CLINTON & COMPANY: Still One Nation Under A Groove

The dance floor of Hollywood nightspot the Palace resembled a happy T'ien An Men Square as a crowd of assorted P-Funk lovers jockeyed for a spot close to the stage. Call them One Nation Under A Groove, or more succinctly, party people under an often pungent cloud of cheap weed, but they were there—young and old, Black, White and in between—all there to indulge in a musical genre they can't really hear on the radio anymore or view in concert: that steamy melange of R&B, Gospel, Jazz and Rock interpretations, better known to aficionados as P-Funk.

Fans of "uncut" Funk didn't have to worry about the musical seal being tampered with or the goods stepped on. Before the show, Funk Overlord **GEORGE CLINTON** gleefully declared to a reporter, "Ain't a damned thang changed." By the time he and his band-aka FUNKADELIC, PARLIA-MENT, FUNK MOB, UNCLE JAM'S **ARMY, THE NATION and P-FUNK** ALL-STARS—broke into the eternal "Cosmic Slop," everyone in the house knew it was true. Staples like "Loose Booty," "Maggot Brain," "Standing On The Verge" and modern classsics "Mothership Connection," "Bop Gun," "Tear The Roof Off," "She Was A Freak" and of course, "One Nation Under A Groove," were all there.

Indeed, why would Clinton change a note? Already, P-Funk is what every smart band aspires to be in the first place, everything.

According to ARCHIE IVY, the Clinton disciple who, after years of devoted service, was finally given the title (officially) of manager (One Nation Entertainment, Inc.), after three decades of tearing the roof off the sucka, P-Funk is poised to take on the '90s. There's the current Clinton "solo" Warner-distributed Paisley Park LP, *The Cinderella Theory*, a new Funkadelic MCA album, *By Way Of The Drum*, due before the year is out, and renewed interest by labels in the goldplatinum capability of the Parliament logo: "We'll talk to anyone, but we'd like to be at PolyGram, especially since they have the old Parliament catalogue," said Ivy. "Being there would fit into our master plan of films and other projects."

A live performance at the New Music Seminar earlier this year kicked off this flurry of P-Funk dates. The band recently returned from a weekend of sold-out Tokyo dates "where the kids knew all the words," and will probably head back there after shows in Europe and Brazil.

Like JAMES BROWN, whose revived career took the same pattern, Clinton and company, in additon to loyal

Black followers now in their thirties and forties, enjoy increased interest from a new generation of White college kids and young Rap fans for whom P-Funk represents something new, or more directly, *real*. "They come to our shows because they're tired of watching videos and going to live-to-track dates by nontalents who have never worked a Ramada Inn," said Ivy. "The Blues is going through the same thing. Why? Because Black radio doesn't really play Black music anymore. Black radio should go on someone like **ARETHA** automatically." Likewise, Ivy said he's mystified by record execs who say P-Funk (the dark side of SLY STONE, by-product of JIMI HENDRIX and road-paver for LIVING COLOUR and PRINCE) isn't a Rock band. To be sure, P-Funk is the original Black Rock Coalition.

Even so, for some 15 years Ivy has served a traveling road show circus that on any given night can feature as many as 20 people on stage. Recruited by Clinton when Ivy was a young wide-eyed music journalist for *Soul Newspaper*, today Archie is married with kids. When will he get a real job? "I'm totally into the One Nation concept," he said. "I can still get into 'Cosmic Slop' every night. By the end of that song, I know what musician is gonna be hot that night."

