Wright Named Sony Exec VP

At a party last Thursday night here in Nashville to honor new Sony/Nashville President **John Grady**, MCA/Nashville-Mercury Exec. VP A&R/In-House Producer **Mark Wright** was formally introduced as the label's new Exec. VP/A&R. Joining Wright is former MCA/Nashville-Mercury Nashville Manager/A&R **Carrie Higdon**, who will serve as Assoc. Director/A&R for Sony/Nashville.

Wright joined MCA in 1994 as Sr. VP of Decca, MCA/Nashville's now-dissolved sister label; he subsequently served as MCA/Nashville-Mercury's Exec. VP/A&R. He previously worked as A&R/Talent Manager for RCA/Nashville in the late 1980s. His songwriting credits include cuts by Alabama, Reba McEntire, Kenny Rogers and George Strait.

Stewart Departs WYGY

After a six-month stint as PD of WYGY/Cincinnati, **Dave Stewart** opts to return to a station he once programmed, Alternative WARQ/Columbia, SC, for similar duties. He will also serve as interim PD.

Fisher Sells Portland, OR Combo To Entercom; Four Exit

For \$44 million, Entercom will receive Country KWJJ-FM and Talk KOTK-AM — stations Fisher purchased in February 1996 from Park Communications for \$35 million. The sale comes as part of a continuing corporate restructuring process, and Fisher President/CEO William Krippaehne Jr. says it should help the company reduce its long-term debt by close to 50% in 2003.

Entercom began operating the stations via a time brokerage agreement with Fisher on June 1, and the company expects to close on the stations by the end of Q3 2003. Entercom already owns two AMs and four FMs in Portland, in addition to KSLM-AM in nearby Salem, OR. Fisher will continue to own 24 stations throughout the Pacific Northwest, including KOMO, KPLZ & KVI/Seattle.

Shortly after Entercom assumed control of the stations, VP/GM **Ron Carter**, GSM **Trey Yant**, OM and KOTK PD **Bruce Agler** and KWJJ PD **Ken Boesen** were all relieved of their duties. Robin Mitchell, who programmed KWJJ between April 1993-June 2000, is the interim PD.

R&R/Bullseye: "Did You Watch the ACMs — or *American Idol*?"

This week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question posed to 175 Country listeners: "Did you watch the Academy of Country Music awards show or *American Idol* recently on TV? Did you: Not watch either; watch both going back and forth; watch only the ACMs; or watch only *American Idol*?"

Of the total sample, 48% said they watched neither show, 20% said both, 15% said ACMs-only and 17%

said *AI*-only. Those numbers, and the spread between ACM-only and AI-only viewers, were fairly consistent across the sex and age demos.

The ACMs got whacked by *AI* viewership in a couple of areas. Among Country P2s, *AI*-only clobbered ACM-only viewers 22% to 8%. Among women, *AI*-only viewers bested ACM-only 17% to 11%. ACM-only viewership led *AI*-only viewership among Country P1s, males and 45-54s.

Of the total sample, 20% were counted in the "back and forth" gang. That figure hovered around the same mark across the sex and demo cells, with a high of 23% among women and a low of 17% among men.


MUSIC NOTES
