Merle Kilgore Passes

It is with an especially heavy heart that I report the death of performer, songwriter and manager **Merle Kilgore**. He died Feb. 6 at age 70 of congestive heart failure related to complications from ongoing cancer treatment. He is survived by his wife, Judy; sons Steve and Duane Kilgore; daughters Pam Compton, Kim Pomeroy and Shane McBee; eight grandchildren; and one great granddaughter. Visitation is set for Monday, Feb. 14 from 4-8pm at the Hendersonville Funeral Home, 353 Johnny Cash Parkway, Hendersonville, TN 37075.

The funeral will be Feb. 15, with visitation at the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville at 11am and a memorial service to follow at noon. A procession to the gravesite service will follow. Flowers may be sent to the Hendersonville Funeral Home.

A member of the NSAI Songwriter's Hall of Fame, Kilgore composed songs including Webb Pierce's No. 1 "More and More"; Claude King's "Wolverton Mountain"; and the classic "Ring of Fire," written with June Carter Cash and recorded by Johnny Cash. It's indeed ironic that the "Ring of Fire" co-writer would pass away just a few days after the song's producer, Frank Jones.

With Kilgore's death, Music Row has lost one of its greatest personalities. Merle was impossible to describe. Even to say he was bigger than life doesn't describe him adequately. His booming voice and even bigger smile lit up every room he entered.

My favorite Merle memory was when my wife and I toured Ireland with the Kilgores and Bill and June Denny. The six of us in a van for a week — and Merle regaled us with countless stories of Nashville's early days.

Also on that trip he fulfilled his lifelong dream of kissing the Blarney Stone. I was manning the video camera at the time, and Merle was very concerned about what got on tape. You see, you have to hang upside down to kiss the stone. And he was very worried about being caught on tape with his toupee hanging in a less than gentlemanly manner.

Rest in peace, Merle. You will be missed.

During his Columbia years he co-produced with Don Law a number of Johnny Cash albums, including *Ring of Fire* in 1963 and *I Walk the Line* in 1964. Jones also produced John Anderson's "Swingin" in 1983.

Through the years Jones served on the CMA Board and as Chairman of the Country Music Foundation board. He was also a member of the Canadian Country Music Hall of Fame.
