Looks Like N.Y.C. For CMA Awards 2005

At a press conference scheduled for 11am ET this morning in New York, the CMA and New York City Mayor **Michael Bloomberg** are expected to announce that the organization will hold its 2005 awards show in New York City at Madison Square Garden. The announcement culminates more than a year of negotiations between the CMA and the city of New York, which approached the organization about the possibility of hosting the awards telecast more than a year ago.

CMA executives will return to Nashville Tuesday afternoon for a press conference scheduled for 3:30pm. Brooks & Dunn's **Kix Brooks** — who is suffering from laryngitis and unable to make the Gotham trip — is expected to join Nashville Mayor **Bill Purcell**, Trace Adkins and CMA's **Ed Benson** to announce plans for a gala return of the CMA awards to Nashville in 2006, coinciding with the 40th anniversary of the awards.

Werewolf In Richmond

WJZV/Richmond, VA flipped from Smooth Jazz to "93.1, The Wolf, Country That Rocks" yesterday (10/4) morning at 9:31. MainQuad Creative Services Director **Jeff Beck** was promoted to PD for the new station, which he says will be an "uptempo, maleoriented Country station that combines Country, classic rock and Southern rock music." Beck previously programmed a similar format on WGRX/ Fredericksburg, VA.

The Wolf is now running 93 hours commercialfree. Beck says it will be live in mornings and

afternoons in a couple of weeks, with other personalities added going forward.

New call letters are pending for the station, which kicked-off with Big & Rich's "Save a Horse, Ride a Cowboy." "That song epitomizes what we're trying to do here," Beck says. "We're going to be energetic, fun, upbeat and a bit irreverent, with a rock feel to what we're doing."

Beck went on to say, "There's so much crossover now — Hank Jr. and Kid Rock, Jimmy Buffett and Martina McBride, Travis Tritt and John Mellencamp. They all respect what the other does and they find a way to work together. It's a mix and marriage that makes sense."

Beck also said the Wolf will be decidedly uptempo, with a target of 18-49 men. "The music we're putting on The Wolf will be uptempo songs with some grit to them to attract the men while not alienating the women with the way we're positioned."

The Southern rock and classic rock tunes in The Wolf's library include lots of Eagles, Lynyrd Skynyrd and Allman Brothers, according to Beck. He said The Wolf is playing current and past music from Robert Earl Keane, Steve Earle, Hank Williams III, among others, noting, "It's not going to be tucked away after midnight; that music is a huge part of this format." He's also instituted a "hip" category and is playing music from Delbert McClinton, BR5-49, Jeffrey Steele, Confederate Railroad, Jamison Clark, Jill King, The Warren Brothers, The Tractors and Anthony Smith, among others.

The flip has been in the planning stages for over a month, and Beck says he adopted the Wolf moniker because "it's a cool name and has a male feel to it." He noted, however, that The Wolf is an accent, not the primary way the station will be imaged. "We want the music to be the message," he explained. There will be limited "wolf howls" on the air.

Beck admitted the new Wolf is indeed on the air taking some shots at venerable Cox Country outlet WKHK. Said Beck, "It really annoys me a station is allowed to go on the air and say they play 50 minutes of music an hour when they don't. We've been monitoring WKHK for over a month, and in that time I don't think there's been one hour between 6am-7pm Monday-Friday that they've played 50 minutes of music.

"We continue to monitor them every hour, and we're calling them on it. Last hour we went on the air and pointed out that the station that guarantees 50 minutes of music played 42 minutes of music, 12 minutes of commercials and six minutes of yada-yada-yada. We tell listeners we're not going to make promises we can't keep. And now we're promising 93 hours of commercial-free country that rocks." Beck can be reached at 804-327-9902.

The Country Radio Broadcasters and Huntsman Entertainment will team to produce an official multistation radio remote broadcast from next year's Country Radio Seminar (CRS-36). *Live From CRS!* will originate from the Nashville Convention Center, March 2-4, 2005. This will be the first time CRS has offered remote broadcasting services to attending stations.

"CRS has become the market week for Country," CRB Exec. Director **Ed Salamon** said. "There is no other time of year when so many radio stations and artists converge in Nashville, and now radio can bring that excitement to its listeners."

R&R/Bullseye: Got 'Net?

This week's **R&R** Country Callout America by Bullseye question posed to 600 Country listeners began by ascertaining if they had access to the Internet on a daily basis at work or at home. If the answer was affirmative, they were then asked these yes or no questions: "Have you listened to an Internet radio station?" "Have you listened to satellite radio?" Are you a subscriber to XM or to Sirius?" "Have you downloaded music and not paid for it?" and "Have you purchased single songs on the Internet?"

Of the total sample, 76% had daily Internet access. Of that universe, 28% said they've bought single songs on the internet, 27% said they've listened to an Internet radio station, 27% said they have indeed downloaded music and not paid for it — an interestingly high number to admit that to an unknown caller, considering the publicity garnered by the RIAA lawsuits — 21% said they have listened to satellite radio and 5% said they subscribe to XM or Sirius.


