Johnny Cash Laid To Rest

Friends and family eulogized, Emmylou Harris and Sheryl Crow sang "The Old Rugged Cross," and seemingly all of music mourned yesterday as Johnny Cash was laid to rest after an emotional funeral service in Hendersonville, TN. Cash, who battled health problems for years and recently endured a two-week hospitalization for a stomach ailment, died Friday from complications of diabetes. He was 71.

An immensely important and compelling figure in popular music, Cash created a legacy that will long endure. One of only four performers enshrined in both the Rock and Roll and Country Halls of Fame — the others being Elvis Presley, The Everly Bros and Brenda Lee — Cash was a larger-than-life entertainer who told the often heartbreaking stories of the common man. His death prompted a worldwide outpouring of emotion.

The Fisk Jubilee singers opened the funeral service with "Good News" and closed with "In Bright Mansions Above." Kris Kristofferson sang "For a Moment of Forever." Speakers included Kristofferson, Dr. Franklin Graham, manager Lou Robin, Jack Clement and Al Gore.

Born February 26, 1932, in Kingsland, AK, J.R. Cash grew up hearing the hard-edged stories of Depressionera farmers. He enlisted in the Air Force in 1950, but never gave up his musical dreams. Moving to Memphis in the mid-Fifties, Cash began recording for Sun Records and, along with labelmates Presley, Jerry Lee Lewis and Carl Perkins, is credited with helping to forge what is now known as rock 'n' roll.

But it is country music where the genre-defying Cash seemed to fit best, having his first major hit with "Cry, Cry, Cry" in 1955. His fame grew with hits like "Folsom Prison Blues," "I Walk the Line" and "Don't Take Your Guns to Town." As his star rose, however, so did Cash's struggles with drugs.

He credited the late June Carter, whom he married in 1968 and who died in May, with rescuing him from drug addiction and turning him back toward the Christian faith that reverberated through his life and music. "Yes, John R. Cash had his demons," said Oak Ridge Boy Joe Bonsall, "but he had two saviors. He was married to one of them and the other now holds them both in His everlasting arms."

Nominated for four CMA Awards this year, Cash was as musically vital as ever and preparing to record a new album. "He gave so much more than he got," said country music journalist Hazel Smith after Cash's funeral. "The sun will never set on his music."

By the way, the Nashville Tennessean ran a front-page piece on Gerry in The Sept. 15 edition. It chronicles his surgery and sense of humor throughout his ordeal. DreamWorks/Nashville Co-National-Northeast Dir./ Promotion **Jimmy Harnen** is leaving the label to join Stuart Dill's Refugee Management. His last day at the label is Sept. 17. Filling Harnen's Northeast role will be DreamWorks Southwest rep **Suzanne Durham**. He left in October 1996 to be part of the new DreamWorks/Nashville promotion team, where he started as the Northeast rep from Baltimore. He moved to Nashville in October 1999 and added Co-National promotion duties in October 2000.

Durham started her music industry career in 1990 at Uni Distribution in Boston. She moved to the company's Dallas branch in 1995 and in late 1997 joined DreamWorks as its first — and so far, only — Southwest regional. R&R/Bullseye: Listeners Pick "Song of the Year"

This week's R&R Country Callout America by Bullseye question posed to 200 Country listeners: "If it were up to you, which one of the following songs would you select for Song of the Year for the 2003 CMA Awards?"

Well, if the listeners' response is any indication, this is a real tossup. Of the total sample, Brooks & Dunn's "Red Dirt Road" and Randy Travis' "Three Wooden Crosses" lead the way with 26%. Close behind at 21% are Toby Keith's "Beer for My Horses " and Darryl Worley's "Have You Forgotten." The fifth nominee, Brad Paisley's "Celebrity," garnered 6%.

P1s gave B&D the nod (27%) while P2s chose Worley (34%). Males gave their top vote to B&D (35%) while females put Travis first (27%). The 25-34s made B&D their choice, 35-44s preferred Worley and 45-54s tapped Travis.

Faith Hill's camp is asserting that rumors the singer has put her organization's Nashville conference on Oct. 7.


