year's CRS-34 New Faces Show & Banquet. Votes were cast for the five highly coveted spots by radio attendees at last year's CRS who provided their e-mail addresses. The "New Faces five" were announced at a press conference yesterday by Andy Griggs and Trick Pony's Heidi Newfield. Each artist on the show will be allowed 20 minutes of stage time, three minutes of which can be a video presentation.

#### WUSN Tops \$1 million for St. Jude ... Again

For the third time in its 11 years of holding a Country Cares For St. Jude Kids Radiothon, WUSN (U.S. 99.5)/Chicago tops the \$1 million mark with an amazing \$1,061,110 in donations. US99.5 cracked the seven-digit mark for the first time in 1999 with \$1,100,507 and again in 2000 with a record \$1,195,892. Even last year, faced with the aftermath of the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks, WUSN tallied more than \$941,000 in donations. The station has raised more than \$7 million for St. Jude's in its 11-year radiothon history.

#### **CRB Details Research Project**

The Country Radio Broadcasters commission a research project every year, with the results presented at that year's Country Radio Seminar. This year, Edison Media Research is conducting a national survey of country music from the viewpoint of the younger generation. Entitled "Super Bowl Dreams for Country Music," the study will discuss strategies proven to attract listeners aged 15-29 to tune to Country. The research presentation is set for Feb. 21 from 9:00-10:30am.

Some of the questions the study will address as part of the national survey include:

- •Why are a number of 15-to-29-year-olds resistant to listening to Country music?
  - •How can the Country music industry battle the

dominance of hip-hop and R&B among these younger listeners?

•What marketing strategies can be developed to win them over?

Edison Media Research President Larry Rosin will be joined by Howard Handler, former Sr. VP/Marketing & Fan Development for the NFL — he was behind the NFL's successful marketing campaign to America's youth — and a former MTV Marketing Director. He will tackle specific questions concerning country music's future and offer specific recommendations for strategies that can be used by record labels and Country radio stations alike.

#### **TV Time**

Here are a few tubular items of interest first posted last week in the Country Format Room at www.radioandrecords.com:

- Chicks Ruled Tuesday Night: NBC-TV earned its highest ratings among adults 18-49 in the Tuesday 8-9pm slot in five weeks with the special *An Evening With The Dixie Chicks*. In the overnight Nielsen ratings, among overall total viewers, the network got its second biggest audience in the time period this season. The show received a 3.7 rating and an 11 share among adults 18-49, with 11.1 million viewers. (First posted on Dec. 11.)
- Country Figures Big At AMA: The American Music Awards, set for Jan. 13, 2003 on ABC-TV, will prominently feature some of country's biggest stars. Tim McGraw's duet with Elton John on "Tiny Dancer" will open the show, but it won't be the only big duet of the night. Willie Nelson and Toby Keith will perform "Beer For My Horses" from Keith's Unleashed CD. Other big country stars on the program include Shania Twain and Kenny Chesney. The show, hosted by the Osbourne family, will also include performances by Christina Aguilera, match-

Steiner's brother, Sid "Rock" Steiner, was crowned the steer wrestling world champion at the event, which drew huge crowds to Glitter City.

#### 'Smile' Is Golden For George Strait

Just months after celebrating his 50th birthday, George Strait has joined another, albeit much more exclusive, Golden Anniversary club. In a truly amazing feat, Strait's "She'll Leave You With A Smile" is his 50th No. 1 record (when both R&R and Billboard Country charts are factored in). In fact, no other solo artist from any genre of music can claim as many chart-topping singles in the two major trades, according to the research mavens at MCA/Nashville.

Of his feat, Strait said, "While I am extremely pleased and excited about reaching this new milestone in my career. I realize that it would not have been possible without an enormous amount of support from the fans and from Country radio as well as the unending effort of dozens, maybe even

hundreds, of great people who have worked at MCA Records over the course of my career. There is no way that I can find the words to properly express my gratitude to everyone for their help. I am very humbled by it all."

Kudos to Michael Powers, Royce Risser and their very own "Ace In The Hole" gang of merry promoters on presenting George with such a history-making No. 1 Christmas present. (For the chart-history buffs among you, it should be noted that Conway Twitty notched 55 No. 1 hits in the two major trades during his illustrious career, but six of them were duets with Loretta Lynn.)

#### **Chart Chat**

Congrats to RCA/Nashville's Mike Wilson, Keith **Gale** and their promo team on hitting a chart trifecta. Nipper's crew hit Breaker with **Martina McBride's** "Concrete Angel," they snagged a Top 10 for newcomer Aaron Lines' debut single "You Can't Hide Beautiful," and nabbed the No. 1 Most Added slot with 54 adds on the debut single from Jeff **Bates**. #### **MUSIC NOTES**

Alan Jackson is no stranger to collecting awards this year. Now, his fans have backed up those allocades, as Jackson has swept the *Country Weekly* Fan Favorite Awards. Jackson won the awards for Favorite Entertainer, Favorite Male Artist, Favorite Collaborative Song ("Designated Drinker" with George Strait), Favorite Song for "Where Were You (When The World Stopped Turning)" and Favorite Album for *Drive*. Full coverage appears in the publication's Dec. 24 issue.

The magazine's fans also gave a few awards to artists other than Alan Jackson. The Favorite Female Artist award went to **Martina McBride**, the Favorite New Artist nod went to **Blake Shelton**, the Favorite Group selection was given to **Alabama**, the Favorite Duo named was **Brooks & Dunn** and **Toby Keith** snagged Favorite Video for "I Wanna Talk About Me."

Close to 65,000 fans cast their votes by mail-in ballots or via the Internet.

As part of its award presentation, the magazine's editors also honored **Johnny Cash** with the Career Achievement Award. *Country Weekly* Editorial Director **Neil Pond** said, "Johnny Cash is the living embodiment of country music. He's lived the life and walked the walk. He's done it all: singing, songwriting, performing, recording, starring in his own TV series, acting in films. One hundred years from now country music will still be feeling the rumble of his massive footsteps."

Meanwhile, Mr. Jackson isn't taking much time to idle in the New Year, as his *Drive* tour continues Jan. 30 in Peoria, IL. The latest leg of the tour includes a New Year's Eve show in LaCrosse, WI and stops in Milwaukee; Mankato, MN; Oklahoma City, Omaha-Council Bluffs, IA and Tulsa — all within the first eight days of February.


