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

# **TOPSIDES**

GEORGE MICHAEL has done it again. This time it took him only four weeks to reach No. 1. And keep in mind, this project is his solo debut. But ... this also is **PEBBLES'** debut. She's No. 2 and knocking hard on the door. Meanwhile, JOHNNY KEMP has a monster on his hands: his single is No. 4 in its fourth week on the R&B Chart<sup>™</sup>, and No. 1 for the secondstraight week on the dance chart (Rhythm Of The Street). And JESSE JOHNSON hops to the Top 5 in his fifth week. AL B. SURE stays Top 5 on the R&B Chart<sup>TM</sup>, he moves to No. 1 on the Video Chart, he debuts at No. 2 on the British singles sheet and debuts in the Top 10 on the album chart. (And he's a debut artist). Also, GEORGE **MICHAEL** pushes to No. 2 on the album chart, just as KOOL MOE DEE heads into the Top 5 at retail.

# R&B LEGENDS



DEE DEE SHARP:
"Come On Everybody,
Let's Pony Again!"

(— From "Ride," 1962)

Looking back on Philadelphia's music history, one can't help but reminisce about one female artist who had a major impact on dance music as well as the girl-group scene: Dionne LaRue, known to the music world as Dee Dee Sharp. At 16, her first solo effort, "Mashed Potato Time," climbed to the top of the charts.

At an early age, Dee Dee gained her first experience singing in her grandfather's church choir. With a growing interest in music, she and a couple of friends decided to record a few demos while in high school. In 1961, she saw a want ad in a newspaper calling for someone who could read music, play the piano and sing. She interviewed and got the job at Cameo Records (which later merged with Parkway.)

With the success of Chubby Checker's "Twist" sound in full swing, Parkway decided to release yet another tune in the same mode entitled, "Slow Twistin'." Although Checker received full credit for it, the song was actually a

duet with, the then-unknown, Dee Dee Sharp. The song was an instant hit climbing into the Top 10 on both the R&B and the Pop Charts in the Spring of 1962. On the heals of the song's success, Cameo decided to rush release another song recorded with Dee Dee, called "Mashed Potato Time." Not only did Cameo wish to build upon Dee Dee's new exposure, but another record company (Chess Records subsidiary label, Checker) in Chicago had just released a tune called, "Mashed Potatoes." Ultimately, Cameo's release beat out the other.

At a time when novelty-dance records were the public's fancy, this type of tune was released day in and day out, creating a fierce competition in the marketplace. "Mashed Potato Time" proved itself to be an excellent competitor, climbing all the way to the No. 2 spot on the Pop charts. And on the R&B charts, it made its way to the top position and stayed there for four weeks. It was a song without many instruments, but carried by Dee Dee's superb vocals, it became a smash. Next to be released was "Gravy" (No. 11 R&B, No. 9 Pop); followed by the gritty "Ride" (No. 7 R&B, No. 5 Pop); and in 1963 was trailed by the repititious "Do The Bird" (No 8 R&B, No 10 Pop). In just a short time, Dee Dee garnered four Top 10 pop singles, an amazing feat for an R&B female artist at the time.

Cameo/Parkway's promotional efforts also contributed to Dee Dee's successes. Each of her single releases included a picture sleeve. She was also given a logo for her nameplate. Each of the "D's" in Dee Dee was turned into a quarter note, and the "S" in Sharp was made into a treble clef.

Unfortunately, apparently Dee Dee's follow-up to "Do The BIrd" sounded to similar to its predecesor. The song was still very popular, but "Rock Me In The Cradle of Love" failed to break onto the Top 40 charts. Slowing her sound down just a bit, "Wild" was released toward the end of 1963 and became her last *bona fide* hit (No. 25 R&B, No. 33 Pop). This song was her first attempt to alter the sound and style of her music.

But it might have been too late ...

Beginning in 1964, Dee Dee was barely denting the bottom of the charts. In February, she had a two-sided hit called "Where Did I Go Wrong" (No. 82 Pop), with "Willyam Willyam" (No. 97 Pop). Her final hit came toward the end of 1965 in the form of "I Really Love You" (No. 31 R&B, No. 78 Pop). By 1966, it seemed over.

