because, well, Chameleon had dropped us and it took them a while to pick us up. When they finally did, the record had already been done for a year and we had already finished most of "...Circus." When "Sky Valley" was released, Elektra went through a lot of changes, so a lot of people over there didn't know what the hell we were all about. Kind of an unfortunate thing that had to happen, but, y'know, there's really no rules that say when a record is supposed to come out anyway.

Why do you keep using Chris Goss as producer?

He has common sense and that's something that Kyuss needs in the studio. We tend to get pretty anal, but he shut us up and pretty much would play guitar and press record. I can't talk highly enough about him, and he's not the type of guy that will bring in hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of equipment into a studio. Instead of using an ultraverb to put reverb on the guitar, he'll reposition the mic, naturally, to get the natural reverb sound.

How do you guys keep it fresh without getting frustrated?

We don't usually get frustrated; we just get bored of playing "Green Machine" 50 million times a night, y'know? We don't even have a set list every night. We just go out there with some sort of little, rough draft of a set list and then we'll take it off the top of our heads.

Do you ever wonder when it's going to start happening for you?

We never really think of that. Kyuss is never going to be a big band. We'll never be Metallica or even Faith No More or even, like, Tool-size. It's not music that applies to everyone — well, it applies to anybody from the 14-year-old kid to the 45-year-old, y'know, heroin addict, but I think there's a very limited group of people that will listen to something like Kyuss.

We're happy playing in front of five people or 5,000 people who wanna learn more about Kyuss. If they want

to read the article, if they want to go and buy the CD or whatever, that's fine. I mean, Kyuss is not gonna cry just because we're not making a shit-load of money. For crying out loud, we still practice in my garage in the desert! Which gets to be 120° and to get rid of the odor, from us stinking so bad in the garage, I mean incense can't even take that away from us. That's something that will always be a part of us.

The best way to survive is to have no expectations.

Whether I'm sitting on a shitter or in a shower, whether it be in this band or in a lounge band, as long as I'm singing, y'know, I'm happy. It's not like I'm waiting for Kyuss to make a million dollars so that I can get a ranch and a Porsche.

What inspires Kyuss?

I'm inspired by what Josh plays, what Scott plays and what Alfredo plays. And I'm inspired by what I grew up on — Earth Wind & Fire, George Benson and the Ohio Players. And Ian Astbury and the Cult — early, early Cult.

After that, it's definitely our surroundings. Kyuss is definitely a product of our environment.

Kyuss has always been, to me, a real simple, simple band. We've always done things a certain way. We're still able to go off on different tangents and explore different things, while still staying within the Kyuss realm of things — whatever that may mean, which I have no idea. All I know is what it makes me feel like.

Do you see yourselves continuing to tour and put out records?

No, I don't. I take Kyuss one day at a time. We could break up tomorrow. One of us could die or someone could just get a wild hair up their ass and say I don't want to do this anymore. So it's pretty much all up in the air. I guess the plan right now, supposedly, is to make another record, but that's not even concrete. Nothing is concrete in this band right now.

No, "Daydream" Is Not Mariah Carey's Take On What The JAMZ Crew Does All Day

MARIAH - MARVELOUS!

Okay, it's understood that Mariah Carey is the closest thing to heaven when she sings. That explains why jaws still drop after a listen to any new Carey offering since her self-titled 1990 debut. We at JAMZ, though, still are scraping ourselves off the floor after Columbia Records' Ken James stopped by the offices (in the process, disturbing our sleep) and played Ms. Carey's first single, "Fantasy," a powerful, sassy and very street single from her spectacular "Daydream" album. It was such a departure from her previous tunes that we didn't know who this singer was — and refused to

acknowledge that it was indeed Carey when James certified the truth. (Ed. note: That's why they work at HITS.) "Laydream" continues the storybook musical life of Mariah Carey, one that has seen her sell over 60 million albums world-wide in a little over five years. Pretty much doing as she pleased when co-writing and co-producing "Daydream," Carey gathered Babyface ("Melt Away"), Jermaine Dupri ("Always Be My Baby"), Walter Afanasieff ("Underneath The Stars," "I Am Free," "Open Arms," "When I Saw You," "Forever," "Looking In") and Boyz II Men ("One Sweet Day"). Mariah Carey has got it going on quite the opposite of HITS Staff Writer Gary "Traction-less" Jackson, whose career is on permanent stall with no tow truck in sight.

