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

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

Trace Adkins is a workin' man's man. His music is known for being believeable and easy to relate to, and his latest effort, Songs About Me, is no different. The songs are an authentic, and Adkins says autobiographical, representation of his way of life. At 23 he worked on an off-shore drilling rig in the Gulf of Mexico and in 1992 he moved to Nashville, where he worked construction jobs during the day, while singing at night. In the past year Adkins has reaped the rewards sown with a decade of hard work and working-class anthems such as his first hits "Every Light. In The House Is On" and "This Ain't No Thinkin' Thing." Songs About Me is filled with the kind of grit and passion for which he has always been known, and the title track is the fastest-moving single he's had in several years. The recognition may be greater than ever, but the formula behind it hasn't changed. "I record songs I can believe in and sing with conviction," he says. "It's that simple."

Always A New Horizon The AristoMedia Group Shares 25 Years of Achievements

LONGEVITY IS NATURE'S RELIARD FOR DOING THINGS RIGHT.

Over the past 25 years, the AristoMedia Group has evolved from a fledgling publicity agency into a comprehensive entertainment services company that also embraces video promotion and marketing, radio promotion and artist development, dance club promotion, venue marketing and music publishing. Ulherever an artist intersects with the public, AristoMedia is there.

eff Walker founded Aristo Music Associates in the attic of his Nashville home in April 1980 after a four-year run as vice president of operations of Con Brio Records, a prominent independent country label. To get matters running smoothly, he drafted his wife, Terri, as his secretary. Walker made the career turn, he explains, because he saw that the increasingly complex country music industry needed a publicity firm that understood all its facets.

A native of Australia with a degree in economics and specialties in accounting and law, Walker arrived in Nashville in 1974 to visit his father, noted arranger/composer Bill Walker. He soon decided to stay. Possessed of a sunny disposition and an irrepressible penchant for punning, Walker fit right into Music Row's easygoing, familial ways of doing business.

In country music, 1980 was the year of the industryboosting movies *Urban Cowboy* and *Coal Miner's Daughter* and of such landmark hits as "Coward Of The County," "My Heroes Have Always Been Cowboys" and "He Stopped Loving Her Today." The time was ripe for adventurous, entrepreneurial thinking.

Aristo's first client was the Shorty Lavender Talent Agency. "I really didn't have a track record as a publicist," Walker admits, "but Shorty just took me at face value." Fortunately, Lavender's roster had some heavy-hitters, among them Ray Price, Juice Newton and Hank Williams Jr. "It opened a lot of doors for me," says Walker. Before long, singer/songwriter Roger Bowling came aboard. Fresh from co-writing "Lucille" and "Coward Of The County," both career rockets for Kenny Rogers, Bowling had just signed an artist deal with Mercury Records. "It just sort of built from there," Walker notes.

But the seismic shift for Walker's new company occurred in early 1983 when clients Mason Dixon and Karen Taylor-Good came to him with their music videos and asked if he could find a way to get them some exposure. MTV had sparked an explosion of interest in music videos only two years earlier, and country music was just catching onto the excitement. Walker approached the very few video venues then available, imploring them to play at least one country video per show. They liked his sales pitch and the videos that accompanied it. "All of a sudden," he says, "we had videos on HBO and VH-1. When CMT and The Nashville Network formed [in 1983], we were there. I was at the initial meeting for the formation of CMT. That was an exciting time—watching that history grow."

At this point, country music's powerbrokers still viewed music videos as a novelty. Although MTV had demonstrated that the clips could sell records, no one in the country market knew quite what to do with them. They were essentially being released into a void and allowed to sink or swim on their own. Walker saw the opportunity to promote videos much the same as record labels promoted singles to radio. Thus was born AristoMedia's

Country Video Promotion Services. That was in 1984 and just in time to earn Walker an invitation to appear on a panel at *Billboard* magazine's first Music Video Conference in Los Angeles.

"I was up there with Gayle Sparrow, the head of programming for MTV, and Michael Reinert, who was head of Rowe International, the video jukebox company, at the time," Walker recalls. "These people were pioneers in this early embryonic field, and I was there as the

voice of country music."

