R&R Sets Reporter Guidelines

R&R will be making some major changes to its Country reporting panel over the next couple of weeks. Next week's Country Hot Fax (5/20) will feature the new additions to the panel. Those stations will be notified this week. The first R&R Country Chart using airplay data that includes those stations will be released Monday, June 2.

We will also be instituting new reporter guidelines designed to maintain **R&R**'s position of presenting an aggressive Country chart. Toward that end, **R&R** is

setting a 25% current music minimum standard for all of its Country reporters. As of the monitored week of May 4-10, 12 stations fall below that mark. Three are at 24%, two are at 23%, two are at 21%, one is at 20%, two are at 19%, one is at 18%, and one is at 15%. Programmers from those stations will be contacted this week. Should their programming plans call for their station to remain at those levels, they will be dropped from the panel. That list will also be released next week.

R&R and Mediabase have also established new AQH minimum requirements for a station to be monitored by Mediabase. A station must be monitored by Mediabase to be part of **R&R's** Country reporting panel. The market size and AQH minimums are: Markets 1-3: 12,000; Markets 4-6: 10,000; Markets 7-14: 7,500; Markets 15-23: 6,000; Markets 24-28: 5,000; Markets 29-40: 4,000; Markets 41-48: 3,500; Markets 49-60: 3,000; Markets 61-71: 2,000; Markets 72-113: 1,500; and Markets 114-140: 1,000.

Universal/Nashville Restructures Marketing Department

Since mid-1999, only four acts have debuted at (or higher than) No. 36. And, only one of those four were debut singles from a new artist: **Jeff Bates** edged-out Mr. Jewel with "The Love Song," which debuted at No. 34 on January 7. Both newcomers are in pretty good company. The other three singles belong to The Dixie Chicks ("Ready to Run," No. 30 on 7/2/99), Martina McBride ("I Love You," No. 36 on 7/23/99) and Tracy Byrd "The Truth About Men," No. 35 on 3/10/03). Congrats to Jewel, who so richly deserves the success for which he has worked so hard for so long. Kudos also go to Columbia/Nashville's Ted Wagner, Buffy Rockhill and their entire team.

At press time, she remains in critical condition after having developed complications. Her husband, the legendary Johnny Cash, has asked the public for their prayers.

Get well wishes also go out to **Beau Tucker**, father of **Tanya Tucker**, who has been in and out of the hospital over the last eight weeks suffering from a respiratory illness.

Fifty-year veteran broadcaster **Al Grosby** died on April 30. He was 71. He spent most of the last 25 years in Northern California, and has held stints as President/GM of Country stations KFRE/Fresno and KRAK/Sacramento. He is survived by his wife Shirley, and sons David, Scott and Todd.

anymore because they disrespected the President with their statement."

Of the total sample, 53% either "Strongly Disagree" or "Disagree." Another 19% said they "really don't care." Across the cells, the strongest disagreements to the statement come from 35-44s at 59% (31% Strongly Disagree and 28% Disagree) and P1s, where 57% (26% and 31%, respectively) don't agree. The low end of the spectrum here comes among P2s, 44% of whom (26% and 18%, respectively) say they Strongly Disagree or Disagree and among 45-54s, where 48% (17% and 31%, respectively) come down on this side of the question. On the flip side, 28% said they "Strongly Agree" (3%)

or "Agree" (25%). Across the cells, 25% of P1s are in this camp (4% "Strongly Agree," 21% "Agree") while 21% of 25-34s (1% and 20%, respectively) and 24% of 35-44s (2% and 22%, respectively) register their votes on this side of the question.


