Tony Brown In Critical Condition In L.A. Hospital

Brown, Universal South's Sr. Partner, sustained a head injury after falling down a three-step staircase Friday while in Los Angeles. He is currently under the care of UCLA Medical Center's Neurological Department, where he is listed in critical but stable condition. Because he is in the intensive care unit, no flowers or gifts can be sent and visitation is limited to immediate family at this time. Updates on his condition will be posted in the Country Format Room at *radioandrecords.com* as soon as they become available. The prayers of an entire industry are with Tony and his family.

WCMS Shifts To Classic Country

At 3pm ET on April 10, WCMS/Norfolk became "Classic Country, the all-new 100.5 WCMS." The station, which will celebrate 50 years as a Country outlet next year, has dropped all current music and will focus on hits released from 1989-94. WCMS has also adopted a Classic Rock approach to its on-air presentation and to the station's production. WCMS will now target 40-to-50-year-olds. Meanwhile, co-owned Country WGH-FM will now target 28-to-38-year-olds after undergoing what OM John Shomby calls a "slight adjustment into a more 'now' type of station." That means less gold and a more recurrent-current mix. (Country Format Room, radioandrecords.com, 4/10.)

The Sing Your Heart Out benefit is set for June 18 at the Country Music Hall of Fame & Museum. **K.T. Oslin** has already signed on to participate ... New West Records signs **Drive-By Truckers** to a new record deal. The first CD for their new label, Decoration Day, is set for a June 17 release.

Artist News

Former DreamWorks/Nashville artist **Shane Sellers**, who also happens to be a top jockey and is expected to ride in the Kentucky Derby, has signed a recording deal with Lofton Creek. Expect a single next week with an album due in the summer. Going for adds on May 5 is "Back To Riding Rainbows," a song written by **Joe Diffie, Randy Boudreau** and **Kim Williams**.

Noel Fox Passes

Noel Fox died April 10 following a heart attack and complications from a stroke. He was 63. Fox spent more than 40 years in the music business, both on and off the stage. He sang bass with a number of groups, including the Tennesseans Quartet, the Harvesters Quartet and, from 1969-72, the Oak Ridge Boys. Fox then moved behind the scenes into booking, management and publishing. In 1978 he managed the Oaks publishing company, Silverline/Goldline, and later headed MCA Music/ Nashville and Maypop Music, the publishing company of the band Alabama. He also previously managed the career of Rhonda Vincent. Fox most recently worked for New England Financial Services.

Fox's body was cremated. Services are set for this morning at 11am at the Hendersonville First Baptist Church. In lieu of flowers, the family has asked that donations be sent to the American Heart Association.

The Noel Fox-Tony Brown Connection

It's a tragic coincidence that both Tony Brown and Noel Fox are part of this week's Hot Fax. Fox's death on April 10 was followed the next day by Brown's awful accident.

The two's professional paths first crossed more than 30 years ago. Fox was singing bass for the Oak Ridge Boys in the late 1960s and early 1970s; playing piano for the then-gospel group was Tony Brown. He later left the Oaks to play piano for Elvis Presley. Years later, around 1978 or so, Fox was managing the Oak Ridge Boys' Silverline/ Goldline publishing and signed Brown to his very first writing deal. Our thoughts and prayers are with the families of both Noel Fox and Tony Brown.

Stationality

WSIX/Nashville will host a third season of free lunchtime concerts, billed as the New Country Café at the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum, starting April 29. Jeff Bates will perform the first of the monthly concerts.

R&R/Bullseye: How Listeners Feel About U.S. Involvement in Iraq.

Here's this week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question, which was posed to 175 Country listeners: "How do you feel about the U.S. involvement in Iraq? On a scale of 1 to 5, '1' means you strongly object and '5' means you strongly support the U.S. involvement."

Of the total sample, 81% said they support this country's involvement in Iraq, with 70% voicing "strong support" — a "5" — and 11% indicating "support" — a "4." Fourteen percent were neutral (3), 3% said they object (2), and 2% said they strongly object (1).

Those numbers pretty much held up across the demo and sex cells, except the P2s, where 73% were in support — 62% answered "5" and 11% "4." The 45-54s came in on the high end, with 88% - 81% "5s" and 7% "4s" — saying they support the U.S. involvement.

