WIRELESS MICROPHONES: How To Succeed Without A Cable

#### By Zenobia Millet

T'is the season of the music awards shows and we are bombarded with collages of performances by today's popular artists. Until recently, the stage would be crisscrossed with microphone cables. Technology now allows artists to perform unencumbered with wireless microphones, headsets, and instrument pickups. However, it is not is a problem-free medium. The chances of success, though, can be increased greatly by a little education.

The wireless system consists of three major elements. The transmitter is made up of the microphone and the electronics to transmit the signal. It can be integrated into a hand-held microphone or in a separate portable pack that a lavalier (clip-on) mic or instrument pickup can plug into. The antenna receives the transmitted signals and is connected to the receiver which decodes the frequencies. Essentially, this is a mini-broadcast station. There are three major frequency bands of operation. The 49Mhz band, the lowest, is used by inexpensive systems, and includes CB radios, most consumer wireless devices (telephones, garage door openers, car phones, etc.) and other commercial transmissions. Interference problems are greatest for microphones in this band. The FM band (88-108Mhz) is also used by less-expensive systems and interference is much less a problem particularly in remote areas. The VHF band (150-

216Mhz) contains the broadcast television frequencies and corresponds to channels 7 to 13. This band is very low in noise and interference and is used by the best wireless systems.

The typical microphone cable is shielded against spurious noises and interferences. That protection is taken away when a wireless system is used since the signal is transmitted through the air. Thus, it is subjected to other harmonic variables and conflicting frequency broadcasts, AC line hums and leakage, neon light interference, and even clothing noise. To reduce a lot of these noises, the distance between the transmitter and the antenna/receiver should be as short as possible.Wireless really only refers to the link between these two elements. Although it may be inconvenient to have the receiver away from the console, its position close to the talent will greatly reduce interference. Also, move the antenna

around to find the location where the least interference occurs — a few feet can make a big difference. Be sure the wireless transmitter and receiver antennas are polarized, i.e., oriented parallel to each other. Hand-held systems seem to work better at a 45-degree angle. The squelch control on the receiver mutes spectrum noise when no signal is present much like a noise gate. Some models make it user-adjustable, others have it internally preset by the factory. Stray noises in the sound system can be reduced via the squelch control and also by simply turning off the transmitter when not in use. Other tips for eliminating noise are use of a good power surge protector/AC filter, good coaxial and audio cables, and lots of fresh batteries.

Diversity systems assist the antennas in seeking out the strongest signals. They consist of two or more antennas positioned on different dimensional

planes. They are connected to the receiver by coaxial cable of special lengths for less interference or by audio cables. If a signal is weaker on one antenna, the other will prevail to get the combined stronger signal. There are two types of diversity systems — the antenna diversity and the switching diversity. The antenna diversity uses placement of two or more antennas to optimize reception. One should be aligned vertically, the other at 45 degrees. The switching diversity monitors the signal strength and uses audio switches to change to the stronger antenna signal. This system, usually more expensive, is convenient but often has switching noise. A well-placed antenna diversity system offers the best coverage and has less phase cancellation problems.

Here are some tips for selecting the appropriate wireless system. Know how you are going to use it. Tell all the possible ways that it will be used. For example, if multiple systems will be used, compatible frequencies have to be chosen. Know where you are going to use it - in a permanent place or on the road with a tour. Since these systems operate on the unused television channels at that particular location, it is very important to know where it's going to be used so the right frequencies can be selected. Learn to spot obvious sources of interference. Nearby broadcast facilities, police stations, private security companies and ham operators are a few obvious sources of potential problems and can be flagged to choose non-conflicting channels.

Communication with the supplier and the engineer can eliminate a lot of problems before the system is turned on. Last but not least, do not expect a cheap system to give the performance of an expensive system — get the right system for the application.

#### A LOOK AT Z'LOOKE



In just a couple of months, Orpheus has pivoted into the realm of long-term advancement with a hand-in-glove relationship between EMI and one of the most successful management and production companies — Hush Productions, along with the marketable talents of the label's first signatories, Z'Looke, Aleese Simmons (Orpheus' second project, released right on the heels of Z'Looke), and a newcomer with a lot of history and talent, Alex Bugnon.

With a top-of-the line staff and an immediate impact within the industry as well as outside of the industry. Orpheus Records and Z'Looke won't be anything less than a success.

