# **Curb Launches New Label; Dalton, Johnson Take Top Posts**

Months of rumors that had Curb adding a second imprint came to rest yesterday when label President **Mike Curb** announced that he was indeed launching a new, as-yet-unnamed Country label.

Curb addressed the issue of opening a new label at this time by saying, "We've seen a lot of changes within the country music community this past year. However, I truly believe that country music is on the rebound and creating a new country label is a reflection of my confidence in it."

Curb's top management tier will also oversee the new imprint. Curb VP/GM **Dennis Hannon**, who will add similar responsibilities for the new label, explains, "The Curb infrastructure for sales, marketing, distribution, press and publicity will be involved with the new label in the same ways they are with Curb."

Confirming months of speculation, the new Curb imprint will have former Epic-Monument/Nashville VP/Promotion **Rob Dalton** as its VP/Promotion and former Giant/Nashville President **Doug Johnson**, who worked with Dalton at Epic as Sr. VP/A&R in the mid-'90s, as the head of A&R. The reunion continues as former Sony/Nashville Sr. VP/Promotion **Jack Lameier**, a consultant since retiring from the company in August 2001, will come out of retirement to consult the new label.

Dalton has already selected his promotion team. Here's who is involved:

•Mike Rogers: The former Columbia/Nashville Director/National Promotion comes aboard as Director/Southeast Regional Promotion.

•Mark Westcott: The former Epic/Nashville Mid-

west Regional will serve as Director/Midwest Regional Promotion.

•Rick Cardarelli: Shifting from secondary promotion at Curb, Cardarelli becomes the imprint's new Director/Northeast Regional Promotion.

•Keith Greer: The Curb Southwest Regional moves to the new imprint as Director/Southwest Regional Promotion.

•John Curb: The promotion veteran segues from handling the West Coast for Curb to the position of Director/Western regional Promotion for the new imprint.

•Mary Befera: The former Epic/Monument Promotion Coordinator is the new label's Promotion Coordinator.

Dalton commented, "The opportunity to work for Mike Curb is exciting and inspiring. I look forward to great things! Doug Johnson is one of the best song men in this business and to work with him again should be amazing. We had a lot of hits together. To be with Jack Lameier, Mike Rogers and Mark Westcott again is like a family reunion. Combine all that with John Curb, Keith Greer and Rick Cardarelli in the field, and we've come to play!"

Johnson seems to agree: "The opportunity to be part of a new label with Mike Curb and to be reunited with Rob and Jack excites me! Their level of passion, commitment, experience, respect and work ethic is impeccable." An announcement regarding the label's name and initial artist roster is expected soon — perhaps as early as next week. Dalton and Johnson can be reached at 615-321-5080.



## **Epic Has Designs On Macky**

Former MCA/Nashville VP/National Promotion **Bill Macky** began his new job yesterday as Director/ National Promotion for Epic-Monument/Nashville. He succeeds Rob Dalton, who resigned at the end of September and has since joined Curb's new label (see item above).

Macky spent 16 years in Country radio before joining MCA for West Coast regional promotion duties in 1994. He was elevated to Director/National Promotion in 1997 and relocated to Nashville for the position. Macky was then promoted to VP/Field Promotion in December 2000 and to VP/National Promotion in August 2001. He left the label last September. His programming experience includes stints at WDSY/Pittsburgh, KRTY/San Jose and KMIX/Modesto, CA.

At the moment, Macky doesn't have a direct-dial phone number. In fact, many of the extensions for Epic-Monument promoters will be changing as the staff moves into new offices that will put the entire promotion team into one corner of the Sony/Nashville building. We'll have the new phone numbers for you when they're set.

#### It's Miller Time In Memphis

WFBE/Flint, MI PD **Chip Miller** takes similar duties at WGKX/Memphis. He starts his new duties on Jan. 17 and succeeds Greg Mozingo, who recently accepted the WIL/St. Louis PD post. Miller arrived in Flint close to one year ago following a stint as PD of WPKX/Springfield, MA. WFBE PM driver **Steve Duncan** is now interim PD.

## **Curb Promotion Responsibilities Change**

There's some restructuring in Curb's promo department as three of its promoters join Curb's newly launched imprint (see today's lead story). The faces remain the same, but there will be some realignment of stations in each regional promoter's territory. Curb VP/Promotion **Carson James** explains, "Change is an integral part of our business both creatively and structurally. This new promotion alignment helps us better manage the challenges we face in 2003. Our experienced staff will be empowered with every available asset to better enable them to manage their territories and serve radio's needs."

Here are the players:

• Eva Wood: The VP/Field Promotions and National Accounts will expand her responsibilities to serve the top 20 country sales markets.