But this would not be the end of her association with music. Dee Dee would marry Kenny Gamble of the Philadelphia International Complex in 1967. She would try releasing a couple of singles and albums in the late-1970s and early-1980s, but the magic was missing. Yet, we are left with a repertoire of songs that remains part of the legacy of R&B music. Dee Dee's youthful voice and lyrics should remind us of the days when teenagers were trying to create new dance steps every week on "Shindig" and "American Bandstand." And, who knows, she could return to the music scene again, starting up the public's pulse, getting the people back on their feet and Slow Twisting once more ...

# **NEW PRODUCERS ON THE RISE**



Call up QUINCY JONES' office regarding his musical services and, depending on who you are, you'll probably be told that the famed record producer has enough projects to last him for the next 10 years, and they probably won't be exaggerating. JIMMY JAM and TERRY LEWIS, thanks largely to JANET JACKSON'S Control LP and an '87 Producers of the Year Grammy award, have turned the corner both in the caliber of projects they accept and fee they command. And thanks to the success he's had with WHITNEY HOUSTON, ARE-THA FRANKLIN and his own Producer of the Year Grammy this year, just any old act can pretty much forget working with NARADA MI-CHAEL WALDEN, currently producing LIONEL RICHIE.

Nevertheless, because of these developments, some young new producers are getting an opportunity to cut their teeth on projects and a number of them have a lot to offer. ROBERT BROOKINS, TEDDY RILEY. BRYAN LOREN, VINCENT BRANTLEY, ex-CLUB NOU-VEAU members DENZIL FOS-TER and THOMAS MCELROY. MONTY SEWARD, CORNELI-US MIMS, JERRY KNIGHT and AARON ZIGMAN and DONALD ROBINSON, among others, aren't exactly household names. However, among A&R execs, these young, ambitious newcomers are proving themselves able to get the job done.

For many of these names, moving into the field of production was a natural progression; as session players and songwriters, their contribution usually ended up so vital to the results that artists either gave them producer's credit or producers shared co-production credits. Others earned their production stripes

after submitting songs to A&R execs, who, impressed with the demo, decided to give them a shot at producing the track for a project. "I think JHERYL BUSBY at MCA was one of the main cats to start that," says songwriter/producer NICK JOHNSON. "You'd take him a song and he'd say, 'Who produced it? Then you can do it for the album."

That's how Vincent Brantley started out, after leaving LEON SYLVERS' Silverspoon company; Busby allowed him and then partner RICK TIMAS



# CALLOWAY BROTHERS

to direct, in the studio, the songs they wrote for NEW EDITION. Brantley, now working on MCA's SUGAR-BABES project, recently produced several fine tracks for ANGELA BO-FILL'S Capitol debut.

The appointment of some of these new cats is simply a case of both common sense and dollars and cents. At 21, Teddy Riley, who has scored with work on **KEITH SWEAT** and **KOOL MOE**DEE, is the same age as his audience; why wouldn't he know what they want? On the other hand, the undoubtedly high

prices of more established producers probably led Wing headman ED ECKSTINE to entrust young Rex Salas with the bulk of VANESSA WILLIAMS' debut LP. Indeed, a young producer aiming to make his mark is more apt to bring in a project on time and under budget. And the new breed is already looking for longevity. LARRY ROBINSON produced only one track on the Williams LP, but the project features several tunes from staff writers from Avatar, the publishing company Robinson formed two years ago when he started "looking to publishing companies for real soul music and couldn't find any."

In the meantime, young hot shots continue to rise. L.A. and BABY-FACE, after several durable R&B hits, await that smash to take them to the next level, while REGGIE and VIN-CENT CALLOWAY were the next to join Jam/Lewis and Walden. Their big hits on LEVERT, GLADYS KNIGHT & THE PIPS and a strong record on TEDDY PENDER-GRASS prove the duo has what it takes to go all the way. And for every ascension, there's another hot shot, ready to pick up the slack at half the price ...

MEANWHILE ...

BACK AT THE RANCH: Perhaps it will be confirmed by the time this hits the street, but rumors say DIANA ROSS signed a big deal at MCA, after a rather uneventful tenure at RCA ... SISTER SLEDGE, no longer on Atlantic, is now managed by JACK NELSON, who also handles JEF-FREY OSBORNE. NILE RODGERS is producing them for EDDIE MURHPY's "Coming To America" film soundtrack ... speaking of Murphy, what's this about his doing a label deal with MCA?

