Rebuilding The KAT — Once Piece At A Time

Is a former KKAT/Salt Lake City PD returning to the KAT as its new owners seek to re-create the ratings and revenue monster of the late '80s and early '90s?

Before we get to that, some background. We've been following the odyssey of KKAT for the last few weeks. You may recall that just before the holidays Clear Channel sold the Country outlet to 3 Points Media for \$26 million. Since then we've reported that it will remain Country, despite there already being *four* FM Country stations in the market: Citadel's KUBL, KSOP Inc.'s KSOP and Simmons Media's recent sign-on, KEGA.

In our Dec. 31 Hotfax we told you that Consultant **Jaye Albright** — who worked with KKAT a few years ago — was back, and that one of the first orders of business was to return KKAT to "K-Kat," an identity it had owned for more than 16 years before abandoning it in January 2002 in favor of "K102, 12-In-A-Row Country."

It now appears that KKAT's return will include not just a former employee, but also its architect. Nothing's official yet — although it may be by the time you read this — but look for KWNR PD **John Marks** to be named to a top KKAT programming post. Marks, who put the Country station on the air in 1985, was there for 12

years before heading to KWNR in April 1998.

Points and CEO Tom Sly — once KKAT's VP/GM
— are *serious* about Country in SLC. Look for more big announcements very soon.

Haskell begins his new duties on Jan. 15 and reports to Citadel VP/Market Manager Milt McConnell.

Moore Has KWJJ Howling

Mike Moore has only been PD of KWJJ/Portland, OR for a little over three months, but he had the station howling last Tuesday — literally. KWJJ jettisoned a laundry list of positioners and slogans Jan. 6 to become the northwest's incarnation of "The Wolf."

Moore notes, "We wanted to rejuvenate and rebrand the station. Our goal was to better define our brand; the Wolf allows us to do that. Nike is based here, and we want the paw print to become the second-most-famous logo in town." Toward that end, Moore says staffers are on the streets handing out T-shirts by the hundreds. He also adds that he has a huge paw-print stencil, which will be used to paint giant imprints on streets leading to various Wolf events. KWJJ is now positioned as "Great Country for the Great Northwest — The New 99-5, The Wolf."

He reports the music mix remains where it's been since his arrival (this week's Mediabase analysis shows it at 31% current, 33% recurrent and 36% gold). He has ratcheted the station's tempo up with the change to The Wolf.

Joining KWJJ as Asst. PD/MD/middayer is **Savannah Jones**, most recently with KOYT/Tucson. The midday slot had been open. Leaving KWJJ is MD/evening talent **Craig Lockwood**. Moore is looking for a night jock.

R&R/Bullseye: Gifts You Gave

R&R Country Callout America by Bullseye this week asked 400 Country radio listeners what kind of gifts they gave the most this Christmas. Response categories include Toys/Games, Music/CDs/Cassettes, Money/Gift Certificates, Electronics/CD Players/Computers and Clothing. The answers aren't likely to warm the hearts of most record executives.

Overall, only 6% of respondents gave their loved ones music. The top gift category was Toys/Games with 30%, matched almost perfectly by Clothing with 29%. Money/Gift Certificates landed at 26%, while Electronics/CD Players/Computers represented only 9% of giving according to this sample.

At 7%, P1 listeners were much more likely to give music versus P2s, at 2%. Men and women were evenly split at 5% and 6%, respectively. The age group least likely to give music was 25-34, with only 3%, while 45-54 was most active, with 9%.

Some interesting but understandable gender differences emerge in the non-music categories. Women gave more Electronics (11%) and Clothing (34%), while men were more likely to give Toys/Games (32%) and Money/Gift Certificates (29%).

Fall Arbitrons: KFRG, KNCI top five; WUSN, WYCD, KRTY KSON top 10

The first of the fall 2003 Arbitrons being released show Country outlets in the nation's top markets holding their own in a sweep dominated by lots of news and the baseball playoffs and World Series. Some thumbnail sketches:

KZLA/Los Angeles: This was the best book for KZLA in three years. PD **RJ Curtis** reports: "We took an excellent jump 25-54 from 2.2-2.7. Cume was flat, but TSL was up big everywhere: 12+, 7:15-8:30; 25-54, 7:15-9:15; and women 25-54 were up to 10 hours. We went 3.0-3.6 women 25-54, which puts us fifth overall. The morning show grew, but middays drove this book. Shawn Par went 2.5-3.1, 12+ (ninth); 2.5-3.2, 25-54 (ninth); and 3.2-4.5, women 25-54 (fifth)."

WUSN (US99.5)/Chicago: The story here, like most Country stations, is 25-54. While the 12+ rank is 10, OM **Tom Rivers** says WUSN is No. 5 25-54, with a 3.9. He's also happy to report US99.5 retains its Most Listened-To Country Station crown, edging KZLA by a scant 5,500 cume persons.

WXTU/Philadelphia: PD **Bob McKay** reports that listening among younger demos and women was up in the fall, with the 12+ dip owing to a decline in older demo listening. Depending on the daypart, listening among men was soft to flat.

KZBR (The Bear)/San Francisco: PD **Ray Massie** debuted The Bear with continuous music in mid-August, added an air staff in late September and had no money for TV or direct mail. The station didn't market anywhere until November. How'd it do? Its 19th place debut (12+) doesn't tell the story. The Bear is No. 10 women 18-34, No. 11 women 19-49 and No. 11 women 25-54. JD in PM drive is No. 7 18-34 women and No. 8 25-49 women. In the morning, Rick Taylor is No. 11 18-34 women and No. 12 25-49 women.