You have a new flava on "Daydream." Tell us about it

I grew up on R&B music, and I'm also a big fan of rar and hiphop. When I began putting the album together, in addition to the pop-oriented songs for which I've received much appreciated support over the years, I also knew I wanted to explore more of my urban roots this time.

On "Fantasy," you combine street, club and radio at the same time.

I love the song because it covers so many bases and gives me the opportunity to spread my wings beyond just singing. (On the re-mix) Ol' Dirty Bastard is real, the most real (hardzore) rapper you can get. The Tom-Tom Club's "The Genius Of Love" was one of my favorite songs growing up. We sampled some of that and put my song on top, so it's not like a re-make. It's really a



completely new song on top of a re-make.

And you also directed the video.

Yes. Before, I mainly took direction, often thinking to myself that my videos could be better and much more reflective of the real me. When I felt I had (enough) experience and confidence to write and direct my own clips, I decided to go for it. It's difficult wearing all those hats, but the challenge and positive results are worth it. That's also why I plan to direct the rest of the "Daydream" videos.

What about potential criticism over directing your own videos? If they work, I'll take the credit. If they don't, I can handle the heat. I have to shake off the criticism.

Much useless ado has been made over your mixed heritage (Mariah's mother is Irish and her father is Venezuelan and African-American). How do you handle the cultural combination? I'm a multi-racial person and perceive myself as such. I strive to be a positive example of the best of both worlds. To say I'm only one or the other would be negating all the other things that I am.

In that vein, you have a project called "Camp Mariah" that sends inner city children to summer camp.

God has given me so much that I feel the need to give it back, especially to kids who deserve to go to camp just like anyone else, despite being unable to afford it. Thus far, I've committed \$1 million the project and, through a benefit concert I gave last December, we were able to raise \$650,000 more.

How do you maintain such high quality from album to album?

I've come to realize more than ever that it's the fans who make or break you. For me, they are the priority and I keep them in mind as far as the quality and substance that has to go into every song I record, as well as every live show and video I do. I'm at a place where I'm comfortable now — and I feel that shows in my music.



Doctor's In Editorial

"Unlocking Doors — Keys To Success"

This is a tale of Billy and Jesse. Billy had never worked with a program consultant before. He had never done real research until now. But he moved up to a larger market and was frustrated because he had assured his new GM that he was down with research and had no problem working with a consultant. Billy was a lot like Jesse.

Jesse figured gold prices would go up, so he bet his life's savings on that scenario. If his forecast comes true, he'll make a killing. If not, he's going to take a bath. Betting on one guess is called "scenario investing." It can produce great profits or huge losses. But it can

also be a helpful tool—if you don't put all your eggs in one basket. Stop and think what may happen to your investments or your ratings if your guess is wrong.


Both Billy and Jesse are affected by the same principles. Whose advice should they take and what are the risks? First, let's look at the consultants. Consultants' advice is like an expensive coin toss—not because of ignorance, but because so many events affecting your ratings are unpredictable. A consultant or researcher may be right a few times in-a-row, but that does not guarantee the accuracy of the next call, especially if "the next call" is your urban station and his AOR, CHR or country concepts don't work.

Why, then, are consultants so popular? First, people want to believe that someone has all the answers. The more certain the forecasters sound, the more confidence they inspire. Many assume that they are experts and, therefore, beyond questioning. You only hear about these gurus when they're right (and then you hear about them everywhere). But bear in mind — even a stopped clock shows the correct time twice every 24 hours.