# RAP WARS: WHO'S WINNING?

The "battle" has always been at the heartbeat of hip-hop. Even before Sugarhill Records pressed up the trendsetting "Rapper's Delight" more than a

decade ago, street rappers gained notoriety by engaging in head-to-head competition. Today, tens of millions of records later, two hip-hop headliners are reprising the old-style battle, but with a twist. This time, it's on the airwayes.

Kool Moe Dee was a founding member of one of Rap's earliest groups, The Threacherous Three. Since going solo, his carefully crafted story-telling raps have steadily catapulted him into Rap's superstar orbit.

Last year, L.L. Cool J became the first Black rapper to crossover without

the help of an established white band. His last LP, Bigger And Deffer, sold over two million copies.

Kool Moe Dee threw the first punch with the title track of his current LP, How Ya Like Me Now. "I'm bigger and better, forget about deffer," he rapped, taking dead aim at L.L. Cool J's Bigger And Deffer LP. "Every time I rocked the mike I left a stain in your brain."

"I took offense to L.L.'s 'I'm Bad," said Moe Dee, "because I felt he was taking some subtle shots at me. We

(The Treacherous Three) were among the first to syncopate, stop-and-go, double-time Rap and so forth. And rappers get tired of me claiming that. So, that's why I think L.L. kind of struck back."

"You used to rock in my face, and now I'm number one ... I reign supreme, and I'm notorious, I'll crunch you like a jellybean. I'm Bad."

"How ya think it feels to see another M.C. get paid, using my rap style ... You took my style, I'm taking it back!"

L.L. Cool J responded to Moe Dee's attacks with a specially designed B-side to his recent hit, "Goin' Back To Cali." The song, "Jack The Ripper," is among the most-requested Rap records in recent months. "How ya like me now, I'm getting busier. I'm double-platinum. I'm watching you get dizzier ... Show that old school sucker punk what real hiphop is!"

"He feels I'm a threat," said Moe Dee.
"Others have made records about him and he's never even commented about it. I think it was a panic move. But it's definitely working to my advantage."

In the past few weeks, Kool Moe Dee had the highest-charting Rap single ("Wild, Wild West") and album (How Ya Like Me Now) in the country. He recently lost to L.L. for Best Rap Single at the Soul Train Awards, but Moe Dee's growing popularity seemed to have a mellowing effect on L.L.

"'Jack The Ripper' is just a B-Boy record," said L.L. "I didn't say anything about Kool Moe Dee in it. Kool Moe Dee makes good records. That's just something you (the media) want to pump up so you'll have something to talk about." Moe Dee, on the other hand, has plans to add fuel to the fire, "We're not taking 'Jack The Ripper' lying down. I wouldn't be surprised if the next few singles had some interesting B-sides, if you know what I mean."



# **TEDDY PENDERGRASS: The Un-Cover Story**

Teddy Pendergrass sought happiness, he ended up with Joy.

His latest album satisfied his personal ambition: to speak the mind of his heart; as well as his professional aspiration: to create an album that would sell.

Really, no story about Teddy Pendergrass needs to be written because his album speaks his story so completely. Listen to the cover photograph on the album jacket: it shouts, "Joy!" This is not per chance. Teddy, himself, worked with the designer and photographer in packaging the album. They revised their approach time and again, until the photographs, the title, the placement of every element said, simply: "Joy!"

Next, place the disk on your turntable. Notice the songs. Each is a story, each depicts a dimension of love, each sets a mood, each is unique. Again not per chance. Teddy didn't receive these songs in the mail, ad-lib modifications in the studio and send the resulting vinyl on its way. No, he

worked with each songwriter—check out the writer's credits—guiding and following each on a creative journey, until he had songs of love that he could sing truly from his heart.

Notice even the sequencing of the album. Teddy made those choices too: figuring out how to start the album, how to pace it, determining which songs are the best transitions to which, deciding how to make the album flow

If you seek Teddy's message, listen to his lyrics: hear the tenderness, that unmistakeable Teddyness, hear the joy, hear his heart, listen for the sounds of an appreciative lover, prepare your ear for the sincere song of a yearning mate. This album is intimate, painfully personal, so honest and real that any commentary misses the point that is made so well by the songs and the sound of his voice.

