Ashcraft Succeeds Kent In Tyler, TX

Cumulus/Jonesboro, AR OM Dave Ashcraft has been named OM for Clear Channel's four-station Tyler. TX cluster and PD of the company's Country station in the market, KNUE. He started yesterday and succeeds Larry Kent, who has been in Tyler with CC since June 1999 and is now retiring. In addition to his duties as OM of Cumulus' five-station Jonesboro cluster, Ashcraft was PD of market-leading Country KFIN.

Ashcraft spent the last three years, and nine of the last 11 years, at KFIN. In between, he spent two years with Power Gold in Little Rock. (Country Format Room, www.radioandrecords.com, 7/11.)

Will The FCC's New Rules Force Clear Channel To Shrink In San Diego?

From Monday afternoon's News Update at www.radioandrecords.com: Clear Channel owns

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eight stations in San Diego, but controls 12 thanks to programming, sales and marketing agreements with two Tijuana-based broadcast companies — John Detmold's XTRA Comunicaciones and Bi-National Media. Now that Joint Sales Agreements will be counted against a company by the FCC when determining market ownership and reach, Clear Channel could be forced to either sell some of its San Diego stations or end some of its agreements with the Mexican broadcasters in order to comply with the commission's new regulations. The Mexican stations didn't count against the company's overall station count in San Diego under the FCC's old rules, since they did not include stations operated via a JSA or LMA. But the new rules will force a company to comply within two years. The Los Angeles Times on Saturday reported on the possible need to divest in San Diego, and Clear Channel VP/Government Relations **Andy Levin** reacted to the piece by telling **R&R** his company will comply with the new rules. However, he notes that since a final decision isn't due for two years, "it's very premature to say precisely what will be done." Included in Clear Channel's San Diego cluster is Country XHCR (Bob 99.3), owned by Tijuana-based XTRA.

Congrats on an **R&R** Country Chart first for **Tom** Baldrica, Rick Moxley and the promo crew at BNA, as **Lonestar** once again tops the Country chart with "My Front Porch Looking In." The song's reascension to the top of the charts marks the first time that a song that had gone to No. 1 and then fell out of the top spot for more than one week has made a return trip to the top. You may recall that on the **R&R** Country chart for June 10, "Front Porch" displaced Toby Keith & Willie Nelson's "Beer For My Horses" at No. 1. In the next week, Toby and Willie reclaimed the prime position and held it for another four weeks. During that span Lonestar was relegated to runner-up status. Now after four weeks at No.2, "Front Porch" is on top again. By the way, "Front Porch" has now spent 12 weeks in **R&R**'s Top 10 and eight weeks in the Top

5. During its Top 5 run, it has been No. 1 for two weeks and No. 2 for five weeks.



R&R/Bullseye: *Is Today's Country 'Boring' Or "Exciting'?*

Once again this week the **R&R Country** Callout America by Bullseye question was posed to another 200 Country listeners, yielding a total sample of 400 Country P1s, ages 25-54, 50% Male/ Female. This time we asked, "On a scale of 1 to 5, with '1' meaning you find today's country music very boring and '5' meaning you find it very exciting, how would you rate the current music you hear on your favorite Country station?"

Of the total 400-person sample, 69% said they found today's country music "Very exciting" (a 5 -29%) or "Kind of exciting" (a 4 -40%). The most 4s and 5s came from Females, 76% of whom gave it the top two scores -33% 5s and 44% 4s. Close behind were the P1s at 76% (40% 5s and 36% 4s) and 25-34s at 76% (31% 5s and 45% 4s).

The fewest top scores came from the P2s (56%), where 15% gave it a 5 and 41% gave it a 4.

On the other end of the scale, only 6% of the entire sample said "It's not very exciting" (2 - 5%) or "It's really boring (1 - 1%). The range of 1s and

2s were from 4% among 35-44s to 6% among P1s, Males and 45-54s.

The project will feature 15 of Waylon's greatest hits performed by an eclectic group of country, rock and pop artists and has been authorized by Waylon's wife, **Jessi Colter.** Colter contributes a new version of "Storms Never Last," a song she wrote and recorded with the legendary singersongwriter. **Travis Tritt**'s version of "Lonesome, On'ry and Mean" is the album's debut single.

Charlie Daniels has a new CD and book on the way. The album is titled *Freedom and Justice for All*, on Blue Hat/Audium/Koch Records, and will be in stores on July 22. Columbia/Nashville's **Buddy Jewel** topped the country sales charts last week, with sales of 51,765 units. That number also places him 13th overall. The label goes on to say that among debut albums by new country artists released since the 1991 inception of SoundScan, only Blue and Billy Ray Cyrus' *Some Gave All* sold more units in their first week than Buddy Jewell.



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



