During **Gretchen Wilson**'s recent press trip to New York, which included a performance on *Today*, a photo shoot for *Blender* and an interview with *People*, the singer also made time for some fun. Wilson visited the infamous Hogs & Heifers Saloon, jumping up on the bar to sing "Pocahontas Proud" through a bullhorn. Later she saw her first Broadway show, *Hairspray*.

Joe Nichols kicks off promotional appearances for his new album, *Revelation*, with a June 29 (album street date) live in-studio performance on *Good Morning America*.