Reinert, who is now senior vice president for business and legal affairs at Universal Music Group in New York, remembers the passion Walker brought to this emerging field of entertainment: "Besides the fact that he was the first person l ever heard say 'G'day, y'all,' Jeff was also one of the first people I met in this business over 20 years ago who truly understood the role of videos in the country music marketplace. But more importantly, he had the vision and determination to do something about it. It was because of his efforts and promises to executives all those years ago that convinced them it was worth their while to invest in the mediuma sort of 'build it and they will come' philosophy. And he worked tirelessly to convince programmers that country videos were more than just a hat and a guitar. I know, because I was one of them back then."

As a part of his presentation to the *Billboard* conference, Walker compiled a status report on all the national and regional video outlets in the U. S. This survey proved so useful that he has since compiled and made it available to the industry each year. He notes that when he first began amassing music-video data, there were only three production companies in Nashville. Now there are many.

It was also in early 1984 that AristoMedia's video division landed its first major label account. Gary Borman, who now manages superstars Faith Hill and Keith Urban, was then handling Michael Martin Murphey. Signed to EMI America Records, Murphey had just filmed "What She Wants," a video that spotlighted the plight of runaway children. Walker orchestrated a comprehensive promotional campaign for it, which may have had more than a little to do with the single going Top 10. Within weeks, MCA and RCA secured him to work clips by the Oak Ridge Boys and Alabama.

Country video production was still moving at a crawl, and many of the early clips were little more than slices from live performances. A report in the June 2, 1984, issue of *Billboard* listed only 149 country music videos then in circulation. This would soon change. Partly as a consequence of AristoMedia's ability to integrate videos into a label's overall marketing and promotional plans, the rate of production rapidly moved up to 200-plus videos a year.

The practice of using videos to create distinct and attractive images for country artists—as well as to spotlight their albums spread to other formats. In 1989, AristoMedia opened the Christian Video Promotion Service. It continues to be one of

the most important parts of the company's operation, locating and cultivating both regional and national Christian video outlets. To make further use of its comprehensive gospel-music database, the company also plans and conducts publicity campaigns for Christian artists. Walker currently serves as a consultant to the recently established Gospel Music Channel.

Chris Parr, CMT's powerful vice president of music programming and talent relations, got his start at AristoMedia, first working there as an intern nearly 20 years ago.

"Since that time," he says, "I've seen a company that has continued to promote country music and its artists with amazing energy and consistency. Personally I'm not sure this industry realizes the efficiencies AristoMedia brought to the earliest days of music video marketing and promotions. Jeff and I spoke many times about how the investment an artist makes in a music video was amortized over spins, regardless of where those spins might live. These newfound marketing clips were also foolproof in the fact that an artist could completely create and control their own image, regardless of where a consumer might be exposed to the clip."

Despite its zeal for maximizing artist development, AristoMedia was always prudent about its clients' budgets. "One of my first assignments as an intern," says Parr, "was to call up the various video outlets and request the dub copies of the videos back so that we could reservice them to other smaller outlets. Now this may seem ludicrous today, but back then it exemplified Jeff's commitment to keeping the expenses down for his clients in the number of duplicates needed to promote a video to multiple outlets."

Today, the company produces compilation reels designed to minimize client expense. These reels in variations of beta, dvcam, SVHS and DVD formats are sent to outlets approximately twice a month. These compilations also go to selected talent buyers, music supervisors of movies and television shows and key entertainment reporters.



Craig Bann has been with Aristo-Media for 16 years and now serves as senior vice president of publicity and marketing. He notes that a fortunate side effect of having promoted

videos all these years is that the company has developed a keen sense of what does and doesn't work. That being the

case, both new artists and veteran video directors routinely come to AristoMedia for advice. "After you've watched several thousand videos, like we have," he says, "you get a feel for them...When I started, directors were more concerned about their 'art.' Now they're thinking more about being part of the marketing and artist development team, creating imagery that 's going to work with packaging and that an artist can carry through his career."