Z'Looke, a group whose music reflects the Minneapolis sound and the feel of major talents such as Prince, Jimmy Jam & Terry Lewis and The Time, appears to have what it takes to have z'songs that make z'hits!

He adds, "We've had great response at R&B and quite a few Pop station's have added the record. The album just hit the marketplace before Thanksgiving, which was a difficult time to get the kind of attention we got at retail — considering that retail already had set plans for the holiday season. Nonetheless, it worked for us and we are delighted."

Insightfully, he continues, "With a great deal of intensity we are now focusing on radio and retail to create an

awareness and gain exposure for the artists. Once that starts to happen we'll then pursue all of the other areas that are so integral in building an artist's career — primarily press, television, touring, videos ... all of those elements will then come into play.

"We want to get as many radio stations excited and enthused over Z'Looke and show everybody that by working real hard and focusing, we can get the job done," he concludes.

Getting the job done, and effectively at that, are Art Z (Zamora), Michael Cee

(Carpenter), Wayne (Cockerman) and Eric Jerome (Strickland) of Z'Looke. All are from Southern California.

They've recently finished the group's first video — which is actually for the second single, "Lovesick." Be that as it may, there is nothing late or dated about the group's music. Along with some great tunes and a high-energy performance, Z'Looke is starting to rack up the credits that will prove that these guys are bonafide musical hyphenates.

Currently in the studio producing and writing a tune for Virgin recording artist

Cheryl Lynn ("That's The Bottom Line"). Z'Looke has also been busy doing the same for Epic's Chris Bender ("Babygirl") and Sweet Obsession ("Cash" (remix)). With Soul Train tapings, East Coast promotional tours, and a bevy of artists lined up to sample their work, Z'Looke is staying in the mix.

Says Michael Cee, "We've been doing a lot of writing and working really hard. Since the release of the album, we've been on the go. We finished our first video and I'll tell you — I must have lost 30 pounds! We acted up! We really got crazy on a little Rap section in the video. It was hard work, but a lot of fun." He adds, "We're just ready to move on to the next step and do some live shows like we used to do."

Just a couple of years ago the guys were going through a rocky situation. Members were coming and going, and the group's direction was unclear. But Eric, determined to make a mark, set out with Mike and Art to find the fourth and final member.

It was Art Z who was drawn to the dancing and singing of Wayne Cockerman on a street corner in downtown Los Angeles. "I heard this voice and then I saw the guy. I thought ... 'He looks kinda' strange and he dances a little funny, but — he might work!"" he muses.

With the addition of Wayne the group was complete, and the work began. The group first cut an independent album. The single from the album, *Attitude*, generated a buzz around the Los Angeles club scene and soon graduated the local homeboys into the major leagues.

Presently gaining national recognition and fans alike, is a group to watch for with that special style and sound. And oh yeah — most definitely, Z'Looke.

#### **STANDING IN THE SHADOWS OF MOTOWN ...** A Tribute to Bassist James Jamerson

Another book on the music making history of Motown has debuted. Unlike recent kiss-and-tell memoirs or unauthorized biographies, this story focuses on the musicians and their contribution to the Motown Sound. It includes interviews from music legends such as Stevie Wonder, Smokey Robinson and Berry Gordy.

"Standing in the Shadows of Motown: The Life and Music of Legendary Bassist, James Jamerson" is written by Dr. Licks.

Jamerson, Sr. was considered the pioneer of the electric bass and a crucial part of Motown's inner circle of musicians. He was one of the key creators of the music that came to represent an American era.

Many Motown artists, when asked who at Motown influenced them the most, will quickly come out with "James Jamerson." Why? The driving bass line provided the rocket fuel that propelled the Motown hit machine. And the bass lines created by Jamerson were ingenious, key elements of the music. According to James Jamerson, Jr., "My father was really projected in the music. On most of those songs, you heard the bass before you heard anything else. The lyrics came second. 'My Girl' for example, can be recognized automatically by the first dum, da, da, dum da, da ... You recognize the song by the bass. The bass was a song."

James Jamerson Sr., born in 1936 in South Carolina, started playing the bass about 1957. He had originally wanted to be a football player, according to his son, but decided to play bass. He was a Jazz fan and basically started with a Jazz feel, but then added his own special touch to his bass sound. Even the teachers noticed there was something different about the way he played. What he ultimately accomplished was to revolutionize the artistry of the bass.

