Country Radio PDs Ponder Chicks Tour

The upcoming **R&R** Country column, appearing in the March 28 issue, focuses on the continuing saga of **The Dixie Chicks** and the country music industry. Both radio and record execs offered comments. Here's a sample of what some of them told R&R's **Angela King:**

With the **Dixie Chicks**' *Top of the World* tour scheduled to kick off May 1 in Greenville, SC, radio stations that had been planning for the tour to be a big part of their spring book promotional push are left wondering what the impact of the show will be in their market. One of the biggest litmus tests will be in Austin, the Chicks first stop in Texas since lead singer Natalie Maines told a London concert crowd that she was ashamed to be from the same state as President Bush. She later apologized by way of a press release.

KASE & KVET/Austin Regional VP/Programming **Jason Kane** tells **R&R** that his stations were anticipating the tour and would have become "Dixie Chicks Radio for a period of time." Now, he says, "I'm really worried about it. There's a lot of people in Austin that want to distance themselves [from the band]. In Texas, the Chicks have a lot of fence mending to do. Frankly, the way I feel about this concert tour right now is going to depend on how the Chicks and their organization reacts to this."

WYCD/Detroit PD **Mac Daniels** is also waiting to see what happens between now and the two shows set for his market, on June 2 and 3. "I would handle it differently today than in June. People say they have burned their tickets and are planning not to attend. It'll be interesting to see how many empty seats there are."

But WQYK & WYUU/Tampa OM Mike Culotta says he's not altering the plans he has for the show in his military-heavy market. "It's a major show coming into the area, and we have arranged a lot of things around it. I don't think anything will change." Culotta says when people call and ask the stations not to play the Chicks' music, "We ask them, 'But if I was giving away their concert tickets, would you take them?' They always say yes."

Will Chicks' Fallout Impact Other Artists?

Some Music Row insiders have been left to wonder if a boycott of music by The Dixie Chicks by some stations will produce a "chilling effect" on what artists are willing to say and express in their music. Capitol/Nashville Exec. VP/Promotion Bill Catino says he always tries to guide his artists away from politics and religion. "You can't win," he says. "There are too many differences of opinion." But, he admits, he isn't always successful: "That's why they call them artists."

WB/Nashville Sr. VP/Promotion **David Haley** agrees that those two subjects should be avoided, as well as anything that artists may regret. "Everybody needs to remember we're granted freedom of speech, but not always freedom of acceptance. You have to live with any backlash."

Should Music Row be concerned about the recent actions of some radio stations? BNA VP/Promotion **Tom Baldrica** says, "To start to censor what you play or don't play is always dangerous territory. It

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has to pose a concern for all of us when you start to censor things we all don't agree with." But Baldrica doesn't necessarily believe that radio is censoring The Dixie Chicks. He says, "I don't look at this as censorship. This is punishment. And, there's a big difference. If she would have just expressed her views, that's one thing. It's different to be outspoken; it's a whole 'nother to be mean spirited."

Chicks' Manager Doesn't Expect Further Apologies

Dixie Chicks' manager **Simon Renshaw** tells **R&R** that despite calls by some radio stations and radio companies for Natalie Maines to make a public apology, he doesn't think one is necessary. Renshaw says, "There have been two strongly-worded statements that were worded by Natalie. Right now, I don't think Natalie can win. If she goes on microphone and apologizes, they'll say she doesn't sound contrite enough. I really apologize for having to use publicists. The next time, we'll use pigeon-post or some other medium people find acceptable."

Renshaw believes the majority of Country radio stations have handled this issue responsibly. "I'm glad The Dixie Chicks have gotten the support they have from radio," he says. He also feels some stations have fallen prey to a political agenda. "You keep thinking that you want this particular music genre to look like it's growing up, it's more cosmopolitan. Then people are calling up and saying, 'See? They are a bunch of redneck Republicans.'"

He believes radio stations should focus on other issues right now: "One should look at the time we are in right now. Is this a time for these kind of debates to continue? Is this how radio feels they are being responsible media partners by the acts they are taking?" No matter what some stations have done, Renshaw maintains that The Dixie Chicks will continue to be open-minded with their dealings with Country stations. He says, "Seeing as how the Chicks have to sit here and suffer retribution, does that mean

they are going to exact some retribution of their own? I don't think so; they aren't that kind of people. Some people might feel the best way to deal with the Chicks is to declare a chain-wide boycott. We would like to think we are capable of operating at a slightly more balanced and larger view of the situation."