MEANWHILE, BACK AT THE RANCH: JON GASS, renowned for his work with producers L.A. and **BABYFACE**, is now taking on engineering/production projects. Contact **CHARLES FREEMAN**, (213)475-3203 ... STEVEN RIFKIND has signed a one-year deal with Delicious Vinyl as a consultant in all areas of promotion and marketing. Rifkind, who played a key role in the success of DV's TONE LOC. is also currently working projects for RCA, CBS, Orpheus, Original Sound and Boogie Down Productions ... JESSE JOHNSON's manager RON SOSKIN was recently in L.A. armed with the Johnson-produced demo and video of KIM CAGE, the young singer/dancer who has been the dynamo of Johnson's live sets. Like many Minneapolis R&B acts, Cage boasts plenty of on stage charisma. If you can view her vocal/video performance of LYNN COLLINS' "Think" without getting excited, check your pulse; you could be dead ... JANET JACKSON's Rhythm Nation 1814 is off to the start most anticipated-the single, "Miss You Much," got 170 adds from Pop stations during its first week and went gold in 10 days. The LP shipped more than one million copies.



R&B LEGENDS

THE THREE DEGREES: Temperatures Are Still Arisin'...

G irl groups have always been a fascinating part of the music scene. It seems like just yesterday when The Supremes, Martha and the Vandellas and The Shirelles bounced their way through some memorable tunes. It is refreshing listening to the penetrating harmonies on Perri's single, "Feels So Good," (as was their absolutely wonderful "No Place To Go") in the midst of what seems to be the age of "dance" for today's girl groups. You might wonder, though, what has happened to your basic R&B girl group?

Ichiban Records, based in Atlanta, recently signed the legendary Three Degrees, and released their first album in quite a few years entitled *Three Degrees... And Holding*. Although their biggest hit was not R&B in the purest sense of the word, they did record some great records of the genre. I managed to speak with Helen Scott-Leggins in between the group's busy (yes, busy) schedule.

The group was formed while the girls were in school in Philadelphia. "We all started in high school and met through our exmanager," said Helen. "I was in-

troduced by a teacher in my school to Faye Pickney and Richard Barrett, who was their manager."

Along with Frankie Lymon and the Teenagers, Barrett had previous success managing another girl group called The Chantels during the late '50s to early '60s. Following the demise of the group, Barrett shifted his interest toward The Three Degrees.

In 1963 the group, which consisted of Pickney, Shirley Porter and Linda Turner, made their chart debut with

"(Gee Baby) I'm Sorry" on Swan Records. Coincidentally, it was the same year when The Chantels would have their last charting release before their demise with "Well I Told You So."

Helen said she joined the group in 1963 and along with Janet Harmon

(Porter and Turner had left by this time), performed with Pickney. Four years later, Helen left to have a family (only to return in 1976). Later Sheila Ferguson and Valerie Thompson would take on vocal duties.

Unsuccessful releases plagued the group on WB, Metromedia and Neptune Records until the release of "Maybe" in 1970 for Roulette Records. Interestingly enough, it was this tune that helped The Chantels achieve national notoriety. The group's Roulette repertoire had some interesting pieces, including their next Top Ten R&B follow-up, "I Do Take You," "You're The One" and "There's So Much Love All Around Me."

In 1973, "Dirty Ol' Man" became the group's first successful effort for their new label, Philadelphia International (PI). The PI association led to a handful of wonderful releases. The group was

paired with MFSB, the large studio band formed by Kenny Gamble and Leon Huff, to procure the chart topper "TSOP" (The Sound of Philadelphia). The song was also used as the theme for *Soul Train*. But in 1974, The Three Degrees gained major attention with the tune "When Will I See You Again." As their popularity skyrocketed, the group began to tour overseas and even made an appearance in the movie *The French Connection*.

Competition from other girl groups did not seem to present a problem for the trio. As Helen remembers, "I think (it was) because of the way we were groomed when we were coming up. We were never permitted to go and see anyone else's show. That way we could never copy anything anybody else was doing. The style we developed was our

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own. As far as the competition was concerned, Sister Sledge had their own particular style, and so did The Jones Girls and The Emotions."

Unfortunately, the trio could not match their previous success. Their next hit, "I Didn't Know," only received a modest reception. "Take Good Care Of Yourself" became the group's final hit for PI in 1975.

