Garrison Heads To Houston

On Oct. 16, KMLE/Phoenix PD **Jeff Garrison** was still in a meeting telling staffers he was headed to Houston to take the OM post for Infinity Country combo KIKK-FM & KILT-FM. While Garrison was in the meeting, we went ahead and posted the news about his new gig in the Country Format Room at *www.radioandrecords.com*. Of course, you knew to watch for the news if you checked in and saw the heads-up announcement we posted the night of Oct. 15 that told you the news was coming the following morning. Garrison should be settled in to his new office by the middle of next month.

In a note to the staff, Infinity/Phoenix EVP/Market Manager **Clancy Woods** said, "For seven years Jeff has given KMLE his unique blend of competitive leadership and 'frontier logic' that has resulted in consistent ratings and revenue victories over our direct format competitor. During his tenure as PD, KMLE has emerged as one of the most honored and respected Country radio stations in America. While Jeff's contributions will be missed at KMLE, his promotion to Houston is an indication of Infinity's commitment to identify and nurture talent within our own company."

Garrison, known as "Tallman," has programmed KMLE for the past 6 1/2 years and arrived there following an 18-month stint as OM of WESC & WFNQ/Greenville, SC. Before that he spent two years as Asst. PD/MD of KKBQ/Houston and 18 months as PD of KFRQ/McAllen-Brownsville. Woods says he's looking for "the best talent in the Country. HOTFAX that there has been no definite selection made on what the next single is for Country radio. He explains, "Several songs are getting airplay and are personal favorites of programmers. If I had to guess right now, I'd lean toward "When The Lights Go Down."

Haley noted that Faith will be performing on the CMA awards show (Nov. 6 on CBS-TV), but there's no decision yet on what she'll sing. When asked if there will be any remixes of songs on the *Cry* CD sent to Country radio, he said, "There has been some talk about remixes, but at this point the jury is still out. Paul Worley actually did one on 'Cry," but we decided not to service it to Country radio."

Haley added that hopes were high that *Cry* will hit 500,000 scans in its first week. He also said that Faith's Australian trip didn't come off as originally planned, but she is still on track for her upcoming trip to Japan. She returns from Japan just a few days before the CMA award show.

You Can Be a Star

There are lots of folks in Nashville who are stars — or who think they are. But for those who haven't yet had their dreams realized, cable TV's USA Network has launched a nationwide talent search for the next country music sensation. The "Nashville Star" program, tied in to local radio partner WSIX, opens initial auditions in Nashville today at the Country Music Hall of Fame. The program is tied in with 30 local radio stations around the country for subsequent auditions, starting with **KFRG/Riverside**, which will host auditions on Oct. 25. After regional competitions, 10 finalists will then be brought to Nashville to meet, live together and perform. The winner earns a recording contract with Sony Music Nashville. Information about partner stations and audition cities is available at www.usanetwork.com/nashvillestar.

National Review Compares CMT to MTV

A column in the Oct. 14 issue of the conservative political magazine *National Review* compares video

channel CMT with MTV and concludes that country music fits the nation's post-Sept. 11 mindset better than pop or rock. Stanley Kurtz writes that the "reallife" focus of country music makes it more apropos to the concerns of today, while MTV — with its angstridden songs — does not cater to the needs of the nation. Kurtz writes, "It isn't just the war that is missing from MTV; most of real life is missing from its offerings. Clearly 'My Neck, My Back (Lick It)' is about oral sex, and 'Oops (Oh My)' is about masturbation, but to treat most MTV videos as though they actually had subject matter is to miss the point."

Conversely, he believes, "CMT videos are about actual adult lives. That's why country music has managed to capture out post-9/11 wonderment at the way in which the simple but fundamental pleasures of life can be taken from us without warning." And, he finds that country artists "have grasped the fundamental truth of the moment; they have offered our young people a way to harness their sexual longings and their strident passions to something higher than themselves — the defense of our country and our freedom. Their counterparts at MTV have yet to pass that same reality test." Kurtz is a research fellow at Stanford University.

Country radio listeners during the last two weeks: "Think about Country music in general — your favorite Country station, the music, the stars, the television shows, the videos, the image. With just a view from 40,000 feet, looking down on it all, how do you feel Country music is doing overall? On a scale of 1 to 5, with "1" meaning you think it is really bad and in worse shape than ever and "5" meaning you think it is in great shape and in fact better than ever, how would you say the Country music business is doing overall?"

The good news is that 60% of the respondents think Country is "better than ever" (5) or "somewhat better" (4). Of the total sample, 30% say it's "about the same as ever" (3), while 8% say it's "not as good as it has been" (2) and 2% say "it's worse than ever" (1).

The P1s awarded the most "fives" at 25%, while the P2s gave the fewest "fives" at 18%. The 35-44s gave the most "fours" at 47%, while the fewest "fours" came from 45-54s at 34%.

On the negative side of the ledger, P2s gave the most "ones" at 3%, while only one percent of the P1s handed-out a "one." P1s, Females and 45-54s topped the "twos" with 9% each, while P2s, males and 35-44s were on the low end at 7%.