In Detroit, Jamerson, Sr. began to play professionally for Motown in 1959. He had been playing sessions here and there and was on the road with Smokey Robinson, Jackie Wilson and Washboard Willie. While playing on the road with Smokey, one of the fledgling Motown label's first artists, Jamerson was spotted by Berry Gordy. It was the beginning of his long relationship with Motown.

Most of the early Motown hits, "My Guy" and "Mr. Postman," for example, were done on an upright, bass. It wasn't until around 1964 that the electric bass became James Sr.'s instrument of choice. "I believe Stevie Wonder's *Fingertips* was the first album where my father played both the upright and the electric bass," said James Jr.

The list of hit songs featuring the bass of James Jamerson Sr. is endless. They're "Ain't No Mountain High," "Signed, Sealed, Delivered," "My Girl," "I Was Made to Love Her" and more. It would be easier to list the names of the artists with whom he played. They include all of Motown's top artists: The Four Tops, The Marvelettes, The Contours, The Monitors, Marvin Gaye, Jan and Dean, Jackie Wilson, The Jackson 5, Stevie Wonder, Smokey Robinson, The Temptations, Diana Ross and Mary Wells. "He worked with every artist on Motown," says James Jr., a bassist himself, "That was what was special about my father. He could pick up the feeling,

the style of each artist. For example Smokey had a very relaxed style while Stevie was more aggressive. So my dad played relaxed for Smokey and played a more aggressive style for Stevie."

According to Jamerson, many of the Motown songs could not only be identified by their bass line, but actually originated with a bass tune. "My Girl" is a great example.

Says Jamerson, "A lot of what was created happened in the studio. Somebody would come in with chord sheets and start humming a melody and they'd just start playing. The musicians would take it from there. Musicians, to me, made the producers' jobs very easy. Most of the lines would come from the musicians, from the heart. There weren't 'parts' as there are today. Then you just played; you played what you felt."

"Kids learning bass over in Europe were more aware than the kids here in the United States," says Jamerson Jr. "When Motown artists went overseas, the kids wanted to know, 'Who was this guy that plays bass on the records?' Every artist who has been to Europe has said the same thing. They would come back from touring and tell me, 'They don't want to know about us, they want to know about your dad.' The bass playing was so different, the fans wanted to know who started this thing."

"Standing in the Shadow of Motown" covers James Jamerson Sr.'s life, and Motown from 1959 until Jamerson's death in 1983. The book is part documentary, part biography, part instructional.

Part One is a biography of James' life based on hundreds of interviews with friends, family and various Motown personalities. Part Two contains 20 pages of material on Jamerson's instrument, a discography, some of his daily musical exercises, a discussion on how Hitsville engineers got his sound in the studio and an analytical chapter written on his bass style by Anthony Jackson, a world renowned studio bassist. Part Three is the artists' contribution section featuring biographies and pictures of each of the contributing bassists and

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

#### It's about time.

That much bandied-about reunion of the original **Time** — the Minneapolis funk band that introduced **Morris Day**, **Jesse Johnson** and hit producers **Jimmy Jam** and **Terry Lewis** — looks like it will happen after all. The project's final catalyst, fittingly, turned out to be the man who created the band in the first place — **Prince**. He'll work on a reunion album of the original unit, including drummer **Jellybean Johnson** and keyboardist **Monty Moire**, for WB.

The Prince/Time re-teaming was put into motion back in December during a top-secret summit at a Beverly Hills hotel organized by WB and the camps of both acts. Three hours later, after the smoke cleared, a deal was struck. Prince will write and produce "half the album," according to a source, with the group handling the rest. Apparently all this activity is not just another false start. Plans call for the album's release this summer, followed by a Time "mini-tour."

Regardless of the details, the Prince/ Time association makes a lot of sense for both entities. The Time has been trying to re-unite for a couple of years now, getting only as far as the semi-reunion that spawned "Fishnet" on Morris Day's last WB LP. Prince, in re-aligning his business and creative direction, needs to get back to basics; producing the Time at this point — is both a return to roots and a challange all at once.

In Minneapolis, Prince reportedly played the band "about seven songs that all sounded like smashes," said another insider. "You have to keep in mind that Prince has a vault at Paisley Park that is filled with demos of songs he's written over the years, but then he's presented new songs as well. The way things are going with Morris and Prince, they could end up working together on Morris' next solo album as well."

Plans reach beyond the album. Once again, the Time is discussing plans for a movie, possibly with Prince's involvement, including a soundtrack to go along with the production.

