Tim & Willy Drop Syndication

KNIX/Phoenix morning team Tim & Willy have opted not to continue to export their show to other Clear Channel stations. The duo began syndicating their show almost three years ago, but they now tell **R&R** that they needed to re-prioritize. "We've been doing the syndicated show - at one time on as many as 11 stations — and decided to either clone a couple of extra Tim & Willys or make changes. We got through this year, and we signed a five-year deal that was great because it gives us the stability of a place to call home. We really want to give our best effort here in town. We want to be No. 1 in Phoenix. Let's knock Howard Stern off the top.' Along with their morning show, Tim & Willy run their own Kids Fundation, a nonprofit organization to benefit local children, and they do as many as 15 to 20 live segments on morning television in Phoenix. In addition, the morning team are part of The Tim & Willy All-Earl Band.

With those many commitments and their desire

to focus solely on Phoenix, Tim & Willy's last day of syndication will be May 2. Clear Channel Regional VP/Programming **Alan Sledge** tells **R&R**,

April 8, 2003

"This is about making KNIX the best station it can be. I support this decision. We had a lot of push-back from stations that did not want to see this happen, but Phoenix is one of the most competitive markets in America. The value KNIX has to Phoenix and to our company is significant. It is a very important radio station here. While we support the export, this will serve listeners better."

The stations that currently carry the exported Tim & Willy morning show are KIXZ/Spokane; KKAT/Salt Lake City; WCTQ/Sarasota; WCKY/ Findlay, OH; KMNT/Centralia, WA; and WRBY/ Utica, NY.

R&R/Bullseye: Will Country Lose War Audience To News/Talk?

Television continues to be the main source of information about the war with Iraq during a typical day, but some believe that News/Talk stations are getting an influx of listening from the Country radio audience who hunger for updates. That, however, does not seem to be the case. While there is a decided interest in information about the war among the Country audience, many listeners are showing that they are getting their news needs met by Country radio.

This week's R&R Country Callout America by Bullseye question, posed to 350 Country listeners: "During the course of a typical day, who do you depend on for news & information on the Iraqi situation?" While 64% of the total sample said television was their first source of information, nearly 20% of respondents said they depend on their favorite Country station for their war updates. Less than 10% of the sample turned to News Talk, 6% looked for updates on the Internet, and only 3% said they did not follow war updates during the day.

For complete breakouts — including men and women, 25-34, 35-44 and 45-54 — check out the **R&R Country Callout America** by Bullseye research page in the 4/11 issue of **R&R**.



Fireworks, Cussing — Just Another *Nashville Star* Night

For the last two weeks, network censors have probably been a little unnerved by live television show *Nashville Star*. Last week judge **Robert Oermann** let the s-word slip out. This week he started things off by apologizing to **Brandi Gibson**, the contestant he swore at. But that was where the love fest ended, and *Nashville Star* finalist **Brandon Silveira** had a little something to say following his performance.

Silveira promises that he didn't set out to get revenge on the judges of the USA Network show, despite the fact that he insisted on addressing them Saturday night. After Oermann told him, "You can't sing," Silveira rejoined, "Opinions are like assholes. Everybody's got one."

Silveira maintains it was a completely spontaneous moment. "It wasn't planned; it just kinda popped into my head," he says. And he didn't wait to say something that had been on his mind just because the judges no longer eliminate contestants from the competition — only a lack of votes from the audience determines the next contestant to leave. He says, "If they had said the same thing two weeks ago, I would have said the same thing."

He admits to being somewhat disdainful of the judges. "Nothing they say surprises me. They contradict themselves a lot. They have their 15 seconds, and they have to get their point across, and they sometimes put their foot in their mouths too. Robert Oermann called [fellow contestant] **Buddy Jewell** a coward a while back. Buddy just laughs about it."

Silveira doesn't think his profanity will cost him with the audience, either. "I've gotten all kinds of calls about what I said: 'You know, you handled yourself beautifully.' Some people said, 'Just because you said that, you won yourself another week.'" He isn't too worried that negative comments by the judges will have an impact on the voting audience: "The American public has their own opinions of who they like and who they don't. Last week the judges didn't say too many bad things about **Jamey Garner** and he was still voted off. For the most part, Americans form their own opinions." He does admit to being surprised by the decision, however. "It was definitely a shock. I thought he would be down to the last two or three. I don't know if it was the song choice [Garner sang a country version of Journey's 'Faithfully'] or maybe because he didn't play his harmonica."

For now, Silveira says the toughest part is "just going out there and doing a good job." He notes, "You only have a week to prepare the next song you have to learn and make your own. You think, 'Will they like the song I pick?' And you only have about four times to practice it. It's nerve-wracking to make sure you have it down."

It is also difficult because contestants have to choose material to fit different themes each week. This week the show moves from its 9pm ET slot to 10pm ET, and the contestants must choose an "America's Song." The producers told contestants to choose a song they would like to sing in front of a room full of troops or their hometown. **Clint Black** will return as a celebrity guest.

Silveira is trying not to let the pressure get to him. In fact, following Saturday night's outburst, he went out. "I've got a lot of family flying up from California, so we've been partying like rock stars." He's trying not to let the judge's comments weigh too heavily on his mind each week. "I don't claim to be a great singer. I have a style. **Johnny Cash** and **Merle Haggard**, they have a style, a twang, and that's all I have. I don't have this amazing voice."

He does think about who will be eliminated from the show each week, and he says, "Every week, I think it's me."


