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


Chart Chat

R&R/Bulleye: Listeners Don't Want Blue

The two-part Question of the Week was posed to 200 Country radio listeners aged 25-54 — evenly divided between men and women. We asked, "On a scale of 1 to 5 with "1" meaning it is not important at all and "5" meaning it is very important, how important is it to you that your favorite radio station *not* use crude language or engage in crude behavior on the radio? And, would you say you *agree* or *disagree* with this statement: 'Radio personalities (DJs) should be able to say whatever they please on the radio."

Of the total sample, 76% said it was either "very" or "somewhat" important that their favorite sta-

tion not use crude language or engage in crude behavior on the radio. Interestingly, the highest number of "4s" and "5s" came from P2s, at 82%. Females came in at 80%, 25-34s placed at 79%, and P1s and 45-54s came in at 74%. On the other side of the ledger, 4% of the total sample said it wasn't important and answered "1" or "2." Of the total, 20% said they didn't have an opinion.

In response to the second part of the question, a whopping 83% of the total sample said they disagreed with the statement that radio personalities should be able to say whatever they want to on the radio. It was surprising to see that the 25-34s were less tolerant than any other cell, with 88% saying they disagreed with that statement. Oddly enough, the lowest percentage of folks who disagreed with the statement came from 45-54s, 80% of whom disagreed. For complete breakouts — featuring men and women 25-34, 35-44 and 45-54 — check out the Bullseye Callout research page in the Nov. 29 issue of **R&R**.

By the way, the Callout page also contains **R&R**/Bullseye Callout research for the Top 35 titles on the **R&R** Country chart. You'll see percentages for "Like a Lot," "Total Positives," "Neutral," "Familiarity," "Dislike," and "Burn" based on a 400 person-per-week sample. Plus, there's a new password allowing you to access regional and demo breakouts of the callout music research at Bullseye's web page, *bullsi.com*. ₹Jane Digs For Dirt On Hill

Much has been made of the now infamous **Faith Hill** interview in the December issue of *Jane* magazine, in which the songstress is asked about rumored liaisons and less about her life as a working mother. Under the headline "Faith Hill Isn't Just Your Typical Cheesy Pop Star. She's The Whole Fondue," Sr. Associate Editor Katy McColl observes — among other things, "She's used to being asked the same questions all the time, so she has pat replies to them. Four separate times she tells me stories I've read before. Verbatim. She has a harder time providing details outside that repertoire and ends up giving these spectacularly vague answers."

That may be true, or could it be that Hill was trying to be civil while avoiding some pretty personal questions, primarily about her sex life and if she used it in any way to get where she is today? Concerning her first boyfriend, Hill was asked, "Did you run the bases with him?" About breaking her engagement to producer Scott Hendricks when she met her husband, Tim McGraw, she was prodded, "It seems like there was overlap with some of your romances."

McColl then asked whether or not Alan Jackson, who Hill asked to write a song for her to sing while they were on tour together, had ever been in love with her. Hill replied, "Was Alan Jackson in love with me?! No! God, you're asking me a rumor? Then you should ask about everybody else" — such as John F. Kennedy Jr. and David Letterman."

At the end of the interview, a defensive Hill is asked about opening for now-husband McGraw back in 1996. She replied, "I didn't sleep with him to get an opening slot. That's what you want me to say, right?"

It's a big day for Mr. McGraw today as his CD *Tim McGraw And The Dancehall Doctors* and his book of the same name are released. He'll spend the day in Chicago partaking in a book signing and an album release party with WUSN. In the next few weeks, McGraw will perform on NBC-TV's *Today*, the Grand Ole Opry and his own NBC special. He'll also appear on shows such as ABC-TV's *The View*, CNN's *Larry King Live* and FOX Sports' *The Best Damn Sports Show Period*. Oh, he'll be featured in *People* magazine's Dec. 9 issue.

The 50th anniversary of **Hank Williams Sr.**'s untimely death will be marked with a special tribute on the Grand Ole Opry stage on Saturday, Jan. 4. As part of that tribute, **Hank Williams Jr.** and **Hank Williams III** will perform together for the first time in public. The performance will be televised on CMT. Hank Williams Sr. died on New Year's Day 1953 at age 29.

George Strait will kick off the second leg of his Road Less Traveled Tour on Jan. 16 in Greenville,

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SC. Of the 21 scheduled dates, all but one will be performed "in the round," with Strait playing to all sides of the stage. This leg of the tour will end Feb. 28 in Louisville. He'll be joined by **Tammy Cochran**.

In other Strait news, tickets for his 21st annual George Strait Team Roping Classic go on sale Monday. The event will be held March 14 and 15 in San Antonio, and it is heralded as one of the premier team roping competitions in the sport. Tickets can be purchased online at www.gstrc.com.