Teddy shares his personal life, but not his private life. If you want to know the details of his private life — mind your own business. Or ask Teddy yourself about his private matters and have him directly and hotly tell you: "Mind your own business." Nothing on the album is private, although it's all personal. Nothing sheds any light on Teddy the Real Man, only on Teddy the Artist. If you want more than that from Teddy — tough.

"Listen to the music," he says.
"It's about love because we need to sing about love in this world. There's so little of it out there. If you must judge, judge the music. I don't think judging the music gives you the right to judge the person. This is the *music* business."

Oh yeah ...

"Nobody has the right to judge anybody," Teddy goes on. "It's all about the music. I've been doing this too long, too many years. It's all about the music ..."

# R&B: A VIEW FROM THE TOP

Bhaskar Menon, Chairman of Capitol Industries-EMI, Inc., as well as Chairman and CEO of EMI Music Worldwide, has created philosophies that reinforce R&B music. Menon has developed a healthy appreciation for the sheer importance of R&B, a commitment that has been implemented by the key executives within his companies.

How does a gentleman from India become chairman of a huge, multinational company? After receiving a BA Honors Degree from the University of Delhi and a Masters Degree from Oxford University, Menon joined EMI Limited in London. In 1970, he became that company's Managing Director of International Services, as well as GM of its Overseas Division, Divisional Director of EMI Limited, and a Director on the boards of several international EMI companies.

In 1971, Menon became President and CEO of what is now Capitol Industries-EMI, Inc. He is on the parent Board Of Directors at EMI Ltd., London, and now holds the title of Chairman of the Board/CEO of Capitol Industries-EMI, Inc.

Menon's far-reaching philosophies, particularly those on R&B music today, are dynamic and inspiring. He views the music business as a "unique, interactive global business in which companies must always focus upon reaching the widest possible audience." He spoke of the "magic and excitement" of music and its effects upon the industry and the individual, recently sharing his perspective in a speech at the CEMA (Capitol/EMI-Manhattan/Angel) Convention in Los Angeles held April 28.

Menon has much to say about R&B music internationally. His commitment to develop it worldwide is becoming more centered.

Menon remembers the beginning, when, in the '60s, EMI represented Motown. A long marketing and promotional relationship with Motown meant taking creative input to the market. Menon feels that representing Motown's great Black artists was a deeply influential relationship.

"Many of our creative people felt this was the strongest single influence on the development of values, musically and otherwise."

The connection to Motown was really a pioneering effort launching aroundthe-world representation and worldwide interest by EMI in what the Black music experience in America meant.

Today Menon stands behind a reaffirmed commitment to Black music a "rare gift," he says, "that is being exported all over the world by Capitol, who in 1985 became the No. 1 label on the Billboard charts."

When asked why the vast wealth that R&B music had to offer was going untapped Menon responded by saying that there was a period when, in his opinion, the company wasn't ready for "the scale and quality of the commitment ... the fanaticism" that was essential for

the constituencies who had great influence, including radio, Black accounts, and Black consumers.

After transferring to North America from London to become President and CEO of Capitol, however, Menon concentrated on creating more structure for the company. Out of this decision emerged Manhattan Records, designed to establish a street presence, primarily in segments of Black music, with a focus on new and promising Black artists.

"I've had a perception problem," Menon candidly states, "with segmentation of the music market, particularly in America."

To remedy this oversight, elaborate monitoring of the conscious and subconscious segregation of R&B music was implemented and, as far as Menon was concerned, Black music is "the greatest popular music of our time." He goes on to say that "Black music has a very special magic ... it's the world's greatest popular music influence." This influence he speaks of is felt in the United States, France, Japan, Britain, India ... indeed, the whole world.

As for the commitment to R&B music, Menon's convictions are inspirational. He says: "The first, and most important, ingredient (in spreading the sound of R&B) is excellent, highly competent, fanatical executives who share the faith, confidence, and the immeasureable support of the investment behind Black music."

Menon considers Joe Smith, President and CEO of Capitol-EMI, as an ideal Black music promoter. Smith is highly regarded in the industry as a major mover and a guider in helping Black music get to a prominent position in the marketplace.

Smith and others have pushed R&B forward in the United States through the power of promotions and marketing centered on Black music.

Internationally, EMI has a substantial investment in maintaining its commitment to exploit R&B worldwide. "The market demands it," Menon explains. Sales figures show the growth that R&B is enjoying globally.