**PRINCE AND THE TIME: Back Together Again** 

In the meantime, Jam and Lewis are reportedly about a month away from wrapping production on **Janet Jackson**'s A&M LP; they're now choosing the best from a glut of recorded material for a summer release. Equally interesting is the strong rumor that the production duo, in conjunction with manager **Clarence Avant**, will debut their own label with CBS under the old Sussex banner, Avant recorded **Bill Withers** through Sussex. The deal, rumored to be very rich, would allow J&L to continue producing as free merchants, as well as sing their various

desires at the new label.

MEANWHILE, BACK AT THE RANCH: Jody Watley, who recently capped production in Los Angeles for the music clip supporting her MCA single, "Real Love," is preparing to hit the road for the first time as a solo act. This summer Watley will play select 2,000-plus capacity facilities ... *Working Overtime* is the title of **Diana Ross'** upcoming Motown album, due in May, with the title track coming as first single in April. Other activity at the label includes a debut solo LP from Klymaxx's Joyce Irby, featuring two tracks written and

produced by ex-bandmate Bernadette Cooper (a collaboration that should put to rest rumors that the two no longer get along). There is also the departure of Tony Joseph from the company's A&R department. Motown's recent listening party for El DeBarge at L.A.'s Stock Exchange was reminiscent of the family-like atmosphere the label used to enjoy in the '60s and '70s. Execs were cutting the rug right along side El, other DeBarges, and label act the Boys, who promptly killed the dance floor competition when they broke out the acrobatics ... While working on the new Gap Band record for Capitol, lead singer Charlie Wilson is also producing a funk-oriented debut for ex-Brides Of Funkenstein member Dawn Silva for Polygram ... Michael Jackson is preparing his Greatest Hits package for CBS, which will feature three new songs (Wonder if the Jackson tune, "Buffalo Bill" will ever see the light of day?). You know an act is big when managers of the other acts on the label fight to have their product avoid the release schedule of a mere greatest hits package ... Eddie Kendrick and Dennis Edwards shopping for a deal as a duo? ... Young songwriter/producer Troy Johnson, formerly a Motown act, is one of Skip Miller's first signings for RCA. The label is excited about Troy's LP, dropping soon ... Virgin A&R man Jeff Forman has signed singer/songwriter and ex-Tease lead singer Kipper Jones to a solo deal ... .lesse .lohnson, who just finished producing three songs for Cheryl Lynn's upcoming Virgin LP, is no doubt pleased to know that Forever Your Girl, Paula Abdul's platinum-plus Virgin debut featuring one of Johnson's songs, has reportedly been doing about 50,000 units a week.







#### **BACKGROUND:**

And the Great Deejay saith: If thou cometh from the city of Rap named New York, thou shall fear no evil. Only those from this promised land shall endure ... M.C. Hammer apparently didn't read this commandment. Born and raised in Oakland, CA, he decided to start his own eightmember Rap group. He began recording original material on Bustin' Records, a label he formed with money from two members of the Oakland A's baseball team. His label released two very successful 12-inch songs, "Ring 'Em" and "Let's Get It Started." An album of the same name followed. It was only in release a few weeks before Capitol signed him to a \$major\$ deal and repackaged the product to include production/writing efforts on acts he develops. While this keeps him busy, he still has time to choreograph a spectacular stage show. Look out Rap. The Hammer is slammin' hard!

**M.C. Hammer On Rap's Image:** "I came from the streets, so I don't need to hear that everytime I put on a record. It's not something to glorify. A lot of rappers feel they have to be offensive or threatening to get their point across and that isn't so."

#### L.A., L.A. — TONE-LOC GOES DOUBLE PLATINUM

Tone-Loc returns from his European tour with another grand slam. When he left in January, his crossover single "Wild Thing" was sizzling on the charts the charts. Number one and steady in R&B circles, it was No. 1 on the national Pop charts as well. Even his video, named MTV's "Hip-Clip of the Week' for a three week run, was edging out other contenders. Since then, the surprise hit has continued its meteoric rise. With two million sales, "Wild Thing" was recently certified a Multi-Platinum single by the Recording Industry Association of America. This is the first such designation for a Rap single, the first for an indie label (Delicious Vinyl/Island), and only the second multi-platinum single in history ("We Are The World" was the other).

To put this remarkable achievement in perspective, Michael Jackson's "Off The Wall" only went gold and his Epic "Beat It" and "Billie Jean" duo only platinum. "We Are The World" was certified with 4 million sales. But that was accompanied by a major media blitz, an unrivaled celebrity roster, and an urgent world crisis.

