R&R Country Panel Recap

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The showcase Country session at R&R Convention 2003 took place on the morning of June 20 and more than lived up to its slightly over-the-top title of "The Best Damn Country Panel Ever." While we'll let you make the final decision on that for yourself when the session is reviewed in full in an upcoming R&R Country column, I will say that the meeting was one of the more open and truthful "tell it like it really is" panels in which I have ever participated. My thanks to Country radio figures Jaye Albright, Bob Raleigh, Alan Sledge and Rusty Walker and Nashville label execs Joe Galante and John Grady for their honesty and candor.

The following report was filed on *radioandrecords.com* by **R&R**'s **Mark Brower** immediately after the session:

"Following a performance by new Curb/Asylum artist Blue County, Country programmers and recordlabel executives gathered for **R&R** Convention 2003's "The Best Damn Country Panel Ever. Period." The session kicked off with some dire figures on declining record sales and radio ratings in Country presented by RCA's Joe Galante, who showed that sales in the segment are the lowest they've been in 10 years and predicted a 12%-13% overall drop in sales in 2003. Among the topics discussed was the responsibilities of the radio and record industries, to which Cumulus' Bob Raleigh commented, "It's not our job to sell product, just as it's not records' job to get us ratings" — to which consultant Rusty Walker responded, "It may not affect us if there are no hits and no partner-

The Wolf, Dreamworks Lead R&R Country Awards

The sixth annual 2003 **R&R** Industry Achievement awards for Country were presented Friday night at a multiformat radio- and record-industry ceremony at **R&R** Convention in Beverly Hills, CA. More than 100 awards were present in just over 75 minutes, thanks to the help of America's favorite fast talker — John Moschitta Jr. We'll have a complete pictorial in the June 27 issue of **R&R**.

The awards go to:

• Station: **KPLX (The Wolf)/Dallas.** This was the third consecutive win in this category for The Wolf.

• PD: **Coyote Calhoun**, WAMZ/Louisville. Coyote captured his second win in this category. He was also **R&R**'s PD of the Year in 2000.

• MD: Cody Alan, KPLX. A four-peat for Cody.


• Personality: **Gerry House**, WSIX/Nashville. He's six-forsix. We have presented this award for six years now, and Gerry is the only Country personality to have ever won it.

• Platinum Label: **Arista/Nashville**. It's the second consecutive win in this category for the label.

• Gold Label: **Dreamworks/Nashville**. This is the first time in the five-year history of this category that a label other than Curb has taken the honor.

• Promotion Executive: **Scott Borchetta**, Dreamworks/Nashville. A three-peat for Scott.

• Regional Promoter: **Suzanne Durham**, Dreamworks/ Nashville. This makes back-to-back wins for Suzanne.

The panel also pondered the problem of radio ratings, on which Clear Channel's Alan Sledge noted that Country radio's audience was growing more in the 50+-year-old demographic while shrinking in 18-34, and consultant Jaye Albright postulated that hip-hop was drawing younger listeners away from Country."

Garrett is celebrating his 23rd year in Hawaiian Country radio. He previously programmed former Country outlets KHUL and KDEO-FM and joined KHCM when it was launched in August 2002.

Baker's Mutual Move To Omaha

After eight years with Clear Channel/Springfield, MO, Market Manager **Donna Baker** has transferred to Omaha as VP/Market Manager for the company's fivestation cluster. Clear Channel's Omaha quintet includes market-leading Country outlet KXKT. Baker replaces **Tracy Gilliam**, who is relocating to Los Angeles for family reasons. Also making the move in mid-August will be her husband, Mitch, who will become Asst. Ops Director for Clear Channel's Omaha and Lincoln, NE properties. By the way, Country KZKX is in the Lincoln cluster.

Our Country Movie Release

A star-studded invitation-only premiere is set for tomorrow night in Nashville for the debut of *Our Country*, a movie that celebrates the heritage of country music. Among the artists included in the project are Alabama, Asleep at the Wheel, Guy Clark, Charlie Daniels, Sara Evans, Radney Foster, Vince Gill, Eric Heatherly, Alan Jackson, Hal Ketchum, Alison Krauss, Patty Loveless, Lyle Lovett, Loretta Lynn, Kathy Mattea, Martina McBride, Jo Dee Messina, Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, Dolly Parton, Marty Stuart, Pam Tillis, Lee Ann Womack, Trisha Yearwood and Dwight Yoakam.

Explains PD **Tommy Carrera**, "This has been a hot topic (the ongoing media battle) between those two acts and we want to make sure we address it in a fun way without letting the negatives overrun our station. We're letting the listeners choose who they want to see."

R&R/Bullseye: "Is it OK to mention God in song?"

This week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question posed to 200 Country listeners read as follows: "On a scale of 1 to 5, with '1' meaning you strongly disagree and '5' meaning you strongly agree, how do you feel about this statement: 'I don't think my favorite Country radio station should refuse to play a song just because it mentions or is about God."

Surprisingly — at least to me — this wasn't the over-the-top, slam-dunk winner I expected. Of the total sample, 57% said they either Strongly Agree or Agree (47% and 10%, respectively.) The highest percentage of 5s and 4s came from the 45-54s, where 67% gave it a 5 (57%) or a 4 (10%). The lowest cell for 5s and 4s was 25-34s, where 48% were in agreement (38% 5s, 10% 4s). P2s were more accepting than P1s by a 66%-53% margin.

On the other side of the spectrum, 36% said they Strongly Disagree (1, 25%) or Disagree (2, 11%) with the statement. The highest degree of disagreement came from 25-34s, 31% of whom responded to the question with a 1 or 2. Conversely, 23% of 45-54s didn't agree with the question as posed.

✓ Johnny Cash performed for a crowd at the Carter Fold in Hiltons, VA over the weekend — a surprise appearance. It was the first time Cash has been on stage since the death of his wife, June Carter Cash, in May. According to the Kingsport, TN *Times-News*, Cash told the audience, "I don't know hardly what to say tonight about being up here without her. The pain is so severe; there is no way of describing it. It's the biggest ... losing your mate. I guarantee it is the big one. It really hurts." Cash told the crowd that he found solace in knowing he was celebrating his late wife's birthday in her "old homeplace." He performed some of his best-known hits, including "Folsom Prison Blues," "Ring Of Fire" and "I Walk The Line."

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Tim McGraw heads to Gulfport, MS this weekend to perform a benefit concert for Green Bay Packers quarterback Brett Favre's charity. The Brett Favre Forward Foundation helps disabled and disadvantaged kids in Mississippi and Wisconsin. McGraw and Favre have traded favors in the past — Favre participated in McGraw's annual Swampstock charity event and in a radio special promoting McGraw's *Set This Circus Down* album in 2001.

Faulkner, Poe, Hemingway and ... Clark? **Terri Clark** may not be ready to join the ranks of those literary heavyweights just yet, but she is writing her first book for publication in the U.S. and Canada. The work, *Phases & Stages*, will be available in Canada on August 15 and the U.S. September 1. Published by Insomniac Press, the book will consist of Clark's journal entries over the last three years.