Bann says he's insistent that pop video outlets stay aware of the new faces and developments in country clips. "Country music is one of those things that once you get people exposed to it, they realize it speaks to everyone," he contends. "It's fun to turn people on to new things and make them see it's not the stereotype."

"AristoMedia was my first introduction to

country music," says Jay Frank, head of programming and label relations at Yahoo! Music. "Without me knowing a soul, Jeff Walker introduced me to everyone in Nashville which gave me instant credibility. Ever since then, Jeff and Craig

Bann have always been there as I worked to bring country music to a wider audience. Most recently, AristoMedia helped [assure] unsure execs that it was OK to embrace the Internet. Without that, we would not have risen to be the No. 1 online outlet for country music so rapidly."

Eric Sherman, of VH1-Country, is



similarly enthusiastic: "Jeff and the whole team at Aristo-Media have really been VH-1 Country's ambassadors to the country music market and the music community in Nashville. Jeff

opened up so many doors for us, and it's really through his time and effort on our behalf that VH-1 Country is now a very successful network in almost 20 million homes."

Walker points out that many video outlets have developed websites, which AristoMedia supplies regularly with additional publicity material. "What we like to do with a video project is get it on the front end and help the labels work with the outlets and provide a video marketing plan—what I call 'prolicity.' It's a combination of promotion and publicity, where you're taking elements of both and pitching a product. Promotion is really a limiting term for what our

relationship is. We'll get the outlets tickets to concerts and perhaps even artist interviews if they're in particular markets. We'll get an artist as much coverage on a particular video show as we can."

In the allied realm of general publicity, AristoMedia designs, oversees and promotes showcases, album launches and tour press. For 12 years, during the late Chris LeDoux's most productive period at Capitol Records, AristoMedia publicized his albums, concerts and related activities. The company also beat the drums for Keith Urban's first Capitol album. Among other clients of note were the late Keith Whitley, Lorrie Morgan, Charlie Daniels and Chris Cagle.

Additionally, AristoMedia has set up extended press junkets for artists as diverse as John Denver, Joan Baez and Tiny Tim. It has handled all the press relations and press credentialing for the annual (and massive) Country Radio Seminar since the late 1980s and has provided similar services for the Canadian Country Music Association for more than a dozen years.

"I recall Jeff's team being instrumental in setting up the very first Wal-Mart tour for artist Marty Brown," says Sarah Brosmer, formerly with MCA Records and now with

as AristoMedia derives its name from Aristotle, Marco is Walker's nod of respect to Guglielmo Marconi, the father of radio.) Last year, to tap the growing promotional potential of dance clubs, Walker created the Club Connection under the Marco Music Group umbrella. Rick Kelly is

Kelly deals with the secondary tier of country radio stations whose playlists form the *Radio & Records'* Indicators, *Music Row* Breakout and Texas Music charts. Besides promoting specific singles, the division also implements special campaigns around the dates on which albums are released.

"The thing that sets Marco Promotions apart from your typical independent radio promotion company," says Kelly, "is that, while we are attentive to charts and chart positions, we try to be that record label whose singles we're promoting to the radio station we're working with. So it's not just about getting airplay. It's about getting artists on the air and setting up phone interviews and streetweek promotions and setting up dates to make sure our artists talk to 40 or 50 stations in morning and afternoon drive times. Our aim is to get the artist in front of the consumer and to increase that artist's brand."

Walker contends that the dance club scene has "loads" of growth potential. "We're constantly getting requests through our website and calls and referrals from clubs wanting to be a part of our service," he reports. Apart from servicing singles and special dance mixes, the company can also supply clients with label-originated posters, standups (life-size cardboard cutouts of artists' photos), tent cards for tables, drink coasters, T-shirts,

promotional albums and a wide array of promotional ideas. "This is a significant way to break acts," Walker maintains. Although Club Connection is new as a formal division of AristoMedia, Walker and his staff long ago worked the club market on a per-project basis for such singles as "Achy Breaky Heart'" and "Boot Scootin' Boogie."