Tone's mission was pure funk and fun, so, what accounts for his wild cross-theboard popularity? Perhaps, it's the universal appeal that sex holds in contemporary society, but it's also Tone's unique humor and cleverness. Even with its sexual candor, "Wild Thing" is more naughty than nasty. Additional crossover credit goes to the production team of Mike Ross and Matt Dike of Delicious Vinyl who looped the surfin' guitar over Tone's gravel baritone and Dee Jay M. Mark's seductive scratch.

Not bad for a kid who grew up in midcity L.A. and cut his record behind a Thai food restaurant. The 22 year-old raconteur has made himself a tough act to follow, but his "Loc'ed After Dark" keeps climbing the charts as well. What might happen if homeboy put his talent to something serious? Stay Toned. — Ifa Bayeza

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**MARCUS LEWIS** (Epic)

Current Single: "The Club" Current Album: Sing Me A Song

#### **BACKGROUND:**

A sure thing for an R&B mainstay is the Gospel-trained tenor voice that roars from Marcus Lewis. With his earliest musical training in Gospel, his vocal magnitude is compared to some of R&B's greatest male tenors. Born in Camden, AR, 26-year-old Marcus began performing as lead singer and bass player for a Gospel quartet at the age of 12. Touring the South for the next three years, Marcus completed his high school education. In 1979, he moved to Michigan where he continued to seek success. Frustrated by only modest success in the Gospel arena, he began writing and recording secular tunes, coming to the attention of veteran music executive, Henry Allen. Promptly calling this promising young singer, Allen put Marcus in the studio and the work began.

Marcus On Gospel Influences: "I wouldn't trade my church experiences for anything in the world. I think that the church turns out good, quality people. It shaped my character. I learned how to put music together from Gospel music. I let my pastor hear the songs, and he thought they were great. They're songs that most people can relate to because they tell a realistic story. I think these songs will become great oldies." — Reported by Thea T. Austin

musical scores of the bass parts they play.

The book also contains tributes by other musicans, primarily bass players who have been influenced by Jamerson. "Most guys (bass players) know who he is," says the younger Jamerson. "Before my dad came along, the bass hadn't been played like that." According to Berry Gordy, "There's hardly a successful Pop band in the world that doesn't owe homage to James Jamerson. His influence is omnipotent."

The Jamerson fans who were influenced by Jamerson and praise him in the book include: Paul McCartney, Stevie Wonder and Chuck Rainey.

Included with the book are two onehour cassettes which contain interviews with artists like Stevie Wonder: Smokey Robinson; Rock & Roll bassist, Jack Bruce; and Berry Gordy. They recall their thoughts and feelings about the "great bassist," James Jamerson, Sr., and of his contributions to the R&B and Pop music record business. Gordy writes the foreword to "Standing in the Shadows of Motown," "He pumped lifeblood into hundreds of our Motown records. The world knows the superstars - Stevie Wonder, Michael Jackson, Diana Ross, Smokey Robinson, Marvin Gaye, and James Jamerson was a major part of the magical combination that made their music the huge success it was."

"This is the first book in which Berry has done the foreword," says Jamerson Jr., "This is the first book that he talks about a guy that was signed as an artist but no one knew ... kind of like the unsong hero of Motown."

The book is also full of fascinating and heretofore untold Motown stories by musicians and producers. According to Jamerson Jr., Marvin Gaye was one of his father's favorite artists.

"My dad always told me that Marvin Gaye was a special guy. He was kind of spiritually in tune with himself and the problems of the world and his music reflected that. He and dad put together some very touching music — Music that touches the heart, the senses. I remember *What's Goin' On* as being the first album my dad really raved about. He came home one night and he told me, 'Jimmy, you *have* to listen to this album.' I stayed up until five in the morning listening to it."

"There were others like Marvin who were special," says Jamerson Jr., "Some very special things happened at Motown. There were all these different Black artists there at one time. There will never be another Motown. All those guys were blessed with something. And my dad was one of those people, he just wasn't out front."

James Jamerson Sr. never was out front. His son recalls only one record on which he sang. It was called "Twist around the World" and Jamerson opened the song talking a little Spanish-lilted introduction that went something like, "Hey Manuel, let's do the twist."