Those answering with either a "1" or a "2"

ranged between 2%-8%. On the top end, 8% of the P2s and he 35-44s responded "1" or "2." It was the 25-34 demo that came in at 2%, with 0% saying they object and 2% saying they "strongly object."

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MUSIC NOTES

Darryl Worley will be playing a rather big gig at the Pentagon Wednesday morning. A 45-minute concert, set for 10:30am ET, will be televised via close-circuit feeds to American Forces Radio and Television Service for troops overseas. Worley is having a big week, with appearances on several

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national talk shows, including *The Howard Stern Show* this morning, a visit with Sean Hannity this afternoon, and a drop-in to G. Gordon Liddy tomorrow.

Of course, all this attention should be getting to be routine for Worley, who last week received a 2003 USO Merit Award, which is presented each year to someone who has outstanding creative talents and who is dedicated to serving others. Previous recipients include Elizabeth Taylor and Steven Spielberg.

George Strait's new studio album, *Honkytonkville*, will hit stores June 24. He'll also be honored at the 38th annual Academy of Country Music Awards show with a Special Achievement Award that recognizes the unprecedented 50 No. 1 hits he's had in his career. This is only the fourth time in ACM Awards history that this designation has been given. The three previous recipients are George Burns, Jeff Foxworthy and Garth Brooks. Strait will also perform on the May 21 ACM telecast in Las Vegas.

Surprises And Shocks As Five *Nashville Star* Contestants Remain

For the first time since *Nashville Star* started airing, contestants and viewers had to wait to find out which of the six contestants on the reality series would be voted off. It was a grueling wait for those on the show who were hoping their names would be among those called to perform. At the end of the show, it was Amy Chappell who failed to receive enough votes from the viewers to stay. *Nashville Star's* youngest contestant to vie for a Sony Music/Nashville recording deal, 19-year old Miranda Lambert, says she tried to "build up a wall on Saturday. It gets worse every week, but you have to be professional about it."

Lambert says the elimination of Chappell was a big surprise, but "anybody would have been a shock for me. I myself packed on Saturday. I did laundry. Anybody could go at any point. I was not feeling safe at all."

While she isn't insecure, Lambert is being realistic. She says it was a reality check when Jamey Garner departed the show. She says, "When Jamey was voted off, I was surprised. I thought he was one of the favorites of America. I really thought he was going to be in the top two. When he lost, I realized this could be me. I don't feel safe from here on out."

Lambert also has a hard time predicting what the viewers will do next. "I don't even try to guess. I don't know what America is thinking or what they are going to do. Anybody in the top five deserves to win."

Last week's show also showed for the first time some discord among contestants. Lambert contends that it was a small dust-up, though, and that everyone gets along fine. "Brandi Gibson got a little upset. Her and Buddy Jewell had a disagreement about practice time. We're not picture- perfect, and I was glad we were able to show that."

Following Saturday night's show, the five contes-

tants were taken by bus to Martinsville, VA to sing the national anthem prior to a NASCAR race. Lambert says, "It was really cool. We got to go into the pit. It was the first NASCAR race for all of us, and what a great way to do it. You don't realize how enthusiastic NASCAR fans are about country music. A lot of people recognized us. There were so many people cheering."

Following that performance Sunday, the contestants did their first mini-radio tour, visiting WSSL/Greenville, SC; WIVK/Knoxville and WUSY/Chattanooga, TN. What's the hardest thing about that first radio gig? "We've learned not to talk over each other and kind of take turns," Lambert says. "We're having a good time."

After the quick time away from the house on Music Row where they've been staying, the contestants will be gearing up for their first chance to perform two songs on Saturday, as Phil Vassar acts as celebrity judge. Contestants are charged with choosing a No. 1 song from the past three years to perform. And, they also have to perform an original song that they feel could one day reach No. 1. Lambert says, "I am considering 'Love Somebody Like You' for the No. 1 song. I have no clue about my original song. I wrote a song with [former contestant] Travis Howard called 'You And Your Memory' that I might sing. We wrote it about two weeks ago, right before he was eliminated. It's a good song."

Is it more grueling to perform more than once in an evening? No way, says Lambert. "I'm excited about it. It's one more two-minute showcase of our talent." Lambert is already setting her sights well beyond *Nashville Star*. "Personally, I don't look at it as a competition as much as I probably should. I'm not competing against them. I feel like I'm competing against superstars. Every one of us is going to get something great out of this."