National Talker Promotes 'Rival' Chicks Concert In Carolinas

Salem Radio Networks syndicated talk show host **Mike Gallagher** has decided to promote a concert set for May 1 in Greenville, SC — the same night The Dixie Chicks are set to launch their 60-city Lipton Presents Dixie Chicks Top of the World Tour.

Gallagher, who was once a locally based host at Entercom's WORD-AM/Greenville, SC, is now on 150 stations around the nation, including WORD, KRLA/Los Angeles and WBAP/Dallas. He said yesterday afternoon, "The event is on. We've booked the 3,200-seat Spartanburg Memorial Auditorium for the night of May 1 and we're 75% of the way there in booking Charlie Daniels, although he's not confirmed yet." Also on his "wish list" are Toby Keith, Travis Tritt and Darryl Worley, and he says a letter has even been sent to Garth Brooks. "But," he adds, "even if I have to get on stage, strum a ukulele and whistle Dixie, people will still fill the place because it's as much a protest to The Dixie Chicks insulting our president as anything else.

"When I heard The Dixie Chicks were opening their North American tour in Greenville, I got very excited. I thought there was something I could do about this, and that's where the idea for the 'Dixie Chicks Rival Concert' was born. Really, the whole idea was to take a negative like Natalie's comments and turn it into a positive. The community seems very excited about this. It has touched a nerve and people are trying to figure out a way to express frustration with what Natalie Maines said. This seems to be the perfect way to do it."

All of the proceeds from the show will go to Gallagher's Army Fund, which helps provide food

and personal care items to the families of military personnel throughout the U.S. On March 21, listeners donated \$35,000 in three hours. The funds were earmarked to offset the shows' production costs. In addition, tickets for the "rival" concert will be \$35-\$40.

Gallagher's decision to promote a "rival concert" was in part based on the promoters' decision to not offer refunds to those who purchased Chicks tickets. The host says he is setting aside a large block of seats for holders of Chicks tickets who come to his concert. Gallagher says, "They'll get in free, have VIP seats and attend a backstage reception with the artist and me.

"For the first time in 25 years of broadcasting, this is the first time I've felt able to really accomplish something this positive through the radio show. Usually in Talk radio we bellyache about stuff. But here's an example of putting our money where our mouth is and getting Americans together and raising money for military families so they know they're not alone right now. And, it all stems from taking a negative and turning it into a positive and I'm very proud of that."

Asked for his reaction to Gallagher's plans, Dixie Chicks' manager **Renshaw** said, "It will be fantastic to see who he gets to play. If he thinks there should be a counter-show, I wish him good luck."

Hostage Drama Ends Calmly

A hostage standoff at a small Country AM daytimer, WDKN/Dickson, TN ended peacefully on March 20 after a gunman surrendered to police. Before turning himself over to police, the suspect fired several shots inside WDKN and pointed a gun at disc jockey Diane Davis, who was on the air reading funeral notices at the time. The man had taken his wife and daughter hostage in their car, located near WDKN's main entrance, and the wife managed to escape, running into the radio station. OM **Ken Loggains** tells **R&R**, "We were the first open door she found. She yelled, 'Call 911. He's going to kill me.'"

Events unfolded about 10 minutes before the station stopped operations for the day. Davis called 911 and hunkered down under the board, leaving her microphone open the entire time. Several listen-

ers dialed 911 after hearing the ruckus in the studio. The suspect entered the studio and pointed a gun at Davis, before leaving to find his wife in the back of the building. Davis was the only employee in the building at the time. Davis escaped shortly afterward, and the suspect surrendered to police about four hours later. No one was injured. Davis is presently on leave of absence from the radio station. (Country Format Room, *radioandrecords.com*, 3/21.)

This week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question was actually posed to 350 Coun-

try listeners over a two-week period. We asked, "How do you feel about this statement: 'When listening to my favorite Country radio station, I sometimes turn the radio off or change stations because my favorite station plays too many commercials.' (One to five scale, with one meaning "strongly disagree" and five meaning "strongly agree.")

The audience is rather neatly divided into thirds on the subject of commercial load. Of the total sample, 37% "strongly agree" (4%) or "agree" (34%) with the statement, 35% say they're neutral and 27% say they "disagree" or "strongly disagree."