A problem has existed for performers in that they are too often "Black" or "white" acts. Menon acknowledges that the "tendency is to label and it's regrettable." His personal philosophy is that

labeling music guarantees that the company's focus on that particular segment is insured. "The importance is that the dominant area of demand is addressed. Right now that dominant area is the Black music scene, whose substantial resources and energies are being tapped," Menon said.

In his view, music is not segregated. He doesn't subscribe to the theory that there is an ethnic or racial market. Menon believes that crossover music is, in essence, everyone's music. "Where is it crossing over from?" "From absolute Black to absolute White? It's ridiculous to presume. Music is an emotional experience that touches everybody," he said. He went on to say that Black artists quite frequently find acceptance at a media/ consumer level that transcends segregation theories that the music industry maintains, from corporate levels to radio programming.

Around the world, he cites how various artists have overcome the view that English isn't as popular as it could be. "In Germany, 80% of the music is American. Tina Turner sold 1.5 million units there ... Bob Marley is one of France's biggest names." By remaining

consumer-oriented, his company has remained consumer-responsive.

Menon further supports his view that there is no-color-line, stating that wherever the creative assets are, the Black artist is a dominant factor in the market, representing the penetration into a huge market in America as well as all over the world.

Menon's goal, and that of Capitol-EMI, is to remain totally market-responsive, and that means a larger voice for Black consumers, the media, and, ultimately, those great and wondrous R&B performers worldwide.

# JOE SMITH: Winning Time

"I'm telling you I've been a winner for a lot of years and I've been around winners..." Joe Smith told the hundreds gathered for Capitol-EMI's first convention in 11 years. He challenged the CEMA family to outhustle, outwork and outthink everybody else on the street saying, "There are thousands of people that want our jobs. And why not?"

Smith joined Capitol Industries-EMI, Inc. as President/CEO in February 1987, to give a much-needed shot in the arm. Despite boasting a roster of superstars including Tina Turner, David Bowie, Freddie Jackson, and Duran Duran, "a kind of lethargy had set in the company," as Smith recalls.

During an exclusive interview with the R&B Report<sup>™</sup>, he described what he had to do to turn the company around.

"They didn't feel that we were leaders, they felt we would always be followers, that Capitol, EMI and Manhattan could not be considered up there with CBS and WEA," Smith said. Since I'm from

WEA, and since John Fagot (VP, Promotions) and Ron McCarrell (VP/Mktg.) are from CBS and Step Johnson (VP/GM, Black Music Div.) is from A&M; Sal Licata (Pres./CEO, EMI-Manhattan) is from RCA, we don't know of that philosophy. We know we win — that we're up there with everybody. And we'll lead the way," Smith said.

Smith left behind a long trail of successes and brought with him a commitment to the development of Black music. There were no Black acts when he took over the helm at WB in the early '70s and guided the company to a prominent position in the Black music market. He joined Elektra Asylum as Chairman in 1976 and during the next seven years quadrupled the company's profits and artists like Grover Washington, Jr. and Patrice Rushen came to prominence.

His turn-around strategy has differed from the WB days but his commitment to R&B music hasn't. In contrast to WB, where he had to start from scratch developing a Black music department, he had something to work with at Capitol.

"One of the first commitments was to strenghthen and position the Black music areas of these companies," Smith explains. "While we were certainly very much in the Black music business a year and a half ago, I didn't think it had the right posture in our own company so I immediately went to work at Capitol where there was a larger roster and started restructuring," he said. "Capitol had some very good records and some good artists at the time, however, I didn't think the department was sufficiently manned and sufficiently positioned in the company to maximize the impact of that," Smith said. Smith noted that it was a small department without a lot of clout and reported through layers of management that couldn't help

it (pop promotion, for instance).

Smith began his reconstruction by bringing in Step Johnson to head the Black division at Capitol. "We gave it a spot with its own budget, its own accountability and its reporting lines going only to the label president and not through some intermediary," Smith said. "Right away that kind of stature in the company puts you in a different ballgame. You can make decisions and you don't clear everything and you're accountable," he added.

At EMI America there were a lot of new artists and not much of a department and at Manhattan in New York there was a department and not a lot of product so they merged the two labels.

