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CRS-34 Delivers People, Panels And Performances

A crowd of 2,110 radio and record professionals — a slight increase from last year — gathered in Nashville last week for the industry's premiere learning event, the Country Radio Seminar. Congrats to CRB Executive Director **Ed Salamon**, President **Gary Krantz** and the entire board and agenda committee for providing a thought-provoking week full of fun. The CRS Agenda committee once again presented a strong slate of sessions, while the entertainment aspect of the week was markedly different from past years.

As always, one of the CRS's real strengths is that it attracts the industry's top executives. Among the radio heavyweights appearing on panels or roundtables during the 2 1/2 days of "official" sessions were Clear Channel Radio CEO John Hogan, Cumulus CEO Lew Dickey, Emmis President Rick Cummings, Rusty Walker & Associates consultant Bob Glasco and Country OM/PDs Gail Austin, RJ Curtis, Jay McCarthy, Bob Richards, Tom Rivers and John Shomby. Record industry execs making panel appearances included BNA VP/Promotion Tom Baldrica, DreamWorks/Nashville co-National Director/Promotion Jimmy Harnen, noted producer and former Capitol/Nashville and Virgin/Nashville President Scott Hendricks, Epic-Monument/Nashville Sr. VP/ Promotion Larry Pareigis, Mercury-MCA Sr. VP/ Promotion Michael Powers and DreamWorks/Nashville President James Stroud.

The CRB once again commissioned a research study by Edison Research. This year, Edison's national survey revealed that country music is growing in today's youth market, although it is still not the first preference for the majority of 15-to-29-year-olds. Edison President **Larry Rosin** believes this demo "is critical to the future of the country music industry and the Country radio format." The study also showed

that radio continues to be more than twice as important as any other medium in exposing new music to this demo. The study, based a sample of 601 people nationwide, and the entire research project results can be found at *www.crb.org*.

Budget cutbacks have seemed to curtail many of the multiartist label shows that have traditionally taken place in area venues such as the Wildhorse Saloon, Hard Rock Cafe, Printers' Alley clubs and the now-shuttered Planet Hollywood. Instead, a number of artists performed acoustically in hotelbased suites and ballrooms. The notable exceptions were RLG's annual Boat Show, which was moved to a warehouse not far from downtown Nashville due to high water levels on the Cumberland River; Capitol's Bowling Ball; and DreamWorks, which commandeered the newly renovated Hermitage Hotel to showcase a large part of its roster and to

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entertain CRS attendees with a night of faux gambling.

Nevertheless, a number of Nashville's finest performed during the official CRB events, including **Gary Allan, Deana Carter, Diamond Rio, Vince Gill, Aaron Lines, Martina McBride,** Lonestar's **Richie McDonald, Brad Paisley, Jeffrey Steele** and songwriter **Craig Wiseman.** Getting rave reviews for their New Faces Show performances were **Steve Azar, Kellie Coffey, Emerson Drive, Joe Nichols** and **Tammy Cochran.**

A number of the artists listed above also appeared in other places, including label suites and showcases. Among those joining them were **Sherrie Austin, Chad Brock, Tracy Byrd, Kenny Chesney, Joe Diffie, Lonestar, Craig Morgan, John Michael Montgomery** and **Blake Shelton.** In addition, more than 80 artists, including **Faith Hill, Jo Dee Messina** and Chesney, participated in the Artist Radio Taping Session.

The Greensboro outlet flipped to CHR/Rhythmic yesterday morning at 8:35am. Two station staffers were affected — PD/morning personality **Billy Buck Blevins** (*fourblevins@aol.com*), who exited on Feb. 21, and evening talent **Sonny Shands**, who will be reassigned to other duties within the Clear Channel/ Greensboro cluster. The station's other dayparts were voicetracked.



Commenting on the demise of WWCC, CC/Greensboro OM **Tim Satterfield** said, "It never had a solid chance of succeeding. It became clear that doing something drastic was the only option we had to benefit the cluster."

WWCC was born on January 2, 2001, when Country WHSL/Greensboro and Rock WXRA switched frequencies. Since the summer 2001 Arbitron, WWCC's 12+ shares have been, in consecutive ratings periods, 1.4, 2.0, 1.7, 1.4, 1.0 and 1.5.

Americana Charts To Appear In R&R

The Americana Airplay Chart, the Americana Music Association's radio chart for album airplay, will soon move to a new weekly home in *Radio & Records*. The charts debut in the March 14 issue of **R&R**.

The Americana Airplay Chart, developed and managed by the Americana Music Association (AMA), represents the reported album play of terrestrial radio stations, nationally syndicated radio shows, satellite radio and Internet stations that have agreed to submit weekly album-play reports.

The reporting panel is presently composed of 70 stations. There are plans to expand that number to between 80-100 in coming months.

According to **R&R** CEO/Publisher **Erica Farber**, "R&R has always felt it important to provide the most up-to-date information for all current-based formats to our readers. We are so pleased with our new relationship with the Americana Music Association and look forward to including the weekly Americana chart in the pages of **R&R.**"

J.D. May, Executive Director of the Americana Music Association, added, "This is an amazing opportunity for Americana that will most certainly continue to raise the profile of our music and our industry. We're thrilled that a leading publication like **R&R** sees the same potential for our music and industry as we do and that they're willing to invest their resources in our format."