Jamerson also formed his own little groups that played clubs around town. These included several "James Jamerson Quartets" over the years and the group "The Funk Brothers" (which was actually the Motown rhythm section). He seemed to be happy being in the background as a driving, creative force in Motown history.

"I grew up in the studio," says Jamerson Jr., "My father would take me into the musicians' room and I would hang out there. It all soaked in. And my father's words of wisdom to me were, 'Jimmy you'll never be me and I'll never be you. So play what you feel. If you don't feel it, don't play it!"

So when it was time for bassist Jamerson Jr. to step in, his group did message songs, something to touch people. "It all goes back to my early days," says the young Jamerson who has since played with various R&B and Pop artists, both in the studio and on the road. Among those he's worked with are The Crusaders, Chaka Khan, Deniece Williams, DeBarge, Paul Anka, Sergio Frankie and Smokey Robinson.

He plays music for commercials (Miller Lite, Suzuki, McDonalds, haircare products) and television shows ("Hooperman," "The Jeffersons" and the new "The Robert Guillaume Show"). And in a way, his dad is still playing music for commercials and television. Assorted commercials and tv shows all

seem to be playing Motown hits as themes or background music. "There's all this Motown stuff now on tv and kids don't know where it comes from," says Jamerson. One ironic thing he notes is that the CBS show, "Murphy Brown" opens with some vintage James Jamerson, Sr. tunes and closes with new James Jamerson, Jr. music.

"Standing in the Shadows of Motown: The Life and Music of Legendary Bassist James Jamerson," is written by Dr. Licks in conjunction with Ann Jamerson and James Jamerson Jr., and distributed by the Harold Leonard Publishing Corp. (Motown contributed all the songs in the book as a tribute to James, and donated its future royalties to the Jamerson family.) The 208-page book contains over 80 pictures and two one-hour cassette tapes. A plus for upand-coming musicians, music history buffs, and lovers of the Motown sound. It will be available for \$29.95 at music and books stores throughout the U.S., Canada and Europe at the end of March.

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#### MAKOTO OZONE

Now You Know (Columbia) FC40676 Keyboardist Makoto Ozone brings us a delightful collection of contemporary and mainstream-flavored instrumentals. "Watch What I'm Gonna Do," is a driving, mainstream tune, with Makoto's excellent keyboard work intermingling with a moody flute. The traditional trio arrangement of piano, bass and drums is used on two cuts, "Might As Well," which features a nice bass solo and "You Are In Love," a warm ballad. "Endless Season Part IV," my favorite cut, features a great guitar solo. A piano-

flute duet entitled "Passage," closes the album. The personnel on this project makes for a great mix. John Abercrombie is featured on guitar, Steve Kujala on flute, Marc Johnson on acoustic bass and Peter Erskine on drums.



#### **SHERRY WINSTON**

Love Madness (Headfirst) A 729-2 The soaring melody of "Stride" introduces Sherry Winston's second album. The flautist, who doubles as an executive at a major label, does an excellent job warting off the sophmore jinx, blending classical, funk and Jazz influences into a strong follow-up project. Two cuts, "Anniversary Song" and "Love Mission" show Sherry's skill at weaving lyrical melodies, while the title track, "Love Madness" adds a bit of funk. "Shall We" is a laid-back, vocal number, while "Hit It Hard" is a hard-hitting cut

with a synth solo by Patrice Rushen. There's also a nice cover of "Songs For My Father" done in a non-Bebop arrangement. QS, New Age and Contemporary Jazz radio should have a field day with this record.



#### **IVAN LINS**

Love Dance (Reprise) 9 25850-1 "Who's In Love Here," a mid-tempo, vocal tune opens this collection of Brazilian tastees. Vocalist/keyboardist Ivan Lins penned all of the tunes with Brenda Russell collaborating on two cuts. Ivan's sound is remniscent of Gino Vanelli, a touch of Michael Franks and maybe even James Taylor. Brenda Russell appears on a nice duet called "You Moved Me To This." Quiet Stormers should enjoy the title track, "Love Dance," a superb ballad displaying Ivan's smooth vocals. Side Two's "Comecar De Novo" is a

moving, mid-tempo, Brazilian number sang in Portugese. Another warm, vocal ballad is "Even You And I." "Evolution," in the same flavor, speaks of the mystery of the planets and suggests that we can avoid our own extinction, concluding that evolution is a state of mind. — Meredith Beal





#### **GERALD ALBRIGHT** His Future Is All-Bright!

Gerald Albright has quickly made his mark in music. It is likely that the sounds of Gerald Albright will soon be household regulars. But, that's happening already!