KEYLESS ENTRY

Just as it's difficult to get into your own locked car without a key, it's getting nearly impossible to unlock many of the answers to today's programming questions without the proper information from consultants and research. For years, drivers have used a variety of methods to gain entry to their locked vehicles; coat hangers, credit cards and long, thin metal implements known as "slim-jims." Programmers have been using tactics just as crude and obsolete to open the doors to ratings. Trouble is, your competition also uses these methods.

Old methods used to attract listeners and build cume just



don't work as well anymore. Today's radio programming "locks" are combinations which involve programming and research secrets that are more theftresistant and complex, yet delicate. How should you use consultants and minimize risk? You should let a consultant serve as a guide rather than as a dictator and try to hedge as many of your bets as you can. Use research the same way — to allow you to make informed decisions. You still need to use your gut, your ears and your common sense.

Telephone call-outs are fine for tracking the development of a station's image and for uncovering some programming


problems, but are often inadequate as a means of offering specific solutions to serious problems. In telephone studies, people cannot react to potential programming elements. Therefore, programming decisions based on telephone studies are usually nothing more than recommendations based on the judgment of the researcher or consultant. If telephone call-outs are not the answer, what is? Focus groups (or small group discussions) are the best beginning for a station's research project, as they are perfect at generating ideas and formulating crucial questions. Focus studies are also excellent ways of pre-testing programming elements, to include music, personalities, station perception and advertising campaigns.

Ultimately, the best way to determine if the research approach is the correct one is to find out, before the project begins, exactly what type of answers one will get from the research. Will recommendations be based on the judgment of the researcher or consultant, sound scientific research or a combination of both?

Many research methods that are currently being used are particularly inadequate when it comes to offering more than just vague and obscure solutions to these problems. This is particularly true of researchers and consultants who have little or no experience in the urban format. Be aware of the difference between solutions based on research and those based solely on the judgment of the researcher. Many of these so-called experts are really amateurs when it comes to specializing in urban formats; all music radio is not the same. Don't let an amateur or "helpful neighbor" try to retrieve the keys to your vehicle. Let a techician do it. If you're in a hurry, take a cab. It's cheaper than a repair bill for a broken lock. Word! 

Crocker replaces Quincy McCoy and acting PD John Mullen. Crocker started October 25. His return marks the third time Crocker has programmed WBLS. Crocker was PD during the glory days of WBLS in the '70s. Inside sources tell Juice that Crocker will probably wind up doing an air shift, most likely afternoon drive. His return couldn't be timed better for

the release of Quincy Jones' new "Q's Jook Joint" LP, which contains "Moody's Mood," a song Crocker used for years as his sign-off theme. WBLS is currently consulted by Tony Gray... Singer Bobby Brown reportedly checked into the Betty Ford Center in Rancho Mirage, CA for drug and alcohol treatment the weekend of October 13. but checked himself out the following Sunday or Monday. Brown's wife, singer/ actress Whitney Houston. did not comment on the

accuracy of the information as she was traveling in support of her soon-to-be-released "Waiting To Exhale" movie. Brown, who has had a history of drug-related problems, as well being at the scene of a recent drive-by shooting in his hometown of Roxbury, MA in which a brother-in-law was killed, is currently living apart from Houston...

More Summer Arbitrons

In San Francisco, Cap Cities' KGO-AM (N/T) led (6.9-6.7). In 2nd and sinking was CBS' KCBS-AM (N/T) (4.8-5.1). Evergreen's dance-flava-ed Top 40 KMEL-FM improved slightly (4.4-4.6) to place 3rd. KYLD/KYLZ-FM danced their way to 7th place (3.5-3.9). Jazzy KKSF-FM may have picked up some of that disenfranchised KJAZ-FM audience, but remained flat at 3.3 to place 9th. Inner Cities' soft Urban KBLX-FM was off slightly (2.7-2.6) to place 13th. Struggling KSOL-FM