Humanitarian Awards Announced

Several radio stations were honored during the CRS for service to their communities last year, earning CRB Radio Humanitarian Awards for improving the quality of life in their markets. In the large market category, KEEY/Minneapolis was honored for its work with multiple charity organizations. Not only did the station raise more than \$1million for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, but it also raised more than \$1 million in funds and collections for local charities as well. In the medium market category, KXKC/Lafayette, LA won for its continued commitment to local charities, such as the United Way and



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the American Heart Association and the station's own event — "Cajun Comic Relief IX," which benefits homeless shelters. In the small-market category, WCTY/Norwich, CT was honored for raising nearly \$900,000 in cash and several hundred thousand dollars more in food, clothing and toys for local charities. The station also participates in blood drives, turkey drives and celebrity bake sales.

BNA's Lonestar received the CRB Artist Humanitarian of the Year Award. The American Red Cross specifically submitted Lonestar for recognition; the group has served as the Red Cross' first hurricane awareness spokespeople, doing public service messages and donating the use of their song "I'm Already There" for those messages. The group went so far as to include the Red Cross logo on the side of their tour bus as well as on the jacket of their CD. The group members were presented with the award from last year's winner, Brooks & Dunn.

Paycheck Services To Be Held Today

Country music icon **Johnny Paycheck** will be laid to rest this afternoon in Nashville. He died Feb. 19 at a Nashville rest home following a long battle with emphysema and asthma. The 64-year old Grand Ole Opry member was best known for earthy, working class hits like "Take This Job And Shove It" and "I'm the Only Hell Mama Ever Raised." He had more than two dozen hit singles taken from 70 albums.

Paycheck was born in Greenfield, OH and changed his name from Donald Eugene Lytle in the 1960s after moving to Nashville. He had a somewhat checkered past and served two years in prison from 1989-91 for shooting a man in the head in an Ohio bar in 1985. In 1990, Paycheck went bankrupt, listing debts of \$1.6 million, most of which was owed to the Internal Revenue Service.

Since his release from prison, Paycheck filled much of his time playing as a regular member of the Grand Ole Opry cast and giving speeches to children about the dangers of drugs. Paycheck's last appearance on record was a recitation on **Daryle Singeltary's** recording of "Old Violin," a self-penned mid-1960s hit for Paycheck.

The last time Paycheck sang on a record was on an un-released Giant song recorded by **Southern Exposure**. He sang harmony on "The Lovin' Machine," Paycheck's first Top 10 hit, which came back in 1966.

R&R/Bulleye: Listeners Rate Shuttle Coverage The **R&R**/Bullseye Country Callout America question to a two-week sample of 350 Country listeners: "Think about when you heard about the Columbia space shuttle disaster. How do you think your favorite radio station did in keeping you informed and upto-date on the information you wanted about the

shuttle disaster?" Radio received high marks, with 63% of the respon-



dents giving it a "5" (awesome job) or a "4" (a good job). Of the total sample, 28% gave it a 5 and 35% a 4. Among the cells, the highest positive ratings came from P1s and Females, with 67% 4s and 5s.

Of the total sample, 25% said their favorite station did a "so-so" job (3), 7% said it did "*way* too much" (2) and 5% said "not nearly enough" (1).

Expect some pretty jammed phone lines at Ticketmaster on Saturday, as tickets go on sale at 10am in each time zone for nearly all of **The Dixie Chicks'** North American tour stops. *The Top of the World Tour* kicks off May 1 in Greenville, SC and concludes Aug. 4 in Nashville. The tour is sponsored by Lipton. It's the Dixie Chicks first tour in three years.

Tim McGraw's *One Band Show* is having no problems with ticket sales. The tour kicks off Friday, March 7 in Birmingham, and promoters have already added shows in cities such as Detroit, which sold out the first concert in just three hours.

Other artists on the project include **Kris Kristofferson, Carlene Carter** and **Allison Moorer**.

Speaking of the Grammy Awards, Alan Jackson scored his first Grammy win for Best Country Song, with "Where Were You (When The World Stopped Turning)." The Dixie Chicks had the biggest country night, taking home statuettes in the categories of Best Country Album for Home, Best Country Performance by a Duo or Group with Vocal for "Long Time Gone," and Best Country Instrumental Performance for "Lil' Jack Slade." Faith Hill's "Cry" won for Best Female Country Vocal Performance, and **Johnny Cash**'s "Give My Love To Rose" won for Best Male Country Vocal Performance. Willie Nelson and Lee Ann Womack's "Mendocino County Line" won in the country collaborative category. Dualtone Records also scored big with a win for Best Bluegrass Album: Lost in the Lonesome Pines by Jim Lauderdale and Ralph Stanley and The Clinch Mountain Boys.

Fresh from his Grammy win, Willie Nelson will headline a show at the annual SXSW conference in Austin on March 14. The BMI/Lost Highway Presents showcase will also offer performances by **Lucinda Williams, The Jayhawks, Tift Merritt** and **John Eddie**.

Travis Tritt isn't one to be late for a party, so where else would you expect to find him than in New Orleans for the opening of Mardi Gras celebrations next week? Tritt will serve as the Celebrity Monarch at the annual Krewe of Orpheus parade Monday and he'll perform at a ball following the parade.