Here's a little something to drive programmers nuts: Leading the "strongly agree" or "agree" segment are men at 47% (5% and 42%, respectively), while the low end of this answer among all demos and cells at 31% (3% and 28%) comes from the women.

At the other end of the spectrum, the highest "strongly disagree" and "disagree" figures are from women at 33% (16% and 17%, respectively). And yes, you guessed it, the lowest scores come from men at 19% (10% and 9%, respectively).

field for a concert for only the second time in the school's history. The first time was for a **Michael Jackson** show. (All similarities reportedly end there.) The daylong show is set for June 7. The tickets are selling for \$50 and will go on sale April 5.

Hank Williams Jr. received a unique form of praise from a tank commander in Iraq last weekend. The soldier was being interviewed on *NBC's Weekend Today* when he revealed that he has painted Williams' nickname, "Bocephus," on the side of his tank as a tribute to the artist. Williams says he is hoping to get this message to that soldier: "Turn out Saddam's lights in Baghdad, son, and get back home quick. You're a man whose hand I want to personally shake."

Aaron Tippin last week was honored by the Tennessee Aeronautics Commission for his patriotic efforts. Tippin performed free shows for troops at bases in Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Afghanistan and Qatar over the Thanksgiving holiday.

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Nashville Star Contestants Get Chummy

As they head into the third week of living together in a house on Music Row, the contestants of *Nashville Star* are letting their hair down around one another — and maybe even doing a little more than that. In an exclusive **R&R** interview, 22-year-old Uvalde, TX contestant **Prentiss Varnon** clarified something he told show host **Nancy O'Dell** after it was announced that **Kristen Kissling** was the first contestant eliminated by the viewing public. "Losing Kristen will take a lot of personality out of the house," Varnon said. "It's hard to think of what it'll be like when we go back and she's not there."

Meanwhile, Varnon says, "I'm the only guy upstairs with four women. I love women. I'm lucky to have two beautiful women crawl in bed with me and stay up and talk." The women in question are Kissling and **Miranda Lambert**. But Varnon is quick to say, "I didn't really come to this thing to hook up with a girl. It's fun. Kristen added so much to the show. She's just plum crazy. She added a lot to our room."

Kissling was eliminated at the top of the show last weekend, and when it came time for the judges to eliminate a second contestant at the end of the show, Varnon says, "I really didn't know what to think. They had a roulette going with all our pictures flashing. Everybody tried to prepare themselves. Everybody thought they were going to see themselves. It could have been any one of us. I feel sad about Tasha Valentine leaving, but I'm just glad I'm here."

In fact, Varnon is so glad that he's still there that he and several other contestants went out on the town after the show ended. "Me, Brandon [Silveira], Travis [Howard], Miranda [Lambert], Jamey [Garner] and John Arthur [Martinez] all kind of stick together. We go out to Broadway to Tootsie's Orchid Lounge. People are starting to recognize us more

and more. It's cool to sign autographs. We went out Saturday night and Sunday night. There's so much pressure built up during the week."

Being recognized more can also be a drawback, however, as Varnon admits to having a slight incident at Nashville nightclub The Stage. "There was a fan of Brandon's there, a wealthy guy who paid money to get Brandon up to sing. Brandon didn't want to sing, so Travis got up there. And the rude performer onstage started making fun of all of us. The guy was really arrogant. He said, 'At least I don't have to get on television to get a gig or be seen.'"

Along with the downside of being known, Varnon says he's also learning a lot about his fellow contestants. "At the beginning it was hard to get to know everyone. Now, they are pretty much acting themselves. **Brandi [Gibson]** is a talker; she rambles. She does like to talk and voice her opinions. And I would let you talk to Travis but I'm sure he would cuss." When the group goes out to clubs, he says, "Mirandais the mischievous one. We try to watch out for her."

Despite the fun, Varnon is starting to feel the pressure. Next week, each contestant will perform a pop song that they've adapted to make it country. Varnon will sing Dan Seals' "I'd Really Love To See You Tonight," but he says that now that the contestants have an idea of what the judges are looking at, everyone is starting to doubt their song choices. "The judges are really leaning on song choice," he says. "It should be about the performance. I think my chances might be better with the audience. **Robert K. Oermann** doesn't seem to like me much. He just tolerates me. I want to play to the audience. It takes a lot of the pressure off."

After the fifth episode, the judges no longer eliminate contestants. The fate of the finalists is then in the hands of the voting audience.
