Summer Arbitron: WUSN, WYCD, KSON Crack Top 10

The first of the Summer 2003 Arbitrons being released show Country outlets in the nation's top markets faring rather well. Joining WKLB/Boston, WXTU/Philadelphia and WQMX/Akron in their respective market's top 10 were WUSN (US99.5)/ Chicago, WYCD/Detroit and KSON/San Diego. The most impressive jump came in the Windy City, where US99.5 shot from 12th to fourth, 12+.

We'll have more ratings notes later. But, if you

WUSN taking the fall '02 and the new summer book.

WUSN no doubt got a smack square on the lips from Shania Twain, whose mid-July concert in Grant Park attracted more than 60,000 people for the NBC-TV special. Each of those folks had to have a ticket to get in. Guess who gave away a whole lot of tickets on the air?

US99.5 also posted stellar 25-54 numbers, riding from the spring '03 3.3 to 5.5. (Last summer's 25-54 shares were 4.4.) OM **Tom Rivers** notes that the first two phases of last spring were adversely affected by the Iraq war and changes taking place within WUSN's morning show. The April 25-54 number was 2.9 while May was 3.0. June rebounded to a 3.8. He added that the last four consecutive books have all been solid, resulting in the summer rise to third place in the Windy City, 25-54.

Meanwhile in Los Angles, KZLA OM **R.J. Curtis** says the story there is all females. KZLA was up 2.8-3.0 women 25-54, which places KZLA squarely in the Top 10. Women 35-49 leaped 2.6-3.7 to fourth and women 35-54 bounded 3.0-3.9, good for fifth place. Curtis says these are some of the biggest female numbers ever for KZLA.

By the way, in perhaps the most awesome demonstration of "ratings compression" in any market, consider this: The No. 1 12+ station in L.A., KZLA's CHR/Rhythmic sister KPWR, boasts a 4.8 share. Coming in with a 2.0 is Urban AC KJLH. There are *24 stations* between a 4.8 and a 2.0. This game used to be measured in shares; now it's measured in tenths.

CRB Relocates DJ Hall Of Fame

The Country Radio Broadcasters has announced a date for relocating the Country Music Disc Jockey Hall of Fame plaques to a new location in the walkway between the Nashville Convention Center and the Renaissance Hotel. Formerly located in the Opryland Hotel, the new Wall of Fame will be dedicated on Nov. 4 at 10 a.m. CT. Nashville Mayor Bill Purcell, CRB board members and living members of the CMDJ Hall will participate.

Street Talk

In last week's (10/7) **R&R** Country Hot Fax, we told you that WSSL/Greenville, SC PM driver **Paul Koffy** was leaving for a new gig in Salt Lake City, where

he is going to work for SLC-based Simmons Media. As hard as it may be to believe, there are more and more indications that Simmons may indeed launch the market's *fourth* FM Country outlet as a Classic Country station. Fueling the speculation is the rumor that SLC radio vet **Jim Mickelson** will be joining the new station. He had been on the air at an SLC Country station for more than 20 years when he exited KWLW-AM & KKAT in November 2001. He was PD/morning host at Classic Country KWLW and MD/middayer at KKAT when he left.

WFMS/Indianapolis PD **Bob Richards** dropped a note to shamelessly promote his evening show's move to syndication. Speaking of "Country Lovin' With Darren Tandy," he says, "After spending the past seven years as the No. 1 or No. 2 evening show in Indy, we felt the timing was right to share Darren's talent across the country. Stations interested in one of the most compelling evening shows in radio only need to call Rich O'Brien at Superadio (508-480-9000, ext. 11) for more information. (I hope that wasn't too blatant!)" Not at all, Bob. That's why we're here.

KZLA/Los Angeles held another "Country Bash" over the weekend. OM **RJ Curtis** reports, "The Bash was awesome. The day ran very smooth and Kid Rock was incredible. LeAnne Rimes sang *Picture* with him, with Kenny Wayne Sheppard on guitar. Then Trick Pony came out and backed him up on Cowboy. After Kid's set, John Schnieder (Smallville) showed up with the original General Lee from the Dukes of Hazzard, and he and Kid were hanging out starting the engine and honking the horn backstage while Keith and Ira from Trick Pony were sitting on the hood posing for pictures with everybody who walked by. It was surreal. LeAnne Rimes, Jo Dee Messina and Lonestar put on great sets. Dierks Bentley basically had his coming-out party for Southern California at this event, and he was very well received. There were 17,000 people

Hyland, whose background includes stints at Atlantic, Capricorn, Elektra/Asylum and publicity firms Network Ink and Full Court Press, will be responsible for exploiting Caption's various catalogs.

