Gerry House Stable Following Two Brain Surgeries

The Country community was stunned to hear the news Monday morning that WSIX/Nashville's highly honored and much-loved morning personality **Gerry House** had undergone two brain surgeries over the weekend. The first, on Friday night, was to repair bleeding from an artery in his brain; the second came Sunday afternoon after he developed a problem with swelling and fluid on the brain.

As of press time Monday night, House was resting comfortably in the intensive care unit of a Nashville hospital. Late word was that he might be moved to a regular hospital room sometime today.

In a statement released at a press conference Monday afternoon, Dr. Robert Singer stated, "Mr. House suffered a subdural arterial brain hemorrhage on Friday evening. He was taken to the operating room for a craniotomy to evacuate the blood clot. On Sunday he required a second operation to control extensive brain swelling. He is now in stable but guarded condition in the intensive care unit. He is conversant and strong, with high spirits. It is anticipated that he will need one final operation prior to his hospital discharge. We expect him to make a full recovery."

WSIX has set up a special phone line that will carry updates on House's condition. The number is 615-744-4747. Updates will also be posted on *WSIX.com*.

Important Chart Note Following Power Outage

The blackout that affected millions of Americans in the Northeast has also had implications on airplay at dozens of stations in those markets. In addition, the power outage may have affected the equipment Mediabase 24/7 uses to monitor those marketplaces. Data was missing from the following stations: WBEE/Rochester, NY; WGAR/Cleveland; WGNA/Albany, NY; WITL/Lansing, MI; and WYCD/Detroit.

It is **R&R** and Mediabase 24/7's policy not to use airplay data for any day on which there was less than 21 hours of airplay in a 24-hour period. If a station is missing a days' worth of airplay, **R&R** and Mediabase 24/7 will use the most recent seven-day period.

In all cases, the most recent seven days will be used to compute R&R's charts so that we can provide the most accurate trend data. For example, if data is unavailable for Thursday, August 14, that information would be replaced by data from Saturday, August 9. If information for Friday, August 15 was missing, the information would replaced with information from Friday August 8.

R&R/Bullseye: When and Where Do They Listen Most?

This week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question posed to 200 Country listeners is a two-parter: "What time of day do you listen to radio most?" and "Where do you listen to the radio most?"

No surprises here, as 49% of the total sample say "mornings, 6-10am" is when they listen to radio most, and 60% of the total sample name "in the car" as the place they listen to radio most. After mornings came middays (27%), PM drive (15%), evenings (8%) and overnights 1%.

The numbers are fairly consistent across all demos and cells. On the high end of daypart listening, 58% of females and 57% of 45-54s polled gave mornings as their answer. On the low end, 38% of 35-44s and 41% of males said morning drive.


Back to where they listen most, 23% said "at home" and 17% said "at work."

Here, too, the numbers were stable across the board. The highest "in the car" responses came from 25-34s at 73%, with Country P1s next, at 62%. On the low end, 48% of 45-54s and 52% of P2s gave that answer.

The North American stretch of **Dixie Chicks**' Top of the World Tour wrapped last week in Calgary. Final numbers for country music's top tour of the year include 63 dates, 57 sellouts, a total gross of \$61 million and attendance exceeding one million. Average attendance was 15,753 and average gross hit \$976,000 for a show that featured an 80,000 pound stage, 120 musicians and staff and 1.5 million LED lights and used 2,000 amps of power and 240 pounds of CO2 every night. The tour resumes overseas in September.

The first tour dates for **Shania Twain**'s first worldwide concert outing in more than three years have been announced. An initial run of 18 *UP! Tour* dates begins in Hamilton, Ontario on Sept. 25 and continues through mid-December. Visit *www.shania-twain.com* for the full list.

Next Tuesday's CMA Award nominations press conference is becoming a bigger event, with performance and interview segments being added to the live, nationally televised coverage by CBS' *The Early Show*. Anchor **Hannah Storm** will interview **Martina McBride**, while **Rascal Flatts** and **Darryl Worley** are scheduled to perform. The announcements will air live at approximately 7:30am CT.

Vince Gill received the PGA's highest honor, the Distinguished Service Award, in a ceremony held last week in Rochester, NY. "It's kind of hard to even fathom it, in all honesty," Gill said at a news conference following the event. "The truth is that my love for golf is as passionate as

my love for music, but music is where I make a living. So any time something comes from music, I understand that, but this comes because I love the game of golf."

The Grand Ole Opry will pay tribute to one of its most beloved members, **Roy Acuff**, on Sept. 13. Vince Gill and members of the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band are among those scheduled to appear, along with U.S. Postal Service CEO John E. Potter, who will dedicate a new commemorative Roy Acuff first-class stamp.

Sherrie Austin and Broken Bow Records announced yesterday that 25 cents from the royalties generated by each sale of her BBR/C4 Records album *Streets of Heaven* will be donated to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis. The album's title track, a mother's plea to God on behalf of her sick child, is generating a tremendous outpouring of emotion from those who've been touched by its message.

Steve Wariner performed an acoustic concert on Saturday at the summer meeting of the National Governors Association. Earlier in the week, Wariner and his wife, Caryn, helped load 5,000 copies of his *Steal Another Day* album onto a military vehicle for shipment to troops in Iraq.

At the request of the White House, **Toby Keith** interrupted his current sold-out U.S. tour last Thursday to perform for 25,000 Marines, as well as President Bush, at Miramar Marine Air Corps Station near San Diego. The show marked the second command performance by Keith for the White House this year.
