

Industry Heads To Speak Out At CRS-34

Leaders of several of the nation's largest broadcast companies will participate in a panel discussion during CRS-34 set for Thursday, Feb. 20. The panel, moderated by R&R Publisher/CEO Erica Farber, will offer insights from Clear Channel Radio CEO John Hogan, Emmis President/Radio Division Rick Cummings, Infinity President/Programming Andy Schoun and Cumulus Media Chairman/CEO Lew Dickey. The Group Head Panel will feature topics such as where the country format fits in the radio business today and what the future holds for radio.

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Cantrell, Others Exit WSM-AM

On Jan. 7, WSM-AM/Nashville PD and 20-year station vet **Kyle Cantrell** was dismissed from the legendary Gaylord Country station along with several other fulltime and parttime staffers. Also dismissed from WSM-AM were Asst. PD/MD/Promotion Director **Trish Matthews**; *Opry Star Spotlight* hosts **Matthew Gillan** and **Johnny Koval**; **K.K. Wilson** — who booked guests for the show and handled Internet duties; and secretary **Carolyn Davis**. The remaining airstaff remains intact. Employees are being told there are no plans to change the station's format at this time, but there is no word about the fate of *Opry Star Spotlight*.

Gaylord Director/Corporate Communications **Jim Brown** told **R&R**, "The first thing we should say is that these are tough decisions. We must make a change in the leadership of the station. Over the years, Kyle made many positive contributions and we appreciate his service. In an effort to ensure the longterm growth and success at WSM-AM other changes have been made. We are consolidating the promotions departments of WSM-AM and WSM-FM into one team. We believe WSM-AM is a very valuable asset and it can be more successful. This change gives us an opportunity to give our team new leadership.

"Under the new leadership, we will find new and creative ways to operate more successfully. There are aspects of the programming that work well. We have consoldiated operations to improve profitability of the station. We have a responsibility to shareholders to be sound. The format is not changing; it will remain Country. WSM-AM will remain the home of the Grand Ole Opry. Our commitment to Country will remain steadfast. The search for new leadership starts today and will be headed up by WSM-AM/FM GM John Padgett." R&R/Bullseye: When And Where They Listen

No wonder satellite radio services are going after deals with car manufacturers with so much zeal. According to Bullseye Research's two-week sample of 350 people, an overwhelming majority of people listen to radio most frequently in the car. About 65% of the total sample listen in the car, while only 19% listen at home and only 14% listen at work. Those percentages change very slightly among Country P1, P2, male and female listeners. The biggest variation is among older listeners (45-54), of whom 57% listen most frequently in the car and 29% listen most frequently at home.

Morning drive continues to be king among radio dayparts, with 42% of the total sample reporting they listen most frequently in the morning, followed by afternoons, with 23%. The only variation is among male listeners, who reported listening slightly more frequently during middays than during afternoons.

A reminder: When you go to the website, use your station call letters as the user name. Then enter the new password.

In those pages, you'll also find results from RateTheMusic.com's online music testing from a very large sample of heavy Country radio listeners.

MUSIC NOTES

Country featured prominently at last night's American Music Awards, televised on ABC-TV. From Tim McGraw and Elton John's duet of "Tiny Dancer" to Toby Keith and Willie Nelson's pairing, to performances by Kenny Chesney and Shania Twain, country music was well represented.

Carolyn Dawn Johnson, who was up for Favorite New Artist — Country last night and presented one of the awards, was also busy last week taping an episode for *Wheel of Fortune's* upcoming "Country Music Stars Week." The shows were taped at the

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Grand Ole Opry and will begin airing during February sweeps the week of the 17th. Other stars appearing that week include **Pam Tillis** and **Joe Nichols**.

TIT was a big night for country at the People's Choice Awards, which aired on CBS-TV Sunday night. The Dixie Chicks tied with Creed for Favorite Band or Group, and Faith Hill was named as Favorite Female Musical Performer. Favorite Male Musical Performer honors went to Eminem. The nominees and winners were determined by a nationwide Gallup poll.

Super Bowl XXXVII is less than two weeks away now — Go Titans! (OK, just a little personal bias slipping in there) — and there will be a lot more to watch than just the game. As we all know, the national anthem will be performed by The Dixie Chicks, part of the halftime show will feature Shania Twain, and now some country artists are going to be featured during commercial breaks, too. Tim McGraw is doing a spot for Anheuser-Busch, celebrating the use of designated drivers. In the 30second spot, McGraw will act as a designated driver for his friends. That's the kind of chauffeur I want! McGraw is just one in a long list of sports and music stars who have taken part in the company's annual Super Bowl spot. The designated driver campaign has previously featured hockey great Wayne Gretzky, NASCAR's Dale Earnhardt Jr., boxer Oscar De La Hoya, and members of 'N Sync.

Willie Nelson will also be seen during a commercial break in the Super Bowl. Nelson, who was stuck with a whopping IRS bill several years ago, will be featured in an H&R Block spot.

Faith Hill will grace the covers of February's *Allure Magazine*, as well as the cover of the February/March issue of *Country Music Magazine*.

Justin Timberlake voices some of the thoughts

that most men have when it comes to Shania Twain in an cover story appearing in the current issue of *Rolling Stone*. "I met her in France recently," he says, "and she was wearing jeans and a low top, and she is one hot little number. Too bad she's married."

It was a hot time at Nashville's Wildhorse Saloon Sunday night as the final regional competition for the new USA Network show *Nashville Star* was held. The top 10 finalists will now live together in a fully-wired house in Nashville (a la *Big Brother*) and they will compete against one another for a Sony Music Nashville recording contract (a la *American Idol*). Clint Black has signed on as a creative consultant and will produce the winner's solo album. 