From his days as a disc jockey on a pop station playing R&B music to heading WB and Elektra/Asylum to his current post at Capitol, Smith has proven that his commitment to R&B music to be a long-standing one. Smith brought a wealth of experience to Capitol and the energy and enthusiasm he brings is contagious. He says they have all the tools and everything is in place, now all they have to do is to execute the plan.

"In these companies are some outstanding people who know what to do with this talent once its identified and we're building an even more efficient delivery system in terms of distribution, manufacturing ... all the mechanics," Smith states.

Though '87 wasn't a very good year because they had a lot of things to clean up, Smith is confident of his company's ability to become the dominant force in the industry within a few years. "We are absolutely players now and our competition knows it. We are players and when this group of people have been together for yet another year they'll be a lot closer together and it'll be a great, great record company next year this time — I promise you."

# STEP JOHNSON: The R&B Perspective

Joe Smith and Step Johnson came to Capitol a year ago like a couple of cowboys coming to clean up a town.

They made it clear that the firepower would not come from Smith & Wesson, but from Smith & Johnson.

The company was in a doldrums: low in morale, low in ambition, bereft of confidence.

That was a year ago.

"That has changed," Johnson reports.
"We've gone from a company that's just sitting on the bench to a company that's a *player*. Capitol no longer just wants to be in the record business. We want to be the best in the record industry.

"We have all the tools. We have all the machinery. Our focus is on getting the best acts that we can possibly get — from breaking new acts to acquiring established acts."

One of Smith's first moves was to establish a self-contained, autonomous and accountable division that was focused on Black music and empowered to carry out the vision of its leader, Johnson.

"In the Black Music Division, we're here to develop a division that can contribute to the profitability of Capitol Records. We have our own VP/A&R (Wayne Edwards), our own VP/ Promotion (Hank Caldwell) and our own Dir./Marketing (Gwen Franklin). The only position we don't have in our division is VP/Sales. We're our own division, a part of the Capitol family."

And they're winning.

"Already we've broken two new acts (dáKrash and Suavé) in the first quarter of 1988. Most people don't break two acts in a year. Look out for us."

# **Tony Terry's Testimony Of Talent**

A Black Washington, D.C., high school student receives counsel from his Black vocal instructor: "Because you're a Black man, your opportunities will be very, very scarce, almost non-existent. Life is going to be a tough disappointment." Great for starters.

He disregards that profound advice, moves to New York to pursue his musical ambitions and, as a transplant, lands a stage-acting job making less than \$100 a week. As Murphy's law would have it, within the first week, his apartment is broken into and everything is stolen. Back to the old drawing board.

At one low point, we find our man sharing Snickers bars with his cousin for dinner. "Times got really, really rough and there was a time when I was really discouraged," says T.T. If this sounds like a scene out of the life of a destined-to-be-down-and-out type ... guess again. Enter the main character in Scene One of our story: Tony Terry.

For Tony, nothing's come easy. For all intents and purposes, he should be the moderately spoiled, only son born between two sisters. Yet his struggles gave him a crash course in dues-paying.


"All of that has really helped me appreciate things and not take anything for granted. The obstacles have made me want what I want much more. I used to laugh in the face of adversity; then I started crying in the face of adversity; now I just laugh, let it happen and deal with it accordingly, without letting it get me down."

At 8 years old, Tony, his sister and two cousins sang around the Washington Metropolitan Gospel circuit in a group called the Freedom Gospel Singers. "Sometimes we'd sing four times on any one Sunday at three or four different churches. After a while, we got tired of it, but the music was definitely

engrained in me. I couldn't get enough.

"I used to buy records of artists and listen to them forever. I was obsessed with records. My mom would come in to remind me go to sleep. I'd just turn down the music real low and keep listening. While all my friends were outside playing, I'd spend my free time inside, doing something musical: either listening, learning, or recording something with some contraption I hooked up to be able to do three or four tracks of my vocals."

With a lot of stage experience from

high school and college under his belt, Tony migrated to New York at 18 to do a play, "Black Nativity," as well as a couple of others. After the season, he returned to Washington to manage a restaurant and, at 21, returned to the Big Apple to give a singing career a second shot

"Coming here wasn't easy, but it developed a lot of character in me. I learned not to take things for granted—like money, having a car and eating. My cousin and friends hounded me not

to give up and about six months later I met Ted Currier, my producer, and things just started turning around."