Gerald's debut album, Just Between Us, hit No. 7 on the Jazz Chart, and produced two R&B hit singles, "So Amazing" and "New Girl On The Block." He topped that off with a Grammy nomination for Best R&B Instrumental Performance. Gerald is taking all of this in stride. He posesses a down-to-earth personality — the kind that takes you far in life, and he has tremendous talent and potential as a contemporary artist.

How do you follow that up? In the music industry you must have another one just like the other one. Sink It! Gerald takes a three point shot and hits with *Bermuda Nights*, the No. 3 album on the Jazz Chart. And yes, there are at least three of four singles that should make the R&B charts in 1989.

"I was very much thrilled with the success of Just Between Us," says Gerald about his debut LP. "I always felt it was going to be successful because the music that went into it was very close to me to begin with. I wanted it to be a very dynamic initial statement to show what my sound was all about, and I'm glad it did as well as it did. "On my new album, *Bermuda Nights*, I've tried to retain the same consistency, but I haved concentrated more on the saxophone. I want people to be able to identify my sound," he says. Gerald also says that he values originality and distinctiveness. "I'm working to develop a sound and a style that is all mine and easily recognizable," says Gerald. In a field of heavy competitors like Grover Washington Jr., David Sanborn, Kenny G, and Kirk Whalum, Gerald has managed to cut a significant niche for himself in no time flat and is just getting started.

Hailing from Los Angeles, Gerald had encouragement at an early age to be exposed to music. Starting with the piano, he recalls "... liking the sound of it, but not he regimen of practicing every day." After coming across a saxophone owned by his piano teacher, he convinced his father to buy the instrument. He soon began to practice every day and his life took on new directions from there.

Gerald attended Locke High School in Los Angeles, where other stars Patrice Rushen, Leon "Ndugu" Chancelor, and Reggie Andrews planted their musical roots. There Gerald and other horn buddies use to go into one of the practice rooms and study James Brown's horn man, Maceo Parker. "We used to listen to Maceo's phrasing and play note-fornote. If there is any one horn player that I would consider an idol, it is Maceo," he says. Gerald's love and respect for R&B is at the foundation of his phenonmenal success in both the Jazz and R&B categories.

While attending the University of Redlands, where he majored in business management, Gerald suddenly decided to switch from saxophone to bass, and taught himself well enough to land a job with Anita Baker as her bassist, and perform with others like Jeff Lorber, Teena Marie, Ray Parker Jr., Atlantic Starr, Olivia Newton-John, and Lola Falana.

Gerald is a front runner in the field of Contemporary R&B Jazz. It is real R&B and real Jazz that makes for such an incredible blend of hard-driving rhythm and intricate Jazz horn arrangements and performances. "The influence of Maceo is balanced by the Jazz I played at Locke High," Gerald recalls. Whatever the ingredients, he has plenty of the right stuff to make for some very happening music.

The list of impressive credentials to his name are an indication of Gerald's ability to be versatile at every creative step of the way. He is a multiinstrumentalist, and has worked with several recording partners who know and understand the kind of sound he is looking for. "People ask why I use the same people? I found some key people who know what I'm looking for and can help me create that sound. I try to cover all bases," was his response when asked about the wide range of music represented by the list of artists he's worked with and his own range of music.

Gerald's career took flight when he met Sylvia Rhone, Sr. VP/Atlantic. "I had enough material for her to hear, and she liked what she heard. She knows how to make decisions quickly and get things moving. Before I knew it, there were contracts being drawn up right away." A dream come true for any artist who has learned their craft and is ready to make a contribution to the progress of music.

Gerald looks to a bright future. He has every reason to. "In the future, I'd like to diversify into production and help other artists. But that's for later," he says. At this moment, Gerald is content to reach for the stars with his current hit album, and to prepare himself for future projects and experiences that are sure to be even more successful.

The only true measure of success in the music industry is durability. Promising new artists come and go, flaring up and then vanishing as quickly as they came. And others last. They consistently turn out good product and remember that they are in the industry for the music. These are the performers that become legendary — Aretha, Gladys, Patti ... The list wouldn't be complete without the inclusion of Chaka Khan, one of R&B's most talented and enduring entities.

Chaka's career has come a long way since her days with Rufus. Sometimes up, sometimes down, it still progresses. She has released a new product, ck, on WB, a label-artist relationship that has lasted for over 10 years.