managed to pull up slightly (1.4-1.8)... In Philadelphia, Westinghouse's KYW-AM (N/T) remained on top (7.3-7.4) and WUSL-FM (Power-99) was 2nd (6.2-6.4), followed by Beasley's Urban Adult WDAS-FM (5.8-5.6). Jazzy WJJZ-FM was flat (3.6) to place 14th. In the 25-54 match-up, it was WDAS-FM on top with 7.6... In the Motor City, WJLB-FM locked up first place (10.1-10.3). Not a bad debut book for new PD Michael Saunders. Secret Communication's other urban facility, WMXD-FM, placed 6th (4.7-4.3). Bell Broadcasting's pure jazz heritage station, WJZZ-FM, was flat (2.9) to place 13th. WJLB picked up 25-54 honors (8.3-8.6) in addition to 18-34. Since former urban-flavored Top 40 WHYT-FM switched to modern rock, they've been sinking (2.9-2.7) to place 14th. Look for changes here.

In Atlanta, everybody's rappin' about the phenomenal debut book of Radio One's WHTA-FM (Hot 97.5). The station signed on July 4 and debuted 4.6 12+ to finish 4th (18-34). Perennial market leader was Granum's WVEE-FM (V-103) (11.9-10.4). WALR-FM (Kiss-104) was down slightly (5.6-5.5) to place 6th. NAC jazzer WJFZ-FM inched up (2.3-2.7) to place 14th. Granum's religious AMer WAOK slipped back slightly (2.8-2.6) to place 15th. WVEE leads both 25-54 and 18-34 demo match-ups... In Tampa, Top 40 WELZ-FM leads the market (8.9-8.2); heritage Urban AMer WTMP is up (1.7-2.1) to place 15th... In Milwaukee, WTMJ-AM (N/T) returned to the top (7.4-8.1). WKKV-FM (V-100) was flat (7.3) to place 3rd. Urban adult WMCS-AM added over half a share (1.7-2.6) to place 12th and tie with Urban AMer WNOV (1.5-2.6)... Indianapolis saw album rocker WFBQ-FM return to the top and remain in double digits (12.9-13.5). Urban WTLC-FM added a full share (5.3-6.3) to place 4th and move up to 3rd in the 25-54 "demo derby"... In "The Big Easy," WQUE-FM continued it winning ways. It was off slightly (14.3-14.2), but still led the format and the market while being the only station in double digits. Sister station urban adult WYLD-FM moved up sharply to place 2nd (6.7-8.7). KMEZ-FM (The Touch) added a share and a half (3.7-5.2) to place 6th. Jazzy WKJZ-FM was flat (4.4) to finish in a two-way tie with former Top 40-turned-talker WEZB-FM (4.7-4.4). WQUE and WYLD place 1st and 2nd, respectively, in the 25-54 race... In Louisville, Country WAMZ-FM was up slightly and on top (15.8-15.9). Top 40 WDJX-FM went up slightly (7.0-7.1) to place 4th, while Urban WGZB-FM had a huge spike (4.4-6.1) to place 5th.

HE STARTED OUT AS A MEMBER OF THE WU-TANG CLAN RAP GROUP, WHICH STOMPED TO THE TOP OF THE CHARTS AND PLATINUM STATUS LARGELY BECAUSE OF THE NOW-CLASSIC TRACK, "M.E.T.H.O.D. MAN." METHOD'S RASPY STYLE HAS SINCE BEEN IMITATED, BUT NEVER DUPLICATED. HE GREW UP IN THE STREETS OF STATEN ISLAND, N.Y. AFTER LEAVING HOME AT AN EARLY AGE, MAKING HIS LIVING SELLING WEED ON 160TH ST. OUT OF AN ABANDONED BUILDING.

Standing in front of 160 [160th St. on Staten Island], that's all I see... sex, drugs and money, baby. I wasn't getting no money and I wasn't getting no real live sex, but as far as drugs, I had it going on. That's how I got the name "Method Man."

DOES SMOKING MARIJUANA HELP YOU WRITE SONGS?

