Perhaps taking a page from his show-stopping 2001 CMA Awards performance, **Alan Jackson** will be debuting a new, as-yet-unrecorded song on Wednesday's *CMT Flame Worthy Music Video Awards*. "To Do What I Do," written by Tim Johnson, is described as a "thank you to the fans" and therefore quite appropriate for the fan-voted Flame Worthy celebration.

In other CMT award-show news, **Carolyn Dawn** Johnson, Jimmy Wayne, Minnie Driver, Dr. Maya Angelou and Elaine Irwin-Mellencamp have been added to the show as presenters, and Brooks & Dunn will be presenting Reba McEntire with her Johnny Cash Visionary Award. Trace Adkins, Dierks Bentley and Gretchen Wilson are set to perform on the 90-minute live pre-party broadcast, with Big & Rich and The Del McCoury Band making appearances as well.

R&R/Bullseye: What They Want To Hear, Pt. II

Once again, this week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question was: "On a scale of 1-5, with 1 meaning 'Not very important' and 5 meaning 'Very important,' how important are the following programming elements when listening to your favorite radio station?" The choices were: "Less talk/More music," "Frequent traffic information," "Frequent weather information," "Contests & giveaways," "Talking with callers on the air" and "Family friendly (no crude talk)."

The second wave of this question gives us a total sample of 800 respondents, ages 25-54 and 50% male, female.

As you might expect, "Less talk, more music" wins by a landslide.

Of the total sample, 78% awarded "Less talk, more music" either a 4 or a 5. The big news was among 45-54s, where a whopping 86% gave "Less talk/more music" a 4 or a 5. Across the board: P1s, 78%; P2s, 77%; males, 79%; females, 77%; 25-34s, 75%; and 35-44s, 77%. Second place for the total sample of 800 was a tie between "Frequent traffic information" and "Family friendly" at 51%. The positive percentages (4 or 5) for "Traffic" ranged from 48-54%, expect among 45-54s, where 61% gave it the two highest grades. "Family friendly" across the board: P1s, 50%; P2s, 51%; males, 48%; females, 53%; 25-34s, 51%; 35-44s, 47%; and 45-54s, 53%.

Next came "Frequent weather information" with 44%, "Contests & giveaways" at 35% and "Talking with callers on the air" with 31%.






