

The alleged bagman for the operation, D'Antonio has been sentenced to life in prison.

#### Rosalie Allen Passes

Rosalie Allen, the first woman inducted into the Country Music DJ Hall of Fame, died Sept. 24 at her home in California. A singer, performer, recording artist and radio talent, Allen was known as "Queen of the Yodelers." She was a pioneering voice for female artists and disc jockeys and had tremendous impact as the host of her own show on New York's WOV. She parlayed her radio success into a television program and New York's first country record shop. Allen also wrote for several country publications and recorded for RCA.

#### R&R/Bullseye: Listeners Pick Horizon Award Winner

This week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question posed to 200 Country listeners: "If you could vote in the Country Music Awards, which of the following nominees would you choose to win the CMA Horizon Award?"

Among the total sample, **Blake Shelton** led with 31%, **Gary Allan** was second at 22%, **Darryl Worley** was third at 20%, **Joe Nichols** was fourth at 18%, and **Buddy Jewel** was fifth with 9%,

Shelton, in fact, led in seven of eight age/sex demo categories. He was tops among P1s, P2s, males, females, 25-34s and 35-44s. His 23% was

second among 45-54s, where Darryl Worley was first 1 with 25%.

The total sample rankings for each artist were fairly consistent across all the cells. For instance, Gary Allan, second in the total sample, placed second in six categories. Third place total-sample finisher Worley was third in five of the eight categories. Nichols, fourth in the total sample, was fourth in five categories and third in three others.

Most surprising in this poll was the showing of Nashville Star winner Buddy Jewel, who placed fifth in every category.
