

Nashville Country Wars, Part 49: R.I.P. 'Live 95'

Nashville commuters yesterday morning were greeted with thousands of "road signs" lining the roads leading to Music Row as WSM-FM's new owner Cumulus Broadcasting, heralded the station's rebirth as "WSM-FM 95.5, Nashville's Best Country." The move brings to an end WSM-FM's 16-month run as "Live 95."

Also heralding WSM-FM's renewed vigor for the Nashville Country battle were 8-foot-by-8-foot spray-painted logos adorning the driveways and parking lots of most major record labels — and those of Country competitors WKDF and WSIX. The two radio stations were also outfitted with "Going Out Of Business" signs.

New WSM-FM PD **Lee Logan** reports that 3,000 signs were strategically placed along Nashville roads leading to Music Row. He told **R&R**, "Everything was all in fun. We just wanted to let people know we're in town and are committed to the format." Fully aware of potential for retaliation, Logan added, "We threw the first punch, so we have to be willing to take a punch when retribution comes."

WSM-FM's road placards featured the interstate road sign used by a number of Country outlets, with "WSM-FM" along the top and "95.5" in the body of the sign (It was unavailable for us to print.). By the way, the painted logos were water-soluble and could be washed off with a hose.

Street Talk: When asked about WSM-FM's shenanigans, WKDF PD **Dave Kelly** would only say, "Let the games begin." An internal memo from Kelly to the

WKDF staff was more to the point. Paraphrasing the missive, it said, in part, "When Kevin O'Neal joined WSM-FM as PD, he tried to draw us into the fray by attacking us on and off the air. We walked away and focused on our game plan. That's what we will do now: Ignore this and stay focused."

WSIX PD Mike Moore told **R&R**, "I never think it's a good idea to deface private property and I was surprised that they would do that. I hear they defaced property at WKDF, too. They've still got a l-o-o-o-o-n-g way to go to even get in the game."

Fan Fair Wrap Up & Stats

The CMA is reporting a smaller-than-expected dropoff in attendance at this year's Fan Fair. The economy and the post-war atmosphere was expected to keep people from attending. According

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to the organization, overall attendance for Fan Fair 2003 came in at 124,300 people, compared to 126,500 in 2002 — a decline of just 1.7%.

Among the stats from this year: 42 artists participated in nightly Coliseum shows, 82 played on the Greased Lightning Riverfront Park stages and a total of 522 artists took part in autograph and photo sessions. Nearly 90 stars took part in the MJI Programming remote radio broadcasts, which included 17 radio stations and two syndicated programs.

Other fun notes: During Fan Fair, you learn to expect the unexpected. Wynonna was joined on stage at her Coliseum show by her mother, Naomi Judd. They performed "Mama He's Crazy" and "Grandpa (Tell Me 'Bout The Good Old Days)" together. Trick Pony was joined by the stars of NBC-TV's daytime dramas during their performance at the Wildhorse Saloon Saturday night. The soap stars in attendance sang "Sweet Home Alabama" with the group. From the "as-long-as-it's-fora-good-cause" file, Verne Troyer — better known as "Mini Me" in the Austin Powers films, bought the bra Chely Wright wore in the video "Jezebel." Proceeds benefit the Reading, Writing & Rhythm cause, which support school music programs.

Fan Fair To Morph Into CMA Music Festival

The Country Music Association has announced that Fan Fair will change its name to the CMA Music Festival next year and confirmed that the event will once again be held in downtown Nashville. While the moniker Fan Fair will continue to represent at least a portion of the event, CMA Executive Director **Ed Benson** says the move from the Fairgrounds three years ago made the organization realize "that Fan Fair no longer represented what the event had become — a world-class, urban-centered music

festival with bigger audiences, multiple venues and many more diverse activities than ever before."

The CMA is trying to make the event more appealing to a broader audience and will continue adding more special activities and different musical styles. Benson says, however, "Any celebrities or musical guests we invite will have a tangible connection to country music and this lifestyle either through their musical influences, personal taste or relationships with country artists."

