KESZ & KYOT/Phoenix PD **Shaun Holly** has been given the added responsibility of programming Clear Channel Country sister KNIX. He succeeds **George King**, who resigned Oct. 24 after 17 1/2 years with the station, the last two as PD. You may recall that Holly was the Asst. PD at Country competitor KMLE/Phoenix when **Alan Sledge**, now a CC Regional VP and OM of CC's Phoenix cluster, was PD of KMLE. Holly ascended to KMLE's PD post in mid-1994 after Sledge transferred to the company's WWWW/Detroit as PD. Holly was one of

KMLE's original personalities when it debuted in 1988; he left he station in April 1996.

King started at KNIX as a weekend jock and later moved to middays. He became Asst. PD in 1994 and was elevated to PD in 2000. King told **R&R** that, after such a long tenure with KNIX, he wanted to explore new opportunities and felt it best to leave the station as he began his search. R&R, Bullseye: Listeners' Choice for CMA Award

In its Question of the Week, **R&R** and Bullseye Research asked 200 Country listeners (25-54, 50% Male, 50% Female) the following: "The annual Country Music Association Awards Show is on CBS-TV Wed. Nov. 6. Do you plan to watch the CMA Awards this year? Additionally, the following singers are nominated for Female Vocalist of the Year. Who do you think should be the winner? "

The great news is that 71% of the total sample said they plan to watch the show. That jumps to 76% for P1s and 35-44s and to 78% for Females. On the low end, 60% of P2s say they plan to watch.

As for who they think should be crowned the CMA's top female, Martina McBride garnered 33% of the votes from the total sample. She was followed by Trisha

The lineup for the 36th Annual CMA Awards Show, set for Nov. 6, keeps getting better. In addition to superstar performances from Shania Twain and Faith Hill, the CMA has added Dolly Parton, Lee Ann Womack and Montgomery Gentry as well as newcomers Rebecca Lynn Howard and Joe Nichols to the show's performance schedule. Also watch for Brooks & Dunn's set, which will include guest performances from Bekka Bramlett and Kim Richey.

Look for **Dixie Chicks** to be their naturally candid selves on an upcoming edition of E!'s *Revealed*, scheduled to air Nov. 13. **Natalie Maines** discusses the half-shaved head and disdain for country music she had in her youth, while the group also explains their lawsuit and subsequent settlement with Sony.

It sometimes seems strange that some of the format's superstars have not yet played the Grand Ole Opry. But reigning CMA Entertainer of the Year **Tim McGraw** will rectify that situation Nov.30 when he takes the stage for his debut performance at the venue. He'll perform during both shows that evening. His Opry debut comes with the Nov. 26 release of his latest CD, *Tim McGraw & The Dancehall Doctors*.

The Opry returns to the Ryman Auditorium Nov. 1 and will remain at the historic venue through Feb. 22, 2003. Additional Friday-night shows and Saturday matinees will be added during the holiday season.

Reba McEntire isn't just wacky in her WB sitcom but also on newsstands. In the current issue of *People* magazine, Reba appears dressed as another famous sitcom redhead: **Lucille Ball**. The multidimensional star

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
