Reba McEntire's *Inside Fame* is set for an Oct. 10 premiere. **Martina McBride** and **Tanya Tucker** are the subjects of two new episodes of CMT's original series *Controversy*, premiering Oct. 10 and Oct. 24, respectively. *CMT Re-Discovered*, a new series premiering Oct. 4, helps fans reconnect with former favorites like **Billy Ray Cyrus**, **Randy Travis**, **Kathy Mattea**, **David Allan Coe** and **Glen Campbell**.

The Clark Family Experience, now known simply as Clark, have finally ended their court battle with Curb Records. The label has dropped its opposition to the band's motion for summary judgment on whether Curb had any post-bankruptcy injunctive rights to prevent them from recording for another label. One of the band's attorneys, J.D. Larson, stated, "The Clarks' insolvency, which landed them in bankruptcy, was caused by financial mismanagement and by terrible recording and publishing contracts. Now, with the litigation finally behind the band, they can make a fresh start, both financially and musically."

Last week a helicopter filming scenes outside Austin for an upcoming **Kenny Chesney** video crashed, leading to minor injuries for two video crewmembers and a pilot. Though the chopper was gutted by fire after it hit some power lines, all aboard escaped. On board was Chesney friend and videographer Sean Silva. "I called Sean a couple hours before to see if they got the shot, and he didn't call me right back," said Chesney. "I figured maybe it was just taking a little longer for whatever reason. When Sean finally did call, he sounded kinda funny. Then he explained what happened. Thankfully no one died or was seriously injured."

CRB Accepting Country Radio And DJ HOF Apps

As reported Aug. 14 in the Country Format Room at *www.radioandrecords.com*, the Country Radio Broadcasters have made several changes to the 2004 Country Radio Seminar. One is the date of the Country

Music DJ Hall of Fame and the Country Radio Hall of Fame induction ceremony, which is moving from the traditional June date to Tuesday, March 2 — the day before CRS-35 officially begins. Still a standalone event, the Hall of Fame ceremony's tickets will be offered to CRS attendees at a reduced rate.

The change of date for the event has substantially altered the time period during which the CRB will accept nominations for the industry's highest honor. Applications for Year 2004 inductees are being accepted through **September 30, 2003**. Inductee nomination applications (eligible persons living or deceased) will be accepted from any member of the Country radio and/or country music industries, including the individuals themselves.

More information, application forms and criteria for HOF applicants can be obtained by calling the CRB offices at 615-327-4487. Applications may also be downloaded from the CRB website *www.crb.org*.

R&R/Bullseye: When And Where Do They Listen Most?

Once again, **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye posed this two-part question to Country listeners: "What time of day do you listen to radio most?" and "Where do you listen to the radio most?"

The two-week sample now yields a 400-person database, 43% of whom say mornings, 6-10am is the time of day they listen to radio most. After mornings came middays (31%), PM drive (15%), evenings (9%) and overnights (2%).

The numbers are fairly consistent across all demos and cells for daypart listening. On the high end, 49% of females and 48% of 45-54s polled gave mornings as their answer. On the low end, 37% of 35-44s and 38% of males said morning drive.

Of the total sample, 58% named "in the car" as the place they listen to radio most. Next came at home

(24%) and at work (18%). Here, too, the numbers were stable across the board. The highest "in the car" responses came from 25-34s, at 63%, with Country P1s and females next at 59%. On the low end, 52% of 45-54s and 54% of P2s gave that answer.