Next year's event is scheduled for June 10-13.

Radio Reacts To Fan Fair's Name Change

There are some concerns among radio folks about what Fan Fair's name change will mean. WZZK/Birmingham PD **Brian Driver**, whose station sent about 30 listeners to the event this year, says, "You can go across the United States and say the words 'Fan Fair' and everybody knows what that is. You call a P1 now and say 'Do you want to go to the CMA Music Festival?' and they will have no clue what they are getting into. The CMA has to do some serious reeducation."

WUSY/Chattanooga PD **Clay Hunnicutt** admits to seeing both sides of the coin. He says, "Do they help themselves because they put a fresh approach on an older event? Or, do you hurt the event because you've spent so many years and so much money branding the event as Fan Fair? Everybody and their brother knows the event and knows exactly what you are talking about when you say the name. These are the same questions we ask ourselves when we change a radio station." Hunnicutt believes it will not be a detriment in the long run. "As long as the event keeps its key elements of performances and the fans getting up close and personal with the artists, it shouldn't change much. Listeners will still go as long as

there's a reason to reward them to go."

Driver agrees, although he is hesitant about the inclusion of artists from other genres. He says, "Do I want to focus on sending people to see other artists so they end up searching the dial to find those artists?"

WFMS/Indianapolis PD **Bob Richards** says, "I never quite subscribed to that protectionist view of country music. But I would still want to see what other music they are going to include. I like the idea of growing it into a bigger event with country music being the centerpiece."

WKDF/Nashville PD **Dave Kelly** notes, "I thought moving Fan Fair downtown was a great move to make it more accessible to locals while also creating the opportunity to make it a much larger event. But it's a mistake to change the name. From a radio station's standpoint, we'll have to do a lot of explaining to people that 'it's this, but used to be this.' I don't understand why they needed to do it. I haven't seen anyone explain exactly why it needed to be done."

Toby Keith Sounds Off

The syndicated *Big D & Bubba Morning Show* had an interesting phoner yesterday with **Toby Keith**. The dynamic duo asked him about his long-standing public feud with **Dixie Chicks**' lead singer **Natalie Maines**. Keith told Big D & Bubba he believes that Maines' F.U.T.K. shirt on the ACM Awards show was directed at him, but, he said, "You know what? Big deal, huh? Whose album is sitting at No.1? In the end, you either win or you lose, and everything she does seems like instant karma. I didn't start this crap."

Keith says he has tried to settle the dispute, but says, "You can't hardly get 'em to speak to you." And, he claims that he's been congratulated by other artists for standing up to Maines. "Everybody in our business has their own Natalie story. You have not heard the last thing coming out of her blow-hole. Believe me. She is not even close to getting started. I'm just one of her pawns."

Keith also claims he left before being announced as Entertainer of the Year because he didn't have any faith that he would win. He says, "If it's industry voted, there are only only two to three thousand people at max that will vote on those, and everybody has their own agenda. Labels have their own reason for voting their artists in. I'm on a small label. Dreamworks is a small label. There are other labels in town who have a lot more political power."

a lawsuit against the station's current and former owners, Cumulus and Gaylord Entertainment, claiming he was wrongfully terminated and that the two companies conspired to breach his contract. O'Neal says he had a no-cut contract with Gaylord that didn't expire until the end of 2005.

According to CMT.com, O'Neal says in his complaint that the reason Gaylord gave for firing him was "failure to perform adequately his responsibilities." CMT.com goes on to say, "O'Neal charges the real reason he was discharged was that he became seriously ill in February 2003 and discovered he had diabetes. He contends that Cumulus, which was in the process of buying the station from Gaylord, 'regarded [him] as having a handicap what would substantially impair or limit [his] activity' and thus pressured Gaylord to fire him." O'Neal is asking for a jury trial, compensatory damages of \$500,000, punitive damages of \$500,000 and various other penalties and compensations. (Country Format Room, radioandrecords.com, 6/3.)




