Raleigh Steps Down; All Cumulus Country To Furst

Cumulus Corporate Format Director/Country **Bob**Raleigh has stepped down from the post he has held since June 1998. Alan Furst, who has held the same title and has been working with half to the company's 45 or so Country outlets since joining Cumulus this past February, will now assume programming oversight responsibilities for the stations with which Raleigh has been working. Raleigh reportedly has been offered the opportunity to remain with Cumulus in another capacity.

Prior to joining Cumulus, Furst had also served as VP/Programming for AMFM and Capstar. He previously was Group Program Director for the Australian Radio Network, National Program Director for NewCity Communications and a Consultant with Shane Media Services.

Raleigh was programming Cumulus' WUUS/Augusta, GA when he was promoted to the corporate programming post. His programming background includes stints at WCOS-FM & WHKZ-FM/Columbus, SC; and WKXC-FM/Augusta.

Radio Responds To Frances

Hot on the heels of Hurricane Charley, Hurricane Frances pounded Florida's East Coast over the weekend. Once again the populace evacuated the area while radio staffers stayed put, updating listeners on the path of the storm and the routes out of the city.

WKIS/Miami PD **Bob Barnett** reminded us that while his 100kw station covers the Upper Keys to the

Palm Beaches, the station is licensed to Boca Raton, which Frances hit hard. As of Tuesday afternoon, WKIS was still operating on generator power.

WKIS went wall-to-wall with preparedness information last Thursday morning, long before the slow-moving storm hit. Barnett told **R&R**, "Thursday was a day of panic and chaos in the market as everyone searched for plywood, food, gas, water, etc. in preparation for the storm. I was surprised how many of the other stations were just playing music while almost 1 million people were in their cars searching for supplies or being evacuated. I'm sure their thinking was that this was a TV event. But in reality no one was sitting in front of the TV — they were all on the road! It was a 24-hour rush-hour, and the clock was ticking."

WKIS was off the air for about two hours overnight on Saturday when a generator belt broke. On the air during the worst part of the storm overnight Saturday and into Sunday were WKIS GM Joe Bell and legendary Florida personality Johnny Dark.

WKIS returned to music around midday on Monday — although programming is still far from normal. "Hundreds of thousands of people in the listening area are still without power," Barnett said. "Radio is the only source of information for people, and we're taking that responsibility seriously. Keep your fingers crossed that Ivan stays away!"

WIRK/West Palm Beach PD **Mitch Mahan** and three others went to work at a local TV station, which simulcast with Infinity's five area stations. Wall-to-wall coverage began Friday night at 7pm. Mahan said, "It took almost three hours for the first eye wall to move past us. We had an unbelievable amount of wind and rain, trees falling outside our hurricane-wrap windows, items slamming into the building, roofing materials blowing — it was insane. The biggest problem we had was the length of time it took the storm to move. We had hurricane conditions for over 24 hours, during which 13.5 inches of rain fell.

"Sunday morning we got power back at the station and came back to our studios dodging downed trees, wires, poles and traffic lights in the streets. We've been fielding calls from listeners with questions, suggestions and information for others."

On the personal side, Mahan reports that WIRK swing talent **Tim Mercer** had the roof of his home collapse. He and his family are fine, but they lost everything.

Mahan's overview of the weekend: "It never ceases to amaze me how a crisis can bring us all together to do something good. We also learned a lot from this storm about planning and how quickly your plans can go to hell. We had several moments of levity, but you had to be there for them to be funny — we did get a lot of 'When can I take my dog out to pee?' calls. I asked one guy how heavy his dog was and if he wanted him to be a kite or not.

"We took on-air calls and questions all day Sunday and Monday from listeners wanting info and passing along info. Hurricanes blow, but radio shines during a crisis."

There you'll find an absolutely amazing assortment of clothing, furniture, sculptures and paintings in addition to numerous guitars, unplayed 45s and vinyl albums on the Sun label and handwritten lyrics to a number of Cash-penned songs. Grammys, CMA and ACM Awards, BMI certificates and RIAA plaques awarded to Johnny Cash and/or June Carter Cash can also be yours — for the right bid, of course.

Among the more unusual items are Johnny Cash's 1996 Kennedy Center Honors Award, his Tennessee driver's license, numerous batches of signed personal checks and a \$100 check made out to Cash by Kris Kristofferson.

Now, before you begin clearing space for one of Cash's Grammy or CMA awards, you should be aware there seems to be a question whether those trophies can indeed be sold.

Country Music Association Executive Director **Ed Benson** told **R&R** that since 1995 CMA awards have borne this engraved inscription: "Property of the country music association. Only the winner or winner's family may possess this award. Any transfer, voluntary or not, will be void, and possession of this award will revert to CMA." Award winners previous to 1995 were sent stickers with the same inscription and were asked to affix them to the bottom of their awards. Benson added that CMA legal counsel has contacted Sotheby's in an attempt to recover the awards.

As for NARAS, Recording Academy business affairs exec Ann Meckelborg says, "Since the Grammys' 1958 inception, our policy has been that if anyone wanted to sell an award we reserved the right to purchase it for \$10. Since then we've included letters with the awards that specify that sale or transfer is not appropriate. We've had outside counsel working with

the Cash estate, and there has been a lot of discussion back and forth." She added that the issue remains unresolved. The academy's outside counsel did not return calls requesting comment.

You may also be wondering if the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum would like to have an item or two for its collection. Director Kyle Young noted, "We have been in touch with the family. They have a list of particular items (we would like to have), representing both Johnny and June, that may or may not be included in the auction. The family has assured us that they will address our needs."

As for raising a hand in the bidding, Young explained, "As a not-for-profit educational organization, this Museum, like most others, does not compete at public auctions. The largest percentage of our collection has been donated. Our 750,000-item holdings are unduplicated. To continue to build the collection, we must rely on either the good will and understanding of owners and their heirs or philanthropists."

KGEE, KNFM Folded Into Lonestar 92

Cumulus' two Odessa-Midland, TX Country stations are now one. Last Saturday at noon, KGEE and KNFM were folded into KNFM's persona as Lonestar 92. KGEE PD/morning personality **Boomer Kingston** — a 23-year KGEE vet — has moved to Lonestar 92 for PM drive, while KGEE PM driver **Dan Travis** has made the switch for evenings. **John Moesch** remains OM/PD/morning host for Lonestar 92 and Kingston becomes its Asst. PD/MD.

Lonestar 92 is also being simulcast on Cumulus' KKLY/Pecos, TX. KGEE will drop out when its new format debuts Sept. 20.

Flipping Out In Bakersfield

Clear Channel has flipped CHR/Rhythmic KKXX (96.5 Kiss FM)/Bakersfield to Country under the calls KBKO (The Big 96-5). The flip came Thursday at midnight.

Kenn McCloud, who had been PD of KKXX and market sister AC KKDJ, is now PD of KBKO, which will run jockless until Sept. 20.

McCloud's former KKDJ morning co-host, Barbie, will now co-host mornings on KBKO using her real name, Larae Nelson. She will team with JP Shane, a voice and production pro relocating from Salt Lake City. McCloud will do middays, followed by Karen Garcia, who will drive south 30 minutes on the 99 freeway from KJUG/Tulare, CA for afternoons. Sammy Cruise will handle nights, voicetracked from KBQI/Albuquerque. (Country Format Room, www.radioandrecords.com, 9/3)