Compendia Music Group has announced an exclusive distribution deal with Koch Distribution, which effectively eliminates Compendia's in-house distribution arm, located in Alpharetta, GA. Artists Get Lifetime CMA Membership


The CMA has announced that current and future Grand Ole Opry members, as well as current and future CMA nominees in artist categories, will be granted complimentary lifetime memberships to the organization. Part of the CMA's ongoing efforts to build stronger relationships with country artists, the idea was a recommendation of the CMA's Artist Relations Committee, chaired by **Kix Brooks**.

Opry member and 12-time CMA Awards host **Vince Gill** and CMA Executive Director **Ed Benson** joined Brooks on the occasion of the Grand Ole Opry's 78th Birthday Celebration over the weekend to deliver this special gift to Opry members past and present. Brooks made the announcement during *Grand Ole Opry Live* on GAC: Great American Country, saying, "[These artists] are asked on so many different levels to do things that benefit the business. And it is just one way of giving a little bit back and letting them know how much we appreciate all the work and good feelings they put out there."

"The Opry is an integral part of the Country music community," said Opry member Jimmy Dickens after he heard about the announcement. "It is great to know that the members will continue to be recognized as such with lifetime CMA memberships."

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The Opry currently has 81 individual members, and there are 328 Country artists who have been final nominees for CMA Entertainer of the Year, Female Vocalist, Male Vocalist, Vocal Group, Vocal Duo of the Year and the CMA Horizon Award since the inception of the Awards in 1967.

Industry Loses Sanders, Adams, Collins

Country radio pioneer Mack Sanders died of a heart attack on Saturday, October 11. He was 80. From his first job, in 1942, at a Birmingham, AL radio station to KBHS/Hot Springs AR, which he owned and where he still did mornings, Sanders never worked a day on the air in any format other than Country. Sanders began purchasing and operating radio stations in 1958. Among those he's owned: KFRM-AM & FM and KSIR/Wichita; KOOO-AM & FM/Omaha; KBIL/Kansas City; KGOW & KTOW/Tulsa; WJKZ &WJRB/Nashville; and WVOK/Birmingham. In the '50s he hosted a TV show called *Proud Country* that was syndicated in 18 other markets. He also fronted numerous country bands and owned The Plainsmen quartet.

We'll let his 60-year signature line be his last here, as well: "It takes 66 muscles to frown and only 16 to smile. Until tomorrow, keep smilin'. We'll see you then.'"

Our sincerest condolences go to Nashville radio and record veteran Janet Bozeman, who currently operates Bozeman Media in Music City, and to John Bozeman, who works at WLAC/Nashville.

There will be no formal service. The family is asking that, in lieu of flowers, donations be made in his memory to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Attn: Memorial Department, 501 St. Jude Place, Memphis, TN, 38105.

We were also deeply saddened last week to report the death of record promotion veteran **Gaylen** **Adams,** who was found in his Marietta, GA home Monday, October 6. He died at age 59of an apparently self-inflicted gunshot wound. Adams is survived by his son, Jerry Douthit, and three grandchildren.

Close friend Rhubarb Jones, morning personality at WYAY/Atlanta, said of Adams, "He had such passion for the music and artists he worked with. He was always so happy and full of life, and he made sure people around him had a great time. He was always doin' for folks."

Adams's promotion career included 16 years at RCA/Nashville (1973-89) and four with Capitol-Liberty/Nashville. He had dabbled in independent promotion since leaving Capitol mid-1993. The funeral was held Sunday, Oct. 12.

Radio personality **Bill Collins** died at his home in Walnut Creek, CA on Oct. 6. He was 67. Collins spent 26 years at KNEW/San Francisco, a top Country station from 1974-1997. R&R/Bullseye: Listeners Pick Top CMA Female Vocalist

This week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question posed to 200 Country listeners: "If you could vote in the Country Music Awards, which of the following female singers would you select for Female Vocalist of the Year for the 2003 CMA Awards?"

The total sample voted **Martina McBride** on top with 55%, **Dolly Parton** second at 14%, **Alison Krauss** third with 13%, **Patty Loveless** next at 11% and **Terri Clark** at 7%.

McBride placed first in all eight of our age/sex categories, outdistancing the No. 2 vote-getter by almost four-to-one in just about every instance. He

highest tally was among females with 59%; her lowest showing was among 45-54s at 49%. It's interesting to note that both 25-34s and 35-44s put her on top with 57%.

Parton was second in five of eight cells. She was strongest among 45-54s at 23% and weakest among females at 10% and 25-34s at 9%.

Krauss placed third in four of eight cells. Her strongest showing was among 35-44s with 20%, good for second place. Her weakest area was 45-54s, where she placed fifth.

Loveless placed fourth in four of eight cells. She placed second among 25-34s with 17% and fourth among 35-44s with 7%.

Clark was strongest among P1s and males at 10% and weakest among 35-44s, where she got 6% of the vote.
