CMA's Lead CBS To Top

The CMA Awards helped propel CBS-TV to its highestrated and most-watched week since March. An estimated 38 million people watched all or part of the awards show, which gave CBS a Wednesday-night win in households, viewers, boomers, men 25-54, and adults 25-54. Compared to last year, the show drew about the same number of households but was up 24% in men 25-54 and up 5% in Adults 25-54.

CRB Extends Personality Award Entry Deadline

You now have more time to submit entries for the CRB Air Personality Award. Country Radio Broadcasters has extended the deadline to Nov. 3. To be eligible, personalities or teams must serve a single market only, and they must submit five copies each of an air check, a one-page description of their philosophy of creating a radio show, an outline on community involvement, and ratings for the airshift. One winner will be chosen from each size market: large, medium, and small. The three winners will be announced prior to the Country Radio Seminar, set for Feb. 19-21 in Nashville.

CRS 2003 Panel News

Some big names in the radio biz will be hosting panel discussions at CRS next year. Arbitron VP/Radio Programming Services **Bob Michaels** will offer *The Secrets of America's Top Performing Country Stations,* and *The Portable People Meter and Country Radio: How's Country doing in Philly?* in back-to-back sessions. Author **Bill Strauss** will conduct a session called *Millenials Rising: Country's New Target Oppor*- *tunity*, and **Dan O'Day** will explore *Radical Station Imaging* and *How to Create Maximum Impact Radio Advertising* in two panel discussions.

Among the radio veterans hosting roundtable discussion groups during CRS next year are Clear Channel's **Dave Ashcraft**, WKIS/Miami GSM **Carole Bowen**, consultant **Bob Glasco**, consultant **Ed Shane**, WYAY/Atlanta PD **Steve Mitchell**, former KSCS/Dallas MD **Linda O'Brian** and WGKX/Memphis PD **Greg Mozingo**. Ten roundtable discussions will take place during the afternoon of Feb. 19.


By the way, the early-bird registration deadline is fast approaching for next year's Country Radio Seminar. After Dec. 6, the fee rises from \$399 to \$429.

R&R/Bulleye: "Did You Watch The CMAs?"

Once again this year **R&R** and Bullseye asked a panel of 200 Country listeners if they watched the CMA awards show and, if so, what they thought of it. Bullseye asked: "The annual Country Music Awards show was on CBS-TV this past Wednesday night. Did you watch the CMA Awards show this year?" And, "If you watched the show, rate it on a scale of 1 to 5, with '1' meaning you did not like it at all and '5' meaning you liked it a lot."

Of the total sample, 53% said they watched the show. Interestingly, only 49% of P1s said they tunedin while 61% of the P2s said they watched. Among the age cells, the highest level of viewing came from 25-34s, with 58% of them saying they watched. The lowend was from 45-54s, 48% of whom said they viewed the show. Of all those who watched, 81% gave it a 4 or a 5, while only 4% gave it a 1 or 2. The biggest raves came from 35-44s, 86% of whom awarded it a 4 or 5. Next came the P1s and Males at 82%.

On the negative side of the ledger, only two cells were over 6% of 1s and 2s — Males and 25-34s.