One interesting point to note is that the girls can sing in five different languages—Japanese, French, Arabic, Spanish and Swahili. "We thought it would be a good idea to learn a song in that particular culture," explained Helen. "We have someone from that country teach us not only phonetically, but we have to know what we are singing in order to be able to project it on stage. So it's not like we just learn the words or the sounds, and we don't know what we are singing—we do!"

Toward the late' 70s, the group fell on hard times as the hit records just did not appear. A few minor bright spots came on Ariola Records with "Giving Up, Giving In" and "Woman In Love," but the Disco era was not good to the group. By 1982, Barrett also decided to call it quits with the ladies.

Through all this, The Three Degrees have kept quite active (not in the U.S. per se), but in all other parts of the globe. "We haven't performed in the States in the last 15 years," commented Helen. "Many people were under the impression that we were ex-

tinct. We have been working extensively and consistently all these years. I think the only time we stopped was to have kids. The only place that we have not been able to touch on is America due to the fact that we did not have any record success. It's not really so much a comeback as it is a 'relaunch' situation. I don't like the word comeback because we haven't gone anywhere."

nd The Three Degrees just keep on moving. The first single from their new album, "Tie-U-Up," has been released in the U.S. and shows that the group can still keep the mercury high. Their unique sound is still there—ready, willing, and able. Boy, it's sure going to be a warm winter...

THE D.O.C.: Another "Bad Brother" Rockin' The Mic

The beat is fresh, the Rap is strong and the voice is hard and heavy. Youthful, conscious and hungry, Tray Curry, better known as The D.O.C., is set to take the world of Rap by storm.

There's no doubt about it, the young man from Dallas, Texas, stands to become one of the best on the block with which to reckon. His debut Ruthless/ Atlantic album, *Nobody Does It Better*, busted sales wide open within the first two weeks of release, and went gold shortly thereafter.


The D.O.C. was destined for success. His talent has shone from the beginning and garnered him attention since high school.

"Everyday when I came home from school this guy would start bagging on me in rhyme," Tray explained. "Eventually I started bagging right back in rhyme. The neighbors would listen and thought it was great. The guy—Fresh K—went to my high school. One day we heard about a talent contest and entered. We won! We called ourselves Fila Fresh Crew and decided after that to give performing a try."

The group began bringing their fresh and def style to local clubs. It was at a club that Dr. Dre heard Fila Fresh Crew—especially The D.O.C. Dr. Dre expressed an interest in the group by telling The D.O.C. that "if you wanna make some money, come out to California."

The D.O.C. defies the typical Rap image. He is well educated, well informed and very personable. He also has a sense of loyalty and responsibility. Because of this, he couldn't just up and leave Fila Fresh Crew. Then, as sometimes happens, internal conflicts arose and The D.O.C. felt it was time to move on. He called Dr. Dre and asked if the offer still stood. It did, so he flew to the coast. Upon arrival, The D.O.C. and Dr. Dre began working on demos. After completing "a couple" they began to shop. The D.O.C. was signed to Ruthless/Atlantic a week later by Sylvia Rhone, Senior VP/General Manager Atlantic Records.

"We flipped over the record when we first heard it," Sylvia stated. "We had a great deal of respect for Eazy-E and Dr. Dre's production work and they were enthusiastic about The D.O.C. They were right. Never have I heard a Rap artist or album quite like this one. The al-

bum's uniqueness, delivery and production is exceptional and a creative work of art."

There is no doubt that what sets The D.O.C. apart is his music. He wrote all of the lyrics on the album in collaboration with Dr. Dre. "I wrote the tunes as we went along. It's easier for me to match the words to a song if I have the music down first. I would wait for Dre to put together something really funky and then build on that," he said.

The sales prove that the collaboration was a success and a new experience for

a 20-year-old from the Midwest.

