Borchetta Exits UMG; Catino Rumored As Replacement

R&R Country Daily subscribers checking their e-mail Sunday afternoon were no doubt shocked to find **R&R's** Breaking News story detailing **Scott Borchetta's** departure as UMG/Nashville Sr. VP/Promotion & Artist Development. Sunday afternoon we wrote, "Apparently a Saturday 10am meet had been set weeks ago by Borchetta to discuss CRS-week label activities with promotion staffers from the three imprints. Prior to the meeting, however, Borchetta had breakfast with Stroud and Lewis and was either asked to resign or told of his termination. Borchetta reportedly has six or seven months left on his current contract, and negotiations on a new deal had not been going well."

New details surfacing Monday morning suggest that is indeed what happened. The two sides just couldn't get together on details of Borchetta's continued association with the company, which reportedly included a desire to move up from promotion to head one of UMG's three Nashville labels. The failure to come to an agreement, coupled with the availability of Capitol/ Nashville Executive VP **Bill Catino**, may have pushed Lewis and Stroud to move sooner rather than later.

Catino is heavily rumored to be Borchetta's replacement at UMG. And, while there's still no official announcement from the UMG camp, Capitol/Nashville President & CEO **Mike Dungan** did tell **R&R**, "Bill Catino has been an instrumental component in all of the success attributed to Capitol Records over the last 15 years, and he has continued to be key during this label's resurgence over the last four years.

"In addition to his professional contribution, he has become a very dear friend. I cannot imagine how strange it will be to come to work and not have him sitting in the office next to me (although my ears are looking forward to the rest). He leaves here taking all of our love with him, and we wish him only the (OK, second best: Some ... moderate success) in his future endeavors down the street at the Evil Empire."

Catino's contract with Capitol was up in January. Sources close to the situation say that Capitol was only willing to give him two firm years plus an option year; Catino wanted three years. That put the promotion veteran in play and open to talking to the UMG folks. Catino was with Universal Records President Jimmy Bowen and A&R head Stroud at that label in the late 1980s. He went with them when they moved to Capitol in similar capacities in January 1990.

Borchetta To Launch Label

Early Monday, UMG issued a press release with this statement from Borchetta: "I've had a burning desire to run my own record label for quite some time now. I am thankful to James Stroud and Luke Lewis for all of their support, and especially the opportunity to help further the careers of so many of country music's most dynamic artists. I have absolutely fallen in love with the MCA and Mercury promotion staffs and their artists, as well as so many on the UMG staff, and of course my original 'Dream Team' DreamWorks crew, making this the toughest part of this move. A special thanks to all of my friends in Country radio for another incredible run."

Borchetta has reportedly been lining up potential backers for his new label while also earmarking a handful of artists and a few promotion people he wants to join him. Weekend events at UMG allowed him to move up his timetable.

The UMG release also included a prepared joint statement from Lewis and Stroud, who said, "While we understand Scott's desire to take the next step in his career, he will be missed. His tremendous contributions to Universal Music Group Nashville include helping to build a superb artist roster and one of the most talented promotion teams in the business. The entire Universal Music Group Nashville family joins in wishing him only the best in all of his future endeavors."

Tuesday night's Country DJ Hall of Fame dinner kicked the seminar off with its best quote, courtesy of none other than Career Achievement honoree **Dolly Parton**. Comparing Country radio to a lover she said, "You were great to me, bought me a lot of nice things, then you dumped my ass for younger women."

President's Award recipient **Larry Daniels** said he was "blessed to be in a career I'm still passionate about today." DJ Hall inductee **Bob Mitchell** joked that he wanted to be in radio for "all the benefits — 401k,

CRB's 2005 Humanitarian Award Winners

CRS-36 opening ceremonies featured a very moving tribute to the late **Tom Rivers**, which included a performance of "Only Here for a Little While" by **Billy Dean**. Rivers was posthumously presented with the CRB's Humanitarian Award, which will henceforth be named in his honor. CRB also announced Radio Station Humanitarian Award winners during the morning's opening session. They are: Small Market, KDXY/Jonesboro, AR; Medium Market, KXKC/Lafayette, LA; and Large Market, WQYK/Tampa. Last year's Artist Humanitarian recipient **Brad Paisley** presented this year's honor to **Diamond Rio**.

Honesty Is Key

Keynoter **Toby Keith** dropped a few bombs during his candid chat Thursday morning. The session covered Toby's childhood and family life before exploring some of the difficulties he's had in his career. He ripped the Grammys, saying, "Country gets dumped on. They called me [to perform as

part of an ensemble], and I told them to go to hell." Later he revealed that his performance on the May 17 ACM Awards will be beamed in live via satellite from Iraq. He also hinted at the end of his tenure with DreamWorks/UMG. When asked how many albums remained on his contract, he quickly replied, "One more. I'm recording in July."

