CRB Seeks DJ, Country Radio Hall of Fame Nominations

One of the most important deadlines of the year is now about two months away. It's important because having a strong Country Music DJ Hall of Fame and a vital Country Radio Hall of Fame depends on

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having applications from those most deserving of enshrinement. And, that's where you come in.

The Country Radio Broadcasters is again inviting radio and music industry executives to submit inductee nominations for those two Hall of Fame Award categories. Applications for 2005 inductees are being accepted through **Sept. 30, 2004.** Inductee nomination applications (eligible persons living or deceased) will be accepted from any member of the Country radio or country music industries, including the individuals themselves.

So, if you know of someone who should be in either hall, get an application and begin the process yourself. We all know deserving candidates; let's be proactive in making sure they're recognized.

CMDJHOF: The Country Music Disc Jockey Hall of Fame is dedicated to the recognition of those individuals who have made significant contributions to the country radio industry through their on-air contributions. Criteria include:

- ·On-air radio career must have begun at least 25 years ago.
- · Contribution to the growth and development of Country radio.
- · Contribution to the preservation and enhancement of country music as an art form.

Country Radio Hall of Fame: Criteria require that the nominee began their radio career more than 25 years ago. In addition they need to have contributed to the growth and development of the Country radio industry and to the preservation and enhancement of country music as an art form. There is no limitation on this award except that the recipient cannot be a current member of the Board or Agenda Committee of Country Radio Broadcasters.

This year's CRB Hall of Fame Event and ceremonies have been set for March 1, 2005.

Plaques commemorating recipients of these awards are on display in the walkway between the Renaissance Hotel and the Nashville Convention Center. Photos, bios and, in many cases, radio airchecks of prior winners can be viewed on www.crb.org.





Cretchen Wilson's recent platinum party in Nashville turned twice as nice when Sony∕ Nashville honcho John Grady presented Wilson with a plaque honoring her just-announced double-platinum certification.

Wilson's "Redneck Woman" has been included in the CD compilation *NOW 16*, which will be released July 27. She is only the third country artist (after The Dixie Chicks and Keith Urban) to be included in the mostly pop and rock music series.

Carific Stone The featured New Face in Rolling Stone's Hot Issue, which hits the stands July 30. A dance mix of their "Save a Horse (Ride

a Cowboy)" is an iTunes exclusive available July 27, while two exclusive tracks are available on Napster: "I Wet My Pants" and "The Bob Song."

Restless Heart's recent Seattle show almost didn't happen when the band got stranded in the Denver airport by inclement weather. Stuck overnight in the Mile High City, the guys were forced to sleep on the terminal's marble floor. CMT will devote the weekend of Sept. 11 and 12 to programming on the late **Johnny Cash**. Shows including *Controversy: Johnny Cash vs. Music Row* will celebrate the legend's life on the anniversary of his death.