"It feels good being on my way to my goal. Everything is just another something to deal with, whether it's good or bad, but you have to take it as it comes. You have to keep in mind where the energy comes from, and who in His own light is allowing me to do this. Everything will keep running smoothly as long as I keep my head on straight.

"And the business? As much as I would *like* to understand, coming from nowhere and being faced with all of this, it's difficult. But there's a special lady named Simo Doe and she has taken me under her wing. She's making sure I get my education and that I understand what's going on around me."

Simo Doe, National Director of Publicity/Atlantic, is equally as taken with The D.O.C.

"I was so impressed with him upon our first meeting. He is intelligent and incredibly talented. We have established a rapport—one that doesn't happen all the time. I encourage him to stay aware of what's happening in his world and to learn and grow all he can."

While The D.O.C has an association with Dr. Dre, N.W.A. and other such rappers, he sees his music as totally different. "My music is for a good time. It isn't rooted in messages like N.W.A., Public Enemy or Boogie Down Productions. It wouldn't sound right coming from me because we come from different backgrounds.

The D.O.C.'s music has opened a whole new life for him and he is ready for it. "I want to keep going up. Each song is so different, from Rock to Reggae, Hip-Hop and even Blues---different attitudes and different styles and by bringing those out and if the audiences like me, then I'll keep giving them what they want as long as they're interested."



It seems like only yesterday when this band burst upon the Jazz scene. But some fourteen years and thirteen albums later, this group from upstate New York continues to kick out the hits! Point Of View takes a more eclectic approach. "Slow Burn" takes a soulful rhythm track featuring bandleader Jay Beckenstein on sax and Dave Samuels on vibes. "Swing Street" follows with an action-packed uptempo number with mainstream components, capturing the sounds of New York's 52nd Street in the '50s.

"Counterpoint" is a spunky track laced with a guitar solo from the band's newest member, Jay Azzolina. Everyone is encouraged to improvise on "Swamp Thing," a slow moving groove (Tom Schuman, keyboards, and Oscar Cartaya on bass). Point Of View is solid from top to bottom. This is perhaps the tightest band in the business and one of my all-time favorites! -Kelvin Ellis Sutton

Immaculate production (by ace studio drummer Rick Marotta) exposes with crystal clarity Fareed's songs and the sterling support of musicians including David Spinozza, Tony Levin, Fred Simon, John Adair, Rob Amster and Marotta. Fareed's imagination and technical

facilities have matured greatly, as amply demonstrated on tunes like "Duende," "Eluizon" and "E Precisso Perdoar." Manressa should open up a large audience to Fareed Haque's talent, a talent well worth discovering.

haron Bryant, a New York suburban gal, came to the attention of the recording industry as one of the founding members and the original lead vocalist of the popular recording group, Atlantic Starr. She is known best for her outstanding performances on such hits as: "Love Me Down," "When Love Calls," "Circles," "Touch A Four Leaf Clover" and "Am I Dreaming." These classics placed Atlantic Starr at the top of the charts and in the heart of mainstream America.

But as time changed, the group further developed their career goals. Sharon was ready for the next stage of her career, thus deciding to part company from the group.

It's been five years since she last recorded, but now she's back sounding better than ever.

"I've been living in Connecticut with my husband, Rick Gallwey (her producer/ co-writer.) I find it's quiet and easy to work here. "We set up a little studio and started doing a lot of writing. We started to focus and key in on writing and producing to get a demo together," Sharon stated. They mastered the tracks and met up with an old friend, Sr. Vice President/ Wing Records, Ed Eckstine. "Sharon and I go back a long way, and I think she's incredible—most deserving of the opportunity. She's a winner," Ed warmly acknowledged.

"Ed and I go way back," added Sharon. He wanted to put David (Lewis) and me together as a teenage Peaches and Herb but it never came about." However as fate would have it, Ed and Sharon would work together.