• April Rider: She continues as National Director/ Promotion.

• **Rick Rockhill:** He continues as Director/Country Promotion Northeast.

• Karen McGuire: She continues as Director/ Country Promotion Midwest.

• **Brooks Quigley:** His new title is Director/Country Promotion South. He had been the Southeast Regional.

• Joe O'Donnell: Previously one of two West Regionals (along with John Curb), he continues as Director/Country Promotion West.

• Jill Gleason: She continues as Curb's National Promotion Coordinator.

# KKBQ Gets A Classic Country Sister

Two months after Infinity decided it didn't want two Country stations in Houston, Cox has decided it does. On Nov. 5, 2002 Infinity flipped KIKK-FM from Country to Smooth Jazz. Last week, as first reported in the Country Format Room at *RadioAndRecords.com* on Jan. 2, Cox elected to give KKBQ-FM a Country sister when it flipped Urban **KTHT** (Hot 97.1) to Classic Country as "Country Legends 97.1." The station is playing hits from the '60s, '70s and '80s and will keep the KTHT calls, which are only used once an hour.

KKBQ PD **Michael Cruise** is programming the new station, which is being consulted by **Rusty Walker**. In fact, Walker is personally scheduling the station's music. Cruise says that Cox put the plan to launch a Classic Country station into motion the day after Infinity flipped KIKK. He added, "When we relaunched KKBQ a couple of years ago the research



then told us there was a hole for Classic Country. But even though there was a hole, who wanted to be the fourth guy in Country? There is a limit to how many Country stations any market can support. But the minute KIKK went Smooth Jazz, this opportunity became much bigger for us."

Describing the new station's strategic role, he said, "Country Legends 97.1 should take the 35+ audience from [Infinity's crosstown] KILT-FM. And, since KKBQ is beating KILT among younger demos, this is how KKBQ becomes the No. 1 Country station in Houston."

The move isn't without some cluster ramifications, however. Cox also owns Oldies KLDE. It was the company's highest-ranking 12+ station in the fall 2002 Arbitron, with a 3.3 share. Since Country and Oldies have a history of sharing listeners, I asked Cruise whether there was any concern that the new station might cannibalize KLDE's audience. "There might be a little, but it's not going to be substantial," he said. "The music is drastically different and there will be different usage of the two stations. We feel there are now two choices for the 35+ listener."

The new station is playing its first 2,000 songs commercial free and without air personalities. Former KIKK-FM night jock **Tubby** joins KTHT as Asst. PD/morning host. When asked about the future for air personalities, Cruise said, "We're going to maintain a music-intensive morning show and wait and see from there. We don't want to get ahead of ourselves. We're seeing a huge passion for this music that hasn't been on the air here for years. We're not in a hurry to throw a lot of clutter on the station. We'll crank the music for awhile, watch a few trends and do some research before we make any moves."

Cruise adds that "Country Legends 97.1" will not share any titles with KKBQ. If you want to hear the new station, it's streaming at *countrylegends971.com*.

## **Tunick Joins GrassRoots Promotion**

VFR Director/National Promotion **Nancy Tunick** joins GrassRoots Promotion as Managing Partner. The

move reunites Tunick with Teresa Johnston, who founded the company in 1997 (the two were part of the SOR promotion team in 1996). As part of the company's expansion, GrassRoots has added a monitored radio promotion team to its secondary promotion efforts. Tunick, who will oversee both promotion teams and continue to consult VFR, is joined at GrassRoots by several VFR staffers. On the monitored radio team, Johnny Mitchell will handle the Southeast region, JR Hughes will take on the Mid-Atlantic and Greg Stevens continues in the Southwest/West Coast region. Former Dreamcatcher northeast regional Tracy Collins joins for northeast promotion duties. The GrassRoots team's initial projects include Steve Wariner's new CD for Selectone Records. Additionally, VFR Promotion Manager Valerie Main joins GrassRoots' secondary promotion team.

#### Verstandig Promotes Brake

**Don Brake** is now OM of the Verstandig Broadcasting stations in the combined Hagerstown, MD-Chambersburg, PA market. He previously served as PD for the market's WRST (Star 92.1) and will now take on PD/MD duties for Country WAYZ and PD chores for CHR/Pop WWMD. Also at the cluster, **Scott Edwards** comes aboard to assist in the programming of WAYZ and WWMD. He'll also handle morning drive on WAYZ.

lib. Tell me exactly what to say." So Roberts came to the rescue. Maines says, "Julia came in my trailer and wrote lines ... and she's very funny. I play a West Texas DJ with big hair and blue eye shadow. She'd come over between takes and help me take my jacket off, sit with me and give me sips of wine. She knew I was just shaking with nerves. Thank God she was there, or I'd never have made it."

