Baumgartner Joins Equity As VP/National Promotion

Broken Bow VP/Promotion **Rick Baumgartner** is joining newly-formed Equity Records (**R&R** 8/8/03) to head its promotion department. Label President **Mike Kraski** said, "It was very important to us to make a big statement with our first staff announcement, and I believe we have done that. Rick has the greatest breadth of experience of any promotion person around — he has worked with both major and indie labels. He has retooled a promotion team and built one from the ground up. But more importantly, Rick has always delivered."

Baumgartner joined BBR almost 18 months ago from his promotion post at Audium. He has also previously served as VP/Promotion for Atlantic/Nashville and Decca, and he spent nine years with Warner Bros./ Nashville, where he was Dir./National Promotion when he left to join Decca. He also headed the Nashville division of **R&R**'s Music Meeting.

Massie To Program New SF Country outlet.

San Francisco got a treat at noon PT Aug. 11 when Bonneville flipped Classic Hits KKDV(The Drive)/San Francisco to Country, a format missing from the Bay Area airwaves for more than 19 months. Already in the building to program the new station is **Ray Massie**, who resigned as KFRG/Riverside OM just last Friday. The new station is currently identified as "My Country Station 95-7." Massie expects to announce an air staff soon and a new station name by the end of the month. Massie was the OM at WIL/St. Louis when he joined KFRG as PD in November 1996. The new station's website is *KKDV.com*, and it offers this note to visitors: "We're building a brand new radio station for you! *My Country Station Ninety Five Seven* started out as just an idea. An idea that puts listeners in charge of what goes on the air. Seems simple. You tell us what you want to hear. *My Country Station Ninety Five Seven* will play it.

"This is truly your Country music station. It's been a long time since there's been a station playing country music for all the Bay Area. Now that you have one, you can proudly say, 'It *is* My Country Station.' If you've ever said or thought, 'Wouldn't it be great if we had a Country station that?' — now you do. Please check in with us often and tell us how we're doing. What do you want to hear on your country station? Send a note to the Program Director."

Alan Jackson's "Gone Country" launched the new Country outlet, which, for now, features music, liners, sweepers and spots. Among the liners on the air:

"We're not a country station for everybody. We're only a station for people who know who Garth, Alan and Tim are. You can call us MY Country Station 95-7"

"Finally, a country station you can hear all over The Bays. West, north, east and south. My Country Station, 95-7!"

"You are enjoying what's on the air. That's why it's My Country Station, 95-7!"

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"Just the best songs — and more of 'em. It's what you asked for, and, after all, we're the station that you call 'My Country station, 95-7'."

"Every time we start the music you chose, we'll play almost 30 minutes of great country songs without stopping. It's what you said — it's what you get. My Country station 95-7."

"From Santa Clara to Concord and everywhere in between, it's your music on your radio. The station you're helping to build. My country station, 95-7."

"From Walnut Creek to Cupertino and everywhere in between, it's your music on your radio. My Country station 95-7."

"There's a new Country station in town — the one you're helping to build. My country station 95-7, KKDV San Francisco, Oakland, San Jose."

The station's address is 400 Second Street, Suite 300, San Francisco, CA 94107. The phone is 415-957-0957.

Street Talk: Interestingly, KKDV is 95.7 on the dial, while KRTY/San Jose is at 95.3. KALF/Chico is also at 95.7. Locals report KKDV covers the entire city — with perhaps a gap or two in the east — with a much better signal than KYCY, the last SF Country outlet.

Hallam Returns To KC As WDAF-FM OM

Former WKHX & WYAY/Atlanta OM **Dene Hallam** has been named OM for Entercom's new WDAF-FM/ Kansas City, which debuted Aug. 10 at noon. The new FM outlet replaces the legendary WDAF-AM. The AM programming has been simulcast on FM for the last month. The new FM programming will now be simulcast on AM 610 until a new Sports format debuts on that signal, a move that will be in the nottoo-distant future.

Entercom's release says, "Hallam will have the responsibility of launching 61 Country on 106.5 and executing the transition of this Kansas City and country tradition to FM. He joins current WDAF PD Ted Cramer in a three-way competition for KC's Country music audience."

WDAF-FM was launched with a music package led by the very first song played on WDAF-AM almost 27 years ago — **Waylon Jennings**' "Are You Ready for the Country?" That was followed by **Alan Jackson**'s "Gone Country," **Neal McCoy**'s "The City Put the Country in Me," (an inside reference to the fact that WDAF-FM is replacing Smooth Jazz "The City"), **Barbara Mandrell's** "I Was Country When Country Wasn't Cool" and **Toby Keith**'s "How Do You Like Me Now?"