The company's club reach is formidable. Gunter says it currently services about 180 outlets, including 120 clubs, a number of mobile DJs and dozens of dance instructors who delight in trying new music with their classes. He estimates that the music he promotes is heard by 280,000 club patrons each weekend. Club Connection has seen some of it's biggest successes in it's distribution and promotion of song re-mixes. The company's first re-mix Big & Rich's "Save A Horse, Ride A Cowboy," experienced several weeks atop the iTunes country download chart, and was the top dance hit in Club Connection's Best of 2004 chart. The success of that single was followed by re-mixes from several other artists including Jamie O'Neal's "Trying To Find Atlantis."

"Club play can translate into radio play," Gunter says. "They haven't been tainted by major business consolidation [as radio has],

and they're very willing to try music that no one else is willing to. Lots of time that provides leverage to get the songs on radio. We encourage our club members to call their radio stations and share information with them. And vice versa."

The synergy that arises from AristoMedia's different divisions working together and sharing information is something that appeals to Mike Dungan, president and CEO of Capitol Records/ Nashville. "I like the fact that AristoMedia is multi-disciplined," he says. "By practicing publicity, radio promotion, video promotion and now dance marketing all under one roof, they are sensitive to the issues presented by all of these areas. While a single focused independent may be rather myopic in their approach. this is more like working with an artist development team."

As the AristoMedia Group has expanded and matured. Walker has volunteered more of his time to industryservice duties. He has served long terms on the boards of Country Radio Broadcasters, the Country Music Association, the Academy of Country Music, the Recording Academy, Leadership Music and he is pas president of the Nashville Film Festival. He is in charge of the CMA's global outreach efforts as head of its Global Markets Task Force. In that capacity, he helped set up advisory groups in Australia and England.

Paul Allen, the former executive

and now a professor at Middle Tennessee State University, has his own take on what makes the AristoMedia Group effective and a valued member of the Nashville community. "Jeff Walker is one of the best-connected people in the

music business," he declares. " He's always a calming influence during those times when people tend to react with a knee-jerk rather than think with their heads. He has a genuine interest in seeing the right thing done."

"In order to be successful," Walker says,

"you have to give back to the community. I love this community. I love getting up and coming to work. I want to help make a difference. Nashville has a lot of great people, and by working in organizations with them, you get to see them in a different light."

Two of the people Walker has worked most closely with are Ed Benson, executive director of the CMA, and C. Paul Corbin, vice president of writer and publisher relations for BMI, the performance rights society.

"I've always called Jeff Walker the hardest working man in the music industry," says Benson. "Not only does he run his own businesses successfully, but he is also the top

"volunteer" in our business. He has traveled overseas numerous times at his own expense to help advance CMA's international development efforts. One more thing: Jeff is also one of the kindest, most caring people 1 know. He is always there to offer his support whenever one of us is down and out. I know from personal experience. During the past two years, when I encountered several medical issues, no one was more concerned and kept up with my condition more than Jeff."

Corbin sees the same virtues. "If I could describe Jeff Walker in two words, I would use 'hard worker.' I have served on a number of music industry boards with Jeff, and he's always been eager and generous with his time and energy. He's an upbeat member of our community and passionate about its programs and people. I often tease Jeff about the success he is having with AristoMedia, but I do it to compliment his efforts with humor. He likes a good story and laughs well."

Sarah Brosmer appreciates Walker's ability to get jobs done efficiently: "Jeff may be one of the few Music Row leaders who actually creates an agenda for a meeting and then keeps the meeting in order so that our [attentiondeficit-disorder] bunch can stick to the topics at hand and generate real business."

However his virtues are assessed, Walker emerges as an entrepreneurial dynamo. Not only does the growth of

his company attest to this fact, so does the CMA President's Award he received in 1996 for his extraordinary services and the International Support Award he won two years later from the Canadian Country Music Association. His work in publicity, which launched him on this 25-year journey, earned his company Music Row's 2004 Independent Publicist of the Year trophy.

Since 1989, the AristoMedia Group has occupied its own spacious two-story building on 16th Avenue, South, at the top of historic Music Row. The company has a total staff of 15 or so. And the TV in the lobby is always turned to a video channel.
