John Grady Named Sony/Nashville President

As first rumored in the Country Format Room at radioandrecords.com on the afternoon of May 2. DMZ Records President John Grady has been named President of Sonv Music Nashville. He succeeds Allen Butler, who exited the label May 2 after a decade at the helm. Grady will oversee all aspects of operations for all Sony Music Nashville imprints, which include Columbia/Nashville, Epic/Nashville, Lucky Dog and Monument. While nothing is official as of yet, look for Grady to continue at least some level of involvement with DMZ, a joint venture between Columbia, recording artist/producer T Bone Burnett and filmmakers Ioel and Ethan Coen.

Sony Music U.S. President Don Ienner said of Grady, "With his eclectic tastes, passion for music, dead-on marketing sensibilities and vast business acumen, John Grady is one of the most talented guys in the business. His fierce dedication to the artists he works with has earned him many admirers throughout the creative community, and his proven ability to craft and implement highly effective strategies for his projects has earned him the respect of the entire industry. I've known John for many years, and I have enormous faith in his talents and abilities.

"I thank T Bone Burnett for generously agreeing to have John take on these new responsibilities. I know that with John in place and the support of the all of the talented and creative people on the Sony Music Nashville team, particularly Larry Pareigis in promotion and Dale Libby in sales, we're perfectly posi-

tioned to further intensify our efforts in the Country music market as well as to bring our Nashville artists to broader audiences than ever before."

Grady was at Nashville imprints Mercury and Lost Highway from 1993 to 2002. He joined Mercury in March 1993 as National Director/Sales, was elevated to Sr. VP/Sales in 1995, and was promoted to Sr. VP/ Sales, Marketing and Promotion for Mercury Nashville and Lost Highway in February 1998. He launched DMZ in March 2002.

Sony Street Talk: When speculating last Friday's Sony/Nashville happenings, we also suggested that MCA/Nashville Executive VP/A&R Mark Wright might be moving up 16th Avenue as well. As of Sunday night, he had yet to be released from his contract with MCA and there was no further word as of late last night. But don't bet against Wright's move to Sony.

Chicks Tour Continues With Little Protest

Despite concerns that the band's Top of the World tour might be met with some resistance, The Dixie Chicks tour continued with two shows in South Florida this weekend that saw little to no words of dissent. The *Miami Herald* reports, "No protest took place outside the sold-out arena, and only support was visible on the inside where 'Free Natalie' T-shirts were on sale." At the same show, one fan did wear a homemade T-shirt that told the group, "Bush ain't proud you're from Texas either" but the wearer also told the newspaper that he's still a fan of their music. Meanwhile, the South Florida Sun-Sentinel reports, "Outside the building, not a single anti-Chicks protester could be found. The only visible placard, in fact, took up for the band: 'Natalie, this is America,' it read. 'Say whatever the hell you want.'"

Brown Returns To Nashville

Universal South Senior Partner **Tony Brown** is in fair condition at Nashville's Centennial Hospital intensive care unit. Brown suffered a head injury in a fall last month while in Los Angeles, and had been hospitalized at UCLA Medical Center. He was flown back from Los Angeles last week. Now that he's back in Nashville, Brown can receive cards and gifts from well-wishers. But, he cannot see visitors. Brown's condition continues to improve with each day.

ACM Broadcast Winners

Readers of the Country Format Room at radioandrecords.com on April 30 were the very first to know that the Academy of Country Music has named WIVK/Knoxville as its Country Radio Station of the Year and KSON/San Diego morning personalities **Tony Randall & Kris Rochester** as its On-Air Personalities of the Year. Winners in other categories include Don Romeo Talent Buyer/Promoter of the Year: Louis Messina, The Messina Group; Nightclub of the Year: Wildhorse Saloon, Nashville and Casino of the Year: Mandalay Bay Resort & Casino, Las Vegas. The awards will be presented at the ACM Awards Show, set to air live on CBS-TV at 8pm ET on May 21 — from the Casino of the Year.

Trapane Leaves KILT For Motor City Rocker

KILT/Houston Asst. PD/MD **John Trapane** has been tapped as PD of Clear Channel Classic Rocker WDTW/ Detroit. This reunites Trapane with CC/Detroit OM Darren Davis, who was OM of Infinity/Houston before his move to Motor City. Trapane's last day in Houston is May 15.