Since the split of **Garth Brooks** and his wife Sandy, speculation has abounded about the role of **Trisha Yearwood** in Garth's life. Now Yearwood is going public. In a cover story appearing in the latest issue of *Country Weekly*, Yearwood says, "We're taking it very slowly. After all, we've known each other for 14 years. We're not engaged or married or having a baby. We've always enjoyed each other's company, and now we've got a chance to test the waters. So we're taking things really slow."

Country could make a big showing at the 45th Annual Grammy Awards, which will air on CBS-TV on Feb. 23. The Recording Academy revealed the nominations yesterday morning at a press conference, and the artists reading the nominations was **Kenny Chesney**. This will be the first Grammy Awards to be held in New York City since 1998.

✓ Undoubtedly, a good portion of the upcoming American Music Awards will be devoted to country music — including a presentation to **Alabama**, this year's Award of Merit winner. The tribute comes in recognition of outstanding contributions to the musical entertainment of the American people. **Reba McEntire** will make the presentation during the awards, to be shown on ABC-TV on Monday evening. The publicity machine surrounding **Shania Twain** keeps blitzing the media, as *Jane* magazine has a cover story on the singer scheduled for its April issue. You'll recall that *Jane* is the magazine that did a somewhat edgy and personally intrusive story on **Faith Hill** several months ago. Twain is likely to receive a much different treatment in other publications running cover stories on her, including *Ladies Home Journal* in March and this month's *Rolling Stone.* She'll also be featured in the February issue of *Seventeen* magazine.


Regional competitions are underway this week in five cities for the USA Network show *Nashville Star*. The regional competitions, set for in Los Angeles, Kansas City, Houston, Baltimore and Nashville, will narrow the field from 125 hopefuls to 10 lucky finalists. Following the Nashville competition this Sunday, the finalists will meet in the city, live together and be judged by a panel of industry insiders, country legends and fans throughout the eight-week show. The grand prize winner gets a recording contract with Sony Music/Nashville.

CRCA's project *I've Always Been Crazy: A Tribute to Waylon Jennings* is slated for release in April. It will feature one of Jennings' last recordings, a song called "The Dream." Among the stars participating in the project are **Brooks & Dunn** ("I Ain't Living Long Like This"), **Kenny Chesney** with **Kid Rock** ("Luckenbach, Texas"), **John Mellencamp** ("Are You Sure Hank Done It This Way") and **Travis Tritt** ("Lonesome, On'ry and Mean"). Jennings' widow, **Jessi Colter**, will contribute a new version of "Storms Never Last," a song she wrote and recorded with her late husband. (Country Format Room, *radioandrecords.com*, 1/3)

Cach week it seems there is some new award or words of praise being given to **Alan Jackson**. The latest accolade comes from *USA Today*, which ranks Jackson's *Drive* at No. 1 on its list of the best Country albums of 2002. Critic Brian Mansfield says, "Twentyfive years from now, young country singers will look to Jackson the way this generation looks to Merle Haggard."

New versions of **Phil Vassar**'s *American Child* CD will arrive in stores as early as this week. The release comes following a demand from fans to include two new tracks on the release: "This Is God," and a duet with **Huey Lewis**, "Workin' For A Livin'."

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CUniversal South's **Allison Moorer** recorded a live album in Nashville this weekend and got some big name help from the likes of Kid Rock and Grammywinning sister **Shelby Lynne**. Rock previously collaborated with Moorer on the song "Picture." The live album should arrive in stores in April.

Cledus T. Judd's "How Do You Milk A Cow" video is being used in a training video by the Michigan Milk Producers Assn. Actually, it's used as more of a "what not to do" ice-breaker for their presentation. A spokesman for the association says they recently showed it to a mostly-Amish audience in Northern Indiana and it was a hit. Is there a whole new fan base for Cledus in the offing?

The anniversary of Elvis Presley's birthday is tomorrow and the city of Memphis will proclaim it

Elvis Presley Day in ceremonies to be held at Graceland. Representatives from RCA will make Gold- and Platinum-record presentations for Elvis' recent worldwide No. 1-selling single, "A Little Less Conversation."

The star power on *Wheel of Fortune* will be kicked up a few notches the week of Feb. 16, as the program showcases the brain-power of Nashville during Country Music Stars Week. The show is being taped at the Grand Ole Opry House this week, and among the stars taking part are **Pam Tillis** and newcomer **Joe Nichols.** Speaking of Nichols, he'll be opening for Alan Jackson on his upcoming tour, which begins Jan. 30.
