The wildfires ravaging California have claimed at least one Country outlet, as the tower used by Riverside's KCAL-FM, KFRG and KSGN was destroyed Saturday night.

Lee Douglas, OM/PD for the Infinity/Riverside Country station, tells **R&R**, "It's a miracle that we're on the air." He adds that he has yet to see KFRG's transmitter site and is uncertain as to whether the station suffered a total loss at the site, located just to the north of San Bernardino, CA. KFRG lost its signal at 12:40pm Saturday and returned to the air with reduced power at 11am Sunday by borrowing KGGI/Riverside's transmitter atop Box Spring Mountain. "We need to figure out a long-term contingency plan, but we hope to have full-market coverage by the end of Tuesday," Douglas says. Meanwhile, KFRG's news coverage has increased as the station gets "all of the info we can get out on the air," he says. KFRG's studios are located in Colton, CA and have seen lots of smoke and ash but are out of the fire danger zones.

CMA Wins Court Battle Over "CCMA" Acronym

The Country Music Association on Monday was granted a preliminary injunction prohibiting the Christian Country Music Association from using the acronym CCMA in identifying itself or its awards show. Nor can it use the acronym in any of its advertising or promotion for that organization's annual awards show. In a 30-page ruling, a Federal Court stated that the use of CCMA was "confusingly similar" to the public and the media alike. Because the Christian Country Music Association's award show is next week, the judge allowed it limited use of "CCMA" this year. The Christian Country Music Association does not have to remove any marketing or promotional material currently in the marketplace. However, any use of "CCMA" within next week's show is prohibited and the organization must air a disclaimer that states the Christian Country Music Association has no connection whatsoever with the CMA.

In a statement to be released later today (Oct. 28), the CMA said, "CMA values the hard work and dedication of all the artists and industry members who have for more than 45 years helped to build CMA and the CMA Awards into a global brand that supports and enhances the format. We are also protecting the right to license the exclusive use of the CMA Awards name to our fine broadcasters CBS Television, CMT and MJI Radio. We are gratified that the courts have acknowledged the equity and reputation of our organization and our signature event, the CMA Awards, in ruling that Gene Higgins, president and owner of the Christian Country Music Association, stop using the acronym CCMA or promoting his event as the 'CCMA Awards' in the future."

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CMA Executive Director **Ed Benson** told **R&R**, "While our efforts were sometimes depicted as 'the Christians against the heathens,' going to court was our last resort. We have tried to work this out since 1994 to no avail. Ultimately, we had to take legal action to protect our broadcast partners, who have broadcasts rights to the CMA awards show. Our feeling is the court did what we felt all along it would do in providing injunctive relief."

The defendant now has 30 days in which to appeal the court's rulings. In the absence of an appeal, the preliminary injunction becomes permanent.

Van Dyke To CC/Chattanooga

As first reported anywhere last Tuesday morning (Oct. 21), Clear Channel/Tallahassee OM **Kris Van Dyke** was named the new OM for the company's five-station Chattanooga cluster, where he will also program Country WUSY. Van Dyke joined CC/ Tallahassee as OM in January 2002 and added PD duties for Country WTNT in July of that year. He should be in place by late November. Van Dyke succeeds CC/RVPP Clay Hunnicutt, who was also OM in Chattanooga but recently transferred to the company's Nashville cluster, where he also has OM responsibilities.

WDSY Teams DeCarlo, Monty For Mornings

WDSY(Y108)/Pittsburgh has teamed a pair of longtime Y108 personalities for its new morning show. **Chris DeCarlo**, who has been doing news with the recently departed *Welch & Woody* morning show since September '02, will be joined on Oct. 31 by Monty for the new *Y108 Country Crew with Monty and Chris*.

DeCarlo held the Y108 midday shift from 1987 to 1996, while she also served as Asst. PD/MD. She left to work in the record business, where she spent five years in promotion at A&M/Nashville and RCA/Nashville. Monty was a member of the Y108 morning show from 1993 to 1998. He later moved to middays before leaving to become a stay-at-home parent for a couple of years.

R&R/Bullseye: Listeners Pick CMA Entertainer of the Year

This week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question posed to 200 Country listeners: "If you could vote in the Country Music Awards, which of the following performers would you select for the Entertainer of the Year for the 2003 CMA Awards?"

Drum roll please: By a margin of 10%, the total sample said they'd vote for **Toby Keith** as CMA's top entertainer. He got 34% of the responses, compared to 24% for **Alan Jackson**, 19% for **Tim McGraw**, 13% for **Brooks & Dunn** and 10% for **Kenny Chesney**.



Keith topped each of the seven other sex/age cells for an across-the-board sweep. Among P1s, he was on top with 34%; P2s, 32%; males, 34%; females, 33%; 25-34s, 29%; 35-44s, 36%; and 45-54s, 35%.

Jackson was second in every category except for females. Among P1s, he had 22%; P2s, 29%; males, 28%; 25-34s, 25%; 35-44s, 23%; and 45-54s, 35%. He placed third among females, with 20%.

McGraw was second with females, with 21%, and placed third in every other cell.

B&D were fourth among P2s, males, females and 35-44s. They placed fifth with P1s, 25-34s and 45-54.

Chesney was fourth among P1s, 25-34s and 45-54s. He placed fifth among P2s, males, females and 35-44s.

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