Meanwhile, back at KILT, OM **Jeff Garrison** is looking for Trapane's replacement. He says you don't need on-air skills, but you do have to be "an aggressive programmer who wants to kick some ass." McCarthy Now WQIK & WROO PD

Cumulus Lifts Chicks Ban, PDs Mixed

In last week's Country Hot Fax, we told you that Cumulus Country programmers were having a meeting on April 30 to discuss the future of Dixie Chicks selections on their stations. Not long after the call last Wednesday, Cumulus Exec. VP **John Dickey** told **R&R**, "The ban against Dixie Chicks music has been lifted. Stations are free to play the Chicks if their listeners want to hear them."

Offering an overview of the meeting, Cumulus

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Country Format Director **Bob Raleigh** told **R&R**, "Several markets reported that listener response had been 50/50 with regard to wanting the music back on the radio. Those markets will begin slowly filtering Dixie Chicks music back into rotation — mainly older library material — and eventually ramp thing back in. Other markets, particularly our Texas markets, report continued strong resentment toward the group and will keep the music off for now. This policy is very similar to any other type of music research. We play what the listeners tell us they want, and keep off what they tell us they don't want."

We polled several Cumulus PDs and, as you can see from their comments, opinions within the company are varied:

KRMD/Shreveport, LA PD **Bob Shannon:** "Since we are the ones that kind of helped start all of this and still to this day receive negative calls about them, we are going to be slow to re-add them. We are one mile away from the largest bomber base in the world and I think it is in our best interest to be a little conservative. But I do see us slowly adding them back after the spring book."

Cumulus/Lexington, KY Director/Country Programming **Dale O'Brian:** "I don't plan on putting them back in until at least after the book and maybe not then. It's gotten to a point where you say to yourself, 'Well, it's what I play that hurts me, not what I don't play.'"

WLWI/Montgomery, AL OM **Bill Jones:** "I think the climate is right to gradually work the Chicks back in. We will limit airplay to nights initially within the next couple of weeks, expanding to other dayparts over time."

WQXK (K105)/Youngstown, OH PD **Dave Steele:** "Eventually, K105 will put the Chicks back on the air. Currently, the time is not right for K105. The Dixie Chicks, while quite possibly inadvertently, had positioned themselves contrary to the image my radio station has presented to the public." An Emerald For Austin

Jayme Austin is the new Affiliate Manager for Emerald Entertainment's broadcast division. She succeeds Sharla McCoy, who resigned a couple of weeks ago. Austin, who has recently been filling-in as the afternoon driver for WSM-FM, has a distinguished on-air history at such top Country outlets as WSIX/Nashville, WYAY/Atlanta, WTDR/Charlotte and WHSL/ Greensboro, where she was also MD.

The Chicks' First Two Nights

The first two dates for the new Dixie Chicks tour were Greenville, SC and Orlando. Succinctly summing up the ladies' first Florida foray, WWKA/Orlando PD **Len Shackelford** said, "One lone protestor, a very pro-Chicks crowd, lots of scalpers who couldn't get rid of tickets and every television station in the market with no story to tell. Calm night, great show. We're hoping we're past it now in Orlando."

WSSL & WESC/Greenville OM **Bruce Logan** was heading to Cancun the morning after the May 1

show, but took time out from packing his speedo to give **R&R** this exclusive look at the night. This was posted on the Country Format Room at *radioandrecords.com* on Friday morning:

"I don't see how the night could have gone any better," he said. "It was all about the music and they played hit after hit after hit."

Describing the scene outside the arena, Logan said, "There were no incidents; no arrests. At the peak, there were about 20 anti-Chicks protesters and about 15 protesters against the protesters. But there were probably six media people for every one protester. I've never seen so many TV news crews in one place at one time."


Back inside the arena, Logan says Natalie emerged wearing a "Dare to be free" T-shirt and the Chicks kicked-off a three-song set with "Goodbye Earl." Then came an interesting moment. "After the third song, Natalie told the crowd, 'We have been anticipating this moment, and if anyone have anything to say or came here to boo, here's your chance ... 3-2-1.' At that point there was lots of cheering — if there were any boos, I couldn't hear them. After that, Natalie said, 'Thanks. We're glad you had your say, so let's get on with the music. And they did, and the show was amazing."

As for the show itself, Logan says it's in the round. The stage is circular, with two "pier-like structures" extending from opposite side of the circle. Inside the circle are two "chicken coops," populated by a hundred or so folks picked by a film crew prior to the show.

Finally, I asked Logan if the great reception the Chicks' got in Greenville altered his view of playing Chicks' music on his stations. He said, "First, it's important to know that every Chicks title on the stations seven weeks ago is on the stations now, although perhaps not in as heavy a rotation as they were seven weeks ago.