After doing session work with Sweet Sensation, the Boogie Boys and Black Britain, he began work on his own demo. Then things finally began turning around for him.


Currier presented Tony's demo to Capitol's Don Grierson. Tony was a breath away from signing with Capitol, when Grierson left the label to become Sr. VP/A&R at Epic. Taking Tony to Epic with him, Don continued grooming him for his eventual success.

Involved in eight of the 10 songs on his Forever Yours album, Tony's first single, "She's Fly," was presented to him during the last two weeks of the recording phase of the project by a school buddy from D.C., George Dick. "Lovey Dovey" was the first song Tony penned. Initially written as a ballad, Tony recalls, "I heard this kickin' track that I thought would fit my melody like a glove. And it did turn out to be a perfect fit." His current single, "Forever Yours," is potentially his third hit. "We've been getting quite a bit of response on the pop side with this single. Being 'pop' is not super-duper important to me, but I just want to open the door so that perhaps I can get more of the She's Fly or Lovey Dovey material out there that maybe they weren't ready for yet."

Tony's in the process of putting a band together to go on the road as an opening act for Gladys Knight & The Pips. If all goes as planned, he'll also be doing some work with the Commodores and Teena Marie.

Graduating with diploma and honors from the School of Hard Knocks, Tony's now better equipped to handle whatever Scene Two will bring.



Keyboardist Clyde Criner comes on strong with a hot combination of fusion and funk. "A Song To Tell, A Tale To Sing" starts the album off with a crisp, free-flowing rhythm. "Just Might Be That Way" presents a haunting melody on top of a lively rhythm. "Arco Iris (Rainbow)," one of my favorites on this project, is a moving tune with a flavorful sax melody provided by Craig Rivers. Clyde's tasty touch on the keys complements this tune masterfully. "Black Manhattan" opens Side Two and features hot licks — Santana style.

Check this one out. "Kinesis" is another favorite, accented by Marcus Miller's bass. The title cut, "Behind The Sun" is a thought-provoking ethereal song, highlighted by Santana's poetry on guitar. WAYNE SHORTER: Still Forging Ground

Forging new ground is par for the course in the career of veteran saxophonist Wayne Shorter. As one of the founding members of the pioneer fusion band Weather Report, Wayne has proven that he is an innovator.

From his days as a young member of Miles Davis' band to his current solo projects, Wayne has traveled through diverse musical territory.

A native of Newark, NJ, Wayne grew up listening to musicians like Woody Herman and Stan Kenton. Jam sessions with John Coltrane, Max Roach and Jimmy Smith opened his ears to the growing spirit of improvisation.

'When Coltrane invited me to his house for a number of days after I left the Army, we just sat and actually talked about life and music and played together and talked about the challenge of different things in the craft," Wayne recalls. "He would demonstrate something and say, 'This is hard to do, this is something to work on, isn't it?' And I would say 'This is another hard thing to do.' For instance, I would take my hand, crash it down on the piano and hold my foot on the resonating pedal.

He'd pick up the horn and try to play all the notes he could hear in there and make sense of it against what we were playing. He'd say, 'How about this' and play a cluster or something ridiculous and we'd say 'Man, if we could take that and bring it to life.' Then 'Trane' would talk inside out. Put the verb where it's not supposed to be. Think of a sentence, start in the middle and go both ways. After a while he started splitting tones, trying to play three at once. That's the kind of stuff we would do and talk about when I was growing up," Wayne reflects.

After his stint in the Army, Wayne landed a gig with Horace Silver, but a month later he signed on with Art Blakey.

Wayne recorded a series of solo albums while with Blakey, and in 1964 a turning point came when he joined Miles Davis' band, which included Herbie Hancock and Tony Williams.

"Working with Miles for six years and working with the caliber of musicians was a welcome turning point. We knew that we had the pick and ax in our hands, so to speak. We were breaking through some walls — trying to put up something fresh and more challenging.

"When we talked about music and what we had to do, we came to the conclusion that we had our work cut out for us in terms of the acceptance in America. We knew it was going to take a while, and knew it wasn't going to be easy. It was going to be a challenge like the other challenges we set for ourselves."

Wayne has responded to the challenge as his current Columbia release, *Joy Ryder*, continues forging new ground.




