Capitol/Nashville has hired **Jimmy Harnen** as Sr. Dir./ National Promotion, reporting to Exec. VP Bill Catino. Harnen fills the position vacated by **Rick Young**, who departed early last week. An 18-year industry vet, Harnen spent six years with DreamWorks and recently did a stint as VP/Associate Manager at Refugee Management International.

Twain, Keith Give UMG One-Two Punch

Look for greatest hits projects from **Shania Twain** and **Toby Keith** to be the best-selling country albums when the final tally is released later this week. "We're looking at scanning over 1 million units combined on the two releases, so we're ecstatic," says UMG/Nashville Sr. VP/ Sales & Marketing **Ben Kline**. He says Twain's *Greatest Hits* will exceed 500,000 in unit sales, with Keith's *Greatest Hits 2* topping 400,000. In all genre sales, **Eminem**'s *Encore* will exceed the two country offerings, with Kline predicting 700,000-plus.

"We've seen a lot of people wonder, publicly and privately, why we would put both albums out on the same day," Kline says. "But we've gotten a lot out of it in terms of presentation and two-for-one price deals. The positives outweigh the negatives because we haven't seen any negatives. In fact, we're hoping to finish onetwo-three with George Strait scanning his millionth album. It's a good market-share week for us."

Kingsley Reports: Veterans Day

American Country Countdown host **Bob Kingsley**, who served in the Air Force, was Master of Ceremonies for the Veterans Day national observance at Arlington National Cemetary last week. We asked him to recount the experience:

When I first met with Secretary of Veterans Affairs Anthony J. Principi, I knew [serving as MC] would be a once-in-a-lifetime experience. What I didn't know was that I would come away from this experience with a renewed sense of what it means to be an American.

This awesome day started with breakfast at the White House with several Medal of Honor recipients. It ended standing at the podium in Arlington National Cemetery with President George W. Bush telling me how happy he was that I was there and that I had done a good job. I couldn't have been more honored and humbled all at the same moment.

During what may be one of the five best days of my life I experienced the booming 21-gun salute of Army howitzers marking the arrival of our President; the emotional laying of the wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier by President Bush at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, marking the signing of the armistice that ended World War I on this date in 1918; "Taps" and a moment of silence following; watching the procession of our nation's colors and those of our veterans service organizations; and listening to the United States Navy Band and the Sea Chanters sing "God Bless America."

I highly recommend that every American visit Arlington National Cemetery. Witnessing the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier is a moving, emotional experience. Seeing the eternal flame burn at the grave of President John F. Kennedy, as well as the graves of his wife, brother and children, brings back every memory of those historic, tragic days.

I will never forget the many veterans I spoke to that day who emphasized how much they appreciate what the President and Secretary Principi have done for them over the last four years. The overwhelming sentiment is that they are being treated honorably and their benefits are improving.

There are 48 million men and women who have served this nation in uniform, and nearly 25 million are still alive today and deserve our respect. I now more fully understand why there is a Veterans Day and that we should never take it for granted. I look forward to telling anyone who is interested some of the wonderful personal stories I learned in Washington, DC on Nov.11, 2004. What an amazing day!



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