"It's very rare to come into a company where the executive is that supportive and nurturing. Ed gave us the opportunity as unproven producers to go ahead and interpret our music, and I just can't say enough about him."

"After Ed heard my material, I was the first signed," she recalled. Ed Eckstine provided Sharon with an opportunity that she refers to as "the chance of a lifetime." Sharon and her husband, were given the go-ahead to produce, write and perform the album themselves—"a dream come true" for Sharon.

"It's very rare to come into a company where the executive is that supportive and nurturing. Ed gave us the opportunity as unproven producers to go ahead and interpret our music, and I just can't say enough about him."

The stylish tracks found throughout her debut album, *Here I Am*, are sophisticated, moody and thought provoking.


"On this album, I played, produced, wrote and sang the material. Everything on this album was based upon every emotion that I had inside my body. I have been blessed with the gift, and when you've been blessed, it's important to give something back—give to other folks, bring something to their party and bring out what they have," Sharon expressed.

She *has given* and *is giving* her all to please her listeners, her record company, herself and her creator.

"I never take my gift for granted, and I thank God for the blessing. I grew up in the church appreciating His love and gifts, and those I cherish and hold near and dear to my heart. In drawing upon that time, I continue to get my confidence and *will* to keep giving music from my heart. That's what we put on the album. Now, I pray to God that folks say, that's happenin'."

The release of the first single, "Let Go," is the proof that it is happenin'. It took Sharon Bryant's talent straight to the top of the charts and her appeal right into the hearts of old fans and new within weeks of its release. The second single, "Foolish Heart," is complemented by the video directed by Kevin Hooks and produced by Underdog Productions with a guest appearance by Denzil Washington. Sharon is most definitely "happenin'." She's a woman on the move, having just recently wrapped up a promotional tour covering San Diego, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Dallas, Houston, New Orleans, Detroit, Chicago, Atlanta, Miami, St. Louis, Pittsburgh and Cincinnati. And according to Ed Eckstine, Sharon has garnered a winning ticket in the music world's lottery.

"We feel that we've created a quality project that's going to have an extended lifespan. This is a potential five single, multi-format project that keeps me optimistically passionate. Sharon is an artist for the ages. She will, most definitely, be here for quite a while."

The sweetly soulful vocals of Sybil Lynch are surely soothing on her latest self-titled album. This Patterson, New Jersey, stylist explores her Gospel/R&B roots, taking them on a musical journey throughout the LP's 12 tracks. She's best known as a dance music diva and the No. 1 single, "Don't Make Me Over," puts her atop the charts to reign again. Her songwriting and vocal talents shine on the pulsating rhythms of "Take Me Away," "Give It To Me," "Living For The Moment" (a beautiful Quiet Storm cut) and "Can't Wait (On Tomorrow)." Other outstanding tracks include "Bad Beats Suite" (the made for Saturday night radio mix of Side One cuts), the Jackson Five penned, "I Wanna Be Where You Are," the Dionne Warwick '60s hit "Walk On By" and "Crazy 4 U," featuring Salt 'N Pepa rappin' on the microphone. Radio should pump up the volume on this one; it's a winner.

TINA TURNER Foreign Affair (Capitol) CDP 791873 2

A long time coming, Tina's latest is just what the first single implies—"The Best." Never has she more successfully merged her distinctive vocals with a blend of Rock, Pop and R&B. Tina took some time off before recording allowing her voice the chance to recover all the textures and raw emotion expected from it. Side One kicks off with the sultry "Steamy Windows" and peaks with one of the best cuts, the gritty "Undercover Agent For The Blues." It is difficult to single out more of the 12 cuts because each is an excellent piece of work. Tina moves nicely into the role of mature Queen of Rock 'N Soul and, through her selection of material, acknowledges a life that is sometimes up, sometimes down, but always musical. Remember the phenomenon of *Private Dancer*? Well, you ain't seen nothin' yet. — *Charles R. Bouley II*




