R&R's Country Industry Achievement Award Winners

While the 2004 **R&R** Industry Achievement Awards were officially revealed during a special party at the R&R Convention in Los Angeles on Friday night, **R&R**/Nashville got a jump on the festivities last Thursday afternoon, paying surprise visits to Labels of the Year **Arista** (Platinum) and **DreamWorks** (Gold).

It was Arista's third consecutive win.
DreamWorks was honored with a hat-trick of trophies for the second consecutive year, capturing top Gold Label, Promotion Executive and Regional of the Year honors. Universal Music Group/Nashville Sr. VP/Promotion Scott Borchetta took top promo exec kudos for the fourth consecutive year, while DW Southwest Regional Suzanne Durham made it a three-peat in her category.

In the radio category, **KPLX** (**The Wolf**)/**Dallas** was honored for the fourth consecutive year as the Country Station of the Year. KYGO/Denver PD **Joel Burke** was voted by **R&R** readers as the Country PD of the Year, **Cody Alan** won MD accolades for the fifth consecutive year, and WSIX/Nashville morning personality **Gerry House** continued his lock on the Personality of the Year award, winning it for the seventh consecutive year.

In the overall categories, Emmis/Los Angeles VP/GM **Val Maki** was named the Market Manager/GM of the Year for Markets 1-25. Country KZLA/Los

ACM TV Ratings

From the "better late than never" department: The Academy of Country Music Awards show on May 26 pulled a 7.2 rating/12 share, giving it a solid second-place finish for CBS-TV, according to Fast National Ratings for Wednesday, May 26.

As you might expect, the *American Idol* finale won the night — and the week — with a 16.0 rating and .26 share. NBC was third, with 6.5/10; ABC was fourth, at 5.8/9; and UPN was fifth, with 1.8/3 in the 8-11pm ET primetime slot.

Among 18-49s, Fox's *AI* beat the other five networks combined with an 11.7 rating. The

ACM awards came in second, with a 3.3; ABC was third at 3.1 and NBC was a 2.9.

The first hour of *AI* posted a 14.1/24 and the ACMs were second, with 6.6/11. (In 2003, the ACM's first hour got a 7.3 rating and a 12 share, good for second place.) AI rose to an 18.0/26 in the second hour, with the ACMs again in second place. NBC won the third hour with *Law & Order* at 8.6/14, and the ACM's third hour once again placed second, with 7.8/13. (In 2003 the ACM's third hour was 8.1/13, also a second place finish.)

Nielsen Media Research put the ACM award show in 11th place for the week, with 11,590,000 viewers (ages 2 and older) and a 4.2 rating. By comparison, *AI* 's Wednesday finale had 38,840,000 viewers and a 10.5 rating, while No. 6 *CSI* had 14,860,000 viewers and a 5.4 rating.

The Academy of Country Music recently announced that CMT's live pre-ACM awards broadcast on the "orange carpet" garnered the network's highest ratings ever among 18-49s. Among the artists appearing on CMT's fourth consecutive live ACM special were Tim McGraw, Martina McBride, Brooks & Dunn and The Rock.




