R&R/Bullseye: Where They Listen, And The Top Dayparts

This week's **R&R**/Bullseye Callout America question is a two-parter. We asked, "Where do you most frequently listen to the radio?" and "What time of day do you most frequently listen to the radio?"

It will probably come as no surprise that "In the Car" listening outpaced "At Home" and "At Work" by more than a two-to-one margin. Of the total sample, 50% said they listened to radio most often in the car. while 23% said "At Home" and 22% said "At Work."

There was quite a divergence between P1s and P2s on where they listen. While 51% of P1s said they listened "In the Car," only 19% said "At Home" and 24% said "At Work." Among P2s, 48%

said they listen most in the car, 32% said "At Home" and 16% said "At Work."

Another interesting divergence takes place in the demos, where "At Home" and "At Work" percentages are inverted. "At Home" is 32% of 25-34 listening, 17% of 35-44 listening, and 18% of 45-54 listening. Conversely, "At Work" listening is 16% among 25-34s, 22% among 35-44s, and 26% among 45-54s.

It will also come as no surprise that the bulk of all radio listening takes place in morning drive, where 51% of our sample said they listened most often. The other dayparts: middays, 12%, PM drive 23%, evenings 12% and overnights 2%.

Across the cells and demos, the highest percentage of folks saying they listened most frequently in morning drive: 64% of 35-44s, 55% of P2s and 54% of females.

Highest midday listening came from 45-54s at 19%, and P2s and females at 13%. In PM drive, 25-34s were at 27%, and males and 45-54s were at 24%. Evening listening was 16% among 45-54s and 14% among P2s. Overnights was 1-2% across all cells and demos.




