Fran Boyd Retires From ACM

As **R&R** first reported Nov. 8 in the Country format room at *www.radioandrecords.com*, Academy of Country Music Exec. Director **Fran Boyd** is retiring from the organization she has been associated with since 1968. She's been in the Exec. Director's chair since 1995. ACM President Jack Lameier says of her departure, "Fran has worked tirelessly year after year, overseeing the day-to-day operations of the academy and working closely with the president and chairman of the board. We are forever indebted to her for her years of devotion to the organization. Regardless of her official capacity with the organization, her legacy will forever be a big part of the Academy of Country Music."

Boyd joined the ACM in 1968 as an executive secretary and worked her way through the ranks over the years. She says, "I continue to be proud of all the Academy of Country Music has accomplished in my time. It has given me great joy to see so many young country artists rise from newcomers to having great careers. The Academy has helped music fans acknowledge country music as the enduring genre it deserves to be."

In addition to overseeing year-round operations, Boyd also served as Talent Producer of the ACM Awards show and had oversight of virtually every aspect of the award presentation. Boyd also coordinated the organization's annual ACM Bill Boyd Celebrity Golf Classic as well as the annual starstudded Christmas party. Boyd was named by **R&R** as one of "Country's Greatest Women" in its Sept. 24, 1999 Century of Country special issue.

The ACM is also expected to announce plans to move its award show to Las Vegas next year. (*Country Format Room, radioandrecords.com, 11/8*).

The New Country Boss

Given the success of Bruce Springsteen's "Lonesome Day" video at CMT, Sony Music Nashville's Monument imprint is working the record to Country radio. **WGGY/Wilkes Barre** is the first station to add the record. The radio edit is about a minute shorter

than the version offered on CMT and it is being digitally delivered followed by a CD-Pro to stations.

The flip of Infinity's KIKK-FM/Houston from Country to Smooth Jazz at KHJZ continues to cause repercussions for the company, as many of the station's advertisers have called the Houston outlet seeking money. If you recall, \$100,000 was promised to KIKK advertisers in a July 26, 2001 "Dear Advertiser" letter written by Infinity SVP **Bill Figenshu**, should KIKK-FM change formats during his tenure.

Several of the advertisers have reportedly discussed the formation of a coalition to petition the company for the money. **Michael Cruise**, PD of Cox's crosstown Country KKBQ, says, "From being in the market, I know they need to answer it, because that is all anybody is talking about."

Arbitron Changes Crediting Procedures

Beginning with the winter 2003 survey, Arbitron will rely on diarykeepers and its own research to determine the proper crediting of radio programs to a particular station in the market — a decision that eliminates the task of listing each station's air talent and shift on the quarterly Station Information Packet. Arbitron will still send out the packets but will ask for such critical information as station name, broadcast hours, network affiliation and power output. Arbitron contends that only 60% of stations have been submitting complete station information on a quarterly basis, and Arbitron spokeswoman Jessica Benbow tells **R&R**, "Diarykeepers are very accurate in what they've been sending us," she says. "They tend to be more accurate and more current."





A Big Night For A New Artist

It could be just about the best showcase ever for a burgeoning Country artist. Singer Adam Wright opens Friday night at Nashville's Gaylord Entertainment Center for Alan Jackson. The show also includes Unviersal South's Joe Nichols. Wright is an unknown to all of Music Row, except for one very big person. He happens to be Jackson's nephew.

The Dixie Chicks initially took a little heat for not having someone on hand at the CMA Awards to accept their Vocal Group of the Year Award. But they quickly sent out e-cards to their friends at radio to apologize and explain that they are all supporting

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Chick **Emily Robison** as she awaits the birth of her first child, which is imminent.

Three of the CMA show performers were decidedly under the weather for the show. Darryl Worley suffered from a stomach virus and was taking fluids through an IV before the show. He was taken to the hospital following his performance and is reportedly feeling much better. Additionally, both George Strait and **Keith Urban** lip-synched their songs due to illness and throat ailments.

 $< ext{Plenty of awards were handed out during the CMA}$ Awards, but CBS walked away as the real winner. CBS's broadcast of the awards gave the network its first Wednesday win of the season in viewers and households, attracting 17.6 million viewers according to Nielsen ratings for Nov. 6. CBS was also first in men 25-54 (6.1 rating/15 share) and adults 25-54 (6.9 rating/16 share, tied with ABC) and was a strong second in adults 18-49, adults 18-34 and women 25-54. CBS research estimates that 38 million viewers watched all or part of the show.

R&R's own **Lon Helton**, host of Westwood One's syndicated radio countdown show, recently interviewed **Trick Pony** for a show that aired last weekend. In the interview, bandmembers Heidi Newfield and **Ira Dean** admit they had a secret, four-year relationship that ended two years ago. Newfield says, "There's a reason why people in bands shouldn't be involved, because you're always working, and it was hard for us to keep it quiet. We thought if Warner Bros. hears about this, the first thing they're going to