During the well-attended Label Heads panel, UMG/ Nashville co-Chairman **Luke Lewis** got a chance to respond to Keith. "If you think you can get through this business without bitterness you're wrong," he said. "It's OK if I piss him off. At least he'll tell me. He's not a backstabber." Warner Bros. Exec. VP **Bill Bennett** praised **Big & Rich**, **Gretchen Wilson** and the MuzikMafia movement for bringing an "optimism about music" to the industry.

Research Presents Good News

"The Largest Study of Country P1s Ever" sampled more than 11,000 respondents, with overwhelming positive reaction. At least 84% said they are listening to Country radio more this year than last, and 60% strongly agreed that today's Country music is better than it was a year ago. Edison Research's **Larry Rosin** said of the study's findings, "It is incumbent on the industry as a whole to capitalize on this excitement."

Overall, CRS-36 drew 1,946 full registrants, as well as 755 other participants at officially sanctioned events, exceeding last year's combined total of 2,633 by 2%.

It's The Music, Stupid

Martina McBride and Catherine Britt sang in tribute to Dolly at the DJ Hall of Fame Dinner. Curb/Asylum showcased Cowboy Crush and LeAnn Rimes at Wednesday's luncheon. Wednesday night's Music City Jam was a full-blown MuzikMafia set powered by Big & Rich, Gretchen Wilson and James Otto and featuring the solo debut of country rapper Cowboy Troy.

Thursday's lunch offered a more complete set from Wilson, as well as the rocking **Montgomery Gentry**. RLG's annual boat trip on the Cumberland produced one of the week's most magical moments. *American* *Country Countdown*'s **Bob Kingsley** hosted a show opened by **Brooks & Dunn** that included turns from **Jeff Bates, Sara Evans, Andy Griggs, Rebecca Lynn Howard, Blaine Larsen, Phil Vassar** and **Brad Paisley**, with his very funny ode to "Alcohol."

The highlight of the night was Vassar returning to a stage adorned with back-to-back grand pianos. His opening chords to "Smokey Mountain Rain" signaled the evening's special guest, **Ronnie Milsap**, who was in magnificent voice, hitting the high notes on "Rain" and "Stranger in My House" effortlessly. The night ended with a tribute to **Ray Charles** by Milsap and Vassar, who performed "What I'd Say" with **Carolyn Dawn Johnson,** Howard and Evans serving as "Raylettes."

Sony drew a crowd to BB King's that evening to showcase **Miranda Lambert**, **Shelly Fairchild** and new Columbia duo **Van Zant**. Friday's Capitol luncheon featured the immensely entertaining debut of **Ryan Shupe & The Rubber Band**, as well as **Jamie O'Neal**. Finally, the **R&R**-sponsored New Faces Show & Dinner closed the week's festivities with **Blue County**, **Billy Currington**, **Josh Gracin**, **Julie Roberts** and the meteoric **Sugarland**.

MCA/Nashville VP/Promotion **Royce Risser** and Country radio consultant **Rusty Walker** were elected to the CRB Board of Directors. Incumbents re-elected to three-year terms were Curtis, **Gregg Swedberg, Tim Roberts** and **Carole Bowen** in the Radio category; **Bill Macky** and **David Haley** in the Record category; and Jeff Walker in the At-Large category. WQYK& WYUU/Tampa OD/PD **Mike Culotta** was elected Agenda Chair for CRS-37. KFKF/Kansas City Promotions Director **Renee Ronner** was voted Agenda Vice Chair.

CRS-37 Dates Set; No Vegas Confab

CRS-37 is set for Feb. 15-17, 2006, once again at the Nashville Convention Center. The event is moved up two weeks to accommodate SEC basketball tourneys, which need the hotel rooms. That will put the Hall Of Fame dinner on Tuesday, Feb. 14 — otherwise known as Valentine's Day. As Regent VP/Programming **Bob Moody** noted, "Those of us who attend the DJ Hall of Fame dinner will presumably have an additional problem. Repeat after me, 'Happy Valentine's Day, sweetheart. How'd you like to drop \$150, eat something that appears to be chicken, and listen to some 80-year-old guy introduce his entire town?'" Also, there will be no CRS Regional event affiliated with the ACM awards in Las Vegas this year. Reportedly at issue was the number of hotel rooms available to the CRB. No other regional CRS event is scheduled for 2005 either.

Chesney Update

The March 3 **R&R Country Daily** told you of Kenny Chesney's freak accident that left him with a severe ligament injury to his right ankle. It also forced Chesney to reschedule the first weekend of his Somewhere in the Sun tour.

As of late Monday, Chesney is still planning to play the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo March 9, the new tour's opening night. His opening weekend dates have been rescheduled as follows. 