It's psychological. It does influence the rhymes. If you smoke some real live shit, it will have you drifting into your own world. You start thinking about stuff which happened earlier that day and the weed gives you different thoughts about how you could have handled shit.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS THAT YOU THINK ABOUT WHEN YOU'RE HIGH? All kinds of shit. You know what I be thinking about ever since I started this rap shit? I smoke weed and start thinking that I've got a million things to do. I just can't put my mind what it is, and I ask people things a hundred times. And when people talk to me, I can hear them, but I'm not listening. I can't believe how you can just shut someone off in your mind.

HOW DID THE WU-TANG CLAN GET TOGETHER?

Me and Rza were in the same 8th grade class. I met OD [Ol' Dirty Bastard through some people I knew in school. We all pretty much knew each other for awhile. Staten Island is so small you can't help but know everybody.

Rakeem [Rza] came to me one day and said, "What you wanna do, sell records or sell drugs?" The choice was evident... I had to go with this. It wasn't like it was something I was looking for... it came to me.

I just got into the business part of it now because of my own project. I was dumb, deaf and blind to this whole shit before. When the Wu came together, we all put \$100 down apiece, went into the studio and did "Protect Yo Neck," then paid for the video ourselves.

IS THAT WHEN LOUD RECORDS PICKED YOU UP?

The labels were all calling, but they wanted to sign certain individuals, not the group. We chose LOUD because they came with the best deal... they signed all eight of us with options to sign solo deals with other labels.

WHAT DID YOU LEARN IN THE PROCESS OF COMPLETING THIS ALBUM? People who listen to music don't know shit about it. It's a lot of dumb-ass deaf as nigga out there 'cause bull shit is selling. Some brothers are getting more credit than what the fuck they deserve. They don't put any originality into their shit; they are going platinum and gold and all that other



shit. They make it real hard for the live nigga to get up in there and bless that shit and teach through his music so that the media can shut the fuck up and stop blaming rap music for everything... word up!

CAN WE EXPECT ANOTHER ALBUM FROM THE WU?

Yeah, we never broke up. The only way outta this shit is death. One nigga die, we all got to die. That's the way it is. 'Cause we are a clan and that keeps us together; we are not group members, we are family members.

YOUR LYRICS SEEM TO EXPRESS A MUSLIM PHILOSOPHY.

Islam is my culture and your culture is nothing but your way of life. Anything I say, I have to live it out, that's manifesting my words. Knowledge is the basic foundation of all things in existence. Know, look, listen and respect. You must know the ledge before you fall off into the edge of the devil's pit of awareness. Wisdom is to wise your dome, to make yourself smarter, to build. Justice is your penalty or reward based on your actions. That's why my album had to teach the truth. I want it to go platinum, but I can't come out with the gimmicks. People who do that have a penalty to pay.

IS THERE ANY REASON IN PARTICULAR THAT YOU CHOOSE TO WEAR YOUR HAIR THAT WAY?

It's like when I get up — whatever. I've been wearing my hair like this before this rap shit. When I get the braids in, they good for the day. Then I start to pull them shits out. Like the "All I Need" video shoot where half of my hair was pulled out; I was bored. And you know what's funny? If I wasn't who I am, half of these girls out here wouldn't have shit to say to me. It's all about what's in the shell on the

HOW DOES IT FEEL TO BE ON TOP OF THE CHARTS?

I ain't at the top 'cause when you at the top, there's only one way and that's doownnn! It's cool to be recognized, word up!

WHAT DO YOU THINK THE DIFFERENCE IS BETWEEN THE EAST AND WEST COAST RAP SCENES?

They rhyme what they see, which is gangs and all that wild shit. They are smart as the street shit goes, but we're more conscience. I feel good to have a little kid running around his house and his mother hearing him sing "All I Need." Instead of the niggas and bitches and suck my... you know what I mean.

If only they could see him now... History: He started in radio as an intern at WPAL-AM Charleston, SC in 1981 and rose from Production Director to

evenings and then afternoons. Next stop, across the street to WMGL-FM Charleston to do mornings. In 1990, it was off to WTUA-FM, just outside Charleston, for his first programming stint. 
