

Miller's Crossing To Motown

As reported in a Breaking News update yesterday, Infinity WYCD/Detroit has tapped former Citadel WGKX/Memphis OM/PD **Chip Miller** as PD, replacing Mac Daniels, who departed in August. Miller's previous programming stops include WFBE/Flint, MI; WPKX/Springfield, MA; and a regional programming gig for an eight-station Nassau Broadcasting cluster in Newton, NJ.

WYCD VP/GM **Steve Schram**, who noted the crowded field of qualified applicants and called the search "exhaustive," says Miller's Michigan background was key. "Chip has kind of been observing the scene up here for a while," Schram says. "He was actually at our Hoedown event in mid-May, and I had a chance to spend some time with him there. So, he was kind of watching WYCD, and when this became available in August he was the second person to contact me."

In Memphis, meanwhile, the search is on for Miller's replacement. As of Nov. 15, current WGKX MD **Trapper John** steps in as interim PD, while Citadel/Memphis President/GM Tony Yoken looks to fill the empty chair. Get to him at 5629 Murray Road, Memphis, TN 38119.

It's Raining Men





R&R/Bullseye: Music Views, Listening Habits

This week's **R&R** Bullseye Research question posed to 350 Country listeners is a two-parter. We asked, "With your busier lifestyle these days — more things to do, more places to go, etc. — do you find you are listening to Country radio more, less or about the same as always?" Also, "Do you think the music you hear on your favorite Country station is better, worse or about the same as it was a year ago?"

Of the total sample, 33% said they're listening more, 14% answered "less," and 53% tune-in about the same as always.

In answer to the second question, 47% of the total sample felt the music is better than a year ago, 10% thought it worse, and 43% said "about the same."


Big & Rich Super Galactic Fan Pak (WB)
