- **Dec. 13: R&R**'s Year-End Music Issue. Once again we'll have the Top 100 songs of the year and every record that hit the Top 15.
- **Dec. 16:** The last reporting day of the year. There will be no reports on Dec. 23 or Dec. 30. The last **R&R** Country HOT FAX with music information will arrive on the morning of Dec. 17. The last issue of **R&R** for 2002 will be dated Dec. 20. Watch for an **R&R** Country HOT FAX News Update a few days after Christmas.
- **Dec. 20: R&R**'s final issue of the year. We'll wrap-up the year in news, recall the highlights and chronicle people's moves through 2002.
- Jan. 3, 2003: R&R's first issue of the New Year. This is a news-only edition and contains no music information.
- Jan. 6, 2003: The first report day of the New Year. Adds from Mediabase-monitored stations and reports from **R&R** Indicator stations will be taken until 3pm ET/noon PT, as usual. You will get an **R&R** Country HOT FAX on the morning of Jan. 7, 2003 that contains this music information.



R&R/Bulleye: Christmas Tunes From Now, Or Then?

Christmas music was also in the hearts and minds of **R&R** and Bullesye researchers last week, as we posed this two-part question to 200 Country listeners: "It's the Christmas season. Think about listening to Christmas music on your favorite Country radio station. Do you prefer to hear Christmas songs performed by today's Country stars, like Alan Jackson and Martina McBride, or would you rather hear them by more traditional artists, such as Bing Crosby, Nat King Cole and similar singers?"

We then asked, "When do you think your favorite Country station should begin playing Christmas music? Should it be "before Thanksgiving," "right after Thanksgiving" or "just before Christmas?"

In response to the first query, today's Country listeners overwhelmingly say they want to hear Christmas songs as performed by today's stars. That's

especially true among the younger demos and, interestingly enough, the P2s. Of the total sample, 77% said that was what they preferred. Across the cells: P1s, 76%; P2s, 80%; males, 78%; females, 75%; 25-34s, 86%; 35-44s, 76% and 45-54s, 68%.

As for the second question, once again the listeners say their desire for Christmas tunes begins long before that of most air personalities. Of the total sample, 67% said they would like stations to begin "right after Thanksgiving." Only 6% said "before Thanksgiving," and 27% said "just before Christmas."

Checking out the cells and demos, the high for "right after Thanksgiving" was among 35-44s, at 73%, and the lows came from P2s, at 61%. The high for "just before Christmas" was 32% among 25-34s and the low was 23% among 45-54s (which proves, once again, how tough it is to program a format that attracts listeners of such wide ranges.) For those who answered "before Thanksgiving," the high was from P2s at 12% and the low from P1s at 3%.

For complete breakouts — men, women, 25-34, 35-44 and 45-54 — check out the Bullseye Callout Research page in the Dec. 13 **R&R.**

By the way, the Callout page also contains **R&R**/ Bullseye Callout Research for the top 35 titles on the **R&R** Country chart. You'll see percentages for "Like a Lot," "Total Positives," "Neutral," "Familiarity," "Dislike," and "Burn" based on a 400 person-per-week sample. Plus, there's a new password allowing you to access regional and demo breakouts of the callout music research at Bullseye's web page at *www.bullsi.com.* A reminder: When you go to the website, use your station call letters as the user name, then enter the new password.

In those pages, you'll also find results from RateTheMusic.com's online music testing from a very large sample of heavy Country radio listeners.

MUSIC NOTES

★ The Dixie Chicks have parted ways with Nashville talent agency Buddy Lee Attractions and is now working with Creative Artists Agency. In an interview appearing in the Dec. 8 edition of The *Tennessean*, Buddy Lee VP Paul Lohr blamed the switch on the Chicks' manager, Simon Renshaw. "They didn't really give a reason for leaving. I think they're letting their manager do the thinking. He moved to L.A. You can draw a correlation there," Lohr told the newspaper. Buddy Lee Attractions still represents artists such as Lee Ann Womack, Clay Walker, Marty Stuart, Lorrie Morgan, Tammy Cochran, and Pinmonkey.

✓ In that same story, Lohr also takes aim at radio consolidation, claiming it's responsible for how long it takes for an act to become established enough to book. "If a song takes 20 to 25 weeks to peak, that means a new act only gets two singles a year. That means a new artist will take 10 years to develop an entire set's worth of music," Lohr said.

CMT is scaling back its *Most Wanted Live* request show from a daily program to a weekly Saturday program, starting in the new year. Host **Katie Cook** will continue to serve as host and will add duties for a new show, *Most Wanted Live Star* — an interview show set in front of a live audience. That show will air Mondays, starting Jan. 13, with **Kenny Chesney**.

The **Shania Twain** cover story in the Dec. 16 issue of *People* magazine explores the singer's willingness to continue with her career, and Twain sounds more than a little hesitant about the future. "My personality isn't suited to what I ended up doing," she says. "When people try to treat me like a star, it makes me withdraw. Ten years from now, if I'm still in the limelight, I just can't imagine it."

Country artists are appearing in many various publications these days, but I never thought I'd write about this one: **Travis Tritt** recently sat down for an interview with KISS front man **Gene Simmons** for Simmons'*Tongue* Magazine and talked about "Sex, Style, and Rock 'n' Roll." Other country acts are also involved in the event, including Travis Tritt — who opened the 10-day event on Dec. 6.

Brad Paisley will guest star on his girlfriend **Kimberly Williams'** ABC-TV show, *According to Jim*. What an acting stretch it will be: Paisley will play a musician and new love interest for Williams' character. The show airs Dec. 17.

Collectors take note: Twenty of **Patsy Cline**'s stage outfits, made by her mother, will be offered for sale to the public along with an archive of 21 personal, handwritten letters from October 1959 through February 1963. The live auction will take place at Profiles In History in Beverly Hills, CA and on the Internet at *ebayliveauctions.com* on Dec. 19.

Not only is McGraw's CD selling like crazy, with 602,000 units selling in the first week, his book sales aren't anything to sneeze at either. The book, *Tim McGraw & The Dancehall Doctors: This Is Ours* debuted at No.19 on the New York Times Bestseller List. McGraw's follow-up book, on his experiences as a father, is due in 2003.


Country will make a big showing at next month's 29th Annual People's Choice Awards. **Alan Jackson** is nominated for Favorite Male Musical Performer, **Faith Hill** is up for Favorite Female, and the **Dixie Chicks** vie for Group honors. The show will air on CBS-TV Jan. 12 from 9-11 ET.

The five acts that will gain coveted spaces on the Country Radio Seminar's New Faces Show will be announced next week. **Andy Griggs** and **Trick Pony** will announce the artists on Dec. 16. Radio attendees of last year's CRS were sent an e-mail ballot to vote on the eligible acts. Among the criteria, acts must have at least one top 25 single during the qualification period and they must never have appeared on the New Faces show before.

Diamond Rio will be hitting the road — literally and figuratively — this week. He'll be appearing on Larry King Weekend Dec. 15 to promote their new song, "I Believe," and filming the video for the single on a highway. The video is set against the backdrop of an interstate car crash.

When you think of Country artists with a literary bent, **Trace Adkins** may not be the first star to come to mind. But during his recent USO tour in the Persian Gulf, Adkins decided to keep a daily journal. "I didn't want to forget a thing," he says. "Landing on and taking off of the aircraft carrier was quite a trip." Other