"I've always thought this wasn't about us — it was about the audience. While last night could not have gone better, I still think the remarks hurt a lot of

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people and we have to be sensitive to that. Everything is not OK. But we're definitely on the road to recovery."

The question posed to 350 Country listeners: "Over the last 30 days, how many Country CDs or cassettes have you purchased? And, are you buying more, less or about the same number of CDs and cassettes over the last year than you previously purchased?"

Of the total sample, 23% said they bought 1-2 CDs or cassettes, 17% said 3-5, 2% said 6-10, 3% said 10 or more. Fifty-five percent said they didn't purchase any. Some of the more interesting gender/age cell showings:

 24% of the P2s said they bought 1-2 pieces of Country product in the last 30 days, vs. 23% of P1s. When you hit 3-5 pieces, the P1s go to 20% while the P2s fall way off to 8%.

 Men are more like to buy 1-2 units than women — 24% vs. 23% — while women are more likely to purchase 3-5 pieces — 19% vs. 16%.

• Not surprisingly, of the 25-34, 35-44 and 45-54 age cells, the 25-34s lead the way in the 1-2 and 3-5 categories. (The 6-10 and 10-more categories are below 5% for all there cells.) Twenty-six percent of 25-34s bought 1-2 CDs, vs. 23% for 35-44s and 22% for 45-54s. Nineteen percent of 25-34s bought 3-5 pieces of music, vs. 16% of 35-44s and 17% of 45-54s.

As for buying habits, the majority of folks say they're buying about the same as last year — which probably isn't saying much. Of the total, 56% said "About the same," 21% said "More" and 23% said "Less."

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



Jewell Takes The Crown At Nashville Star

It's been a long journey toward landing that coveted Nashville recording contract for 42-year old **Buddy Jewell** — 20 years, in fact. But not only does that amount of time make the victory sweeter, it also makes him better prepared to face what lies ahead.

Iewell, who was selected by the audience of USA Networks' *Nashville Star* to receive a recording contract with Sonv Music Nashville, will finally experience what it means to have his dream come true. After decades of being turned away by label executives, Jewell says, "If there was ever an example of poetic justice this would be it. I hung in there, and my wife has been a rock through this whole thing." In fact, while Jewell says he went through many moments of doubt about continuing to pursue a recording career, he and his wife discussed how they would handle success. "We sat around and talked about what we would do to ensure the family stays together. If it came down to me being a star or a husband and father, I'll take being a husband and father."

Jewell is very aware of how difficult it's going to be to be away from his family doing concert stops. He says, "I'm gonna miss my family, but my wife will hopefully be able to soon be a stay-at-home mom. She's always wanted to do that and share my dream with me. I can change the history of my family from this day forward if I do this right."

Doing this right means "staying true to my faith and my morals and insulating myself from temptation on the road. I need to surround myself with good people who will hold me accountable for what I say and do."

Jewell may be out on the road sooner rather than later. "That's a rush-order thing. I'm taking meetings with prospective agents. I'm supposed to sing at the Opry in the next couple weeks and I'm performing at Fan Fair on the Sony stage June 7. A couple producers from the show are looking to put together a Nashville Star tour. I made so many close friends in that house — people that I got to grow with and know and love. We will have a blast out there."

Before that blast begins however, Jewell has the heady job of getting his first CD made and ready for stores. The project's due date is currently set for July 15. Jewell had his first single digitally delivered to Country radio yesterday. The single, "Pour Out The Rain (Lacey's Song)," was penned by Jewell for his daughter. Now he begins the arduous process of choosing other songs for the CD with producer **Clint Black** and Sony A&R executive **Tracy Gershon**.

Jewell says, "We're on an enormously short time schedule. On Monday, I start recording the rest of the record. This is one of the really exciting parts, getting to sit down and listen to people pitch me their best stuff. I'm really excited about it. It's gonna be a tough process to go through, but I've got Clint and Tracy and other folks at the label to help me with those decisions."

The moment he learned he was the winner was "an out-of-body experience," Jewell says, but he remembers "standing up there thinking how ironic it was that the two oldest guys on the show were the last two standing. It was almost symbolic. I couldn't have scripted it any better if I sat down and wrote it out."

While waiting to learn if his dream had come true, Jewell says, "I just kept staring at my wife. Win or lose, I wanted her face to be the first thing I saw. And I was praying for grace — to be a gracious winner or a gracious loser."

Jewell doesn't remember much after host Nancy O'Dell read his name, but he says, "I've gotten to watch the show once since then. I had big ol' tears well up watching it. It's just like a weight being lifted off my shoulders that's been there for 20 years."
