Garth & Friends Raise \$2 Million For Med Center

Garth Brooks came out of retirement Sunday night to join **Steve Wariner**, **Stephanie Davis** and event organizer **Dan Roberts** in a benefit that raised more than \$2 million for Cook's Medical Center in Ft. Worth, TX.

Roberts, a singer and songwriter who penned Brooks' "Beaches of Cheyenne" and "Fever," staged the fundraiser to buy a new piece of equipment for Cook's. His daughter was diagnosed with a brain tumor in the fall of 2000. After receiving a number of operations and a rather bleak prognosis, she began the road to recovery thanks to a new technology at UCLA called MRI Motor Mapping and the use of an Intraoperative MRI. Dan Roberts hopes to bring the same technology to Ft. Worth.

We asked KSCS/Dallas MD **Chris Huff** and veteran Country personality **Steve Harmon** for their thoughts on the show, called A Four Star Evening for Refuse to Lose. Huff recollects, "[Garth] accepted on the condition that his appearance not be made public and that he only be billed as a 'mystery guest' — he didn't want the event to be about him.

"When word leaked [about Brooks], we immediately went on the air with the news and, thanks to an anonymous donor, wound up with two pairs of tickets that we auctioned off for over \$6,500." The show's 2,000 tickets started at \$1,000 and were sold out by that point.

Huff continues, "Things started off with Dan and his three guests — Davis, Wariner and Brooks — each taking turns performing acoustically. It quickly became apparent that performing must be like riding a bike for Garth — you'd never know this was a guy who'd been retired for almost half a decade. After about three songs from each guest there was a brief intermission, after which Garth returned to the stage with just his guitar.

"There we saw a unique side of him as he recounted the music that influenced him over the years and playd portions of songs from Merle Haggard, George Jones, Billy Joel, Cat Stevens and more. When Garth started to reminisce about 1989, he joked that his acoustic guitar wasn't going to be enough. That's when the curtains rose behind him and, in typical Garth fashion, he was suddenly joined by his full band and led into a seemingly endless set list that could double as just about anyone's power gold list.

"The night's mystery guest was himself joined by a surprise guest, as Trisha Yearwood made an appearance to perform 'Walkaway Joe,' accompanied by Garth's guitar and harmonies.

"Garth sounded just as good as ever, and although he frequently talked about how he enjoys his life now as a stay-at-home dad, you could tell he was enjoying performing just as much as the audience was enjoying him. It was truly a magical evening — it was one of those rare occasions where you could actually sense the history being made.

"Who knows when we may see Garth perform again? Whenever it is, I left with the sense that Garth will return to the stage, and when he does he will not disappoint."

Harmon notes, "Steve Wariner was in incredible voice and, with Dan and Stephanie, stole the first half of the show." As for the G-Man, he says, "What if you could create a time machine? Seems Garth Brooks can and did! Garth mentioned often he was in retirement and not ready to leave it, noting this show was for his friend Dan and the Roberts family. However, at one point during the show Garth stopped, wiped away tears and said quietly, 'I do miss this so much.'

"For a finale, Garth brought out Trisha Yearwood. The two kissed many times on stage and sounded incredible together. But there was no talk of that magic duet CD he has wanted to make with her for years. His intro to Trisha had a slight misstep as he said 'my wife, Trisha.' It came out like it's been said before, and the crowd buzzed. Garth realized it and said, 'Let me correct myself. She is not my wife. But someday, if I am very lucky....'

"The taste of it is in Garth's mind's eye again. And for those of us there from the beginning, to see the band and hear the Garthzilla one more time was mind-boggling. Garth said over and over, 'Only for Dan,' but the smile on his face in the spotlight made you wonder if someday in the future — The Return?"