The launch also featured the station's regular lineup, with morning personality **David Lawrence** doing noon-3pm, PD **Ted Cramer** handling 3-6pm and PM driver **David Bryant** working 6-9pm.

Describing the changes made to create WDAF-FM's format, Hallam said, "We cut out the songs WDAF-AM was playing from the '40s, '50s and '60s and have redone the production to make it more contemporary. We really focused on trying to keep the essence and soul of 61 Country WDAF, while at the same time being contemporary enough for today's Country listeners.


This is a return to KC for Hallam, who in the mid-'80s was PD of KUDL and later was VP/Programming for Gannett's KCMO-AM/FM. It also reunites him with Entercom/KC Market Manager **Bob Zuroweste**, who was KUDL's GM when Hallam was PD there.

In what is perhaps a harbinger of things to come, Hallam said of his new job, "Our charge is to leave the Country competition in Kansas City in obfuscatory ruins!"

CRS SW Huge Success

Almost 200 Country radio and record folks spent last weekend at the Omni Hotel in Dallas for CRS SW. Highlights included the opening programming panel featuring CMT Sr. VP/GM **Brian Philips**, WUSN/ Chicago OM **Tom Rivers**,

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Clear Channel/Minneapolis OM **Gregg Swedberg** and Emmis Regional VP/Programming **Jimmy Steal**.

Among the one-liners, Steal told the crowd, "The music today is pretty much a science. That last 10-15% of programming is an art. Stations need to be very unpredictable in a predictable way, while really beating the drum on that 15%. It's more of a risk to not do anything than to try something different. You run the risk of becoming extinct."

Philips' comment included: "Programmers need to get as much feedback from as many people as they can so they have an idea of the [cultural] changes going on around them, so they don't miss them." He also reminded PDs to ask themselves if what they're putting on the air is "on- or off-brand." He added programming is "1,000 gut-checks a day."

Talking about morning shows, Rivers reminded attendees of the difference between bit humor and having a sense of humor. He said that today's adult radio audiences prefer their air personalities especially in the morning — to have a sense of humor rather than lots of prepared bits. He said, "Even if six out of 10 bits are funny, that's only 60%. It's better to have the entire show have a sense of fun around it."

Swedberg told those assembled he's very excited about the music coming from Nashville, saying the new music is great. He noted, "The best part of what we have, more than the other formats, is a wonderful pool of people to choose from."

While highlights from other panels will be discussed in an upcoming **R&R** Country column, I would be remiss if I didn't rave a bit about Hank Williams Jr.'s performance following lunch. He quickly served notice that his allotted 30 minutes were barely enough for him to get warmed up. But no one complained as he neared an hour of music that encompassed country, Southern rock, blues and music set for his upcoming CD. He regaled the huge crowd — which included every new Country artist on hand to play at CRS SW — with stories about his daddy, his music and his life. He got a standing ovation when he walked on the stage, and another when he left. Perhaps even more telling was the fact the stage was crowded by those wanting pictures and autographs for almost an hour after he finished. Hank proved once again why he remains one of this format's top entertainers. And he had PDs asking themselves why the format had turned its back on his music in the past. His sound is sorely missed on today's Country radio. From the crowd's reaction to the his new songs, it looks as if that won't be a problem for much longer.

CRB Schedules "Fall Forum"



R&R/Bullseye:

This week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question posed to 400 Country listeners: "Think about your radio listening over the last few weeks. Have you tried a new station in the city you live in and listened again at another date based on that experience? Did you listen for more than an hour? Why did you listen to that station the first time? Was it: "Saw a television commercial", "A friend recommended it", "Just tuning around", "Saw a billboard" or "Got an invitation in the mail."

In answer to the first part of the question, 73% of the total sample said they had tried a new station in the past few weeks. Perhaps most disturbing, 74% of the Country P1s said they had tried a new station for the first time, while 72% of the P2s said that. Females (77%) were more likely to listen to a new station than males (69%). And 79% of 35-44s, 72% of 25-34s and 68% of 45-54s said they had tried a new station.

As for how they found the new station, 73% of the total sample said, "Just tuning around." Coming in a distant second at 14% was "A friend recommended it." Next were "Saw a billboard" (8%), "Saw a TV commercial" (4%) and "Got an invitation" (1%).



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