"Warner has stuck by me through some pretty rough times. They are one of the last labels to retain the human touch. They've always been there for me," Chaka stated.

The new album has her trademark deliveries, yet has a different feel to it. It also features numerous collaberations with artists such as Prince, Bobby McFerrin, Brenda Russell, Miles Davis, Stevie Wonder and George Benson. Those collaberations weren't planned.

"They all just happened. We'd do a tune and think, 'Oh, wouldn't so-and-so be good on this!' Then we'd call them up and do it. Some, I never even met. Like Bobby McFerrin. We were on opposite coasts and couldn't get away, so he did his wonderful vocals and sent them out.

"In Prince's case, we had talked about working together for some time. We weren't able to be in the studio together, so he did the next best thing. He wrote me a Rap

song and forwarded it," Chaka reflected.

That song, "Sticky Wicked" is one of the album's most unique and controversial cuts. It depicts the life of a drug abuser and the daughter she can't even recognize.

"I had no idea of the monumental quality of the lyrics before Prince sent the track. When I heard it I thought,



God, I can't do this. I can't rap. But there is a reality to those lyrics. Maybe not mine, but the song is real," Chaka said.

Chaka's music has again metamorphasized into tracks that don't fit the norm. Some may have trouble on radio due to their inability to be categorized. Dance, Funk, Jazz, Quiet Storm, all bases are covered.

"I'm not motivated by Pop, Crossover, R&B or any of those categorizations of music. I detest them. They are stumbling blocks for artists and can be distracting. It makes for a lot of bullshit in the marketplace. You have to stay true to yourself and not be swayed to jump on the beat-of-the-week bandwagon. I owe it to my fans to maintain some kind of excellence in my music and not sell out," she commented.

It is that attitude that keeps Chaka tuned into her music and tuned out of most radio, confessing that she usually only listens while in the car. She influences easily, and feels that being contemporary means updating your own sound in your own way. She also is updating her lifestyle.

"I would like to start spending more time with my two daughters. I also have a more positive personal relationship going right now


and I feel that influences what I am doing. I always do everything better when I am in love!" she laughs.

The Chaka Khan I expected and the Chaka I interviewed were two different people. Sincere, honest, insecure, funny and witty were the parts seen most. Not the image the press usually gives. Chaka explained it best. "People see you as they wish and take one slice of your life as representation for the rest of it. It's not fair, but it happens," she explained.

Chaka is insured a future by her solid past. She would like "to be a Jazz singer when I grow up" and plans on expanding her musical horizons even beyond. Music is what keeps her on an even keel.

"I can't imagine not singing. It's the thing that I do best. My life is klutsville and music is the only place that I feel graceful and right in sync. I would like to be known for the honesty that I feel toward my art and the honesty I have there if no place else. As for image, let them say, 'She's here and she sings and overall, she's a good ol' gal!"





#### **ALYSON WILLIAMS** *Raw* (Def Jam/CBS)



Alyson Williams is perfect as Def Jam's first female recording artist. Her debut album. *Raw*, is exactly that: gutsy, brash, funky and soulful. Side One contains all ballads and displays the sweeter, softer textures of her voice. She opens up on "I'm So Glad" and "Not On The Outside" and plays with the phrasing on "Just Call My Name." Side Two, with the exception of "I Need Your Lovin"" (no, not Teena Marie's), is non-stop street funk. "My Love Is So Raw" truly jams, and features a rippin' liberated woman's rap. "On The Rocks" is a slower groove but one that gets you movin'. The side finishes with the first single, "Sleep Talk," a solid cut but not one of the album's strongest. Quiet Storm and Urban programmers should have a field day with this one. All the cuts are hard-edged and RAW!

**BOY GEORGE** *High Hat* (Virgin) 91022-4

With a taste for the ultimate in "schee-schee poo-poo" fashion and the adventurous coif with flare, is the one and only Boy George. Back and better than ever after a two-year hiatus from the music world and a much-publicized drug addiction, he returns with a twist of a groove on the vocals and a couple of slammin' dance tracks. The "Boy" should find his name at the top of the charts soon. This can be attributed to the production teamwork of Gene Griffin and Teddy Riley, on the hot new single, "Don't Take My Mind On A Trip." Other tracks worth the listen are "Kipsy," a rockin' Reggae tune, featuring Carson Geary on a cool rap. "I'm Not Sleeping Anymore," and the solid Gospel groove of "Whisper." 
